To win the AL East for the fifth time in franchise history and the first since 2021...have secured their spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final homestand of the season, a nine-game stretch against the Astros (1-0, two to play), Athletics (three to play), and Red Sox (three to play), tonight at Tropicana Field...have won five of their last seven, 10 of their last 15, and 12 of their last 18 games (Aug. 23–pres.)...since July 20, the Rays are an MLB-best 32-17 (.653)...four of their five remaining series (including current set) come against opponents currently in position to qualify for the postseason...hold a 3-0-game lead over the second-place Yankees in the AL standings, marking the fifth latest date in franchise history they have led the division, trailing only their division titles in 2021, 2020, 2010, and 2008...have spent 117 days leading the division (77 consecutive days, June 27–pres.), 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...have held the AL's best record for 116 days in addition to leading the AL East for 117 days, both of which are franchise records (Stats Perform).

- ★ The Rays became the first team in the majors to clinch a spot in the postseason with a 3-1, walk-off victory over the Astros (see more in the "162+" note below).
- ★ **Junior Caminero** launched the Rays' first walk-off home run since April 19, 2025 vs. NYY (**Jonathan Aranda**) and the first at Tropicana Field since June 11, 2024 vs. CHC (**Brandon Lowe**)—see more in the "Brightest Lights, Biggest Moments" note below.
- ★ The Rays have won in each **Drew Rasmussen's** 10 post-All-Star break starts, tying **Blake Snell** (Aug. 10–Sept. 29, 2018) for the second-longest streak in franchise history...the streak is one behind **Matt Moore's** (11G, Sept. 22, 2012–May 19, 2013) franchise record...the last AL pitcher to have their club accomplish the feat was **HOU Framber Valdez** (13G, May 7–July 22, 2025), with **PHI Jesus Luzardo** (10G, May 25–July 18) and **MIL Kyle Harrison** (10G, April 21–June 14) marking the only hurlers to turn the trick this season.
- ★ **Victor Mesa Jr.** homered for the third straight game (Sept. 9–pres.) for the second time this season (also: July 18–20)...he is the first Ray to have multiple home run streaks of three games or more in a single season since **Caminero** in 2025 (3x)...he can join **Gabe Kapler** (4G, June 8–16, 2009) as the only player in team history to homer in four straight games as an outfielder.
- ★ The Rays returned to a season-high-tying 29 games over .500 (also: Sept. 9)...they were last 30 games above .500 at the conclusion of the 2023 season (99–63).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays selected **RHP Brody Hopkins** [TB No. 7] from Triple-A Durham and optioned **RHP Alex Cook** to Durham...to open a spot on the 40-man roster, **RHP Michael Grove** has been designated for assignment...Hopkins will wear No. 88.

- ★ As reliever this season in Triple-A, the right-hander has went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (20.0IP, 5ER), 33 strikeouts, and a 1.05 WHIP in 12 appearances...in his last outing on Sept. 9, Hopkins recorded a 102.1 mph pitch...the only pitcher in Rays history to throw a pitch 102.0 mph or faster is **LHP Mason Montgomery** (April 4, 2025 vs. PIT - 102.2 mph).
- ★ Hopkins was acquired on July 26, 2024 from the Mariners alongside **OF Aidan Smith** and **RHP Ty Cummings** for **OF Randy Arozarena**.

162+—The Rays have clinched a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in franchise history, sixth in the last eight seasons (2019–pres.), and for the first time since 2023...Sept. 11 marked the earliest date in team history the Rays have secured a spot in the postseason, surpassing 2023 and 2020 (both Sept. 17)...Their six postseason appearances since 2019 are tied for the third most in the majors over that timeframe with the Astros, Braves, and Yankees, behind the Dodgers (7) and Brewers (7; including this season)...each of the franchise's 10 postseason berths have come since becoming the Rays in 2008, tied for the third most in the majors over that span with the Braves, Cardinals and Brewers, three behind the Yankees (13) and five behind the Dodgers (15).

- ★ The Rays are 3.0 games in front of the Yankees for first place in the AL East, seeking their fifth division title in team history and first since winning back-to-back in 2020–21 (also: 2010 & 2008)...the AL East is the only division to have all five teams win a division title since 2018.

BRIGHTEST LIGHTS, BIGGEST MOMENTS—**Junior Caminero** launched a two-run, walk-off homer in the 13th inning last night, his first career walk-off plate appearance...per Elias, it marked the 11th time since 1903 when the first World Series was played that a player hit a walk-off home run on the same day his team clinched a postseason spot and the first since **SEA Cal Raleigh** on Sept. 30, 2022 vs. **OAK** (see table on the right)...of the 11 instances, Caminero's came on the earliest date in a season...it was the second instance in franchise history along with **Evan Longoria's** walk-off in Game 162 on Sept. 28, 2011 vs. NYY to secure a Wild Card spot...the Rays are one of three franchises to have multiple such events, joining the Los Angeles Dodgers and the Milwaukee/Atlanta Braves.

- ★ Caminero's blast marked his 40th of the season, securing the following distinctions:
 - ★ First Rays player in franchise history with multiple 40-homer campaigns after hitting 45 in 2025.
 - ★ Second player in the modern era (since 1900) with multiple 40-homer seasons in age-22- or younger campaigns (age as of June 30), joining **MLN Eddie Mathews** (1953–54).
 - ★ The first primary third baseman (min. 50% of games at the position) since **COL Nolan Arenado** (2015–16) to have back-to-back seasons with 40+ home runs, and the first AL primary third baseman to turn the trick since **LAA Troy Glaus** (2000–01).
 - ★ Became the 10th Dominican-born player with multiple 40-homer seasons and the second Dominican-born primary infielder to do so, joining his World Baseball Classic manager **Albert Pujols** (6x, 2004–06, 2009–10, 2015).
 - ★ The 10th player in the modern era to reach 92 career HR before his age-23 season, alongside **Mel Ott** (115), **Eddie Mathews** (112), **Alex Rodriguez** (106), **Tony Conigliaro** (104), **Juan Soto** (98), **Mike Trout** (98), **Frank Robinson** (98), **Bryce Harper** (97), and **Giancarlo Stanton** (93).
- ★ The blast marked the 68th walk-off home run in franchise history and the 13th on the first pitch of an at-bat...**Kameron Misner** on Opening Day (March 28 vs. COL) in 2025 was the last Ray to hit a first-pitch, walk-off home run and the last to accomplish the feat at Tropicana Field was **Travis d'Arnaud** on July 6, 2019 vs. NYY.

THE COUNTDOWN—With 15 games left in the 2026 regular season, the following Rays are within reach of the following accomplishments:

- ★ **Chandler Simpson** (306) is four points behind **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (310) for the AL batting title, attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only Rays to pace the AL in average...in doing so he would become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title within their first two major league seasons and the third since 1942, alongside **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season - 2001) and Rays Hall of Famer **BOS Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season - 1983)...only five players in the Wild Card era (since 1995) have hit .295 or better in each of their first two MLB seasons (min. 400AB in both seasons), joining **CHC Starlin Castro** (2010–11), **NY Yankees Robinson Cano** (2005–06), **STL Albert Pujols** (2001–02), and **Suzuki** (2001–02).
- ★ Simpson paces the AL in singles (140) and triples (6)—no Ray has ever paced the AL in the former category over a full season, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have finished atop the Junior Circuit's leaderboard in the latter...since 1983, only two AL hitters have led the league in both categories in the same season: **CLE Amed Rosario** (2022) and **KC Whit Merrifield** (2019)...Simpson needs five singles over the Rays final 15 games to match Crawford's club record from 2003 (145).
- ★ Diaz (.303) is on pace to become the second player in franchise history to finish back-to-back seasons with a .300 average or better (min. 502PA)...only **Carl Crawford**, who turned the trick twice in his career, has accomplished the feat as a Ray, doing so between 2005–07 and 2009–10...the pair are the only players in team history to have multiple qualified .300 or better seasons.
- ★ As a team, the Rays have opened September 6–4 and need to win seven of their final 15 games to secure their sixth straight month with a .500 record or better...it would mark the first time in franchise history they have finished a full season with a .500 record or better in every month and tie the franchise record for consecutive months going .500 or better (also: July 2019–Sept./Oct. 2020).

WHEELING AND DEADLINE DEALING—Prior to the Aug. 3 trade deadline, the Rays acquired **RHP Freddy Peralta** (Aug. 2), **C Liam Hicks** (Aug. 3), and **RHP Tyler Wells** (Aug. 3)...according to Baseball-Reference, the trio have combined for a 1.8 bWAR in the 36-game span since the deadline closed on Aug. 3.

- ★ When Hicks starts behind the plate for the Rays, the backstop is slashing .325/.402/.525 (26-for-80) with 4 2B, 4 HR, 17 RBI, and a .927 OPS...since being acquired on Aug. 3, he has an .859 OPS, 14th among AL hitters with 100 PA or more over that span.
- ★ Peralta turned in his third consecutive quality start (Aug. 26–pres.) Tuesday, earning the win in all three outings...his four quality starts in seven appearances as a Ray equal his total across 22 starts to begin the year with the Mets...during the three-start streak, the right-hander has spun a 1.00 ERA (18.0IP, 2ER) with 13 strikeouts to one walk and a .156 (10-for-64) opp. average.
- ★ Through 13 relief appearances, Wells has posted a 2-0 record with two saves, a 1.59 ERA (17.0IP, 3ER), a .145 (8-for-55) opp. average, and a 0.71 WHIP...his 0.71 WHIP is the second lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors since Aug. 3 (min. 15.0IP), while his .145 opp. average is tied for fifth in the AL and tied for ninth in MLB...he has allowed no runs in 11 of his 13 outings.

THE SUN & THE STARS—The Rays and Astros meet for their second set this season after the clubs met for a three-game series in Houston during Fourth of July weekend, with the Rays losing the set, 2-1...despite the series loss, the Rays have won four of their last six sets against the Astros (July 28, 2023–pres.), including a three-game series (2-1) at Steinbrenner Field between May 9–11, 2025.

- ★ Through 12 career games opposite the Astros, **Junior Caminero** has hit .277 (13-for-47) with 3 2B, 6 HR, 15 RBI, and a 1.057 OPS...nine of his last 10 hits against the Astros have gone for extra bases.

RIVERDOG DAYS—Last night, Class-A Charleston won Game 3 of their best-of-three Carolina League Divisional Series, 7-6...they are set to return to the Carolina League Championship Series tomorrow for the first time since 2023, when they won their third straight league title (2021–23).

TONIGHT'S START—**Ian Seymour** is slated to make his 14th start of the season and his 44th appearance...marks his 33rd career appearance and 19th career start...owns the second-most strikeouts (88) among AL LHP over his last 13 outings (10 starts) since July 1, trailing BOS **Payton Tolle** (90)...was selected in the second round (57th overall) of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of Virginia Tech.

- He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his last seven starts since July 18 at BOS, the longest active streak and third longest by a Ray this year...**Nick Martinez** owns the two longest streaks, with the longest being an 11-start stretch from March 30–May 29.
- Among AL pitchers with 100.0 innings pitched or more this season, his 4.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio ranks fourth among southpaws and 13th overall, with rotation-mate **Drew Rasmussen** leading the group (5.93).
- When pitching in the 4th inning this year, he has recorded 21 strikeouts in 15.1 IP, limiting the opposition to a .164 (9-for-55) clip...his opp. average in the frame is the third lowest among AL arms (min. 15.0IP in 4th inn.), behind **NYY Cam Schlitler** (130) and teammate **Shane McClanahan** (158).
- Since transitioning to a starting/bulk relief role on June 8, Seymour has turned in a 4.01 ERA (85.1IP, 38ER), 1.09 WHIP, and .227 (75-for-313) opp. average (17G/12GS) compared to a 5.23 ERA (31.0IP, 18ER), 1.35 WHIP, and .239 (27-for-113) across his first 26 appearances of the year (March 26–June 2).

LAST TIME OUT—Did not factor into the decision on Sept. 6 at TEX (3.0IP, 5H, 4R-3ER, BB, 2SO, 2HR), marking his shortest outing in his last nine appearances since July 18 at BOS (3.0IP)...surrendered two 1st-inning singles before yielding a **Jake Burger** solo home run to lead off the 2nd frame...retired six of his next seven batters faced through the 3rd inning, his lone 1-2-3 inning of the start... he issued a walk to **Wyatt Langford** to begin the 4th inning before allowing another homer to Burger...gave up a single to **Logan O’Hoppe** in the following at-bat before handing the ball to **Kevin Kelly**.

- Marked the first time in his career he has allowed multiple home runs to the same player in a game (**Jake Burger** - 2HR)...the last Ray to do so was **Mason Englert** on July 17 at BOS (G2) against **Wilyer Abreu** (2HR).
- He has allowed a home run in five straight games since Aug. 15 (9HR), the longest streak of his career...is the second-longest run by a Ray this season, with **Jesse Scholtens** giving up a long ball in six straight contests (May 8–Aug. 18 - 8HR).

OUT OF THIS WORLD—Seymour is set to take the mound for his first career start/appearance against the Astros tonight...in eight career appearances (three starts) against AL West competition, he is 2-1 with a 4.21 ERA (25.2IP, 12ER), 25 strikeouts, a 1.36 WHIP, and a .216 (21-for-97) opp. average...all three starts have come this year, where he has gone 1-1 with a 6.57 ERA (12.1IP, 9ER).

- His most recent outing against an AL West club came in his last start on Sept. 6 at TEX (3.0IP, 5H, 4R-3ER, BB, 2SO, 2HR).
- Seymour is 10-7 with a 3.98 ERA (131.0IP, 58ER), 150 strikeouts, a 1.16 WHIP, and a .212 (104-for-490) opp. average against the AL over 43 career outings (13 starts)...the Rays are 22-21 when he pitches against an AL foe in his career.

DOMES IS WHERE THE HEART IS—Seymour has appeared in 23 games (eight starts) at Tropicana Field this season...in those outings, he has a 4-4 record, a 3.82 ERA (63.2IP, 27ER), 77 strikeouts, a 0.99 WHIP, a .206 (48-for-233) opp. average, and two saves...he has allowed three runs or fewer in 22 of those 23 games in 2026, giving up six runs on July 12 vs. SEA...he is one of four AL pitchers with four wins or more, six holds or more (6), and multiple saves at home, joining **MIN Jeff Hoffman** (4W, 7HLD, 3SV), **MIN Andrew Morris** (4W, 9HLD, 3SV), and **BOS Garrett Whitlock** (5W, 10HLD, 2SV).

- Across 29 career appearances (nine starts) at home, he has allowed four earned runs or more just twice: Aug. 19, 2025 vs. NYY (6ER) and July 12, 2026 vs. SEA (5ER).

SWING-AND-MISS STUFF—He boasts a 29.2 pct. whiff rate this season, ranking sixth among active AL southpaws (min. 1,000 pitches) to **NYY Brent Headrick** (32.2%), **BOS Jovani Morán** (31.5%), **HOU Steven Okert** (30.9%), **TEX Jacob Latz** (30.4%), and **CLE Joey Cantillo** (29.4%)...117 of his 140 strikeouts this season have come on swings-and-misses, second most on the Rays behind **Drew Rasmussen** (130)...Seymour's 117 swinging strikeouts are fifth most among AL southpaws this season.

- His out-of-zone swing pct. (35.1%) has increased 8.7 points from his mark last season (26.4%).

CHANGING IT UP—Seymour has utilized his changeup 29.3 pct. of the time this season, down from his 31.4 pct. usage rate in 2025...his 29.3 pct. usage rate in 2026 ranks sixth in the majors (min. 1,500 pitches) and third among southpaws behind **PHI Cristopher Sánchez's** MLB-leading 37.6 pct. clip and **ATL Martín Pérez** (30.9%)...min. 500 changeups thrown this year, Seymour's 39.0 pct. whiff rate on the pitch is the fourth-highest mark in the majors behind **DET/LAD Tarik Skubal** (46.8%), **Sánchez** (45.7%), and **CLE Joey Cantillo** (39.4%).
