METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed Memorial Day off yesterday...The team is returning home after a six-game road trip (2-4) to Chicago-NL (1-2) and Colorado (1-2)...Tonight, the Mets begin a six-game homestand against Philadelphia (three games) and Toronto (three games).

HOMER HAPPY: After the Mets went five straight games without a home run, the Mets have homered in season-high 12 straight contests, hitting 21 home runs in that span...The Mets are 22-13 when hitting a home run this season and 9-7 when hitting multiple homers...In 2022, the Mets longest home run streak was nine games (September 9-17)...The team hit 14 home runs in that span...The last time the Mets had a longer streak was in 2019...From June 20-July 5 the Mets homered in 14 straight games, socking 24 dingers in that span...The 14-game homer streak is tied for the second-longest in franchise history.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga is set to take the bump tonight...It will mark his 10th start and his fifth at home...Overall he is 4-3 with a 3.94 ERA with 31 walks and 61 strikeouts...In five starts at Citi Field, Senga is 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA (4 ER/23.0 IP) with 14 walks and 29 strikeouts...His 61 punchouts through 10 career starts are the fourth-most by a Mets pitcher...Only Dwight Gooden (80), Matt Harvey (70) and Nolan Ryan (68) recorded more...The 61 strikeouts are the seventh-most by a Japanese-born player in a player's first 10 starts.

HOME, SWEET HOME: Jeff McNeil is batting .343 (23-67) with 10 runs, three doubles, a triple, one home run, nine RBI and 13 walks with a .451 OBP in 21 games at home this season...He has hit safely in seven straight games at home, batting .462 (12-26) with five runs, four RBI, two walks with a .944 OPS in that span...Brett Baty is hitting .340 (16-47) with seven runs, four doubles, four home runs, seven RBI, six walks with a .415 OBP and a .681 SLG in 15 games at Citi Field in 2023.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has homered in seven of his last 12 games...Overall, he has hit 20 home runs this year, which leads the majors leagues...His 46 RBI are third in The Show and lead the National League...Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 426 career RBI...Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468)...Alonso has appeared in all 54 of the Mets games this year.

ITS'S GONNA BE MAY: Pete Alonso has socked 10 home runs in May, one shy of his career high for any month...Alonso recorded 11 in September of 2019...This is the fifth time Alonso has clubbed at least 10 homers in a single month, the most ever by a Met...Howard Johnson is second with three such months, while Carlos Beltran, Dave Kingman and Darryl Strawberry reached 10 homers in a month twice each...Courtesy Sportradar.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez is on an eight-game hitting streak, the longest of his young career...He is batting .400 (12-30) in that span with seven runs, two doubles, five home runs, 13 RBI, one walk with a .455 OBP, a .967 SLG and a 1.421 OPS...The backstop is batting .303 (23-76) with six doubles, seven home runs, five walks with a .361 OBP and a .658 SLG against right-handed pitching this year...In 21 games in May, Alvarez is batting .309 (21-68) with 11 runs, six doubles, seven home runs, 17 RBI, six walks with a 1.087 OPS.

PHILLIES-METS NOTES: The Mets take on the Phillies for the first time this season...The Mets have won six of their last seven games against the Phillies at Citi Field.

YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS: Francisco Alvarez has hit eight home runs this season...That puts him tied for the third-most by a rookie in the majors and tied for the second-most in the National League...Only two rookie catchers in Mets history have had more homers in a season...Travis d'Arnaud (13) holds the club mark for home runs by a rookie catcher in 2014...Jason Phillips hit 11 as a rookie in 2003...Alvarez's nine career homers before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Iván Rodríguez had 21 from 1991-1993.

IN THE CITI: The Mets have played 21 games at Citi Field, the fewest home games in the majors this season...The team is 12-9 at Citi Field this year...The team won 54 games at home last year...That was their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are 9-8 against the division this year...They are 4-5 against the division at Citi Field in 2023...The team went 50-26 against the East in 2022.

IF YOU START ME OFF: The Mets are 13-0 this season when the starter goes at least 6.0 innings and 4-0 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 16-3 (.832) when scoring first this season...On the other hand, the Mets are 11-24 (.314) when their opponent scores first...Since the start of 2022, the Mets are 97-19 when scoring first...Their .836 winning percentage is the best in the majors.

FIRST INNING: The Mets have been outscored 43-13 in the first inning this year.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets lead the major leagues with a 86.0% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 14 bags this year, tied for seventh in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 328 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 24-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 119 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the longest streak in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of 117 consecutive games...From October 1, 1990- September 2, 1992, the Mets also won 117 straight games when ahead after eight innings.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed 18 errors in 54 games this year...That gives the team a .990 fielding percentage...Their .990 fielding percentage ranks second in the majors and in the NL...Their 18 errors are tied with the Padres for the fewest committed in the majors.

COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF: Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP Al Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his second career loss on May 24 against Chicago (NL)... Threw 5.0 innings, allowing three runs on six hits...Finished with a career-high five walks and six strikeouts...Recorded a career-high 106 pitches, his third game with 100-plus pitches.

STRIKE 'EM OUT: Senga has 61 strikeouts through his first nine career major league games, the third-most in franchise history behind Dwight Gooden (73) and Nolan Ryan (71).

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 33 of his 61 strikeouts through nine starts...The pitch has a 57.3 percent whiff rate and a 27.3 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just six hits in 48 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .125 batting average.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven Matz.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

2022: Last season, Senga went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION: Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO (1-2, 6.75)

LAST TIME OUT: Recorded his first win of the season, throwing 6.2 in the Mets 10-1 win against Chicago (NL) on May 25...Allowed one run on five hits, with two walks and four strikeouts.

MILESTONES & MORE: At this point in the 2023 campaign, Carrasco is nearing 1500.0 career innings with 1473.1...Is also on the precipice of 300 games and 250 starts with 288 and 241, respectively. Last season, Carrasco made 29 starts last year, his most in a single season since making 30 starts in 2018...Carrasco is one of 14 hurlers with at least five seasons of 150+ strikeouts since 2015.
