THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY
On this date in 1998, just prior to the last home game of the season, **Cal Ripken, Jr.** asked manager **Ray Miller** to be removed from the lineup...Ripken's consecutive game streak ended at a Major League record 2,632 games and covered a span of 16 years...**Ryan Minor** started at third base, and the Orioles fell, 5-4, to the New York Yankees.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Orioles conclude their home schedule today with their 33rd home game...Due to rescheduled games, the Orioles will finish with more than 30 home games...At home this season, the Orioles currently own a 12-20 record, but rank third in the AL and eighth in the majors with 139 runs scored at home...The O's enter play today tied with the Chicago Cubs with most games played at home (32).

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Orioles dropped their fourth consecutive game, and they have lost their last six consecutive games against Tampa Bay...Baltimore has now scored one-or-fewer runs 13 times this season, and eight times in their last 11 games...The O's are now 0-20 in games in which they have scored three-or-fewer runs.

- 📍 **RHP Jorge López** was dealt his first loss of the season after allowing three runs on a season-high eight hits and one walk with five strikeouts through 6.0 innings of work.
- 📍 **INF/OF Ryan Mountcastle** went 2-for-4 and picked up his 11th multi-hit game of the season...He has now reached base safely in 21 of his first 28 games (21 of his 27 starts), and he has hit safely in 17 of his 27 starts.

WAKE ME UP WHEN SEPTEMBER ENDS: According to *teamrankings.com* the O's 2020 strength of schedule (as of September 20) ranks as the toughest in the AL and fourth-toughest in the majors.

- 📍 During the month of September, O's hitters rank eighth in the AL in OPS (.722), rank seventh in batting average (.246), and rank fourth in home runs (24).
- 📍 **OF DJ Stewart's** seven home runs are tied for second in the AL lead in September and **INF/OF Ryan Mountcastle** ranks fifth in the AL with 17 RBI, Stewart ranks ninth in the AL with 14 RBI, and **INF Rio Ruiz** is tied for 15th in the AL with 12 RBI during the month.
- 📍 The O's 4.09 ERA (71 ER/156.1 IP) during September ranks seventh-best in the AL...O's pitchers have allowed 71 earned runs during the month to rank seventh-fewest in the AL.

IF YOU AIN'T FIRST, YOU'RE LAST: On the first pitch of a plate appearance, the Orioles rank first in the AL and second in the majors in batting average (.412), and rank second in the AL and fourth in the majors in OPS (1.096), while ranking tied for seventh in the majors in extra-base hits (29)...The Orioles rank second in the AL and are fourth in the majors in doubles (18), and are second in the AL in hits (77) as a team on the first pitch.

SMALL BALL FOR ALL: The O's lead the majors with 15 bunt hits this season...**OF Cedric Mullins** leads the majors with nine bunt hits, while **INF Hanser Alberto** is tied for fourth in the majors with four bunt hits and **INF/OF Andrew Velazquez** is tied for 10th in the majors with two bunt hits.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Orioles pitchers have allowed just seven runs in the seventh inning this year for a 1.29 ERA (7 ER/49.0 IP)...It is the fewest runs allowed in the seventh inning in the majors, with the second-closest team (New York-AL) allowing 14 runs.

- 📍 **LHP Tanner Scott** has made nine appearances in the seventh inning (6.1 IP) without allowing a run, while **LHP Paul Fry** has made eight appearances in the seventh inning (6.1 IP) without allowing a run.
- 📍 On the offensive side, the Orioles have scored 30 runs in the seventh inning, tied for fourth-most in the AL and tied for ninth-most in the majors.

RACE FOR .400: **INF José Iglesias** is hitting .377 (49-for-130) through his first 36 games with the Orioles...Among players with at least 120 at-bats, Iglesias' .377 average leads the majors...**DJ LeMahieu** of the New York Yankees ranks second in the majors with a .368 mark (min. 120 AB)...The last player in the majors to hit over .390 in a season was San Diego's **Tony Gwynn**, who hit .394 during 110 games of the strike-shortened 1994 season.

LEFT IS RIGHT: Since the start of the 2019 season, **INF Hanser Alberto** leads the majors with 102 hits off of left-handed pitching...In that time, he leads the majors with a .389 (102-for-262) average against lefties...This season, Alberto ranks 20th in the AL among qualifying hitters with a .282 (55-for-195) average against all pitchers.

SABR 50 2.0: The Society for American Baseball Research (SABR) has announced that their 50th national convention will be held in Baltimore from June 16-20, 2021...SABR 50 was originally scheduled for July 2020, but was rescheduled due to the COVID-19 pandemic...The SABR national convention is an annual gathering of writers, researchers, fans, players, executives, scouts, and many others throughout the baseball community...Attendance is open to all baseball fans...For more information, visit SABR.org/convention.

INJURED LIST: Six players are on the Injured List...**RHP Shawn Armstrong** (left SI joint inflammation), **INF Chris Davis** (left knee patellar tendinitis), and **OF Anthony Santander** (right oblique strain) are on the 10-day Injured List...**LHP Wade LeBlanc** (left elbow stress reaction), **INF/OF Trey Mancini** (colorectal cancer recovery/treatment), and **INF Richie Martin** (right wrist fracture) are on the 60-day IL.

COACHING STAFF: The O's named **Fredi González** as Major League Coach, **Darren Holmes** as Bullpen Coach, and **Anthony Sanders** as First Base Coach...**José Hernández** shifted from Major League Coach to Assistant Hitting Coach...All other coaches remained in their same positions from the 2019 season: **Doug Brocail** as Pitching Coach, **Tim Cossins** as Major League Field Coordinator/Catching Instructor, **José Flores** as Third Base Coach, and **Don Long** as Hitting Coach.

THE SKIPPER: **Brandon Hyde** was named the 20th manager in O's history on December 14, 2018...He began his first Major League managerial role following 16 professional seasons in the coaching ranks and four as a player...Most recently, Hyde served as bench coach for the Chicago Cubs in 2018, his second season in that role (also 2014)...Hyde spent three seasons as the Cubs first base coach from 2015-17, and previously served as Chicago's Director of Player Development from August 2012-2013, after joining the Cubs in December of 2011 as their Minor League Field Coordinator...Prior to joining the Cubs, Hyde spent nine seasons in the Marlins organization.

LAST START: Made his eighth start of the season on 9/13 at NYY...Recorded his second-straight start of 6.0 innings after failing to do so through his first six starts of the season...Took a no-decision after allowing just one run on five hits (one home run) and one walk with four strikeouts...Has allowed at least one home run in each of his last five starts, and in seven of his eight outings this year... The Orioles have lost seven of the eight games that Means has started this year.

CAREER VS. TAMPA BAY: Making his fifth appearance (fourth start) against the Rays...Has gone 2-1 with a 3.68 ERA (9 ER/22.0 IP) in his first four games against Tampa Bay, which all came in the 2019 season...Will be his third start against the Rays at Oriole Park...Earned the win in his last start against Tampa Bay, which came at home on 8/24/19, when he tossed 7.0 innings, allowing one run on five hits (one home run) while racking up seven strikeouts.

FACING THE AL EAST: Means has faced AL East opponents in 20 games (15 starts) throughout his career...Owns a 7-5 record and 4.78 ERA (46 ER/86.2 IP) with 72 strikeouts in these outings...AL East opponents are batting .251 (85-for-339) with 38 extra-base hits (19 doubles and 19 home runs) against Means in his career.

STARTING SLOW: Means has posted an 11.74 ERA (10 ER/7.2 IP) in the first inning in his eight starts this season, his highest mark of any inning...Opponents are hitting .344 (11-for-32) with two home runs and two walks in the first inning... For his career, Means' first inning ERA is 5.45 (21 ER/34.2 IP) and opponents are batting .246 (33-for-134).

HOME VS. ROAD: Means has started five of his eight games at home this season...In 23 career games (21 starts) at home, Means is 8-8 with a 3.67 ERA (44 ER/108.0 IP), compared to 5-6 with a 4.70 ERA (43 ER/82.1 IP) in 17 games (14 starts) on the road...Has held opponents to a .222 (91-for-409) clip in games at Oriole Park, as opposed to his .264 (85-for-322) opponent average on the road.

LEFT IS RIGHT: Means has held lefties to a .212 average (38-for-179) in his career, compared to a .250 clip (138-for-552) against right-handed batters...Means held left-handed hitters to a .184 (26-for-141) clip last season, which ranked eighth-lowest in the AL and 13th-lowest in the majors...Lefties had a .223 OBP and slugged just .333 against Means...Left-handers hit .153 (13-for-85) against him at Oriole Park in 2019.

AT THE TOP OF HIS CLASS: Finished the 2019 campaign leading all rookie pitchers (min. 155.0 IP) in opponent batting average (.234), and ranked in the top 10 among rookie pitchers in: opponent OPS (2nd - .702), WHIP (2nd - 1.14), K/BB (2nd - 3.18), ERA (3rd - 3.60), K/9 (3rd - 7.03), winning percentage (3rd - .522), wins (4th - 12), opponent SLG (4th - .417), HR/9 (4th, 1.34), strikeouts (5th - 121), and Quality Starts (6th - 11)...He received votes from the media in April and May's voting for AL Rookie of the Month.

SECOND HALF RECAP: Means made 13 starts in the second half of 2019, pitching to a 5-7 record with a 4.85 ERA (39 ER/72.1 IP) and six Quality Starts... He worked at least 6.0 innings in seven of his 13 post-All-Star break starts, going 4-2 with a 3.13 ERA (16 ER/46.0 IP) in such games...Had a career-high four-game losing streak from 7/24-8/19, followed by a two-game winning streak from 8/24-8/30, during which he allowed just three earned runs over 14.0 innings of work with 11 strikeouts and no walks.
