# COLORADO ROCKIES (8-25) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (15-19) May 5, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 1:35 EDT - GAME \#35/HOME \#15 RHP RYAN FELTNER ( $1-2,5.13$ ERA) vs. LHP BAILEY FALTER (2-2, 4.22 ERA) 

THE PIRATES:...snapped their five-game losing streak with yesterday's 1-0 walkoff win...Have been charged with two errors in their last nine games... Have gone 4-0 in extra innings this season, which is tied for the most second-wins in extra frames in MLB (Cleveland leads with five)...It is Pittsburgh's longest win streak in extra-innings games to begin a season since 2012 (also 4-0)...The last start to a season with a longer streak was 1960 (7-0).

KEEP THE FAITH: The Pirates won in walkoff fashion for the third time this season yesterday with Jack Suwinski's pinch-hit, runscoring single in the ninth inning (it was Pittsburgh's first walkoff win against the Rockies since July 19, 2014)...The Pirates have played in a total of 10 games this season decided in the last at-bat (the Bucs are 6-4 in those games), which are tied for the secondmost in all of MLB along with the Cubs and Mets...The Tigers have played in 14 games decided in the last at-bat.

BAILEY AT THE BEST BALLPARK IN AMERICA: Bailey Falter gets the start this afternoon in the finale of this weekend series against the Rockies...Falter is making his third start of the season here at PNC Park...He is $1-0$ with an 0.69 ERA (13.0ip/1er) in first two starts here (his only run allowed came in his final batter faced here on April 23 when Milwaukee's Gary Sanchez took him deep leading off the eighth inning).

HERE'S THE PITCH: Yesterday was Pittsburgh's fourth shutout against the Rockies at PNC Park in 11 games dating back to the 2021 season...Pittsburgh's other three shutouts in that time came in a doubleheader on May 29, 2021, and last year on May 8 when Mitch Keller scattered four hits while tossing a complete game...The Pirates have now recorded a 1.97 home ERA ( $96.0 \mathrm{ip} / 21 \mathrm{er}$ ) in those 11 games against the Rockies since the beginning of the 2021 season.

CATCH THIS: Yasmani Grandal became the 32nd different player to appear in a game this season for the Pirates after making his debut on Saturday...Grandal also became the fourth different catcher the Pirates have used this season along with Jason Delay, Joey Bart and Henry Davis...That's the most different catchers to appear in a game in all of MLB.

DEALING LIKE DeLEON: Yesterday was Jared Jones' second career 10-plus strikeout game, joining his Major League debut on March 30 at Miami...Jones joined Jose DeLeon as the only two pitchers in Pirates history to record multiple double-digit strikeout games within his first seven career games (DeLeon did so in his third and seventh game).

KNOW WHEN TO HOLDERMAN: Colin Holderman threw a total of nine pitches (six strikes) on Saturday while extending his scoreless streak to 8.0 innings...Since allowing two runs in his season debut on April 11 , Holderman has tossed 8.0 scoreless innings while allowing just four hits in 28 at-bats ( .143 average).

A GRAND ENTRANCE: Keiner Delgado hit a grand slam in his organizational debut on Saturday in the first game of the season for the Florida Complex League Pirates...The Pirates acquired Delgado on Tuesday from the New York Yankees as the player to be named from the March 29 trade of pitcher JT Brubaker...The 20-year-old Delgado was rated as the 20th-best Yankees prospect by MLB Pipeline at the time he was acquired by the Pirates.

THE RENEGADE: David Bednar has converted each of his last four save opportunities and comes into today with 66 as a member of the Pirates...Bednar's next save will tie him with Matt Capps for the eighth-most in team history.

ON DECK: Pittsburgh's nine-game homestand continues tomorrow night with the beginning of a three-game series against the Angels...lt's just the third time the Pirates will host the Angels at PNC Park along with 2004 and 2016.

WINNING STARTS HERE: Pittsburgh's starting rotation has recorded a 3.18 ERA (45.1ip/16er) in
the last eight games...Pittsburgh's starting rotation comes into today with the fourth-best ERA (3.58) among all National League teams behind the Phillies (2.60), Cubs (3.24) and Dodgers (3.38).

CLOSING IN ON OROSCO: Aroldis Chapman comes into today with 1166 career strikeouts, which are just three shy of tying Jesse Orosco for the secondmost all-time among left-handed relievers (Billy Wagner leads with 1196)... Chapman's 1166 career punchouts are also the 10th-most overall among relief pitchers (Hoyt Wilhelm has the most with 1363).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY
May 5, 1992: The Pirates upped their record to $18-7$ on the season after beating the Reds $5-2$ at Three Rivers Stadium. Pittsburgh took the
lead for good in the sixth inning thanks to a run-scoring single by Gary Varsho. Stan Belinda sealed the win with his sixth save of the season
while Paul Miller earned the win in relief of starter Vicente Palacios.
