RAYS REPORT—The Rays continue their final homestand of 2025 tonight at Steinbrenner Field, a seven-game stretch against the Blue Jays (2-2) and Red Sox (0-1, two to play)...are 2-4 in their last six games and 4-10 in their last 14 on the heels of a season-high seven-game winning streak (Aug. 29–Sept. 4)...are 11-10 during a stretch of 23 games in 24 days from Aug. 29–Sept. 21...have gone 7-15-1 over their last 23 series since a 16-8-2 start...are fourth in the AL East for the 71st consecutive day dating back to July 11, 14-0 GB the first-place Blue Jays...have a 2.0-game lead over the fifth-place Orioles with eight games to play...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 101 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ✦ The Rays committed a season-high-tying three errors (also: June 13 at NYM) and yielded seven runs in the 8th inning of last night's 11-7 loss, officially eliminating them from postseason contention...it was their fourth time this season permitting sevens runs or more in an inning, first since the 8th frame on June 27 at BAL (7R).
- ✦ It marked the 40th time this season the Rays have scored seven runs or more in a game, tied with the Blue Jays for third most in the AL behind the Yankees (49G) and Tigers (44G) and tied for seventh most in a season in team history.
- ✦ The Rays need to win one of the next two games for their ninth consecutive winning season at home (2017–pres.)...entering the year, only the Yankees (33), Dodgers (19) and Brewers (9) had longer active streaks than the Rays current eight-season run.
- ✦ Tampa Bay leads the majors with a 3.07 ERA (231.2IP, 79ER) over its last 26 games since Aug. 22...the staff paces the AL in strikeout rate since the All-Star break (25.9%).
- ✦ Last night marked the Rays fourth straight loss when opposed by a left-handed starting pitcher...they are 6-15 in their last 21 games vs. southpaws.
- ✦ The Rays need to win the next two games to avoid a series loss, which would drop them to 0-4-1 in their last five sets, matching June 27–July 12 (0-5-0) for their longest streak of winless series this season.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays recalled **RHP Jesse Scholtens** from Triple-A Durham and optioned **RHP Cole Wilcox** to Durham...Scholtens, 31, was claimed off waivers from the White Sox on Aug. 4...his Rays debut will mark his first major league appearance since Sept. 20, 2023 at WSH with Chicago.

- ✦ Yesterday, Wilcox became the 10th Ray to make his MLB debut this season, tied with 2023, 2003 and 2002 for second most in team history behind 2018 (12)...among AL clubs, only the Athletics (15), Astros (11) and White Sox (11) have more debuts.

THUNDER AND LIGHTNING—With 3 HR last night, the Rays (176HR/186SB) became the eighth team in MLB history with 175 HR and 175 SB and the first since the 2024 Brewers (177/217)...the Rays have accomplished the feat once previously, in 2009 (199/194)...other teams to turn the trick include the 2023 Reds (199/190), 2016 Brewers (194/181), 2007 Mets (177/200), 1998 Blue Jays (221/184) and 1996 Rockies (221/201)...with a major league-leading 186 SB, the Rays are 8 SB shy of matching the 2009 team's franchise-record 194 SB.

- ✦ Last night, **Everson Pereira** became the seventh Rays leadoff hitter (8x) to record a grand slam, first since **Yandy Diaz** on May 13, 2023 at NYY...he is also the fifth Ray to tally a grand slam for one of his first two career home runs, joining **Oleivis Basabe** (Aug. 22, 2023 vs. COL), **Wil Myers** (June 22, 2013 at NYY), **Jorge Velazquez** (Sept. 25, 2007 vs. NYY) and **Terrell Lowery** (Aug. 18, 1999 at DET).
- ✦ Pereira's grand slam was the sixth by a Ray this season, third most in the AL behind the Yankees (8) and Mariners (7) and tied with 2023 and 2007 for third most in franchise history behind the 2021 (9) and 2010 (7) seasons.
- ✦ **Carson Williams** is the third Rays rookie over the last six seasons (2020-25) to homer in back-to-back games, joining **Junior Caminero** (Aug. 23-24, 2024) and **Randy Arozarena** (6x, last: Aug. 2-3, 2021)...his 5 HR tie **Mike Brosseau** (2019) and **Nathaniel Lowe** (2019) for the most in franchise history through a player's first 25 career games.
- ✦ Williams' 5 HR as a shortstop since his Aug. 22 debut are tied for third most in the AL behind **CWS Colson Montgomery** (8HR) and **BOS Trevor Story** (6HR).

THE GREAT YANDINO—**Yandy Diaz** has gone 10-for-16 (.625) with 2 2B, 1 HR, 3 RBI, 7 BB, 1 SO and four multi-hit efforts over his last five games—the 17 times reaching base (H, BB or HBP) are tied for the most over any five-game span in Rays history (6x), a feat previously accomplished by Diaz (2022), **Austin Meadows** (2019), **Evan Longoria** (2x in 2011) and **Carl Crawford** (2007)...he recorded his 52nd multi-hit game of the season last night, tying **JOR Bo Bichette** and **SEA Julio Rodriguez** for the MLB lead and one shy of his career high from 2023 (53C)...Diaz has tallied a hit in 17 of his last 22 games dating back to Aug. 25, batting .427/.510/.659 (35-for-82) with 7 2B, 4 HR, 9 RBI, 14 BB, 1 SO, 16 R and a 1.167 OPS...over that timeframe, he leads MLB in batting average, paces the AL in hits and is second in the AL in both on base pct and OPS to NYY **Aaron Judge** (.510/.510/.740).

- ✦ He is one double away from joining **Ben Zobrist** (2011-14) as the only players in Rays history with four straight 30-double seasons...his next double will also tie **Aubrey Huff** (172 2B) for the fifth-most two-baggers in Rays history.
- ✦ Diaz's next game will be his career-high-tying 145th, matching 2024...he is also three hits and two extra-base hits from tying his career bests from 2023 (173H/57XBH).
- ✦ In yesterday's loss, he tallied his 273rd and 274th XBH with the Rays, surpassing **Kevin Kiermaier** (273) for eighth in club history...it was his 44th multi-XBH game as a Ray, tying **B.J. Upton** for fourth most by a Tampa Bay batter behind Longoria (95G), Zobrist (60G) and **Carl Crawford** (55G)...he also hit his 100th career homer and 99th with Tampa Bay, tying **Fred McGriff** for eighth on the Rays all-time list.
- ✦ Diaz has reached base safely in nine straight games and has drawn a walk in each of his last six, one shy of the longest streak in his career (7G, July 24-31, 2020).

CATCH HIM IF YOU CHAN—**Chandler Simpson** has back-to-back three-hit games and is 15-for-30 (.500) with 3 2B, 3 RBI, 2 BB, 6 R, 3 SB and a 1.131 OPS over his last eight games since Sept. 11, leading the majors in batting average over that span while tying ATL **Matt Olson** for the most hits...Simpson is second in MLB with 42 SB despite appearing in only 103 of the Rays 154 games...over 162 games, his current pace equates to a 66-SB campaign...the 42 SB are tied for 10th most in a season in franchise history—he is 3 SB shy of joining **Carl Crawford** (6x, last: 47SB in 2010) as the only Rays with a 45-SB season.

THE CAMINER-SHOW—With eight games to play, **Junior Caminero** (44HR) is 2 HR shy of tying **Carlos Peña**'s franchise-record 46-HR campaign in 2007...has 17 HR in 42 games since Aug. 1, tying NYM **Juan Soto** for the MLB lead in that span...his 108 RBI are the most by a Ray since **Evan Longoria** (113RBI) in 2009 and are fourth most in Rays history (see table to the right)...his 72 XBH match **Ben Zobrist** (2011) for seventh most in a season in team history, one shy of Longoria in 2010 (73XBH) for sixth and two shy of Longoria in 2013 (74XBH) for fifth.

- ✦ Caminero is two doubles shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with a 30-double, 40-homer season.
- ✦ He has tallied 22 HR at Steinbrenner Field, tied with **Brad Miller** (2016) for the second-most long balls at home in franchise history behind Peña (23HR) in 2007.

BASH BROTHERS—With 29 HR, **Brandon Lowe** is one long ball shy of becoming the second Ray to reach 30 HR along with **Junior Caminero** (44HR)...they would become the sixth set of Rays teammates to both hit 30 HR in a season, first since Lowe (39HR) and **Mike Zunino** (33HR) in 2021...Lowe would also become the fourth active second baseman with multiple 30-HR seasons, joining ATL **Ozzie Albies** (2), HOU **Jose Altuve** (2) and AZ **Ketel Marte** (2), and would join **Evan Longoria** (4) and **Carlos Peña** (3) as the only players in franchise history with multiple 30-HR campaigns.

SOX AT THE STEIN—The Rays have lost nine of their last 10 games against the Red Sox, including an active seven-game losing streak, tied for their third longest vs. Boston behind streaks of 11 (April 6–June 26, 2001) and 10 games (Oct. 3, 2001–July 23 [G1], 2002)...four of seven losses during the current streak have come by one run...the Rays, who have already clinched their first season series loss to the Sox since 2018 to end a six-season unbeaten run, are 9-15 against Boston since the start of 2024 (3-7 at home)...they have lost three straight series to the Sox since their last series win from Sept. 27–29, 2024 at Fenway Park...their longest skid since dropping five in a row from Aug. 8, 2017–April 8, 2018.

- ✦ Tonight marks the sixth of 13 straight games vs. AL East clubs to conclude the season...the Rays are 2-8 in their last 10 intra-division games and 5-14 in their last 19.
- ✦ **Yandy Diaz** has reached base safely in 12 straight starts against Boston, batting .362 (17-for-47) with 1 2B, 3 HR, 7 RBI, 7 BB, 10 R and a .444 on-base pct. in those games.
- ✦ Min. 250 PA, **Brandon Lowe**'s .995 OPS vs. the Sox in his career leads active players.
- ✦ **Jake Mangum** is 17-for-37 (.459) in 11 games against the Red Sox this season.

TONIGHT’S START—Adrian Houser will toe the rubber for his 20th start of the season, ninth as a member of the Rays...marks his 124th career start (172G), but has never faced Boston in his career...the ninth-year veteran was acquired from the White Sox on July 31 for INF Curtis Mead, RHP Duncan Davitt and RHP Ben Peoples.

LAST TIME OUT—Houser took a no-decision after going 6.0 innings on Sept. 14 at CHC...he allowed two runs on seven hits, one walk and one home run with two strikeouts...he allowed a run in the 1st inning after a double-single sequence to open the game...after a single to open the 2nd inning, he retired the next six batters he faced...he worked out of a bases loaded situation in the 4th inning without allowing a run...he was tagged for a solo home run by Ian Happ in the 6th inning before his exit at the end of the inning.

- ★ The Rays have won five of his last six starts, with Houser turning in a 3.74 ERA (33.2IP, 14ER) in those games...in his first two starts with the Rays, he was 0-2 with a 7.59 ERA (10.2IP, 9ER).
- ★ Since June 22, his teams are 11-3 when he starts...he is one of six pitchers in MLB this season to have his team win multiple five start winning streaks, joining HOU Hunter Brown, LAD Clayton Kershaw, ATH Jacob Lopez, SF Robbie Ray and DET Tarik Skubal).

THE GREAT GREEN JEWEL OF THE COMMONWEALTH—Houser is yet to face Boston in his nine-year career...throughout his career, he has made 10 appearances, eight starts, against AL East opposition and has gone 1-4 with a 4.63 ERA (46.2IP, 24ER) and one save in one opportunity... as a starting pitcher, he has allowed three runs or fewer in five of the eight starts including all three in 2025...this season, he is 1-1 with a 2.75 ERA (19.2IP, 6ER) and three quality starts.

- ★ He has gone 7.0 innings or more in each of his last two home starts against AL opponents (July 9 vs. TOR & Sept. 3 vs. SEA)... he has allowed four runs or fewer in each of his last seven home appearances against the AL (April 4, 2024–pres.).

HOME IS WHERE THE HOUSER IS—In seven home starts in 2025, Houser is 7-0 with a 2.54 ERA (46.0IP, 13ER) and a .213 (34-for-160) opp. average... as a member of the Rays, he is 2-0 with a 5.40 ERA (13.1IP, 8ER) and a .204 (10-for-49) opp. average in a pair of starts at Steinbrenner Field...he is the first pitcher to go 6.0 innings or more and earn the win in each of his first seven road starts since Adam Wainwright (April 12–July 17, 2010)... making it eight straight starts tonight would make him the 27th pitcher in major league history to do so and the second since 1975.

- ★ With a win tonight, Houser would become the second pitcher in major league history to pitch in six or more games at home in a season and earn a winning decision in each, joining SF Billy Pierce (12-0, 12G) in 1962.

MIX IT UP—In 11 starts with the White Sox, Houser threw his changeup at a 10.5 pct. clip, allowing opponents to bat .293 (12-for-41) against the pitch...in six starts with the Rays, they are 4-for-30 (.133) off Houser’s changeup, and he has increased his usage rate by 4.9 pct. to 15.4 pct. he has relied on his sinker/slider combination 68.3 pct. of the time with the Rays, but opponents are 41-for-125 (.328) against those pitches...with Chicago, he threw those offerings 38.1 pct. of the time, and opposing hitters went 38-for-149 (.255) against them.

DEEP CUTS—Despite allowing home runs in seven of his last nine starts, Houser has only allowed nine long balls in 19 starts this season...min. 100.0 IP, his 0.72 HR per 9.0 IP ranks seventh in the AL, trailing BAL Trevor Rogers (0.25), KC Kris Bubic (0.46), LAA Jose Soriano (0.64), HOU Framber Valdez (0.65), NYY Max Fried (0.67) and TEX Nathan Eovaldi (0.69) ranks 11th in the majors.

- ★ Houser went five straight starts without a long ball from June 22–July 19, the fourth-longest stretch of his career...he has allowed multiple home runs just once since the beginning of 2024 (July 14, 2024 vs. COL) and 12 times in 171 career appearances.

STRIKE 1, 2 AND 3—Houser set his season high in strikeouts in consecutive starts on Sept. 3 vs. SEA (8SO) and Sept. 9 at CWS (9SO)...these are the most strikeouts he has had in a game since he tied his career high on July 22, 2023 vs. ATL (10SO)...the right-hander has tallied 49 strikes or more in each of his last 25 starts dating back to April 9, 2024...that is the sixth longest streak by current AL pitchers.

BUCKLE DOWN—Houser has held opponents to a .207 (19-for-92) clip with runners in scoring position, the 10th-lowest average in the AL (min. 90AB with RISP)...this includes a 5-for-27 (.185) clip across his seven home starts...opposing hitters are 5-for-22 (.227) with 8 SO with RISP over his last six starts overall.

BETTER THAN EVER—This season marks his first pitching in the AL, and it has turned into a career year for the right-hander...in eight previous major league seasons from 2015-24, Houser made 104 starts in 152 appearances to a 32-39 record, 4.21 ERA (608.2IP, 285ER) and a 1.38 WHIP...thus far in 2025, he is 8-4 with a 3.11 ERA (113.0IP, 39ER) and 1.27 WHIP...his ERA, 10 quality starts, 3.2 bWAR and 3.64 FIP are all the best marks of his career.

SUMMER STARTER—He began the year with nine appearances (8GS) for Triple-A Round Rock in the Rangers organization, going 2-2 with a 5.03 ERA (39.1IP, 22ER) before being released May 15...Houser officially signed with the White Sox 20 and made his debut with the club the same day vs. SEA, throwing 6.0 scoreless innings with two hits, three walks and two strikeouts in a winning decision...min. 100.0 IP, his 3.11 ERA (113.0IP, 39ER) since his May 20 debut ranks 11th in the AL.

TOMORROW’S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP JOE BOYLE [1-3, 4.64]

LAST START—Took a no-decision after going 6.0 scoreless innings against Toronto on Sept. 15...he allowed three hits with five strikeouts in his 11th appearance, seventh start, of the season...marked his first career start with no walks allowed.

vs. RED SOX—Boyle has made two career appearances, one start, against the Red Sox...he is 0-1 with a 12.15 ERA (6.2IP, 9ER) and five strikeouts in those outings...in his lone relief appearance against them on July 11 at Fenway Park, he went 4.0 innings and allowed three hits, two runs and two walks with one strikeout.
