FLIGHT PATTERN: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their six-game homestand with the opener of a three-game Interleague series with the Houston Astros at Busch Stadium .. With a win tonight, the Cardinals would return to .500 for the first time since April 6 (4-4 record) and will have won consecutive games for the first time since starting 3-0 ... St. Louis enters tonight in 4th place in the National League Central Division, 2.5 games behind Chicago.

SERIES-LY?: St. Louis took two-of-three from Philadelphia over the weekend, winning a series over the Phillies for the first time since June 20-22, 2017, and blanking the Phillies twice in a series for the first time since April 19-20, 1997 at Veterans Stadium ... The Cardinals are looking for their first series win vs. Houston since Aug. 16-17, 2016 and first vs. the Astros at home since July 9-10, 2013.

HATS FOR BIRD BATS: St. Louis leads MLB in on-base pct. (.350) while ranking 2nd in batting average (.280), 3rd in runs/game (5.47) and OPS (.773), and 5th in slugging pct. (.435) ... The last time the Cardinals lead all of MLB in on-base percentage was 2012 (.338). - Elias

THE CONTRERAS BROTHERS: Willson and William Contreras yesterday homered on the same day for the 6th time in their MLB careers (June 8, 2021, Aug. 5, 2022, June 3, 2023, July 15, 2023, Aug. 8, 2023, April 13, 2025) ... Willson (153) and William (71) have combined

to hit 224 home runs in their careers, 29th-most in MLB history among brothers ... The only active brother-combo with more homers are Kyle (242) & Corey (203) Seager (445 HR, 9th).

FOREVER YOUNG: With a victory tonight, 38-year old Oliver Marmol will reach 255 career managerial wins and tie Roger **Bresnahan** (1909-12) for 14th all-time in franchise history.

BOMBS AWAY: With Willson Contreras's first home run of the season yesterday, the Cardinals became the first Major League team to have 12 different players to homer this season ... The Yankees rank 2nd with 10 different players ... Active Cardinals who have yet to go yard this season include Alec Burleson, Luken Baker, and Michael Siani ... Last season, 18 different Cardinals went deep, while the Redbirds franchise record is 22 different Cardinals during the 2000 season.

IT'S ALWAYS SONNY: Sonny Gray tonight makes his 100th career start and appearance as a National Leaguer tonight - and of course it's in an Interleague game ... St. Louis is 20-11 (.645) in Gray's starts since becoming a Cardinal last season, with wins in each of his last seven starts (Aug. 29, 2024-present).

BACKSTOP BRILLIANCE: St. Louis catchers Iván Herrera, Pedro Pagés, and Yohel Pozo combine to lead all MLB team catching combos in hits (22), home runs (6), doubles (7), extra-base hits (13), total bases (47), batting average (.349), slugging pct. (.746), and OPS (1.134).

START ME UP: Since April 8, the Cardinals starting rotation of Sonny Gray, Erick Fedde, Andre Pallante, Miles Mikolas, and Matthew Liberatore have combined to lead Major League Baseball in average against (.116), baserunners/9 (6.21), and WHIP (0.69) while ranking 2nd in ERA (1.24) and T-3rd in wins (3).

DONNY, YOU'RE OUT OF YOUR ELEMENT: Brendan Donovan yesterday extended his hitting streak to nine games (.457/.486/.657 16-35), longest active hitting streak in Major League Baseball ... Donovan ranks T-4th in MLB in hits (21) and 7th in batting average (.350) ... Donovan's 21 hits are the most by a Cardinal in the team's first 15 games of a season since 3B Matt Carpenter (24 in 2015).

GETTING DEFENSIVE: The Cardinals rank among Major League defensive leaders in fielding percentage (.990, T-5th), Baseball Savant's Outs Above Average (8, 2nd), and FanGraph's defensive runs above average (6.9, 1st).

FELIZ CUMPLEAÑOS: Happy 25th birthday to Cardinals pitcher Roddery Muñoz ... Other notables born on this date include Steve Avery (55), Brad Ausmus (56), Greg Maddux (59), David Justice (59), quarterback Baker Mayfield (30), actress Sarah Michelle Gellar (48), actor Adrien Brody (52), and Pete Rose (1941-2024).

Masyn Winn was born in Katy. Tex...graduated from Kingwood (Tex.) High School in 2020..resides in Kingwood, Tex.

John King was born in Laredo, Tex...graduated from Clements (Tex.) High School...played college baseball at Angelina College in Lufkin, Tex. before transferring to the University of Houston...resides in Grand Prairie, Tex.

Luken Baker was born in Houston and resides in Spring, Texas...graduated from Oak Ridge High School in Conroe, Texas...originally selected by the Astros in the 37th round of the 2015 MLB Draft, but did not sign to attend Texas Christian Univ.

Jeremy Peña is the son of Gerónimo Peña, who played six seasons with the Cardinals (1990-95).

First Base Coach Stubby Clapp worked five seasons (2007-12) in the Astros organization, serving as hitting coach for Single-A Lexington for three seasons (2007-09), one season as hitting coach for Double-A Corpus Christi (2010), and taking on his first managerial role with short-season Tri-City for two seasons (2011-12).

Astros Manager **Joe Espada** played in eight games for Triple-A Memphis in 2003.

Astros Quality Assurance Coach Jason Bell was born in St. Louis...graduated from Parkway Central High School...played college baseball at Saint Louis Univ. and the Univ. of Central Missouri.

Astros Community Outreach Exec. **José Cruz** played five seasons with St. Louis (1970-74), making his MLB debut...purchased by Houston (Oct. 24, 1974).

Asst. Hitting Coach Brandon Allen was born in Conroe, Tex...graduated from Montgomery (Tex.) High School...earned football scholarship to Rice University as a linebacker/defensive end and a baseball scholarship at the University of Houston.

Astros owner **Jim Crane** was born in St. Louis and grew up a Cardinals fan in nearby Dellwood...caddied for members of the Cardinals team at local golf clubs and parked cars for patrons at Cardinals games...graduated from Lutheran High School North in St. Louis County (1972)...played college baseball at Central Missouri State University (1973-76)...inducted in the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame (2017) and St. Louis Sports Hall of Fame (2018)...received the Jack Buck Award from the Missouri Athletic Club in St. Louis (2018).

TONIGHT'S GAME:

- Leads the team's starting rotations 4th turn thru as he is set to make his 4th start of the young season tonight; It's his 3rd start at home.
- The Cardinals are 3-0 in his three starts to begin the 2025 season; he's won 4-straight decisions dating to last season, with last loss coming on 8/24/24 at MIN
- The Cardinals have won each of his last seven games started dating back to last season.
- Four of his 12 hits allowed have been HR's; Ranks 6th in NL in WHIP (0.88) and 5th in strikeouts/batters faced (31 pct).
- Improved to 2-0 with a 5-3 win over the Pirates last Tue. (4/8) at PIT in a match-up vs. Paul Skenes; Game time temperature was 38 degrees and snow flurries.
- Is making his 100th career start and appearance as a National Leaguer tonight and of course it's in an Interleague game.
- Is 19-12 with a 3.07 ERA in 43 career starts in April and had a 3-1 mark with a 1.16 ERA last April in four starts for St. Louis; ; He would become 9th active pitcher to achieve 20 career April wins with win tonight.
- Made his 300th career start on 4/2 vs. LAA. Threw 6.0 innings for a no decision, exiting after a grand slam by Logan O'Hoppe, before
 the Cardinals retaliated with nine unanswered runs for a 12-5 win.
- Passed 1,750 career innings pitched in his 4/8 start at PIT, becoming the 10th active Major Leaguer to hit that mark (*Justin Verlander, Max Scherzer, Clayton Kershaw, Charlie Morton, Jose Quintana, Chris Sale, Gerrit Cole, Patrick Corbin and Kyle Gibson*).
- St. Louis is 20-11 in his 31 starts with the club since joining in 2024; His record stands at 15-9 while wearing the Birds on the Bat.
- Drew the Cardinals Opening Day start on 3/27 vs. MIN, the 4th Opening Day start of his career and his 1st for St. Louis.

2024 NL Ranks: Wins (13, T-7th), Home Wins (9, 3rd), Decisions (22, T-7th), Strikeouts (203, 4th), Opponent BA (.228, 9th), Hits/9IP (7.68, 8th), Baserunners/9 IP (9.96, 5th), SO/9 IP (10.98, 2nd), Strikeout % (30.3, 2nd), WHIP (1.09, 6th), SO/BB (5.21, 3rd), FIP (3.20, 5th).

- Struck out 203 batters in his first season in St. Louis, 19th-most in Cardinals single-season history. Became the 9th pitcher in Cardinals single-season history (20th instance) to reach 200 strikeouts and first since **Jack Flaherty** (231 in 2019).
- His 203 strikeouts were 2nd-most by a pitcher in their first season with St. Louis behind only José DeLeón's 208 strikeouts in 1988.
- Established new single-season Cardinals records in strikeouts/9 IP (10.98) and strikeout percentage (30.3%) in 2024, surpassing **Jack Flaherty** (10.59, 29.9%) in 2019.
- Finished two strikeouts shy of tying his single-season career high of 205 with the Reds in 2019. Recorded a 57.1 strikeout pct. on his Sweeper (fanning 112 in 196 plate appearances), MLB's best strikeout pct. of any pitch (minimum 150 plate appearances).
- Yielded a career high 21 home runs, but only five at Busch Stadium.
- His team-leading 13 wins were his most since a career-high 14 victories in back-to-back seasons with Oakland (2014-15)
- Signed a three-year (2024-26) free agent contract with St. Louis following the 2023 Thanksgiving holiday, with a fourth year club option for the 2027 season.
- The Cardinals are his fifth Major League team, after the Athletics (2013-17), Yankees (2017-18), Reds (2019-21), and Twins (2022-23).
- Finished 2nd in the 2023 American League Cy Young Award voting behind Yankees **Gerrit Cole**, who received 30 unanimous 1st place votes. Gray received 20 2nd place votes and six 3rd place. Also ranked 18th in AL MVP voting.
- Three-time Major League Baseball All-Star, earning selections in 2015 (American), 2019 (National) and 2023 (American).
- Graduated from Smyrna (Tenn.) High School. A two-sport athlete, lettered all four years in baseball and three years in football. Played quarterback and led Smyrna to back-to-back Tennessee High School state championships. Was also Homecoming King.
- Originally selected by the Chicago Cubs in the 27th round of the 2008 MLB Draft out of Smyrna High School, but did not sign. Drafted by the Oakland Athletics in the 1st round (18th overall) of the 2011 Major League Draft out of Vanderbilt University.

GRAY vs. HOUSTON

- Making his 13th career start vs. the Astros and his 1st as a member of the Cardinals.
- Has a 4-4 career mark with a 3.03 ERA over his previous 12 starts vs. Houston; Has gone 0-2 with four no-decisions in six starts since recording his last win against the Astros (9/8/15).
- Last faced the Astros as a member of the Twins on May 29, 2023 in Houston; Hurled 6.0 innings, allowing 3 runs in a no-decision the Twins won 7-5.
- Struck out his career-high 13 batters just over two years ago April 7, 2023 vs. the Astros while pitching for MIN.
- Has wins in 25 different Major League Ballparks (including inactives) over his career; has yet to record a win at Chase Field (ARI), Coors Field (COL), Fenway Park (BOS), Globe Life Field (TEX), Daikin Park (HOU) and the defunct Turner Field (ATL).
- Is 20-11, 3.43 ERA career in 47 games/46 starts in Interleague play; was 5-1, 3.11 ERA in his six Interleague starts last season.
