WARM IT UP: Today the Twins will play the fourth of 32 scheduled spring training games and the second official road game...their first road game was a 5-1 defeat in Bradenton against the Bucs...their second road game was cancelled due to rain after two innings on Monday at Port Charlotte...15 more games will be played at Lee Health Sports Complex and 13 games will be played on the road.

Tomorrow afternoon, Minnesota will continue Grapefruit League play with a two-game homestand against the Pirates on Thursday and they will host the Orioles on Friday.

TWINS WALK-OFF THE YANKEES: The Twins beat the Yankees yesterday afternoon by a score of 5-4 in walk-off fashion...Simeon Woods Richardson made his spring debut, allowing one run on three hits in 2.0 innings pitched, with no walks and three strikeouts...the Twins used eight pitchers as Matt Canterino made his return to a big league mound with 1.0 scoreless innings, three walks and one strikeout...Jhoan Duran worked an efficient third inning, throwing 12 pitches and getting three outs on three batters...the offense recorded five hits, two from Harrison Bader, who homered for the first time in a Twins uniform...Ty France also added a home run in the second inning...DaShawn Keirse Jr. hit a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth to score Diego Cartaya — the game-winning run.

BIG MO: Andrew Morris is in his first career major league spring training as a non-roster invite and making his exhibition debut...he began 2024 with High-A Cedar Rapids...named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week on April 7...earned award three more times on season: June 30, July 7 and August 11...threw first professional complete game, pitching 5.0 innings on May 9 at Iowa, allowing one run on six hits, with two walks and four strikeouts for theernels...promoted to Double-A and recorded first professional save on July 26 at Amarillo, allowing one run on five hits in 4.0 innings pitched for Wind Surge...made Triple-A debut in a start on August 13 at Indianapolis, allowing one run on two hits in 6.0 innings pitched, with one walk and two strikeouts...named Texas League Postseason All-Star after his time with Wichita...ranked third among all Twins minor leaguers in innings pitched (133.0) and second in strikeouts (133)...also ranked fourth in starts (24)...ranked by MLB.com as Twins sixth-best prospect entering 2025.

TWINS AND TIGERS: The Twins and Tigers are playing each other for the first of two spring games today...Fort Myers will host the Tigers on Tuesday, March 18...these two met twice in spring training of 2024 as the Twins lost 1-0 in Lakeland on March 12 and lost again to the Tigers at Lee Health Sports Complex on March 20...the Twins went 7-6 against the Tigers in the 2024 regular season, going 4-3 at Comerica Park and 3-3 at Target Field...these two clubs are scheduled to play each other 13 times during the regular season, beginning with a three-game series at Target Field from April 11-13...the first time the Twins will play in Detroit in 2025 will be for a three-game series from June 27-29.

CHASED DOWN BY TIGERS: The Twins finished the 2024 season with a record of 82-80, in fourth place in the American League Central and 10.5 games back of the division-winning Cleveland Guardians (92-69)...behind the Guards were the Royals (86-76) and Tigers (86-76), who both made the playoffs as wild card teams...Minnesota began the 2024 season by going 7-13 in their first 20 games through April 21...the Twins then won 12 straight from April 22-May 4 and continued to go 63-40 in their next 103 games from April 22-August 17, the most wins in baseball in that span...after August 17, they went 12-27 to finish the year and won just two of their final 12 series'.

On August 20, 2024, the Twins were in second place of the AL Central and 8.0 games ahead of the Tigers, who were in fourth place in the division.

DOWN TO THE CORE: Cory Lewis earned first professional save on August 2 vs. Northwest Arkansas, pitching 4.0 shutout innings...struck out season-high nine batters on August 8 at Corpus Christi (6.0 IP)...named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week on September 14 after making a start on September 12 vs. Tulsa, allowing one run on two hits in 6.0 innings pitched, with two walks and six strikeouts for Wind Surge...made one start for the Saints on September 19 vs. Indianapolis, allowing one run on seven hits in 5.0 innings pitched, with three walks and two strikeouts, earning the win...ranked by MLB.com as Twins 14th-best prospect entering 2025.

Lewis was named the Jim Rantz Award winner in 2024 for Twins minor league Pitcher of the Year.

MIRA A MIRANDA: This year marks Jose Miranda's fifth-consecutive Twins spring training...reached base safely in 13-straight plate appearances July 3-6 (1 HBP), setting a new Twins record (1961-present)...recorded season-high five hits on July 4 vs. Detroit, the 60th time in Twins history for a player to record at least five hits in a game...recorded three doubles on the day...named American League Player of the Week, marking the first weekly honor of his career...set career-highs in doubles (18) and triples (4)...posted a 26.3 line drive percentage, highest of career.

ROCCO BAL: This season marks Rocco Baldelli's seventh as the Twins' manager...he will enter the regular season with a career managerial record of 457-413 (870 games) and three division titles (2019, '20 and '23)...Baldelli is one of four managers in team history (since 1961) with 400 victories, joining Tom Kelly (1,140), Ron Gardenhire (1,068) and Sam Mele (522).

Rocco's coaching staff for 2025 includes: assistant hitting coach Trevor Amicone, hitting coach Matt Borgschulte, first base/infield coach Ramon Borrego, assistant bench coach Hank Conger, quality control coach Nate Dammann, pitching coach Pete Maki, assistant pitching coach Luis Ramirez, bullpen coach Colby Suggs, hitting coach Rayden Sierra, bench coach Jayce Tingler and third base/outfield coach Tommy Watkins — Amicone, Borgschulte, Borrego and Sierra all join the staff for the first time this season...additionally, the only coach shifting roles for 2025 is Conger, who transitions from first base coach to assistant bench coach.

HAPPY CAMPERS: The following players are full participants in major league camp with the Twins for the first time: 12 pitchers: Travis Adams, Scott Blewett, Eiberson Castellano, Cory Lewis, Zebby Matthews, Darren McCaughan, Anthony Misiewicz, Andrew Morris, Erasmo Ramirez, Marco Raya, Alex Speas, and Huascar Ynoa...one catcher: Diego Cartaya...four infielders: Armando Alvarez, Mike Ford, Ty France, Luke Keaschall...one outfielder: Harrison Bader...two utility players: Mickey Gasper and Jefferson Morales.
