FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals continue their homestand tonight with the second game of a three-game Interleague series against the Houston Astros (1-0), followed by the division-rival Chicago Cubs visiting Busch beginning Tuesday.

RED-HOT REDBIRDS: Winners of six in a row, nine out of 10, 12 of 14, and 16 of their last 22, the Cardinals enter today holding sole possession of 1st place in the National League Central for the first time since May 6, and this late in the season for the first time since October 3, 2015...St. Louis is nine games over .500 for first time since May 2 (20-11 record)...Since the All-Star break (July 11-present), St. Louis and San Francisco co-lead MLB with 12 wins.

SOARING: The Cardinals current six-game win streak (July 21-present) is the longest active in MLB and the club's longest since winning eight in a row last season (August 7-15).

REJUVENATING JULY: St. Louis (15-6, .714) trails only San Francisco (17-4, .810) among NL teams in July win pct. and wins. The Cardinals' .714 win pct. is currently tied for their 5th-best in July in club history and best since the 2004 squad (20-5, .800) that reached the World Series.

2004 NATIONAL LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP ANNIVERSARY CEREMONY: In celebration of the 15th anniversary of the 2004 NL Championship season, the Cardinals will honor 24 former team and staff members in a pregame ceremony before tonight's game against the club's NLCS opponent, the Houston Astros.

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: St. Louis is 188-181 all-time in Interleague play, with a .509 win pct. that ties the New York Mets for best among National League clubs...The Cardinals are 7-7 vs. the American League this season, and have finished with a winning Interleague record 13 times in 22 seasons (since 1997).

THE GOLDEN TICKET: Paul Goldschmidt extended his career-best homer streak to five games last night, one shy of the Cardinals record of six shared by Matt Carpenter (July 14-21-G2, 2018) and Mark McGwire (Sept. 27, 1997-April 4, 1998). His team-leading 23rd homer last night also was his 12th to either tie the game or give the Cardinals the lead (T7th in NL), and sixth game-winning homer (T3rd NL). St. Louis is 15-6 when Goldy goes yard (11-1 since June 1).

EAT YOUR WIE-TIES: Matt Wieters' nine homers this season (115 at-bats) are most by a Cardinals switch-hitting catcher since Ted Simmons (21 in 1980) and most by any Cardinals backstop not named Yadier Molina since Tom Pagnozzi (career high 13 in 1996)...from 2011-18, Cardinals catchers besides Molina have combined to hit nine home runs (1,268 at-bats): Tony Cruz 5, Francisco Peña 2, A.J. Pierzynski 1, Gerald Laird 1). In the month of July, Wieters leads all NL catchers in home runs (5), slugging pct. (.596) and OPS (.929).

CHICKS DIG THE LONG BALL: The Cardinals have homered in a season-high 10 straight games (July 17-present), with 22 home runs hit by 10 different Cardinals, including six by Paul Goldschmidt. The last time St. Louis went yard in 11 in a row was during a 16-game homer streak last season (August 7-24). The 10-game homer stretch is the longest active in the NL, trailing only Minnesota (11).

HOUSTON CONNECTIONS

Paul Goldschmidt graduated from The Woodlands (Tex.) High School...grew up a fan of Jeff Bagwell and Craig Biggio...as a high school senior, was seated in the center field upper deck at Minute Maid Park when Albert Pujols hit the famous home run off Astros closer Brad Lidge in Game 5 of the 2005 NLCS...played college baseball at Texas State University (2007-09) in San Marcos, Tex. where he left as the school's all-time leader in home runs (36) and RBI (178)...his No. 37 was retired in Feb. 2015, becoming the first TSU baseball player to have his jersey retired.

Paul Goldschmidt and Andrew Miller were teammates with Alex Bregman on the gold-winning USA squad in the 2017 World Baseball Classic.

Giovanni Gallegos made his MLB debut (with the Yankees) against Houston on May 12, 2017 at Yankee Stadium...his first strikeout victim was Houston's Brian McCann (swinging) on May 14, 2017.

Daniel Ponce de Leon pitched his junior season (2013) at the University of Houston...selected by the Cubs in the MLB 2013 Draft, but failed his physical due to concerns about the ulnar nerve placement in his right elbow...later ruled ineligible by the NCAA to return to Houston and transferred to Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach, Fla. for his senior season (2014).

Dexter Fowler played in 116 games with Houston in 2014...became an Astro via trade with Colorado, exchanged for outfielder Brandon Barnes and pitcher Jordan Lyles (Dec. 3, 2013).

Adam Wainwright's first MLB start was April 6, 2007 at Houston (W, 7.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 3 BB, 4 K).

Hitting Coach Jeff Albert worked six seasons in the Astros organization (2013-18), serving as a Roving Hitting Instructor (2013), Minor League Hitting Coordinator (2014-17) and Houston's Second Hitting Coach (2018).

Pitching coach Mike Maddux pitched in 21 games during his final professional season with the Astros in 2000...coached three seasons as the pitching coach for Houston's AA-Round Rock (2000-02)...Round Rock made the Texas League playoffs all three seasons in which he was pitching coach and won the 2000 league championship (2000).

First Base Coach Stubby Clapp worked five seasons (2007-12) in the Astros organization, serving as hitting coach for A-Lexington for three seasons (2007-09), one season as hitting coach for Double-A Corpus Christi (2010), and taking on his first managerial role with short-season Tri-City for two seasons (2011-12)...played college baseball at Texas Tech University.

Aledmys Díaz signed with the Cardinals as a free agent and played two seasons with St. Louis (2016-17)...in 2016, became the first Cardinals rookie to make the All-Star team since Albert Pujols (2001)...traded by St. Louis to Toronto for outfielder J.B. Woodman (Dec. 1, 2017).

Astros Pitching Coach Brent Strom spent six seasons (2008-13) with the Cardinals organization, serving as minor league pitching instructor (2008-11) and pitching coordinator (2012-13).

Astros bench coach Joe Espada played in eight games for the Triple-A Memphis Redbirds in 2003.

Astros President of Baseball Operations and GM Jeff Luhnow spent eight seasons with the Cardinals as VP of Baseball Development (2003-05), VP of Player Procurement (2005), and VP of Scouting and Player Development (2006-11). During his time with the Cardinals, oversaw scouting, international, and player development that brought in many players instrumental to the 2011 World Series victory, the 2012 NLCS team and 2013 World Series team...of the 25 players on the Cardinals' 2013 World Series roster, 16 were drafted while he oversaw player development and scouting.

Astros owner Jim Crane was born in St. Louis and grew up a Cardinals fan in nearby Dellwood...caddied for members of the Cardinals team at local golf clubs and parked cars for patrons at Cardinals games...graduated from Lutheran High School North in St. Louis County (1972)...played college baseball at Central Missouri State University (1973-76)...inducted in the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame (2017) and St. Louis Sports Hall of Fame (2018)...received the Jack Buck Award from the Missouri Athletic Club in St. Louis (2018).

Astros Special Assistant to the GM, People Operations & Major League Translator Oz Ocampo began his career with the Cardinals in 2005 as their Dominican academy administrator and coordinator of Latin American scouting.

Astros Manager, Baseball Administration Alexandra Noboa worked two seasons as a Cardinals Spanish Interpreter (2016-17).

Astros Community Outreach Exec. José Cruz played five seasons with St. Louis (1970-74), making his MLB debut...purchased by Houston (Oct. 24, 1974).

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Rookie right-hander makes his seventh Major League start of the 2019 season and his 11th career start (21st appearance).
- Tonight marks his third start since officially being designated as a regular in the starting rotation. It's also his first career start in Interleague play.
- In six starts this season with St. Louis, is 0-0 with a 2.54 ERA (28.1 IP) and 29 strikeouts. The Cardinals are 5-1 in his games started in 2019.
- Is 0-2 with a 2.64 ERA in 10 career starts (47.2 IP/14 ER), receiving just 17 runs of support (1.70 runs/game). St. Louis is 6-4 in his 10 career starts.
- Two of his six prior starts this season were as fill in for Adam Wainwright (6/14 at NYM & 7/12 vs. ARI).

LAST TIME OUT

- Lasted just 3.0 innings as pitch count quickly climbed to 86. Cardinals went on to win in extra innings on Paul Goldschmidt grand slam that snapped 2-2 tie in 10th.

2019 SEASON

- Paul Goldschmidt has had HR for GW-RBI in three of his first six games started, including each of the past two.
- Allowed career-high eight hits and matched career-high four runs in St. Louis come-from-behind 6-5 win over the Pirates in 7/17 home stand finale.
- Made emergency start for (7/12) Adam Wainwright (back spasms) and limited Arizona to one run on three hits in his 6.2 IP, striking out seven. Took ND in the 4-2 loss.
- Had a career-best 7.2 scoreless innings streak between his 7/4 relief appearance at Seattle and 7/12 start vs. Arizona.
- Gained his 1st career MLB win on 7/4 at Seattle with 2.2 scoreless IP and 3 strikeouts in his 2nd relief appearance of 2019.
- Fanned a career-high 9 on 6/29 at SD in 5.1 relief IP. The 9 strikeouts in relief were the most by a Cardinal since Al Hrabosky did so 9/25/74 vs. PIT. His 5.1 relief innings were also a Cardinals season high.
- Recalled on 6/25 when Jordan Hicks went to 10-day IL and LHP Genesis Cabrera was optioned to Memphis (AAA); was his third recall this season (also 4/23 & 6/9).
- Optioned to Memphis (AAA) on 6/20 when Adam Wainwright was activated from the 10-day IL, but did not pitch.
- Scattered two hits over 6.0 scoreless innings in a 6/19 start vs. Miami.
- Made a spot start for St. Louis on April 23 vs. Milwaukee and took a no-decision in the Cardinals 4-3 win, allowing just one run in his 5.0 IP with 7 strikeouts.
