RAYS REPORT—The Rays continue their final road trip before the All-Star break tonight at Comerica Park, going 1-4 so far against the Twins (1-2), Tigers (0-2, one to play) and Red Sox (4G)...have lost four of five and eight of their last 11 games...are still 28-17 in their last 45 games since May 20, tied for fourth in MLB behind the Blue Jays (32-14), Astros (30-15) and Brewers (29-15), and 40-29 in their last 69 contests since starting 9-14...are 3-5-1 in their last 45 mine series after going 7-1-1 in their previous nine (May 9-June 8)...are third in the AL East, 5.0 GB the first-place Blue Jays, their largest deficit since entering play on June 14 (5.5 GB)... spent 19 days within 2.5 games from June 16-July 4, including three within a half-game, but never claimed first... have been in second or third for the last 45 days...on the season, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 30 in third, 30 in fourth and four in fifth.

* The Rays jumped out to a 2-0 lead before falling, 4-2, last night...they have blown a multi-run lead in three of their four losses in July.

* They have now lost four straight series for the first time since June 18-July 4, 2024 (six straight)...pairing the current set with a three-game sweep from Sept. 24-26, 2024, this is their first time losing consecutive series at Comerica Park since 2015-16.

* Rays starters have thrown five quality starts over seven outings in July, tied for the most in MLB (AZ. KC. MIA), and their 45 quality starts on the year lead the AL...the rotation's 3.27 ERA (85.1IP, 31ER) in their last 16 starts since June 21 ranks fourth in the majors behind the Phillies (2.48). Tigers (2.92) and privates (3.26).

* Tampa Bay is 21-18 (.538) on the road, second in the majors behind Detroit (27-20/.574)...having played the most home games (53) and fewest road games (39) to this point, 12 of 18, 24 of 33 and 30 of its next 44 games will come on the road.

WHAT'S AT STAKE—The Rays need to win tonight in order to avoid:

Their second time being swept on the road, joining April 4-6 at TEX, and fourth time overall, joining April 29-May 1 vs. KC and May 6-8 vs. PHI.

Being swept at Comerica Park for the second straight series and third time overall, joining Sept. 24-26, 2024, and May 23-24, 2011 (min. 2G series).

Their first four-game losing streak against the Tigers since dropping six straight from May 21-July 3, 2016.

Their sixth straight loss at Comerica Park, surpassing Aug. 11, 2010-April 10, 2012 (5G) for their longest skid in the ballpark's history...their last win in Detroit came on Aug. 6, 2023 (10-6).

Losing back-to-back season series to Detroit for the third time (2011-12, 2005-06).

MADE FOR THE SPOTLIGHT—Last night, Junior Caminero was named to the AL roster for the 2025 All-Star Game in Atlanta, replacing the injured BOS Alex Bregman...this morning, he was announced as the sixth participant in this year's T-Mobile Home Run Derby on July 14...Caminero is the third All-Star third baseman in Rays history, joining Evan Longoria (2008-10) and Isaac Paredes (2024)...Caminero will be 22 years, 10 days old when the Midsummer Classic takes place on July 15, making him the youngest All-Star in franchise history and the youngest in the majors this season, ahead of WSH James Wood (22.301 on day of ASG)...Caminero is the fifth third baseman to earn an All-Star nod in an age 21-or-younger season (age as of June 30) since the game's inception in 1933, joining BAL Manny Machado (2013 20). CLE Buddy Bell (1973, 21), MLN Eddie Mathews (1953, 21) and WSH Buddy Lewis (1938. 21).

**Caminero will be the fourth Ray to participate in the Derby, and he is looking to become the club's first champion (see table to the right)...he could become the youngest player ever to win the Derby, surpassing a trio of 23-year-olds: Juan Soto (2022), Juan Gonzalez (1993) and Ruben Sierra (1989).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR—Between Jonathan Aranda, Brandon Lowe and Junior Caminero, the Rays have three All-Stars or more for the fourth time in the last six seasons since 2019 (no ASG in 2020) and the seventh time in franchise history, all since 2008...this marks the second time the Rays have had three or more All-Star infielders in the same season, joining 2009 (Jason Bartlett, Evan Longoria, Carlos Peña, Ben Zobrist).

* This is Aranda's first career selection—he is the fourth Rays first basemen to earn an All-Star nod, joining Yandy Díaz (2023), Carlos Peña (2009) and Fred McGriff (1999).

* Lowe made the Midsummer Classic for the second time, joining 2019...he is the only second baseman in Rays history to make the All-Star Game and is the eighth player to earn multiple selections, joining Carl Crawford (4), David Price (4), Evan Longoria (3), Chris Archer (2), Scott Kazmir (2), Shane McClanahan (2) and Ben Zobrist (2).... Crawford, Longoria, Zobrist and Lowe are the only position players in that group.

CHASING HISTORY—Chandler Simpson singled with two outs in the 9th inning last night to extend his hitting streak to a career-high 12 games, surpassing his 1-game streak from May 11-26...the 24-year-old is batting, 405 (17-for-42) with 1 2B, 1 3B, 3 RB1, 3 BB and a . 911 OPS during the streak, which is is tied with KC Bobby Witt Jr. for the third-longest active run in the majors behind WSH Daylen Lile (14G) and NYY Cody Bellinger (13G)...with a hit tonight, Simpson would tie the longest streak by a rookie in franchise history, a mark currently shared by Rocco Baldelli (March 31-April 16, 2003) and Delmon Young (June 15-28, 2007). according to Stats Perform...as it stands, his 12-game streak is tied for the third longest (8x, last: Randy Arozarena, June 3-17, 2021)...only two MLB rookies have had longer streaks this season: Lile and ATH Jacob Wilson (15G, March 27-April 12).

**Simpson went 45 PA without striking out before fanning in his first trip to the plate last night, the second-longest streak by a rookie in Tampa Bay history behind Randy Winn's streak of 59 PA from July 16-Aug. 4, 1998.

**His 24 SB are tied for second in the AL behind teammate José Caballero (31SB) despite appearing in only 49 of the Rays 92 games...he is 3 SB shy of the Rays rookie record for a full season, set by Baldelli in 2003 (27SB).

MISSING THE MARK—Rays pitchers have allowed four runs or more in nine straight games for the first time since another nine-game streak from May 27–June 6, 2017...this marks just their fifth such streak of nine games or more since becoming the Rays in 2008, and the club has not had a longer streak since going 13 straight games from June 16-28, 2016...the bullpen has allowed runs in eight of nine games during the streak...this includes an active streak of six straight games yielding multiple runs, the 'pen's longest since Sept. 20-26, 2023 (6G)...their last longer streak was seven games from May 21-27, 2023...Tampa Bay, has blown a multi-run lead in three of its four losses in July.

**The Rays 6.07 ERA (43.0IP, 29ER) against the Tigers is their second-highest vs. any AL opponent, better than only their 6.64 ERA (61.0IP, 45ER) against the Orioles...17 of the 29 runs allowed to the Tigers have come off the bullpen.

HARD KNOCK LIFE—Over their last 10 games (3-7), Rays hitters have an expected batting average of .266, while their opponents are at .225...they have had a higher xBA than the the opposition in five of the seven losses...they have 50 hard-hit outs in the last 10 games compared to 46 by opposing hitters...Jonathan Aranda, Junior Caminero, Yandy Diaz and Jake Mangum lead the team with seven hard-hit outs apiece in that span...seven Rays have an xBA higher than their actual batting average during the 10-game stretch, highlighted by Taylor Walls (120 AVG/.198 xBA - 78 pts.), Josh Lowe (.270 AVG/.336 xBA - 66 pts.) and Danny Jansen (.263 AVG/.325 xBA - 62 pts.).

ARANDA'S WORLD—Jonathan Aranda has collected an RBI in three straight games, going 6-for-13 (.462) with 1 2B, 1 HR and 4 RBI...he has tallied a hit in 11 of his last 14 road games, batting .345 (20-for-58) with 4 2B, 4 HR, 10 RBI and a 1.008 OPS...on the season, Aranda's .321 average ranks fourth in the majors behind NYY Aaron Judge (.360), ATH Jacob Wilson (.335) and HOU Jeremy Peña (.322)...the first-time All-Star is looking to become the fourth hitter in Rays history to enter the All-Star break with a .320 average or better (min. 250AB)...he would join Fred McGriff in 2001 (.330), Yandy Díaz in 2023 (.323) and Carl Crawford in 2010 (.321).

20-20 VISION—With 19 doubles and 21 homers, Junior Caminero needs one double to become the first player in franchise history to record 20 doubles and 20 homers before the All-Star break...only seven players in the majors have accomplished the feat so far this season, including four AL hitters: NYY Aaron Judge (21 2B, 34HR), DET Riley Greene (21/22), DET Spencer Torkelson (20/21) and LAA Taylor Ward (20/20)...since 1901, five have turned the trick at age 22 or younger: ATL Ozzie Albies in 20018 (29/20). WSH Bryce Harper in 2015 (21/26), LAA Mike Trout in 2014 (26/22), STL Albert Pujols in 2002 (25/21) and CIN Jonny Bench in 1970 (23/28).

TONIGHT'S START—Zack Littell will take the mound for his 18th start of the campaign and his second against the Tigers...it marks the 66th start of his career (221G) and his fifth (9G) against Detroit...the Rays have won nine of his last 13 starts...eight of his last 11 starts have been quality...has allowed three runs or fewer in 14 of his last 15 outings...is in his second season as a full-time starter after joining the Rays rotation in July 2023... claimed off waivers from the Red Sox on May 12, 2023.

LAST TIME OUT—Littell left with a no-decision on the Fourth of July after tossing 6.0 innings and allowing one run on four hits (1HR) and two walks with five strikeouts...marked his 12th quality start of the year...he scattered three hits and one walk through the first four frames without a run allowed...allowed a home run to Harrison Bader with one out in the 5th inning, and then retired the last five batters he faced...opposing hitters went 0-for-5 in at-bats ending with his slider and are 1-for-13 (.077) against the pitch in his last three starts.

Littell has gone 6.0 innings or more with two walks or fewer in 13 of

- He has gone 5.0 IP or more in 15 straight starts and 17 of his 18 this season...is 7-4 with a 2.88 ERA (93.2IP, 30ER) in his last 15 starts.

LIONS & TIGERS, OHMY—Littell holds a career 2-2 record against the Tigers with a 3.16 ERA (25.2IP, 9ER) in eight outings (4GS)...he has allowed three runs or fewer in three of his four starts, including his last outing against them at Steinbrenner Field on June 22 (5.0IP, 4H, R, 5SO, HBP)...his last start in Detroit came on Sept. 25, 2024, and he went 4.2 innings with three runs allowed on seven hits (1HR) and seven strikeouts...he has received a total of two runs or support in his last three starts against Detroit.

- In 44 appearances (16GS) against the AL Central, he is 9-6 with a 3.40 ERA (124.1IP, 47ER) and a .254 (119-for-469) opp. average...he has allowed three runs or fewer in nine of his last 10 outings and 38 of 44 overall.
- * As a starter against the division, he is 4-6 with 3.72 ERA (84.2IP, 35ER) with seven quality starts in 16 outings...this season, he is 1-0 with a 1.56 ERA (17.1IP, 3ER) and a .186 (11-for-59) opp. average.

<u>I'VE BEEN EVERYWHERE</u>—Today marks his 10th road start of the year, having gone 6.0 IP or more in eight of the previous nine...he is 5-3 with a 3.58 ERA (60.1IP, 24ER) and six quality starts away from Steinbrenner Field...Littell has allowed 13 home runs in his last six road starts (May 3-pres.), accounting for all 14 runs against him over that stretch.

BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN—After losing each of his first five starts, the Rays are 9-4 in his last 13, including an eight-start winning streak from April 27–June 11 that tied the fourth-longest in a pitcher's starts in franchise history...it also ties four other hurlers for the third-longest team winning streak in a pitcher's starts this season, trailing only HOU Framber Valdez (11GS, May 7–pres.) and SF Robbie Ray (9GS, March 30–May 13)...over the 13-start span, Littell is 7-2 with a 2.87 ERA (81.2IP, 26ER), producing a 1.00 WHIP with 55 strikeouts against eight walks.

**In his last 26 starts dating back to July 27, 2024, Littell is 12-10 with a 2.89 ERA (140 OID, 53EP), over that graph he rapids among AI.

In his last 26 starts dating back to July 27, 2024, Littell is 12-10 with a 2.98 ERA (160.0IP, 53ER)...over that span, he ranks among AL leaders (min. 100.0IP) in fewest pitches per IP (2nd, 14.4), walk rate (4th, 4.0%), WHIP (9th, 1.02), opp. on-base pct. (9th, .269) and GIDP per 9.0 IP (11th, 0.90).

HOMER (UN)HAPPY—Over his last seven starts, 11 of the 14 runs allowed by Littell have come via the 10 HR against him...across his last 12 starts since the beginning of May, 17 of the 24 runs (70.8%) against him have come on 16 HR...he has permitted 24 HR on the season, the most in the majors at the most before the All-Star break in franchise history, surpassing three pitchers with 20 HR: Jake Odorizzi (2017), Drew Smyly (2016) and Esteban Yan (2000)...he has allowed a homer in 13 of his 18 starts, and 28 of the 43 runs (65.3%) against him have come via the long ball.

Of the 24 HR he has allowed, 20 have been solo shots and four have come with one runner on base.

DIG DEEP—Opponents are batting .209 (27-for-129) against Littell with two outs compared to .264 (76-for-287) with one or zero outs...it marks the 12th-lowest two-out average among AL pitchers (min. 100AB)...opposing hitters are 13-for-63 (.206) against him with runners in scoring position but have gone 5-for-29 (.172) with RISP and two outs.

DON'T WALK THIS WAY—Since his Rays debut on May 16, 2023, Littell's 3.8 pct. walk rate ranks third in the majors (min. 1,000BF) behind SEA **George Kirby** (3.1%) and BAL **Zach Eflin** (3.6%)...he has issued one or zero walks in 50 of his 61 starts with the Rays and two walks or fewer in 58 of them...is one of two active pitchers with 50 or more career starts and have issused less walks as a starter than games started in their career (also: SEA **George Kirby**).

27 OUTS—The right-hander worked the 10th complete game in MLB this season on May 31 at HOU, the first by a Rays pitcher since **Ryan Yarbrough** on June 3, 2021 at NYY...before Yarbrough, the club's last CG belonged to **Matt Andriese** on May 14, 2016 vs. OAK...Littell ended the Rays run of 647 consecutive games without a CG, the second-longest streak in major league history, eclipsed only by Tampa Bay's own 731-game streak from May 15, 2016–June 2, 2021...of the 106 CG in team history, only three have come over the last 10 seasons since 2016 (103CG from 1998–2015)...Littell threw a career-high 117 pitches, most by a Ray since **Jake Odorizzi** (118) on May 27, 2017 at MIN and most by a Ray in a CG since **David Price** (118) on Sept. 30, 2013 at TEX.
