TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 4-game series vs Chris Tunno's firstplace Cardinals and Game 1 of a 7 -game homestand that includes an upcoming 3 -game series vs the Padres...is Game 10 (4-5) of a stretch in which the Reds are scheduled to play 13 of $\mathbf{1 6}$ games at Great American Ball Park ( $2-0$ vs LAA, $2-2$ vs Cubs, $0-3$ at $W s h, 0-0$ vs StL, 3 g vs SD)... the Reds went $4-2$ on their previous homestand ( $2-0$ vs LAA, $2-2$ vs Cubs) and are coming off a brief 3 -game road trip, all at Wsh ( $0-3$ )...was their first series sweep loss at Nationals Park since August 2008.

TRANSACTIONS: Today the Reds recalled from Class AAA Louisville RHP Matt Bowman (\#67), selected from Louisville the contract of RHP Joel Kuhnel (\#66, COON-uhl) and optioned to Louisville RHP Sal Romano... RHP Jared Hughes was claimed off waivers by the Phillies...when he pitches, Kuhnel will become the fifth Reds player to make his Major League debut this season (CF Nick Senzel, IF/OF Josh VanMeter, RHP Jimmy Herget, OF Brian O'Grady).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are 4-7 vs StL this season, including 1-3 at Great American Ball Park...over the last 4 seasons, the Cardinals' . 576 winning percentage (19-33) is third-best among opponents at GABP (Wsh .769, LAD .615)...the Reds are 3-2-2 in their last 7 completed series vs StL, including a 1-1 series split in April in Mexico at Estadio de Béisbol Monterrey, home of the Sultanes de Monterrey of the Mexican League.

## REDS vs CARDINALS:

Joey Votto has 196 career hits vs the Cardinals (196-625, .314), the most among active players...in the live ball era, his career . 437 OBP vs StL ranks second among all players with at least 500 plate apps (Lefty O'Doul 1st, .477; Ralph Kiner 3rd, . 424)...in 91 apps over the last 6 seasons vs StL, Votto has produced a 1.034 OPS (.335ba, $.571 \mathrm{slg}, .463 \mathrm{obp}$ )...in his last 60 apps overall vs StL beginning 8/2/16 is hitting 339 (75-221, 16 2b, 1 3b, 9hr, 36rbi, .543sig, .449obp).
Beginning $8 / 5 / 17$, Eugenio Suárez has reached base safely in 27 of his last 28 apps vs StL (28-100, .280, 5 2b, 9hr, 24rbi, .600slg, . 387 obp ), including a $\mathbf{2 5}$-game on-base streak snapped on 7/19 after he was ejected following a called third strike in the first inning.
Beginning 7/13/18, Jesse Winker has a 14-game hitting streak vs StL (21-53, . $396,52 \mathrm{~b}, 3 \mathrm{hr}, 10 \mathrm{rbi}, .660$ slg, .484obp)...beginning 9/19/17 has reached base safely in each of his last 24 apps vs StL ( $35-93,376,82 \mathrm{~b}$, $4 \mathrm{hr}, 16 \mathrm{rbi}, .591 \mathrm{slg}, .453 \mathrm{obp})$... hit safely in 23 of those 24 apps.

RHP Raisel Iglesias is 11 -for-11 in save opps vs the Cardinals, joining Bill Landrum (10-for-10) and Jeff Brantley (12-for-12) as the only pitchers, since the save became an official statistic, with a minimum of at least 10 perfect save conversions vs StL...in his last 22 apps vs StL beginning 8/4/16, Raisel Iglesias has posted a 1.32 ERA (11sv, 27.1ip, $14 \mathrm{~h}, 4 \mathrm{er}, 18 \mathrm{bb}, 31 \mathrm{k}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$ )...in that span, Cardinals batters are hitting just . 149 against him (14-94).

THE PUNISHER: Rookie Aristides Aquino produced 9 HR in his first 14 career games, including a 3-homer game on Sat vs Cubs in which he homered in 3 consecutive innings (2nd, 3rd, 4th)...he played 1 game for the Reds last season.

Is the first player in modern Major League history with 9 HR in his first 14 career games
Is the first player in modern Major League history with 8 HR in his first 12 career games.
Is the second player in modern Major League history with 7 HR in his first 10 career games (Col's Trevor Story, 2016). Is the second player in modern Major League history with a 3-homer game within his first 10 career games (Bobby Estalella, 10th game, 9/4/1997).
Is the first Major League rookie and first Reds player to homer in 3 consecutive innings (2nd-4th), tying the Major League record for HR in consecutive innings in a game...he was the 13th player to do it, the second this season (Chi's Kris Bryant, 5/17 at Wsh, 7th-9th).
Is the second Reds rookie to homer in 4 consecutive games (Eric Davis, 9/3-9/6, 1984)
Is the second Reds rookie with 3 HR in a game (Joey Votto, 2008)
Is the second Reds batter this season with 3 HR in a game (Derek Dietrich, $5 / 28$ vs Pit)...was the 29th Reds player with at least 3 homers in a game, accomplished for the 37th time

SUSPENDED: LHP Amir Garrett is $\mathbf{3}$ games into an 8 -game suspension...in his absence the Reds are 0-3, while the bullpen's ERA is 7.59 (10.2ip, 9er)...he cannot be replaced on the 25 -man roster...Garrett was 1 of 9 ejected in the 11-4 loss on $7 / 30$ vs Pit and, 2 days later, 1 of 8 suspended by Major League Baseball...also suspended were manager David Bell $(6 \mathrm{~g})$, RHP Jared Hughes $(3 \mathrm{~g})$ and RF Yasiel Puig $(3 \mathrm{~g})$ of the Reds and manager Clint Hurdle (2g), RHP Keone Kela $(10 \mathrm{~g})$, José Osuna $(5 \mathrm{~g})$ and RHP Kyle Crick $(3 \mathrm{~g})$ of the Pirates.
Bell and Hughes already served their suspensions.
FIRST WATCH: In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in runs scored (99), HR (35), RBI (96), batting average (.311), on-base percentage (.370) and slugging percentage (.595)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, 99-66, and are 29-7 (.806) when leading after the first inning... 6 times this season scored at least 4 runs in the first

REHABBING: RHP Tyler Mahle, on the injured list since $\mathbf{7 / 2 2}$ with a left hamstring strain, tomorrow is scheduled to begin a rehabilitation assignment by throwing 2.0 innings for Class AAA Louisville vs Rochester...C Curt Casali, on the injured list since $7 / 18$ with a sprained medial collateral ligament in his right knee, made 2 rehab apps before he was shut down with soreness in his left hamstring...in Fri's 3-1 Bats win at Rochester started behind the plate and caught 5 innings (0-3)...in Sat's 6-5 loss in 10 innings at Rochester, he was the Bats' designated hitter $(0-2)$ but left the game with the hamstring injury.

## Tonight's Pitcher - \#54 Sonny Gray, RHP

## RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a 2019 National League All-Star...in his last 8 starts is $\mathbf{4 - 1}, \mathbf{1} .74$ with $\mathbf{7}$ quality starts and 3 times was the victim of blown saves...will take a 13-inning scoreless streak into tonight's start, tying his season high ( $7 / 3-7 / 12$ ) and sixth-longest active streak in the Major Leagues...the longest scoreless streak of his career is 14.2 innings ( $4 / 28-5 / 8,2015$ )...in his $3-0$ win on $7 / 3$ vs Mil, threw 8.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 12 strikeouts...the 8.0 innings are the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season, and his 12 strikeouts were the most by a Reds pitcher this season until Luis Castillo had a career-high 13 strikeouts on $8 / 5$ vs LAA....has 7 wins and 4 times was the victim of blown saves....began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since...with the completion of the second inning on $7 / 17$ at Cubs reached 1,000 career innings pitched...on $7 / 12$ at Col, his strikeout of Charlie Blackmon to end the fifth inning was the 900th strikeout of his career.

\section*{RED HOTS}

Luis Castillo in his third Major League season at just 26 years old, was the Reds' Opening Day starter and is a 2019 National League All-Star...per Baseball America, his changeup was voted by managers, scouts and executives the best in the National League...in his last 4 starts vs StL is 2-0, 1.13...eft Sun's 6-3 loss vs Cubs leading, 3-2, but became the victim of a blown save when Kris Bryant hit a 3-run HR off Michael Lorenzen...took a 2 -hit shutout into the sixth inning...in his last 29 apps beginning 9/1/18 is $14-5$ and in that span leads all Major League starting pitchers with an ERA of 2.39...this season ranks among the National League leaders in wins (T5th), ERA (6th), strikeouts (T6th) and strikeouts per 9 innings (4th, 10.77).

Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
Went hitless on $6 / 2$ vs Wsh, snapping a 9 -game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, $1 \mathrm{hr}, 5 \mathrm{rbi}, .378 \mathrm{obp}$ ) and a 20 -game on-base streak (26-86, . $302,62 \mathrm{~b}, 23 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}$, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp)...ties Aristides Aquino \& José Iglesias' for the longest hitting streak by any Reds batter this season and ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on $3 / 25$ during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on $4 / 23$ and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his $5 / 3$ promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).
In the eighth inning of the $12-5$ loss on $8 / 8$ vs Cubs, as a part of a double switch made his first Major League appearance at 2B.

EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf
2nd Half: 32-112 (.286), 13hr, 21rbi
First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
Since the All-Star break is tied with Atl's Ronald Acuña Jr. for the National League lead in HR (13) while ranking among the leaders in slugging percentage (.670, 2nd), RBI (21, T16th) and on-base percentage (.388, 15th).
In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues with 11 HR while ranking among the ML leaders in RBI (21, 4th) and among NL leaders in batting average (.326, 13th). In his last 16 apps beginning $7 / 29$ is hitting .298 (17-57, $12 \mathrm{~b}, 5 \mathrm{hr}, 6 \mathrm{rbi})$.
Homered in 3 of his last 6 apps and in 4 of his last 8 apps...beginning $6 / 30$, homered in 15 of his last 39 apps (17hr, 30rbi), including a pair of 2-homer games (7/1 vs Mil, $7 / 22$ at Mil).
Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23). Suárez and Tony Pérez are the only third basemen in franchise history with 25 HR in 3 seasons and the only third basemen in club history with 30 HR in 2 seasons. Received votes for National League Player of the Month for July after leading the NL in HR (12), slugging percentage (.733) and total bases (66, T1st)...also finished among the July leaders in RBI (23, 3rd), OPS (1.086, 3rd) and extra-base hits (15, 5th)...his 12 HR in July were the most by a Reds batter in that month since Adam Dunn hit 12 HR in July 2008...no Reds batter has hit more than Dunn's 12 HR in July since Frank Robinson hit 13 HR in July 1961.

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of
2nd Half: 22-68 (.324), 6 2b, 4hr, 8rbi Hit safely in 5 of his last 6 apps ( $7-22, .318,42 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{rbi}$ ), including two 2 -hit games. In his fourth stint with the Reds this season, has made 25 apps and 15 starts since he was promoted from Louisville just after the All-Star break...was 1 of 7 roster moves that day $(7 / 18)$.
Has made 22 starts ( 13 gs in LF, 6 gs at 2B, 2gs at $3 \mathrm{~B}, 1 \mathrm{gs}$ at DH)...started all 3 games of the series at $W$ sh ( $2 \mathrm{~B}, 2 \mathrm{~B}, \mathrm{LF}, 4-12, .333,12 \mathrm{~b}$ )...also made 2 apps at 1 B and 1 appearance in RF ( $7 / 22$ at Mil).
His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacín on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, $6 / 23$ vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18. Is 1 of 4 Reds players to homer in at least 3 straight games (Derek Dietrich, Eugenio Suárez 3 times, Aristides Aquino 4 g ).
Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit . 348 (14 2b, 1 $3 \mathrm{~b}, 14 \mathrm{hr}, 43 \mathrm{rbi}, 8 \mathrm{sb}, 1.097 \mathrm{ops}) . .$. started at $1 \mathrm{~B}(10 \mathrm{~g}), 2 \mathrm{~B}(20 \mathrm{~g}), 3 \mathrm{~B}(10 \mathrm{~g})$ and LF $(3 \mathrm{~g})$. In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month...in April hit . 358 and led the IL in games (26), hits (34), runs (24), HR (11), RBI (28), total bases (24), slugging percentage (.758) and OPS (1.204)...his 11 HR and 28 RBI are RiverBats/Bats records for April (since 2000). In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13). Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b
2nd Half: 31-125 (.248), 8 2b, 4hr, 17rbi For the fifth straight season, per Baseball America was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League. Has a 6-game hitting streak ( $8-22, .364,32 \mathrm{~b}, 1 \mathrm{hr}, 3 \mathrm{rbi}$ ), 1 game shy of his season high (7g, 5/21-5/31).
Sat night's first-inning double off Chi's Kyle Hendricks was his 865th career hit at Great American Ball Park, the most by any player at GABP (Brandon Phillips, 864). From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season...his current on-base streak, beginning $8 / 1$, is at 13 games (.261ba, .386obp).
Beginning $5 / 8$ made his last 77 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff ( $6 / 18 / 08$ vs LAD).
In his career has hit 64 HR on the first pitch, most recently Fri's HR off Yu Darvish.
33 JESSE WINKER, of
2nd Half: 28-86 (.326), 5 2b, 1 3b, 3hr, 12rbi Since the All-Star break ranks among National League leaders in on-base percentage (.431, 5th) and batting average (.326, 8th).

In his last 16 apps beginning $7 / 29$ is hitting .364 (16-44, 2 2b, $2 \mathrm{hr}, 5 \mathrm{rbi}, .996 \mathrm{ops}$ ). In his last 26 apps beginning $7 / 18$ is hitting .342 (25-73, 5 2b, 3hr, 9rbi, .976 ops ). Has 4 career leadoff HR, including 3 this season ( $6 / 18$ vs Hou off Justin Verlander, $7 / 31$ vs Pit off Dario Agrazal, 8/12 at Wsh off Erick Fedde)...the leadoff HR off Fedde came on the first pitch of the game.
Has 16 HR, a new single-season career high ( $7 \mathrm{hr}, 2017$ \& 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
Has made 87 starts, including a team-high 59 starts in LF (16gs in CF, 11gs in RF).
