**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets began a quick three-game trip with a 9-1 loss to the Pirates...They are in a stretch of 13 straight games (3-8)...New York is 19-23 on the road compared to 29-12 at Citi Field in 2025...Today is game two of a three-game set against the Pirates (0-1)...The team is off on Monday before the start of a six-game homestand against Milwaukee (three games) and the Yankees (three games).

**JUAN SPECIAL MONTH:** Juan Soto has 11 homers this month...That is tied for the second-most in a single month...Gary Carter (September of 1985) and Dave Kingman (July of 1975) own the franchise record with 13 homers in a single month...Pete Alonso was the last Mets player to record 11 homers in the month, doing so in September in 2019.

**JUNE BLOOM:** According to Elias, this is the first time in franchise history that the Mets had four players each with at least 15 home runs, before the end of June: Soto (19), Alonso (18), Lindor (16) and Nimmo (15).

**WALK TO ME:** He has recorded 25 walks in the month of June, the most by a Met in a single calendar month since Brandon Nimmo's 29 walks in September of 2018...He has recorded a Major League-leading 68 walks this season, the most by a Met through the team's first 82 games in franchise history...His 68 walks through the team's first 83 games are the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024).

**SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT:** According to Elias, Francisco Lindor has hit 257 home runs and stolen 196 bases as a shortstop...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

**UPCOMING MILESTONES:** Francisco Lindor is two steals away from 200 career SB and one steal away from 100 as a Met...He would become the 12th Met to reach 100 stolen bases and the sixth Met to record at least 100 homers and 100 steals with the team (also: Darryl Strawberry, David Wright, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán and José Reyes).

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers...Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Over the last 30 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .313 (36-115) with 18 runs, five doubles, seven homers, 15 RBI, 10 walks, six steals and an .917 OPS...In 24 games when batting in the two-spot, Nimmo is hitting .326/.394/.584 with five doubles, six homers, 13 RBI, eight walks and four steals.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** In 25 games this month, Pete Alonso is batting .299 (29-97) with 15 runs, five doubles, seven homers, 22 RBI, seven walks, a .376 OBP and a .567 SLG...His 22 RBI this month are tied for the third-most in the NL, while his seven homers are tied for seventh in the NL in June...He is fourth in the Majors with 65 RBI.

**LAST TIME OUT:** He suffered his second loss of the season after tossing 4.2 innings against Atlanta on June 23...He allowed three runs on six hits, with three walks and five strikeouts...He has allowed three or fewer earned runs in six of his eight starts since joining the Mets last season.

**BACK AND FORTH:** He has made five appearances this season, including three starts since returning from injury...Overall, he has a 6.62 ERA (13 ER/17.2 IP) allowing 24hits and striking out 13...In his three starts this season he has posted a 4.05 ERA (6 ER/13.1 IP) with 10 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .260 batting average...As a reliever this season, he has allowed seven earned runs over 4.1 innings and opponents are hitting .478 (11-23) off him.

**SAVE ME:** Entered in the sixth inning on June 8 at Colorado and he allowed three earned runs over 4.0 innings, earning his first career save (S, 4.0 IP, 7 H, 3 ER, BB, 3 K)...It was just his fifth appearance as a reliever and his first since July 9, 2023, at Boston...He became just the second Met since 1997 earn a save and throw more than 4.0 innings in a game and the first since Brian Stokes did it in 2008 at Washington on August 13.

**VS. PITTSBURGH:** In Blackburn's nine-year career in the Major League, he has never faced the Pirates...Today will make his first appearance against Pittsburgh.

**REHAB STARTS:** He was reinstated from the 15-Day Injured List on June 2...Was originally placed on the IL on March 27 (retro. 3/24) with right knee inflammation...Began his rehab assignment on April 19 and made seven rehab starts between High-A Brooklyn, Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse, combining to go 2-2 with a 3.68 ERA (12 ER/29.1 IP), 13 walks and 31 strikeouts...Did not allow more than three earned runs in each of those seven outings...Held opponents to a .194 average (19-98) in his rehab appearances. Made his last start of his rehab assignment in Game 1 on May 28 at Iowa with Syracuse, earning the win after allowing two earned runs over 6.1 innings (4 H, 2 BB, 4 K, HR, HP)...He threw 84 pitches, 54 for strikes...Was his second consecutive quality start (also: 7.0 IP, H, 0 R on May 21 vs. ROC)...In four total rehab starts with Syracuse in the month of May, went 2-1 with a 2.70 ERA (6 ER/20.0 IP) and a .188 opponents' BA (12-64).

**HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS:** In six home starts last season, Blackburn was 2-1 with a 2.75 ERA (11 ER/36.0 IP)...Four of those starts at home have been quality starts, and Blackburn has pitched into the sixth inning in four of those five starts...His last home start at Citi Field came on August 18, 2024, and he allowed one earned run and four hits over 6.0 innings.

**SPRING FLING:** Blackburn made five starts with the Mets in spring training this season, going 1-1 with a 5.28 ERA (8 ER/12.2 IP), six walks and nine strikeouts prior to being placed on the IL...Allowed three earned runs or less in each of those five starts and held opponents to a .229 average (11-48).

**THIRD TIMES THE CHARM:** In 2024, Blackburn held opponents to a .213 average (13-61) his third time through the lineup compared to a .284 average his first time through and a .265 average his second time through the lineup.

**2024 REWIND:** On July 30 Blackburn was acquired from the Athletics in exchange for RHP Kade Morris...He made five starts for the Mets last season, going 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA (14 ER/24.1 IP), seven walks and 21 strikeouts before missing the remainder of the season due to a right hand contusion...Allowed one earned run in three of his five outings with the club...On August 2 at Los Angeles-AL, he earned the win in his Mets debut after allowing just one run over 6.0 scoreless innings...The right-hander became the 10th pitcher in franchise history to allow one or zero runs over 6.0+ innings and earn the win in his team debut...In 14 combined starts with Oakland and the Mets last season, went 5-4 with a 4.66 ERA (29 ER/75.1 IP), 21 walks with 59 strikeouts...He began the season with three straight starts of 6.0+ scoreless innings for the Athletics and became the seventh pitcher since 1914 to do so (last: James Paxton from 4/5- 4/15/2017)...His season-opening scoreless streak of 22.1 innings was the longest scoreless streak to open the season by an A's starting pitcher...Blackburn then went on the 15-Day Injured List from May 13 (retro. May 11) to July 26 with a stress fraction of the fifth metatarsal of his right foot...He appeared in three rehab games between Single-A Stockton and Triple-A Las Vegas prior to the trade deadline.

**CAREER NOTES:** Over parts of eight Major League seasons with the Athletics (2017-24) and the Mets (2024-25), has gone 22-29 with a 4.91 ERA (241 ER/441.1 IP), 136 walks and 337 strikeouts over 90 games (84 starts)...Was originally drafted by the Chicago Cubs in the first round (56th overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft out of Heritage High School in Brentwood, California...On July 20, 2016 Blackburn and INF Daniel Vogelbach were traded from the Cubs to the Seattle Mariners in exchange for RHP Jordan Pries and LHP Mike Montgomery...On November 12 that same year, he was traded to the Athletics in exchange for INF Danny Valencia...At the age of 23, Blackburn made his Major League debut with Oakland on July 1, 2017 vs. Atlanta and allowed one unearned run over 6.0 innings...Blackburn finished his rookie season with a record of 3-1 and a 3.22 ERA (21 ER/58.2 IP) over 10 career starts...From 2018-2021, Blackburn appeared in 20 games (17 Starts) and pitched to a 7.60 ERA (67 ER/79.1 IP)...In 2022, Blackburn was named an American League All-Star and established career highs in starts (21) and innings (111.1) before suffering a season-ending right middle finger injury...Blackburn began the 2023 season with a right middle finger injury...Was acquired by the Mets from the Athletics on July 30, 2024 in exchange for RHP Kade Morris...In the 2024 offseason, Blackburn underwent cerebrospinal fluid leak repair surgery.

- Recorded his 10th hold of the season on June 24 vs. Atlanta...Allowed a sac fly to Ozzie Albies and left the game with two on, both eventually scored (0.1 IP, 3 ER, 3 BB)...Was the second time this season he has allowed at least three walks and three earned runs (also: 6/19 at Atlanta)...Prior to the game on June 19, had not allowed more than one earned in his first 30 outings of the season...Was also tied for his shortest outing of the season (also 5/3-G1 at St. Louis).
- Allowed one hit over 2.0 scoreless innings on June 21 at Philadelphia (2 K, HP)...Stranded an inherited runner in the sixth inning...Marked his longest outing since May 21 (2.1 IP).
- On June 19 at Atlanta, allowed a season-high four earned runs over 0.2 IP (2 H, 3 BB)...Stranded two of three inherited runners after entering the game in the fifth inning...Allowed four or more runs for the third time in his career and first since June 26, 2024 at Kansas



- City...Also marked the first time he allowed more than one earned run this season...His three walks were his most in an outing since June 1, 2024 vs. Texas.
- Has gone 3-2 with one save, 10 holds and a 3.00 ERA (14 ER/42.0 IP) through 33 appearances (two as an opener) this season, holding batters to a .187 average (26-139) including right-handers to a .150 average (12-80)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .125 average (8-64).
  - Has allowed a run in three of his last five away games after allowing just one run in his first 14 road outings this season (0.47 ERA).
  - In six appearances vs. the Pirates, has gone 3-0 and has not allowed an earned run (5.1 IP)...In 32 career appearances vs. NL Central opponents has gone 6-0 with a 1.11 ERA (4 ER/32.1 IP) and 13 walks compared to 47 strikeouts.
