CINCINNATI REDS VS BOSTON RED SOX

THURSDAY, MARCH 26 • GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK



### 150TH HOME OPENING DAY GAME

Thursday's game will be the Reds' 150th Home Opening Day game, their 24th home opener at Great American Ball Park, and their 23rd to open a season at Great American Ball Park...the 2022 season marked the only time the Reds opened a season on the road in GABP's existence (MLB labor dispute)...the Reds are 71-77-1 in home openers, including 66-71-1 vs National League opponents, 1-2 vs American League opponents (3-1 loss in 13 innings vs LAA in 2013, 9-7 win vs Det in 2020, 10-5 loss vs Cle in 2022), and 9-14 at GABP...is expected to be the 142nd regular season sellout at GABP and the 22nd sellout of the 24 season home openers (exceptions: 2020 & 2021 seasons affected by COVID-19)...the crowd of 44,063 on 2023 Opening Day was the largest during the regular season at GABP.

### REDS VS RED SOX ON OPENING DAY

The Reds are playing the Red Sox on Opening Day for the first time in franchise history...also marks the third time Cincinnati will open a season against an American League opponent since Interleague play began in 1997, with the other instances coming in 2013 (Angels) and 2020 (Tigers)...these 2 clubs first faced off in the 1975 Fall Classic, with the Big Red Machine defeating the Red Sox, 4 games to 3, to secure the first of back-to-back World Series championships...Cincinnati and Boston have met 26 times during the regular season, with the Reds owning a 7-19 record in those games.

### GREAT AMERICAN FANS

This afternoon's Opening Day crowd will be the 142nd sellout during the regular season at 42,271-seat Great American Ball Park...the Reds produced 148 sellouts in the first 23 seasons of GABP, including 141 regular season sellouts, 4 National League Division Series sellouts (1 in 2010, 3 in 2012), and sellouts for all 3 days of 2015 All-Star Week...during the regular season, the Reds are 918-888-1 (.508) overall at GABP, including 69-72 (.489) when playing in front of sellout crowds...regular season attendance over 23 seasons and 1,807 games totals 44,765,954.

### 2025 OPENING DAY GAME

The Reds opened the 2025 season with a 6-4 loss to the Giants at Great American Ball Park, falling to 71-77-1 all-time in home openers and 9-14 in home openers at GABP...in that game, Cincinnati tied a modern-day franchise record (since 1900) for strikeouts in a season opener with 17, matching the mark originally set in a 3-1, 13-inning loss vs the Angels on 4/1/13...marked the earliest regular-season game by calendar date (3/27) in Reds history, according to Elias...prior to 2025, Cincinnati had never opened a campaign earlier than 3/28, done twice (2019, '24).

### OPENING DAY STARTER

LHP Andrew Abbott is scheduled to make his first career Opening Day start this afternoon, making him the 19th different left-handed pitcher to start for the Reds in a season opener since the club joined the National League in 1890, according to Elias (last: Mike Remlinger, 1998)...Abbott will snap the Cin's streak of 27 consecutive season openers started by a right-handed pitcher...was the longest-such run in franchise history, surpassing the previous club record of 12 straight Opening Day games with a right-handed starting pitcher from 1923-34...he will also become the youngest Reds left-handed pitcher to start in a season opener (26 years, 305 days old) since Reds Hall of Famer Don Gullett (24 years, 91 days old) in 1975.

### RED SOX ROYALTY

Second-year Reds skipper Terry Francona, who managed the Red Sox from 2004-11, is set to face Boston on Opening Day for the second time in his Major League managerial career (also: 2016 w/Cle)...during his 8-year tenure as Boston's manager, Francona compiled a 744-552 (.574) record, guiding the club to 2 World Series championships (2004 & '07) and 5 Postseason appearances...he ranks second to only National Baseball Hall of Famer Joe Cronin (1935-47) among the Red Sox' all-time leaders in managerial victories and games managed (1,296).

### NEW FACES

Seven Reds this year are appearing on their first career Opening Day roster: RHP Chase Burns, RHP Jose Franco, RHP Rhett Lowder, OF Noelvi Marte, RHP Connor Phillips, INF Sal Stewart, and LHP Brandon Williamson...in total, 12 players are appearing on their first Opening Day roster as a member of the Reds: LHP Brock Burke, Burns, Franco, INF Ke'Bryan Hayes, RHP Pierce Johnson, Lowder, INF Nathaniel Lowe, Marte, OF Dane Myers, Phillips, Stewart, & Williamson.

### BRIGHT AND EARLY

Today's Opening Day matchup between Cin and Bos is the earliest regular-season game by calendar date in Reds history...Cin opened the 2025 season on 3/27 vs SF, which was previously the earliest regular-season game in team history.

### PARADE ROUTE 107TH

Reds broadcaster and 2025 Ohio Sportscaster of the Year Jeff Brantley will serve as the grand marshal of this afternoon's 107th Findlay Market Opening Day Parade...Reds team physician Dr. Timothy Kremchek will join Brantley as the Honorary Grand Marshal, celebrating his 30th season with the team.

### POMP AND CIRCUMSTANCE

Reds Hall of Famer and 2004 World Series champion Bronson Arroyo will throw out the ceremonial first pitch...Reds Hall of Famer and 9-time All-Star Dave Concepcion will serve as the Honorary Captain of the Game...retired Technical Sergeant Felita LaRock will perform the National Anthem...the pregame flyover will be performed by 3 AH-64 Apache helicopters and one UH-60 Blackhawk helicopter from from the 1st Battalion, 101st Aviation Regiment out of Fort Campbell, KY...a 300- by 150-foot American flag will be unfurled during the singing of the National Anthem by members of the Cincinnati Fire Department and Cincinnati Firefighters Local 48...representatives from the Rosie Reds organization will make the traditional presentation of Opening Day plaques to managers Terry Francona of the Reds and Alex Cora of the Red Sox...representatives from Findlay Market will make their annual basket presentation to Reds manager Terry Francona...player introductions begin at 3:37 p.m.

### IN THE BOOTHS

John Sadak will broadcast his sixth Opening Day game as the play-by-play voice of Reds.TV...he will be joined in the booth by Hall of Fame shortstop Barry Larkin (6th season) and former Reds pitcher Chris Welsh (34th season) as color analysts, and in the Reds' dugout by Jim Day (25th season)...Brian Giesenschlag (22nd season) and Sam LeCure (9th season) will provide insight from the studio desk...Tommy Thrall (8th season) and Jeff Brantley (20th season) return for their sixth full season together in the 700 WLW Radio booth.

**TODAY'S GAME:** Is the Reds' 150th home Opening Day game and their 24th home opener at **Great American Ball Park**

- The Reds are 9-14 in home openers at **GABP** and 71-77-1 in home openers overall...the 2022 season marked the only time in **GABP's** existence that the Reds didn't open their season here (MLB labor dispute).

**SPRING RECAP:** The **Reds** finished 2026 Spring Training action with a 14-17 record, going 9-6 at Goodyear Ballpark (including when **Cin** was the "away" team vs **Cle**) and 5-11 on the road...the overall record reflects the 2 exhibition games the Reds lost vs the **Brewers** in Milwaukee on Mon and Tue.

- Reds** batters concluded their spring schedule ranked among Major League leaders in extra-base hits (129, 1st), average exit velocity (91.6 mph), home runs (55, T1st), total bases (535, 2nd), slugging pct (.499, 2nd), hard-hit balls (237, 2nd), and runs scored (182, 6th).
- The **Reds'** 55 home runs were their most in a single Spring Training season since 2006 (as far back as ST data is available), surpassing the previous best of 44 set by the 2024 club.
- Temperatures in the Phoenix area ran 20-30 degrees above normal this March and reached over 100 degrees for 5 consecutive days leading up to the Reds' departure Sun afternoon.
- Cin** earned its 200th win all-time in Cactus League action with a 3-2 victory on 2/25 at **CWS**.
- The Reds were successful in 37 of their 62 ABS challenges this spring (59.7%)...only **StL** (65.6%), **Sea** (62.3%), and **Phi** (62.3%) had higher success rates.

**CACTUS MATT:** **INF Matt McLain** this spring was among Major League leaders in virtually every offensive category, including batting average (.509, 1st), on-base pct (.559, 1st), slugging (.981, 1st), OPS (1.540, 1st), hits (27, 1st), total bases (52, 1st), runs scored (18, 1st), times on base (33, 1st), home runs (7, T1st), RBI (16, 3rd), and hard-hit balls (18, T5th).

- His 7 home runs were the most by a Red during a single spring season since at least 2006 (as far back as ST data is available).
- His Major League-leading 27 hits were the second-most by a Red in a single spring season since at least 2006 (**Josh Hamilton**, 29 hits in '07).
- His 52 total bases were the most by any player during Spring Training since 2017 (**NY Yankees' Greg Bird 56 & Mil's Jesús Agilar 53**).

**THE SKIPPER:** Manager **Terry Francona** returns for his second season after guiding the 2025 Reds to their first Postseason berth since 2020 and their first during a full season since 2013...his 83-79 Reds were the 12th Postseason club he has managed in the majors.

- Francona** finished as the runner-up to **Mil's Pat Murphy** for the **2025 National League Manager of the Year Award**.
- He became the fifth skipper in Reds history to lead the team to the Postseason in his **first year** at the helm, joining **Lou Piniella** (1990), **John McNamara** (1979), **Sparky Anderson** (1970), & **Patrick Moran** (1919).
- Francona** became the 12th manager in Major League history to lead 3 or more teams to the Postseason (**Cin, Cle, Bos**).
- His **2,033** career wins as a Major League manager lead all active skippers and rank 12th in Major League history.

**...AND HIS CREW:** New members of the Reds coaching staff in 2026 include third-base coach **Willie Harris**, catching coach **Bill Haselman**, and bullpen coach **Oscar Marin**.

- Returning to the coaching staff for the 2026 season are bench coach/field coordinator **Freddie Benavides** (13th season on the Major League staff), director of pitching/pitching coach **Derek Johnson** (8th), bullpen catcher **José Duarte** (8th), coach/coordinator of advance scouting **Kyle Arnsberg** (5th), first-base coach **Collin Cowgill** (4th), assistant pitching coach **Matt Tracy** (1st in current role, 4th on staff), director of hitting/Major League hitting coach **Chris Valaika** (2nd), assistant hitting coaches **Alex Peláez** and **Will Remillard** (2nd for each), assistant bench coach **Mike Napoli** (1st in current role, 2nd on staff), & bullpen catcher **James Keller** (2nd).
- In addition to his assistant bench coach duties, **Napoli** will fill in as the team's first base coach while **Cowgill** recovers from knee surgery.

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds and **Red Sox** are meeting for the only time in 2026... **Bos** won 2 of 3 games vs **Cin** at **Fenway Park** in 2025, which marked the 50th anniversary of their historic battle in the 1975 World Series.

- These teams last met here at **Great American Ball Park** when **Bos** took 2 of 3 games from the Reds from 6/21-6/23, 2024.
- The Reds won 2 of 3 games at **Fenway** in 2023...it was the first time **Cin** won a series vs the **Red Sox** since the aforementioned '75 Fall Classic, and the first regular season series win against a team from Boston since a 2-1 series victory vs the **Braves** in September 1952 (was the opening series of the **Braves'** final homestand in Boston).
- The Reds' 2-1 win on 5/31/22 was their first victory at **Fenway Park** since Game 7 of the 1975 World Series.
- Reds skipper **Terry Francona** managed the **Red Sox** from 2004-2011 and led them to 2 World Series championships, 5 Postseason apps, and 6 seasons of 90 or more wins...he finished his 8-year tenure in Boston with a 744-552 (.574) record while not suffering a single losing season.

**NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM:** The Reds enter this opening series having not been swept in any of their previous **31 home series** (min. 1g) dating back to 2024...it's tied for the 5th-longest ride in club history and is the longest such streak since 9/19/11-9/25/13 when the Reds avoided being swept at **Great American Ball Park** in a franchise record **52 consecutive home series**.

- The Reds avoided being swept in all 26 of their series last year at **GABP**...only the **Cin** teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being broomed.

**2025 IN REVIEW:** In 2025, the Reds reached the Postseason for the first time since 2020 and for the first time in a full season since 2013...they were swept in a best-of-3 National League Wild Card Series by the eventual World Series champion **Dodgers**.

- Although **Cin** and **NYM** finished with identical 83-79 records, the Reds secured the final Wild Card berth by winning 4 of 6 from the **Mets** during the season series.
- Following a 5-4 loss on 9/5 vs **NYM**, the Reds trailed both the **Mets** and **Padres** by 6.0 games for the final NL Wild Card berth with 21 games remaining...from there, the Reds went 13-8, while the **Mets** finished 7-14.

**ROCKET:** Reds manager Terry Francona on 3/8 announced Abbott as the Opening Day starter vs Bos...it will mark his first Opening Day start.

- Is set to become the 19th different left-handed pitcher to start for the Reds in a season opener since the club joined the National League in 1890, the first since Mike Remlinger in 1998.
- Will snap the Reds' streak of 27 consecutive season openers started by a right-handed pitcher...was the longest such run in franchise history, surpassing the previous club record of 12 straight Opening Day games with a right-handed starting pitcher from 1923-34.
- At 26 years, 298 days old, is the youngest left-handed pitcher to start a Reds' season opener since Reds Hall of Famer Don Gullett (24 years, 91 days) in 1975.

**SPRING RECAP:** Went 1-3 with a 11.72 ERA in 6 Cactus League starts (17.2ip, 28h, 25r/23er, 8bb, 22k, 6hr, 362 TP).

- Last pitched in Sat's 11-7 win over the White Sox in Goodyear (4.2ip, 4h, 5r/3er, 1bb, 5k, 1hr, 84 TP).

**AWARD TOUR:** Following the 2025 season, received from the local chapter of the Baseball Writers' Association of America the 2025 Ernie Lombardi Award as the Reds' Most Valuable Player and the Johnny Vander Meer Award as the Reds' Most Outstanding Pitcher.

- Became the sixth Reds pitcher since the Vander Meer Award was established in 1969 to receive both awards in the same season.
- Became the seventh Reds pitcher (eighth occurrence) to be named team MVP.

**2025 ALL-STAR:** Was named to the National League All-Star team as a replacement for LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto...was his first career All-Star selection..

- Pitched a perfect 6th inning in the National League's 7-6 victory (Jazz Chisholm Jr lineout, Riley Greene flyout, Randy Arozarena groundout; 13 total pitches).
