TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners open their final homestand of the regular season with the first of 3 games against the Houston Astros...Seattle will also host the Texas Rangers (4 G, Sept. 28-Oct. 1) on the homestand...the Mariners are coming off a 3-3 road trip at Oakland (3-0) and Texas (0-3)...tonight's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Aaron Goldsmith and Mike Blowers on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) and Mariners.com with Rick Rizzs and Dave Sims. ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped yesterday's game to the Rangers by a 8-9 score...the Mariners are 21-17 over their last 38 games, 29-19 over their last 48, 31-20 over their last 51, 34-21 over their last $55,37-23$ over their last 60 and 46-29 over their last 75 contests...the Mariners are 65-26 when scoring at least 4 runs and 19-45 when scoring 3-or-fewer...the Mariners are 41-33 at T-Mobile Park and 43-38 on the road this season...they are 28-27 in day games and 56-44 at night.

- Since July 1 - Seattle is 46-29 (.613) since July 1, 2nd-best record in the AL over that span and T-3rdbest in the Majors (also: Atlanta), trailing the Dodgers (.676/50-24) and Orioles (.645/49-27).
- The Power Generation - The Mariners have hit 203 home runs this season...Seattle has hit 200+ home runs in a season 8 times in franchise history: 1996-99, 2016-17, 2019 \& 2023.
- Silver Platter - The Seattle Mariners were named as one of 4 American League finalists for the first ever Silver Slugger Team Award...Seattle is joined by fellow nominees Houston, Texas and Tampa Bay.
- Men of Steal - José Caballero (26 SB) and Julio Rodríguez (36 SB) are one of 8 pairs of teammates to steal at least 25 stolen bases this season...Caballero's 26 SB are the 3rd-most by a rookie in Mariners history, trailing Ichiro Suzuki (56 in 2001) and James Jones (27 in 2014).
- The Right Stuff - The Mariners are 63-54 when facing a right-handed starting pitcher this season. POSTSEASON PICTURE...the Mariners have 7 regular season games remaining ( 3 vs . HOU, 4 vs . TEX)... Seattle enters play today 3.0 games back of the Texas Rangers for the AL West Division lead and a half-game back of the Houston Astros for the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot...the Astros have 6 games remaining (3 at SEA, 3 at ARI), the Rangers have 7 games remaining (3 at LAA, 4 at SEA) and Toronto has 6 games remaining (3 vs. NYY, 3 vs. TB).
ON THE MOUND ...the Mariners pitching staff ranks 2nd in MLB in ERA (3.76), 1 st in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.51), 2nd in walks-per-9 innings (2.57), T-2nd in WHIP (1.19), 2nd in FIP (3.88) and 3rd in fWAR (19.7) this season...Seattle's 16 shutouts thrown this season are a franchise record...the Mariners are the only team in the Majors to have 3 pitchers with 17+ quality starts this season...Luis Castillo (18), George Kirby (18) and Logan Gilbert (17) make up the trio...Seattle pitchers age 26-or-younger lead the Majors in fWAR (13.6) by a wide margin over next-closest Cleveland (9.2), Los Angeles-NL (9.2) and Miami (9.2).
THE J-ROD SHOW: AL MVP CANDIDATE?...Julio Rodríguez leads American Leaque outfielders in fWAR (6.1) by more than a full "win", ranking ahead of Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (5.0) and Aaron Judge-NYY (4.9)...among AL outfielders with at least 400 plate appearances, Julio ranks 1st in hits (179), 2nd in stolen bases (36), T-5th in batting average (.284), 4th in home runs (31), 2nd in runs scored (100), 3rd in RBI (100), 7th in slugging percentage (.495), T-6th in OPS (.839), 4th in OPS + (132), 2nd in doubles (37), 1st in total bases (313) and 2nd in extra-base hits (70)...in 2022, Julio won an AL Silver Slugger Award in his rookie season, alongside outfielders Aaron Judge-NYY and Mike Trout-LAA.
- 36, 36, 100 - Julio is the 4th player age 22-or-younger with $36+$ doubles, $36+$ stolen bases and $100+$ RBI in a season.... he joins Denny Lyons for the 1887 Philadelphia Athletics of the American Association, Joe Kelley for the 1894 Baltimore Orioles of the National League and Ty Cobb for the 1908 Detroit Tigers.
- Playing the Hits - J-Rod currently leads the AL in hits, with 179 and ranks 2nd in total bases (313) trailing Shohei Ohtani-LAA ( 325 TB) for the league lead...he could be the youngest player to lead his league in hits AND total bases since Hank Aaron for the 1956 Milwaukee Braves...if he finishes with the league lead in hits, he will become just the 3rd player in franchise history to lead the AL in hits, joining Alex Rodriguez (1998) and Ichiro Suzuki (7x, 2001, 2004, 2006-10) and just the 9th player age 22-or-younger to lead the AL in hits.
CRAWFORD'S CAREER YEAR...J.P. Crawford this season has set career-highs in home runs (17) and RBI (58) and is on pace to set additional highs in on-base percentage (.378), slugging (.432) and OPS (.810)...J.P. ranks 4th in the American League in walks (88), 4th in OBP, T-6th in wRC+ (132) and T-11th in fWAR (4.5)...his 17 home runs are the 6th-most in franchise history by a shortstop, trailing 5 different seasons by Alex Rodriguez (1996-2000).
GOLDFINGERS...Julio Rodríguez's 12 Outs Above Average rank T-2nd among American League outfielders with Kevin Kiermaier-TOR, trailing only Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (13)...Eugenio Suárez' 10 OAA rank 2nd among AL third basemen, trailing only Maikel Garcia-KC (12)...Cal Raleigh's 22 catcher caught stealings rank 2nd among AL catchers, trailing only Shea Langeliers-OAK (23).
IF YOU SMELL WHAT LA PIEDRA IS COOKING...Luis Castillo has been one of the best pitchers in the American League this season...Castillo is 14-7 with a 3.06 ERA ( 64 ER, 188.1 IP) with 50 walks and 207 strikeouts in 31 starts...the righty has gone $5.0+$ innings in all 31 of his outings...Castillo has gone $6.0+$ innings in 22 of them, recording 18 quality starts...he is the 8th Mariners pitcher (and 3rd right-hander) to tally 200+ strikeouts in a season in franchise history...among AL pitchers this season, Castillo ranks in the top- 5 in ERA (4th), wins (T-4th), strikeouts (T-4th), opponent batting average (1st, .211) and WHIP (3rd, 1.05). SEPTELENIC RETURNS...Jarred Kelenic went 1 -for- 4 with 1 run scored, 2 RBI and 1 stolen base in yesterday's game...in the 3 -game set in Texas, Kelenic went 2 -for- 5 with 6 walks, reaching safely in each of his first 7 trips to the plate...in 9 games this September, Kelenic is batting .286 ( $8 \times 28$ ) with 1 run, 1 double, $4 \mathrm{RBI}, 8$ walks and 1 stolen base, getting on base at a .444 clip...in 52 career games in September, Kelenic is batting .235 ( $43 \times 183$ ) with 28 runs, 10 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 29 RBI and 4 stolen bases, getting on base at a .340 clip, slugging .465 (. 804 OPS).

- The 30 -year-old right-hander is set to make his 32 nd start of the season, 3rd against the Astros...he is also making his 180th Major League start and 4th career start against Houston.
- Has been named an All-Star in 2019, 2022 and 2023.
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on 12/23/11.
- Made MLB debut on $6 / 23 / 17$ vs. Washington (w/ Cincinnati)
- Signed a 5 -year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
LAST TIME OUT...W\#14 in last start on 9/19 at OAK...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed 2 runs on 3 hits and 3 walks with 8 strikeouts.

FAMILIAR FOES...in 10 games started against an AL West opponent this season Castillo owns a 3.16 ERA (22 ER, 62.2 IP) with 14 walks and 69 strikeouts... he has faced each AL West team at least once this season and will make his 3rd start against the Astros this season tonight...the rest of Castillo's starts this season will also come against division rivals.
OFF TO A GOOD START....his 268 strikeouts through his first 40 Mariners starts are the most in Mariners history through a pitchers first 40 starts...he ranks ahead of Félix Hernández (233).
INNINGS EATER...has made 10 starts this season where he has pitched at least 7.0 innings...his 10 starts of $7.0+$ innings pitched are the most in a season in his career...he currently is tied for the 6th most $7.0+$ innings pitched games in the majors this season and has the 2nd most on the Mariners....he ranks behind George Kirby (11).
HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR ...was named to his third All-Star team on July 2 (also: 2019, 2022)...he was joined by teammates George Kirby and Julio Rodríguez.
MAKING THEM EARN IT ... has allowed 64 earned runs through 31 starts this season which is the 4 th fewest in the Major Leagues (min. 31 GS)... his 3.06 ERA ( $64 \mathrm{ER}, 188.1$ IP) ranks 5th in the Major Leagues among qualified pitchers....he currently ranks behind Justin Steele-CHC (3.00).
KEEPING THE BASES CLEAN...has allowed 208 runners to reach base safely through 31 starts this season which is the 2nd fewest in the Major Leagues (min. 31 GS) behind Spencer Strider-ATL (207)...he also ranks among Major League leaders ( min .100 .0 IP ) in opponents average ( 9 th, $.211 / 147 \times 697$ ) and WHIP ( 4 th, 1.046).

SEASON-HIGH PUNCHIES...set a new season-high in strikeouts with 11 against the Twins on July 19....this marked the 3rd time this season and the 18th time in Castillo's career that he has recorded $10+$ strikeouts in a game (last: $6 / 6$ vs. LAA)...his career-high in strikeouts in a single game is 13 which he achieved on $8 / 5 / 19$ vs. LAA.

1,000 AND COUNTING...recorded his 1,000th career strikeout in his outing on $5 / 22$ against Oakland after striking out Shea Langeliers to begin the 5th inning...Castillo finished the night with 8 strikeouts.
DOMINATE THE ZONE....recorded 32 strikeouts in August which is just 7 away from matching his career high for the month...his career-high in strikeouts in a single month is 50 which he achieved in March/April 2019...Castillo has now recorded his career where he has recorded $30+$ strikeouts in each month he has pitched in a season (also: 2019).
KEEPING THEM IN THE YARD...gave up his first home run of the season on $4 / 28$, breaking a 5 -game span of allowing no home runs...this was his longest span of games to start a season without giving up a home run in his career.
NEARLY PERFECT...carried a perfect game into the 7th inning in his start against Colorado on $4 / 16$...earned his second win of the season after pitching 7.0 scoreless innings and allowing only 2 hits while striking out 9 batters...the last Mariners pitcher to throw a perfect game was Félix Hernández on 8/15/12.
HOT START...did not allow a run in either of his first 2 starts to begin the season, becoming just the third Mariners pitcher to do that, joining Félix Hernández (2007) and James Paxton (2017).
PREVIOUSLY ON OPENING DAY ...became just the 3rd Mariners starter to hold the opponent scoreless in an Opening Day start, joining Félix Hernández (2007, 2013 \& 2018) and Randy Johnson (1995)... he is the first player in franchise history to to his game score of 76 was the highest of any Opening Day starter this season.
