RAY REPORT-The Rays continue a seven-game, two-team homestand against the Giants (1-1, 1 to play) and Angels ( 4 to play) this afternoon at Tropicana Field...the Rays
are 1-1 so far in a stretch of 13 consecutive games without an off day...they are 5-2 in are 1-1 so far in a stretch of 13 consecutive games without an off day...they are $5-2$ in their last seven games after going 1-4 from March

The Rays yielded a season-high 5 HR in yesterday's 11-2 setback...it marked their most homers allowed and largest defeat since July 29, 2023 at Houston (17-4, 5HR). In his first career pitching appearance, catcher Ben Rortvedt limited the Giants position player in Rays history, matching Brett Phillips (April 11, 2022 vs. OAK) position player in Rays history, matching Bre Brosseau (Aug. 27, 2019 at HOU).
Despite allowing 11 runs yesterday, the Rays have held opponents to a .139 (5-for 36) average with RISP over their last four games compared to 319 (30-for-94) in 36) average w

The Rays have been held to two runs or fewer in three consecutive home games The Rays have been held to two runs or fewer in three consecutive home games for the first time
The Rays are in the midst of a stretch from April 5-May 30 in which 14 of their 16 series are against clubs that missed the postseason in 2023, having gone 5-3 thus far... 12 of those sets are against clubs that were under the .500 mark last season. With 747 oserer wins, surpassing his predecessor, Joe Maddon, as the Rays all-time managerial wins leader...the earliest he could reach the milestone is April 21 at Yankee Stadium.

WHAT'S AT STAKE-With a win today, the Rays would:
Secure a third straight series victory for the first time since Sept. 4-13, 2023.
Record their first series victory at Tropicana Field since Sept. 19-21, 2023 vs. LAA (2-1), snapping a three-series winless streak (0-2-1).
Claim their third straight series victory over the Giants (also 2023 \& 2019)
Own a winning record through 16 games for the third straight season (14-2 in
2023; 9-7 in 2022) and improve to 18-5-2 over their last 25 regular-season series.
FOREVER IN OUR HEARTS-Longtime Rays Radio broadcaster Dave Wills will be posthumously inducted into the Rays Hall of Fame in a pregame ceremony featuring his Wife, Liz, and children, Alex and Michelle...Wills spent 18 seasons (2005-23) on the Rays the most iconic moments in franchise history, including World Series appearances in 2008 and 2020 as well as Game 162 vs. the Yankees in 2011.

Before joining the Rays, Wills spent 11 years calling games on White Sox radio broadcasts in his native Chicago after beginning his play-by-play career with the Kane County Cougars from 1991-95...he also served as the radio play-by-play voice of the University of Illinois-Chicago's men's basketball team from 1997-2005 The Rays Hall of Fame was established in 2023 in celebration of the organization's 25th anniversary...its inaugural class featured senior advisor Don Zimmer, third baseman Wade Boggs and outfielder Carl Crawford...outfielder Fred McGriff will become the fifth inductee when the Rays host the Padres on Sept. 1.

OPENING ACT-RHP Shawn Armstrong will serve as an opener for bulk reliever LHP Tyler Alexander in this afternoon's contest...the Rays went 5-1 in Armstrong's starts last season, including 3-0 when he worked as an opener (June 7 vs. MIN; July 15-G2 at KC; Sept. 30 at TOR)...in his lone start this season, which also came as an opener for 31 vs. Toronto...however, he owns an 0.87 ERA (20.2IP, 2ER) in 10 career starts.

Since introducing the concept of an opener on May 19, 2018 at Angel Stadium, the Rays are 102-67 (.604) when using one, including a 12-9 mark in 2023, and 396-277 (.588) in all other contests...last season, the Rays used an opener 19 times in the first half of the season compared to only twice after the All-Star break (July 15-G2 at KC; Sept. 30 at TOR).

POWER OUTAGE-The Rays have 3 HR in their last nine games after tallying 8 HR in their first six...the 3 HR since April 3 are second fewest in the majors, ahead of only the White Sox (2HR), and signal their fewest in any nine-game span since Sept. 23-Oct. 2, 2022 (also 3HR)...from Opening Day through April 2, the Rays 8 HR tied the Astros and Royals for the most in the AL.

From the beginning of the season through April 2, the Rays 45.8 pct. hard-hit rate pct. of batted balls hit at $95+\mathrm{mph}$ ) ranked third in the AL/fifth in the majors.. since April 3, their 36.0 pct. mark ranks 10th in the AL/23rd in the majors.
The Rays have not homered in three straight home games for the first time since April 24-26 vs. HOU...their last four-game skid came from June 26-July 12, 2022 (5G). In their first six games, 14 of the Rays 25 runs (56.0\%) came via their 8 HR...in their previous nine, only three of 34 runs ( $8.8 \%$ ) have been produced by their 3 HR.
KEEP IT CLOSE-The Rays are 5-0 in games decided by two or fewer runs and 3-7 in all other contests...they join the Yankees (7-0) as the only clubs that have yet to lose a game by two or fewer tallies...they lead the majors in losses by $3+$ runs (T1st, 7) and by 6+ runs (5)...in 2023, their 28 defeats by $3+$ runs and eight losses by 6+ runs were both the fewest in the majors.

Of the Rays 57 runs, 41 have come in their eight wins ( $5.13 \mathrm{R} / \mathrm{G}$ ) while 18 have come in their seven defeats ( $2.57 \mathrm{R} / \mathrm{G}$ )...they are batting .358 (24-for-67) with RISP in victories compared to .196 ( 9 -for-46) in losses.
WELCOME BACK!-LHP Blake Snell will oppose the Rays in this afternoon's contest marking his first appearance at Tropicana Field since the Rays traded him to the Padres following the 2020 season...Snell won the AL Cy Young Award in 2018, joining David Price (2012) as the only Rays pitchers to earn the honor...selected by the Rays in the first Sound (S2nd ovan ( School, Snell ranks among the Rays all-time leaders in SO/9.0 IP (2nd, 10.49), opp. average (3rd, .223), ERA (4th, 3.24), strikeouts (5th, 648) and wins (6th, 42).

He has pitched against the Rays once since being traded, tossing 6.0 scoreless rames at San Diego's Petco Park on June 17, 2023 (W, 6.01 , 12 , 0 , 3 BB, 12SO).

IT'S BEEN AWHILE-The Rays and Giants conclude their seventh all-time series this weekend at Tropicana Field...the Rays are 4-2-0 in the previous six sets, including series victories in each of the last two meetings (2023 \& 2019 at SF)...this marks the Giants fourth series in St. Petersburg, joining 2016, 2013 and 2004...the Rays are 5-3 against the

seven seasons with the Rays (2011 17) after the club drafted him in 2006....he finished his Rays career at 700.0 IP , 5th most in club history Rays starter RHP Zack Littell made 102 appearances for the Giants from 2021-22 after signing with them as a free agent.
Rays outfielder Jose Siri was part of the Giants $60-$-man player pool in
2020 and spent the summer at the club's alternate site in Sacramento.
San Francisco hitting coach Pat Burrell played two seasons with 12-year playing career...he signed with the Giants in 2010, winning a World Series title later that year before retiring in 2011.
Mike Cash, the father of Rays manager Kevin Cash, was drafted by the Giants in 1974 and spent five seasons in the San Francisco and Philadelphia farm systems.

## TODAY'S OPENER: RHP SHAWN ARMSTRONE [0-1, 5.68]

Armstrong will serve as today's opener, followed by LHP Tyler Alexander.
Was an opener for Alexander on March 31 vs. Toronto and allowed two runs (one earned) on three hits and one walk with one strikeout. He made six starts last season, including four as an opener (June 7, July 15, Aug. 12, Sept. 30)...his other two starts (July 6 \& Aug. 24 were on bullpen days.
Has made 10 career starts since Aug. 30, 2022, all coming with Tampa Bay...has gone 0-2 with a 0.87 ERA (20.2IP, 2ER) with 20 strikeout against five walks across those outings.

TODAY'S OUTING-Alexander makes his third appearance of the season including his second in a bulk relief capacity.

Made his Rays debut on March 31 vs. Toronto in a bulk relief role. worked 5.0 innings, allowing five runs on six hits and two walks with four strikeouts.
LAST TIME OUT-Did not factor into his start on April 6 at Colorado after working 4.1 innings, allowing four runs on eight hits and two walks with four strikeouts.

Marked the ninth time in his career allowing 8+ hits, including the
first since conceding a career-high-tying 10 hits on Sept. 5, 2022 at Los Angeles-AL
UNFAMILIAR FOE-In his lone outing against the Giants on April 14, 2023, he tossed 1.1 relief innings, allowing one hit...he is 1-4 with a 5.70 ERA (66.1IP, 42ER) in 22 career appearances (9GS) opposite the NL West.
HOMER (UN) HAPPY-Alexander has allowed two home runs in each of his first two outings in 2024...it marks the first time he has ever allowed 2+ HR in consecutive appearances.

In his last 12 starts dating back to Aug. 14, 2022, Alexander has yielded 16 home runs ( $2.44 \mathrm{HR} / 9.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ), allowing a homer in 10 of the
In 25 relief appearances since the beginning of the 2023 campaign, he has allowed nine homers across 46.0 innings (1.76 HR/9.0IP).
SPLITTING HAIRS-Through two appearances, Alexander is holding left handed hitters to an .083 (1-for-12) mark...right-handed hitters, however are batting . 433 (13-for-30).

He has held lefties to a career .229/.270/.387 (78-for-341) mark compared to a .288/.330/.501 (301-for-1044) clip against righties.
UP IN THE AIR-Alexander's 17.6 pct. ground ball rate is the lowest in the majors, ahead of CHC Shota Imanaga (22.0\%) and OAK JP Sears (25.2\%). he has produced a career 37.4 pct. ground ball rate, including a 33.3 pct clip in 2023.

SMALL SAMPLE-In 2024, Alexander has utilized his cutter 30.9 pct. of the time and his four-season fastball 30.3 pct...opponents are 2-for-11 (.182) with one XBH (2B) against the cutter compared to 5 -for-13 (.385) with 2 HR against the four-seamer.

He has struggled with his breaking/offspeed pitches, as opponents
are batting a combined 7 -for-18 (.389) off his changeup, sinker, sweeper and slider.
STARTER VS. RELIEVER-He has made 122 career appearances, 78 of which have come in relief.

Is 7-3 with a 4.09 ERA (147.1IP, 67ER) as a reliever compared to 4-20 with a 4.78 ERA (203.1IP, 108ER) in 44 career starts.
2023 RECAP-Alexander made the Tigers Opening Day roster for the fourth consecutive season and went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (44.0IP, 22ER) over 25 outings (1GS).

In his first three outings from April 1-8, recorded an 8.64 ERA (8.1IP, 8ER)...went 2-1 with a 3.53 ERA (35.2IP, 14ER) over his final 22 appearances, including 1-1 with a 0.96 ERA (18.2IP, 2ER) across eight appearances (1GS) in June.
