METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets returned to action last night and defeated the Nationals, 8-0, at Citi Field...The team earned their third win in a series opener and their first since April 7 vs. Arizona...They had lost each of their last five series openers...It is just the fifth time they have scored at least eight runs this season and they improved to 5-0 in those games...Recorded their second shutout of the season and their first since April 4 at San Francisco...The Mets are in the midst of a 10-day, nine-game homestand (3-4) against the Twins (2-1), Rockies (0-3) and Nationals (1-0)...Following this homestand, the Mets head West to face the Angels (three games), Diamondbacks (three games) and Rockies (three games).

ROSTER MOVE: OF Tommy Pham was outrighted to Triple-A and elected free agency in lieu of accepting the assignment.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY GARE: Today, we celebrate the birthday of Mets Hall of Fame broadcaster Gary Cohen...The Queens, NY native is in his 38th season as a New York Mets Play-by-Play announcer and 21st season as the television voice of the Mets on SNY.

HERE'S THE PITCH: Despite being 3-6 over their last nine games, the Mets have surrendered three or fewer runs in eight of those games... Overall, their staff has pitched to a 3.87 ERA (112 ER/260.1 IP) this season which is the sixth-best mark in the NL.

RE-PETE: David Peterson made two appearances in relief, hurling 7.0 innings and allowing only one run on seven hits with one walk and three strikeouts...He is 0-1 with a 3.95 ERA (6 ER/13.2 IP), five walks and 11 strikeouts in three games (two starts) at home...Peterson has appeared in 14 games (11 starts) against the Nationals and is 7-1 with a 2.48 ERA (20 ER/72.2 IP), 20 walks and 52 strikeouts.

BO KNOWS: Last night, Bo Bichette hit a lead-off home run on the first pitch of the game to put the Mets in front 1-0...It was the first lead-off home run by a Met on the first pitch of the game since Brandon Nimmo did so on June 17, 2023 vs. St. Louis...It was his seventh career lead-off home run and his first since June 21, 2025 vs. Chicago-AL...He has recorded a hit in six of his last seven games and he is hitting .308 (8-26) during that span.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets start divisional action this series...The team is 1-0 against the East in 2026...Last year, the Mets went 25-27 against the NL East division...They posted a 4.35 ERA, while slashing .266/.338/.452...This compared to a 30-22 record against the division in 2024.

COMING OFF THE BENGE: Last night, Carson Benge plated two with a single in the fourth inning to extend the Mets lead to 5-0...It marks his first career game with multiple RBI...He has recorded multiple hits in consecutive games and in three of his last five games...Over that span he is batting .438 (7-16).

MY OH MYERS: Tobias Myers added 2.0 scoreless innings yesterday, allowing one walk and striking out two...He is now 0-1 with a 2.33 ERA (5 ER/19.2 IP), three walks and 16 strikeouts in nine games this year...He has not allowed an earned run over his last three appearances, tossing 6.1 scoreless innings and allowing three hits, two walks and seven strikeouts.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets are in the midst of their third homestand of the season...The team is 6-10 in New York this year...The team has posted a 4.01 ERA (66 ER/148.0 IP) at Citi Field in 2026...They are hitting .221/.288/.330 at Citi Field.

NATIONALS-METS NOTES: The Mets have gone 19-8 against the Nationals since 2024...New York has won 15 of their last 18 games against Washington at Citi Field.

SAY IT IS SOTO: Juan Soto blasted a two-run homer to left field in the fourth inning last night...He recorded his first extra-base hit since returning from the Injured List on April 22...He has reached base in each of his first 14 games of the season, which is his longest streak to begin a season...He is slashing .300/.407/.460 (15-50) through 14 games this season.

DOWN ON THE FARM: A.J. Ewing appeared in his first game at Triple-A last night...He went 3-4 with two runs, a double, a triple, two RBI and a walk in the team's 10-4 victory...Ewing is ranked as the third-best prospect in the Mets system according to MLB Pipeline.com...He was selected in the fourth round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of Springboro High School in Ohio.

WE REMEMBER: The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship... From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets returned to action today and defeated the Braves, 10-5 at Fulton County Stadium...Ron Darling got the nod and allowed five runs on five hits with four walks and two strikeouts...Bruce Berenyi, Terry Leach and Roger McDowell hurled 5.1 scoreless innings in the victory...Wally Backman recorded four hits in the win, while Keith Hernandez collected three of his own including two doubles...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at Mets.com/1986.

LAST TIME OUT: Tossed 3.1 innings and allowed one earned run in his second relief appearance of the season...He has allowed one earned run over 7.0 innings in relief this season...Over 18 career appearances as a reliever he has posted a 2.40 ERA (9 ER/33.2 IP)...Peterson's last start came on April 13, 2026, at Los Angeles-NL where he allowed four runs on 5.0 innings pitched with seven strikeouts against four walks.

VS. WASHINGTON/NL EAST: Peterson has made 14 appearances with 11 starts against Washington, recording two runs or fewer in 11 of those games...Holds a 2.48 ERA (20 ER/72.2 IP) and a 6.44 SO/9.0 IP...Peterson made 10 appearances, all starts, against the Division last season, posting a 5.20 ERA (32 ER/55.1 IP)...The Mets were 4-6 last year when Peterson started against a National League team.

IN THE CITI: Dating back to last season, Peterson has recorded six starts where he's completed at least 5.0 innings and allowed one or zero runs...He has allowed one or fewer earned runs in seven of his last 17 starts at Citi Field.

SPRING TRAINING: In three Spring outings (three starts), Peterson recorded a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/13.0 IP) with nine strikeouts...Held Spring batters to a .235 (12-51) average...Last pitched on March 22 at Miami, tossing a spring-high 5.0 innings (1R, 5H, 1BB, 4K).

2025 YEAR IN REVIEW: Over a career-high 30 starts in 2025, he went 9-6 with a 4.22 ERA (79 ER/168.2 IP), 65 walks and a career-high 150 strikeouts...He allowed three earned runs or less in 22 of his 30 starts this season and one or zero earned runs in 10 starts...He picked up at least eight strikeouts in five of his 30 starts this season...Allowed four or more earned runs in eight of his last 16 starts after not allowing more than three earned runs through his first 14 starts of the season...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, finished third in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.59), tied for fourth in opponent GIDP (20) and sixth in groundball percentage (54.7).

GOING THE DISTANCE: Completed at least 7.0+ innings in six of his 30 starts last season...Mets starters completed 7.0 innings 10 times in 2025, six of those starts came from Peterson...Him and Nolan McLean were the only Mets pitchers to complete 8.0 innings this season...His two 8.0+ innings pitched starts were the most by a Mets southpaw in a single season since Jon Niese (2014)...He completed pitched 5.0 or more in 24 of his 30 starts this season, and 6.0+ innings in 16 of those starts...His 24 such starts were the most on the team and his 16 such starts of 6.0 or more innings were the most on the team...He became one of 13 left-handed starters this season to record at least 16 starts with 6.0+ innings pitched...He joined Sean Manaea (16 in 2024) as the only Mets lefties to record as many 6.0+ IP starts since Steven Matz (16 in 2016 and 2019)...Peterson's 24 starts of 5.0+ innings pitched, his 16 starts of 6.0+ innings pitched, six starts of 7.0+ innings pitched and two 8.0+ innings pitched are all his most in a single season.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR: On July 10, 2025, Peterson was named to his first career All-Star Game after posting a first-half career-best 3.06 ERA and 93 strikeouts (previous: 3.09 ERA in 2024 and 84 K in 2022)...He became the first Mets starting pitcher to be named an All-Star since Kodai Senga in 2023 and is the first left-handed Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Johan Santana (2009)...He threw 1.0 scoreless inning in the Midsummer Classic on July 15, becoming the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom in 2019 and the first left-handed Mets pitcher to do so since Tom Glavine in 2004.

LEFTY LEADERBOARD: His 614 strikeouts are the seventh-most by a left-hander in franchise history...Tug McGraw is next on the list with 618 K...His 115 career starts are the eighth-most in franchise history by a southpaw...Vs. left-handers this season, he posted a .228/.275/.289 slash line (34-149) and allowed just one home run to 161 lefty batters faced...Among qualified left-handed pitchers facing left-handed batters this season, he finished fifth in groundball percentage (63.7), tied for fifth in strikeouts (48), seventh in opponents' SLG (.289), 10th in OPS (.564) and 13th in opponents' OBP...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

QUALITY CONTROL: Recorded 15 quality starts in 30 total outings last season, including 12 of his last 23 starts...Recorded five straight quality starts from July 3 - August 1, which was tied for the longest such streak in his career (also: 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson recorded 27 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 25 of them coming in his last 46 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to the end of this season, he was one of 12 pitchers (one of five in the NL) to record at least 25 quality starts and one of five left-handers to do so (also: Tarik Skubal, Framber Valdez, Max Fried and Cristopher Sánchez).

APPLE PICKING: Last season, Peterson recorded a net bases prevented of eight (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which was tied for the second-best in the majors with six others, trailing Matthew Boyd and Max Fried...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 33 net bases prevented is the most among qualified Major League pitchers...Max Fried is next on the list at 23...Peterson has recorded 18 career pickoffs (three this season), which is tied with Sid Fernandez for the seventh-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20)...According to *OPTA*.

CAREER NOTES: Set new career highs in strikeouts, innings pitched and starts last season...Had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from June 5-17...He threw at least 5.0 innings in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career...Over parts of seven Major League seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 37-33 with a 4.16 ERA (300 ER/649.1 IP), 273 walks and 638 strikeouts in 137 games (119 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.

- Fired 2.0 innings of relief on April 26 vs. Colorado (G1) (2.0 IP, 2 H, ER, K, BB)...Marked his second multi-inning relief outing of the season.

- Since joining the Mets in 2024, he has made 40 appearances (two starts) at Citi Field...In those contests, he is 3-1 with eight holds, a 3.19 ERA (17 ER/48.0 IP) and 40 strikeouts.
- Entered in the eighth inning with the bases loaded and surrendered a grand slam on April 23 vs. Minnesota (0.2 IP, H, ER).
- Threw 1.1 scoreless innings in relief on April 21 vs. Minnesota (1.1 IP, 2 K)...Since the start of last year, he has recorded four or more outs without allowing an earned run in 18 relief appearances, which is tied for the sixth-most appearances among NL relievers.
- Fired 2.2 scoreless innings in relief on April 11 vs. the Athletics (2.2 IP, 2 H, 3 K)...Marked his ninth scoreless relief appearance of at least 2.0 innings since the beginning of last season...Is tied for the eighth-most such games among NL relievers during that span.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Appeared in three Grapefruit League games and he threw 3.0 scoreless innings...He struck out five of the 11 batters he faced during the spring.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.
