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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (71-73) vs. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (75-68)

September 8, 2026 - Rate Field - Chicago, IL - 6:40 CDT - Game #145/Road #73

RHP Bubba Chandler (6-9, 4.30 ERA) vs. RHP Sean Burke (8-6, 3.20 ERA)

THE PIRATES: had the day off on Monday (Labor Day) and will begin their penultimate road trip of the 2026 season at Chicago-AL (Tuesday-Thursday) and Chicago-NL (September 11-13) with tonight's series opener at Rate Field...Went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand vs. San Francisco (2-1, September 1-3) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1, Friday-Sunday), including a 1-0 win on Sunday at PNC Park...Have hit 165 home runs (they hit 117 home runs all of last season)... Have the fourth-most hits (1245) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Milwaukee (1259), Chicago-NL (1255) and Tampa Bay (1253)...Have scored the fifth-most runs (694) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Chicago-NL (771), Washington (750), Milwaukee (730) and Los Angeles-NL (711)...Have struck out the fifth-most batters (1322) in all of Major League Baseball.

A WINDY WEEK: Pittsburgh will play six straight games in "The Windy City" when it takes on Chicago-AL (Tuesday-Thursday) and Chicago-NL (September 11-13) during this road trip...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, it is the seventh time in the Expansion Era (since 1961) where the Pirates will play six straight road games in the same metro area, along with August 14-17, 1986 (at Philadelphia), May 22-27, 2009 (at Chicago-AL/Chicago-NL), August 31-September 5, 2021 (at Chicago-AL/Chicago-NL), September 15-21, 2022 (at New York-NL/New York-AL), April 26-May 1, 2024 (at San Francisco/Oakland) and April 22-27, 2025 (at Los Angeles-AL/Los Angeles-NL)...The Pirates swept the White Sox in their last series here in Chicago from July 12-14, 2024.

ONE AND DONE: The Pirates picked up 1-0 wins on Friday and Sunday vs. Los Angeles (AL)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, it marked only the seventh time in team history (since 1887) where they earned two 1-0 wins in a single series...Pittsburgh also did that on May 17/18, 1907 at Brooklyn, August 28/29, 1908 vs. Philadelphia, May 31, 1915 vs. Chicago (both games of a doubleheader), May 9/11, 1958 vs. Philadelphia, October 3, 1976 vs. St. Louis (both games of a doubleheader) and June 12/14, 2015 vs. Philadelphia...The Pirates' Major League-best five 1-0 wins this season are tied with 1915, 1918, 1919, 1958 and 2013 for their fourth-most in a season in the Modern Era (since 1901), behind only 1908 (10 wins), 1907 (six wins) and 1917 (six wins).

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: Pittsburgh has won four straight series after winning two of three games from August 24-26 at San Diego, two of three games from August 28-30 at St. Louis, two of three games from September 1-3 vs. San Francisco and two of three games from Friday-Sunday vs. Los Angeles (AL)...It is the first time the Pirates have won four straight series since July 9-24, 2024...They last won five straight series from August 14-30, 2015...Pittsburgh is also looking to win three straight road series for the first time since April 16-25, 2021...The Pirates have won six of their last seven series, dating back to August 14-16 vs. Boston.

CENTRAL PERK: The Pirates are 7-2 vs. the American League Central this year...They swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota, won two of three games from July 18-19 at Cleveland and won two of three games from August 17-19 vs. Detroit... The Bucs will play three games from September 18-20 vs. Kansas City (their penultimate home series of the season) and will close out the 2026 campaign with three games from September 25-27 at Detroit.

KEEPING IT 100: Bryan Reynolds is four runs shy of 100 for the season (he is also four runs shy of 600 for his Major League career)...He would become one of only six Pirates (eight instances) in the 21st century to score at least 100 runs in any season and the first since Andrew McCutchen (107 runs) in 2012.

PARTNERS IN TRADE: The Pirates and White Sox are meeting for the first time since their July 10 deal that brought Jacob Gonzalez/Brandon Eisert to Pittsburgh...Gonzalez is 5-for-15 in his last six games (since August 29)... Eisert has pitched 4.0 scoreless innings in his last three games (since July 28).

AMERICAN SPIRIT: Pittsburgh will play nine of its final 18 games vs. the American League (Tuesday-Thursday at Chicago, September 18-20 vs. Kansas City and September 25-27 at Detroit)...The Pirates' 25-14 (.641) interleague record is third in MLB, behind Los Angeles-NL (31-17, .646) and Milwaukee (29-16, .644)...Their only better single-season interleague records came during the 2013 (15-5, .750), 2018 (15-5, .750) & 2015 (13-7, .650) seasons.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

September 8, 2020: The Pirates won in walkoff fashion for the second straight game after rallying from a 3-0 deficit in a 5-4 win over the White Sox at PNC Park. Kevin Newman reached on a game-ending fielder's choice that scored Jason Martin after Chicago catcher Yasmani Grandal dropped the ball at home plate. It marked the first time they won back-to-back games via walkoff since September 17-18, 2018.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the third round of the 2021 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Chandler has a no-decision after allowing three runs on five hits (including a home run) and three walks (four strikeouts) over 5.0 innings in Pittsburgh’s 5-4, 10-inning loss on September 2 vs. San Francisco...He is 3-1 with a 3.30 ERA (46.1ip/17er) in his last nine starts, dating back to a start on July 11 (G2) vs. Milwaukee.

LET’S GET IT STARTED: Chandler will make his 27th start of the year tonight, making him the first Pirates rookie with 27 starts in any year since Paul Maholm (30) in 2006.

AMERICAN MAN: Chandler is 4-2 with a 3.44 ERA (36.2ip/14er) in seven starts against the American League this season...He has a 1.62 ERA (16.2ip/3er) in his last three interleague starts (June 25 vs. Seattle, July 22 [G2] at New York, August 14 vs. Boston).

ROOKIE RANKINGS: Chandler’s 121 strikeouts through his first 27 appearances (26 starts) of the season are the sixth-most among Major League rookies, behind New York (NL)’s Nolan McLean (179), Cleveland’s Parker Messick (173), Boston’s Payton Tolle (159), Cleveland’s Foster Griffin (142) and Los Angeles (AL)’ Walbert Ureña (124).

RIGHTON: Chandler has limited right-handed hitters to a .216 batting average against (50-for-231) and a .593 OPS this season...The only righthanders to take him deep were Chicago (NL)’s Dansby Swanson (April 12) and San Francisco’s Heliot Ramos (May 10).

THREE’S COMPANY: Chandler won each of his first three starts last month (August 3 at Milwaukee, August 8 vs. New York-NL and August 14 vs. Boston) before having a no-decision in his start on August 21 at Los Angeles (NL)...The only Pirates pitcher to win four straight starts this year was Braxton Ashcraft (June 17-July 4)...Chandler’s streak was the longest by a Pirates rookie starter since Nick Kingham (July 8-21, 2018).

WHAT A RELIEF: Chandler allowed just one hit and struck out seven batters over 5.1 innings out of the bullpen on June 7 at Atlanta...He became only the second Pirates reliever in the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch at least 5.0 innings, strike out at least seven batters and allow one or zero hits in an appearance...Chandler joined Bill Swift, who did that over his 7.1 innings out of the bullpen on July 28 (G2), 1935 vs. St. Louis.

GIMME FIVE: Chandler struck out a career-high 11 batters in 5.0 innings on May 22 at Toronto...He joined Erik Bedard (May 3, 2012 at St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings...Chandler also became one of 11 Major Leaguers (since earned runs became an official stat in both leagues in 1913) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero earned runs in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings (he was only the fourth rookie to accomplish that).

A BIT OF BOTH: Chandler went 2-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1ip/11er) in four starts and 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) in three relief appearances in 2025...Nine of the 11 runs he allowed as a starting pitcher came during his first career start (Sept. 7 vs. Milwaukee).

FINISHING STRONG: Chandler went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2ip/2er), 19 strikeouts (zero walks issued), a .123 batting average against (7-for-57) and a 0.42 WHIP over his final three starts of the 2025 season, including 5.2 innings of one-run ball in his final start on September 27 at Atlanta (he is a native of Lawrenceville, GA, located approximately 30 miles from Truist Park)...He became the first Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to make three consecutive starts with one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts...Chandler also joined Milwaukee’s Corbin Burnes (four starts) in 2021, Arizona’s Zac Gallen (three starts) in 2023 and Detroit’s Tarik Skubal (three starts) last season as the only Major League pitchers during the Modern Era to make at least three consecutive starts with four or fewer hits allowed, one/zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts.

Pittsburgh has not named a starter for Wednesday night's game against Chicago (AL) at Rate Field.
