RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals, who completed a season-opening six-game homestand with an 2-1,11-inning walk off win against the NY Mets on Wednesday afternoon, bring a 4-2 mark into today's series opener against the Detroit Tigers ... St. Louis is opening its 1st roadtrip (DET-3, WSH-3) of the season this weekend...the Cardinals were 34-47 in road games last season, losing each of their final four road contests...playing their 135th regular season of play in the National League, the Cardinals last winning season on the road came in 2021 (45-36) when they won their final 11 road games.

MOTOWN MOVES: St. Louis is just 17-33 all-time against Detroit, with a .340 regular season win percentage that is its 2nd-lowest against any opponent since 1892 ahead of the Rangers (7-14, .333) ... The Cardinals and Tigers have been common foes since the start of inter-league play in 1997 ... The 50 games vs. Detroit are the Cardinals most against all AL teams except cross-state rival Kansas City (134 games) ... The Cardinals and Tigers have played a total of 19 World Series games (1934, 1968, 2006).

SUITCASE SLUGGER: Nolan Gorman has played more career career games on the road then at home (220-212) & needs 3 RBI for 100 career on Road. Gorman ranks 2nd among all Cardinals LHB in AB/HR ratio (19.81) in road games behind Jim Edmonds (16.00) min. 200 road games.

MIDWEST MAULER: Iván Herrera has produced a career .426 BA (29-68) vs. AL Central clubs with a 1.076 OPS - his highest against any Division.

HOT (CORNER) TAMALES: A 2022 American League Rawlings Gold Glove winner at third base, Ramon Urias is ranked 4th all-time among Mexican-born primary third basemen with 51 career HR's (former Tigers' Gold Glover Aurelio Rodríguez is ranked 2nd with 124 behind Vinny Castilla (320).

WARMING UP: Masyn Winn's slow starts in March (.136 career BA) have then seen him hit his stride with a.308 (41-133) career mark in April - his best in any month...Winn collected his 1st RBI of 2026 and his 1st career walk-off RBI in Wednesday's 11 inning 2-1 win over the Mets on April Fools' Day...Masyn was the 5th youngest shortstop (23 yrs, 191 days) to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award - The Tigers HOF Alan Trammell (1980) is ranked 4th (22 yrs, 228 days).

WE'RE GOING STREAKING!: Rookie JJ Wetherholt has reached base safely in each of his first five career games, the first Cardinal to do so since Jordan Walker reached safely in his first 12 career games in 2023.

YOUNGRIER: According to *Baseball America*, the Cardinals entered the 2026 season with the youngest Opening Day roster across Major League Baseball with an average age of 27.3, while the Braves sport MLB's oldest average age at 30.9 ... At age 23.5, JJ Wetherholt is the 16th-youngest in the National League and the circuit's youngest middle infielder.

DETROIT CONNECTIONS

Lars Nootbaar made his MLB debut vs. Detroit (June 22, 2021)...Tripled off Matt Manning for his first MLB hit (June 23, 2021).

Tigers Hitting Coach Michael Brdar was originally selected by St. Louis in the 36th round of the 2017 MLB draft...played the 2017 minor league season with the GCL Cardinals.

Jack Flaherty was selected by St. Louis in the 1st round (#34) of the 2014 MLB Draft...pitched seven seasons with the Cardinals (2017-23)...traded to Baltimore at the 2023 MLB Trade deadline for INF César Prieto, RHP Zack Showalter, and LHP Drew Rom (Aug 1, 2023).

Matt Vierling was born in St. Louis...graduated from Christian Brothers College High School in St. Louis...originally selected by the Cardinals in the 30th round of the 2015 MLB draft, but did not sign to attend the University of Notre Dame...attended the 2013 World Series at Busch Stadium.

Cardinals Hall of Famers Vince Coleman (1997) and Edgar Rentería (2008) each played parts of one season in Detroit.

Cardinals Sr. Director of Communications Brian Bartow is a native of Battle Creek Mich...graduated from Ferris State University in Big Rapids, Mich.

Tigers Special Asst. Jim Leyland spent six seasons (2000-05) as a scout for the Cardinals, scouting NL clubs from Pittsburgh and AL clubs from Cleveland.

2006 World Series: The Cardinals secured a play-off berth on the final day of the regular season by winning the NL Central and later capturing the 10th World Championship in history, topping the Tigers, 4-1...the Cardinals won the Fall Classic with the fewest regular-season wins during a full season in MLB history (83)...David Eckstein was named MVP...Tony La Russa joined Sparky Anderson (Reds & Tigers) as only the second manager to win the World Series with teams in both leagues.

1968 World Series: The Tigers overcame a 3-1 deficit and defeated the defending World Series champion Cardinals, 4-3, for their first championship since 1945...LHP Mickey Lolich hurled three complete-game victories (1.67 ERA) to earn MVP...Gibson won two games and set World Series records by striking out 17 in Game 1 and 35 in the Series...Lou Brock batted .464 and stole seven bases...Tim McCarver and Mike Shannon each homered and played all seven games.

Hall of Famer Ted Simmons was born in Highland Park, Mich...originally selected by St. Louis in the 1st round (#10) of the 1967 MLB Draft from Southfield (Mich.) High School...attended the University of Michigan and Wayne State in his offseasons.

Tigers Bullpen Catcher Chris Chinea was drafted by St. Louis in the 17th round in 2015...played five seasons in the Cardinals organization (2015-19).

1934 World Series: The "Gas House Gang" won the NL pennant on the final day of the season, then defeated Detroit in the World Series, 4-3, for their third championship in eight years...Dizzy and Paul Dean each won two games over the Tigers...The final game of the Series, won 11-0 by the Cardinals, was marked by Commissioner Kenesaw Landis' order to eject Ducky Medwick from the game; Medwick slid hard into Tigers 3B Marv Owen in the 6th inn., infuriating Detroit fans that they bombarded Medwick with empty bottles, fruit, vegetables, and debris when he took his position in left field in the bottom of the inning. Landis removed Medwick to halt the disturbance...1934 was the last World Series in which both teams were led by player-managers (Frankie Frisch & Mickey Cochrane).

TODAY'S STARTER:

- The 25-year-old righty is making his 2nd start of the 2026 season today in his 21th career start (23rd career game).
- This season marks his 1st time making the Cardinals Opening Day roster.**
- Has one career appearance in March and today is his first in April; 17 of his 22 career appearances (16 of 20 starts) have come post All-Star break.
- Is making his 1st career appearance/start against Detroit and just his 5th career Interleague appearance (1-0, 1.13 ERA, 24.0 IP)
- Has made 13 career appearances (11 starts) at Busch Stadium where he is 5-3 with a 4.09 ERA (66.0 IP).
- Lifetime 6-1 with a 3.38 ERA (58.2 IP) in 10 career starts on the road.
- Went 4-0 with a 2.45 ERA in 5 Spring Training starts, striking out 16 to just 2 walks but did allow a team-high 6 HR's
- Led MLB with his 4 Spring Training wins and ranked in top 10 in ERA (2.45), Opp. BA (.229) and WHIP (0.98)**

LAST TIME OUT (Saturday, March 28 vs. Rays) ND, W, 6-5; 6.0 IP, 0 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 5 SO, 96 pitches.

- Retired a career-high nine batters to start the game and did not allow a hit through 6.0 innings (previous career-best: 2.1 innings on Sept. 24, 2024 at Colorado).
- Became the first Cardinal to throw 6.0+ no-hit innings in a completed start since **Erick Fedde** on April 9, 2025 at Pittsburgh (6.0 IP).
- Became the 2nd Cardinal in franchise history with a hitless start in one of the first two game of a season, joining **Jack Flaherty** (5.0 IP in Game 2 on April 1, 2023 vs. Toronto), and the 14th time an MLB pitcher has done so in a start of at least 6.0 IP.
- Since 1961, the Cardinals record for the longest hitless inning streak as a starter (excluding any possible intervening relief appearances) to begin a season is 8.0 IP by **Daniel Ponce de Leon** - July 23, 2018 (7.0 IP) and Aug. 21, 2018 (1.0 IP) - *Elias*

2025:

NL Rookie Rankings: Wins (8, T-2nd), Innings Pitched (95.2, 6th), Games Started (16, 6th), Quality Starts (7, T-1st)

CARRYING THE LOAD: Combined to make 31 starts over 32 appearances between St. Louis and Memphis (AAA). Hurlled a career-high 170.2 innings and won 16 games.

TOTAL RECALLS: Was recalled five times to St. Louis during the season including once as the 27th player in a doubleheader (6/19 at CWS).

SECOND WINS: Ranked T-2nd among Cardinals with **Miles Mikolas** (31 GS) and **Matthew Liberatore** (29 GS) with eight wins, despite making only 16 starts.

POST-ER CHILD: His 7 wins post All-Star Break ranked T-5th among Major League pitchers. Most by a Cardinals pitcher since **Adam Wainwright** went 10-2 post All-Star Break in 2021.

ONE-HIT WONDER: Made his 2025 season debut with 5.2 scoreless innings of one-hit relief vs. NYM (5/4) in the second game of a doubleheader sweep earning the win.

QUALITY STUFF: Made 10 starts of 6.0 innings or more, six of those quality starts. Pitched 6.0 innings or more in six August starts, longest streak by a Cardinals pitcher in 2025.

AUGUST RUSH: Was 4-0 in the month of August, most wins by a Cardinals pitcher in August since **Adam Wainwright** was 5-1 in 2021.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT: Benefitted from a 6.21 run support average, ranked 7th among MLB pitchers with 16 or more starts.

SEEING RED: Threw a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings of three-hit ball vs. CIN (9/16) in a 3-0 win.

TURN ON THE FANS: Struck out a career-high seven batters over 6.0 innings vs. PIT (8/25).

WALKING PNEUMONIA: Led all Cardinals starting pitchers with a 1.9 walks/9 IP ratio.

DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE: Ranked 3rd among Cardinals with 10 opponent ground into double plays induced, trailing Andre Pallante and Erick Fedde with 12.

TRIPLE-A ON DISPLAY: Was 8-3 with a 3.72 ERA in 15 starts at Memphis (AAA). At the time of recall, was 3rd among International League leaders in winning pct. (.727, 8-3), 5th in wins (8), 8th in ERA (3.72) and WHIP (1.24).

CAREER:

- Cardinals 1st round pick in 2021 made his Major League debut vs. Texas on July 31, 2024, throwing 7.0 innings and allowing one run in a 10-1 victory.
- Earned 11 wins in his first 21 Major League games, 6th Cardinals pitcher to achieve that mark and first since Luis Arroyo in 1955. **Jack Harper** set the franchise record with 14 wins in 1901. **Bobby Miller** of the Dodgers was the last in MLB with 11 (2023).
- His .769 win percentage Post All-Star Break over the past two seasons (2024-25) is the best among starting pitchers.
- Posted a 1.96 ERA (5 ER/23.0 IP) through his first four career games, best by a Cardinal through his first four career games since RHP René Arocha's 1.52 ERA (4 ER/23.2 IP) in 1993 (min. 20 IP).
- Became the first Cardinals rookie to pitch at least 8.0 IP in one of his first four career starts since RHP **Alan Benes** on Sept. 30, 1995 at Pittsburgh (3rd career start).
- First Cardinals pitcher to earn a win in his MLB debut at Busch Stadium since **Nick Greenwood** (6/16/2014 vs. NYM). First Cardinals pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings in his MLB debut at home since **Jason Simontacchi** vs. ATL (5/4/2002). First Cardinals pitcher to throw 7.0 innings with 1 ER or less in his MLB debut since **Michael Wacha** vs. KC (5/30/2013), and first to do so and earn the win since **Tyler Lyons** (5/22/13 at SD). Started the game with 5.0 scoreless innings, most since **Austin Gomber** with 6.1 scoreless innings at CIN (7/23/2018).
- Earned a win in relief in his second MLB appearance with 3.0 scoreless innings in relief vs. PIT (9/18/24) in a 10-5 win at Busch Stadium. Is the only Cardinal in franchise history to earn a win as a starting pitcher and then a relief pitcher in his first two appearances (7/31 vs. TEX & 9/18 vs.

PIT).

- Threw a career-high 8.0 innings at San Francisco (9/29/24) on the final day of the regular season, allowing one run in a win. Marked the longest outing by a Cardinals starting pitcher in 2024
- His outing on Sept. 29, 2024 at SF made him one of 11 rookie pitchers in 2024 (12 instances) to throw 8.0 or more innings.
- Was the first Cardinal with nine or fewer walks and 80.0+ IP in their first 14 career games and only the 2nd in MLB history with **Elmer Steele** (1907-08) of the Boston Red Sox.
- Over the past four seasons (2022-25), led Minor League Baseball in wins (39), innings pitched (552.1), games started (82) and complete games (4).

McGREEVY vs. DETROIT:

- Is making his 1st career appearance/start against Detroit and just his 5th career Interleague appearance (1-0, 1.13 ERA, 24.0 IP).
- Has never faced Tigers Triple-A Toledo Mud Hens club.
- In his first career Grapefruit League appearance on March 7, 2023, yielded six runs in 1.1 innings against the Tigers in a start at Lakeland's Publix Field at Joker Marchant Stadium.
- This is his 2nd career appearance against an American League Central opponent. Allowed one run over 5.0 innings on June 19, 2025 at Chicago's Rate Field in a no-decision.
