## RHP Carlos Carrasco $(13-4,3.76)$ vs. RHP Spencer Strider (6-4, 3.11)

 SNY - WCBS 880 AM • ESPN 1050METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets blanked the Phillies, 6-0, on Sunday in New York...The Mets have won eight of their last nine games and 17 of their last 20 games...The Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (14-3)...The Mets are 59-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 27-6-3 in 36 series this year...The Mets just finished an 11-game homestand (9-2), their longest of the year...Tonight, the Mets begin a 10-game, nineday road trip to Atlanta (four games), Philadelphia (four games) and New York-AL (two games).

TWO GOOD: The Mets have allowed two runs or fewer in eight straight games...That ties a franchise record, accomplished by the 1969 team from September 8-13...The Houston Astros (May 2-10) are the only other team with a similar streak this year...The Astros are the last team to record a nine-game streak, doing so from August 18-26, 2015...The innings) with 15 walks and 96 strikeouts...The Mets have allowed a total of 11 runs in their last eight games, outscoring opponents 40-11.

BLANK STREET: The Mets recorded their MLB-leading 16th shutout of the season yesterday and their second in a row...It was the second time this season the team recorded a shutout in consecutive games (also, May 31 - June 1 vs. Washington)...The most since they 19 in 2010...The Mets have been blanked only five times this season.

SERIES-LY: The Mets allowed two runs in the three-game series against the Phillies...It was their fewest in a three-game series since yielding two runs in a three-game sweep of the Rockies from September 8-10, 2014 at Citi Field...Mets starting pitchers allowed one earned run in 18.0 innings in the series ( 0.50 ERA)...The rotation is $8-0$ with a 1.11 ERA ( 7 earned runs/56.2 innings) in the team's last nine games.

ATL-ONSO: The Mets have eight wins against Atlanta this year and Alonso has driven in the game-winning run in six of those games...Manny Machado (five vs. San Francisco) is the only other player with five or more game-winning RBI against one team this year...Only four players have had more than six game-winning RBI against a single opponent in one season since game-winning RBI started being tracked in 1974: Michael Cuddyer (2009 Twins vs. Royals), Gary Sheffield ( 2002 Braves vs. Phillies), Andy Van Slyke (1990 Pirates vs. Cubs) and Keith Hernandez (1982 Cardinals vs. Cubs) were each responsible for seven game-winning RBI.

TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUIST: Jeff McNeil has hit . 333 (19-57) with seven runs, six doubles, a home run, five RBI and four walks in 16 career games at the home of the Braves...Tomás Nido owns a 300 (9-30) average with five runs, a double, a home run three RBI and two walks in 10 games at the yard...Pete Alonso has hit .258/.375/.452 with 10 extra-base hits and 20 RBI in 25 career games at Truist Park.

C IS FOR COOKIE: Since the start of July, Carlos Carrasco is $5-0$ with a 1.69 ERA (eight earned runs/ 42.2 innings) with 11 walks and 42 strikeouts...The Mets have won all seven of his starts...He ranks third in the majors and second in the National League with a 1.69 ERA since the start of July...Carrasco is set to make his third start against the Braves this year...He is $2-0$ with a 1.93 ERA (thre strikeouts against Atlanta in 2022.

STARTING OFF: Since the start of July, Mets starters have posted a MLB-best 2.37 ERA (61 earned runs/231.1 innings) in 39 games with 258 strikeouts and 53 walks...The Dodgers are second in that period with a 2.62 ERA, followed by the Astors with a 3.20 ERA...New Yorks' 258 strikeouts in that span lead the NL and are second in the majors... The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.43 in that span...The Mets rank third in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.43 ERA from their starters.

WE JUST KEEP DANCING LIKE WE'RE 22: Brandon Nimmo has reached base safely in 22 straight road games, the longest stretch of his career... He is batting .366 (34-93) with 23 runs, six doubles, five home runs, 16 RBI, nine walks with a .434 OBP, a .591 SLG and a 1.025 OPS in that span that dates to June 12...Overall, he is batting $.315 / .406 / .509$ with 46 runs, 11 doubles, two triples, nine home runs, 31 RBI and 26 walks in 55 road games Field in 2022 Nimmo's 406 road OBP is third in the

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets have won five of their last six road games and nine of their last $11 \ldots$ New York is $35-21$ on the road this year...The Mets have surpassed their
2021 road wins total ( $30-51$ )...Their .625 road winning percentage is the second-best in the majors...New York is batting 261/329/417 away from Citi Field Their 261 road in the majors...New York is batting . $261 / .329 / .417$ away from Citi Field...Their . 261 road average ranks third in the majors and second in the NL...The Mets rank second in the Show with a .329 OBP on the road.

JUST SHORT: Francisco Lindor has hit 20 home runs this season (19 as a shortstop)... Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016... He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...L ( 80 dasted 20 home runs in 2021 .... He has recorded 82 RBI in 114 games this season ( Mets his a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBl by a shortstop in Mets history...Jose Reyes owns the sixth the majors and fourth in the NL with 82 RB

GO AHEAD AND MAKE MY DAY: Pete Alonso leads the majors leagues with 31 goahead RBI this year...That is nine more than the next player, Francisco Lindor...Lindor is second in the majors with 22 go-ahead RBI...Alonso's 31 RBI are tied for the eighth most in single-season history...His career-high is 32 go-ahead RBI which he accomplished in 2019...Keith Hernandez owns the both the franchise recordand 36 go-ahead RBI in 1985 and 35 in 1984.

HECK OR HIGH-WATER: The Mets are a season-high 35 games over . 500 ...The last time the team was 35 games above .500 was when they were a season-high 35 games over on September 13, 2006...A win tonight would mark the most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60)...New York has won 75 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the second-most in the majors...Their 652 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has
posted a $75-40$ record through the team's first 115 games. Only the $1986(76-39)$ team posted a $75-40$ record through the team's first 115 games...Only the 1986 (76-39) team posted a better record through the first 115 games of the season.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 17-5 in the second-half...The team's 17 wins are the second-most in the majors, and their .773 winning percentage also ranks second... The team is batting .288/.357/.461 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and OBP and are third in SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 115-65 following the break.

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season... He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs... Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs...Alonso is second in the majors and leads the National League with 97 RBI.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is seeking to record 100 RBI in a season for the second time in his career...Alonso recorded 120 RBI in 2019, his rookie year... He is seeking to become the eighth player in franchise history with multiple seasons with 100 or more RBI...He would be first Met to do so since Carlos Beltrán and Carlos Delgado accomplished the feat in 2007 and 2008.

POLAR EXPRESS: Alonso recently surpassed 1,000 career road plate appearances.. Among the over 2,500 players in major league history with at least 1,000 PA on the road, Alonso's .940 OPS away from home ranks 15th, just behind Stan Musial (.944) and Mickey Mantle (.958)...Only Mike Trout (.979) and Juan Soto (.967) have better marks among active hitters...Alonso's .583 career road slugging percentage leads active players and is the seventh-best all-time behind six of the top hitters in major league history: Babe Ruth (.681), Lou Gehrig (.644), Ted Williams (.615), Joe DiMaggio (.610), Barry Bonds (.597) and Mark McGwire (.586)...This season, Alonso is third in the majors with 17 road home runs and is sixth with a .562 SLG in away games.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Edwin Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 94 strikeouts...That is 23 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has struck out $52.2 \%$ of batters faced ( $94 / 180$ ), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 47 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.87 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00 ...Overall, he is 2-1 with 27 saves, a 1.33 ERA (seven earned runs/47.1 innings), allowing 27 hits and 14 walks...The Mets are 41-6 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 20 outings dating back to June 22, covering 20.0 innings, establishing a career-high scoreless streak... 40 of Díaz last 56 outs have been recorded via the strikeout... He was won back-to-back ERA (one earned runs/26.2 innings) with 11 hits, four walks and 56 strikeouts... He has converted all 16 saves in that period.

WHAT A RELIEF: The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.48 ERA (151 earned runs/390.1 are third in the Senior Circuit and fifth in the majors.

LAST START: Earned the win on August 9 vs. Cincinnati, allowing two runs on seven hits (one home run) and a walk with nine strikeouts in 6.2 innings...Was his seventh outing of the season with more than 6.0 innings pitched, third-most on the club behind nine such games from Chris Bassitt and Max Scherzer....He has 14 starts with two earned runs or fewer this year, the most on the club and tied for 14th-most in the National League among starting pitchers.

WINNER, WINNER: His 13 wins on the season are tied for the fourth-most in the majors...The Mets have won each of his last seven starts... Has won five consecutive decisions since July 3, his second-longest win-streak of the season...Won six consecutive decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season.

THAT'S QUALITY STUFF: Registered his ninth quality start of the season in his last outing on August 9...Notched just two such starts last year... Has notched three consecutive quality starts since July 30 for the first time since finishing 2020 with six in a row...He has reached double-digit victories for the fifth time in his career (also, 2015-2018) and has earned 10 wins prior to the All-Star break for the fourth time in his career (also, 2015, 2017 \& 2018).

CLUTCH COOKIE: Carrasco did not allow a run in 22.2 consecutive innings from July 14-August 4, surpassing his previous career-long scoreless streak of 22.0 innings from July 30-August 11, 2015...He threw three straight scoreless starts for the first time in his career from July $14-30$...He has three scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings in a single season for the first time since 2018... His six scoreless starts of at least 5.0 innings are tied for third-most in the majors behind Paul Blackburn (OAK) and Justin Verlander's (HOU) seven such starts.

VS. ATLANTA: Has gone 2-0 posting a 1.93 ERA (three earned runs/14.0 innings) in two starts against the Braves this season...Will mark just his second career start on the road against the Braves, joining October 2, 2021...Made a 2.0-inning relief appearance at Atlanta on August 27, 2013 while with Cleveland...Carrasco has gone 10-3 with a 3.06 ERA ( 37 earned runs/ 109.0 innings) in 23 career games ( 18 starts) against National League East foes...It is his lowest ERA against any division in the majors...This season, his seven wins against the NL East lead the majors.

THAT MAKES 100: Carrasco earned the 100th win of his career on July 30 at Miami...He became the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100 -win milestone and the fifth-fastest Venezuelan-born hurler to accomplish the feat, doing so in his 274 th career game...Is one of 18 active pitchers with 100 career victories.

JULY HEAT: Carrasco went 3-0 with a 0.90 ERA (three earned runs/ 30.0 innings), nine walks and 27 strikeouts in five starts in the month of July...It is his lowest ERA for any month in his career and the third-lowest for any single month in Mets history since 1990 (min. 30.0 IP)...In that time frame, he joins Frank Viola ( 0.86 ERA, April 1991), AI Leiter (0.92 ERA, April 2002), R.A. Dickey (0.93 ERA, June 2012) and Jacob deGrom ( 0.51 ERA, April 2021) as the only Mets pitchers with a sub-1.00 ERA in a single month.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelanborn pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego.
