- YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Orioles dropped Game 1 of the AL Wild Card Series to the Royals, 1-0...Corbin Burnes suffered the loss despite allowing one run on five hits and one walk with three strikeouts in 8.0+ innings...Baltimore finished 1-for-7 with runners in scoring position.

 Os Burnes' 8.0 innings were the most by an Orioles starter in the Postseason since Mike Mussina (8.0 IP) in Game 6 of the 1997 ALCS on October 15, 1997 vs. Cleveland; he became the first MLB starter to throw a pitch in the ninth inning of playoff game since Washington's Stephen Strasburg in Game 6 of the 2019 World Series on October 29 at Houston, and the first Oriole to do so in the Postseason since Scott McGregor clinched the 1983 World Series with a complete game shutout in Game 5 on October 16 at Philadelphia.

 Os Burnes is the first pitcher to suffer the loss in a playoff game while throwing at least 8.0 innings since Toronto's Marco Estrada (8.0 IP) in Game 1 of the 2016 ALCS on October 14 at Cleveland, and the first Oriole to do so since McGregor (8.0 IP) in Game 1 of the 1983 World Series on October 11 vs. Philadelphia.

 Baltimore lost a Postseason game 1-0 for the third time in team history, joining Game 6 of the 1997 ALCS vs. Cleveland on October 15 and Game 3 of the 1974 ALCS vs. Oakland on October 8.

 The 0's are now 16-8 in Game 1s in the playoffs, including 1-1 in the one-game Wild Cards, but have lost four traight. O_s
 - lost four straight. **Keegan Akin, Colton Cowser**, and **Heston Kjerstad** made their Postseason debuts

POSTSEASON SERIES NOTES: The 0's have not won a playoff game since Game 3 of the 2014 ALDS at Detroit and have lost their last nine Postseason games since Game 1 of the 2014 ALCS vs. Kansas City, the longest in team history and longest since Minnesota dropped a Postseason record 18 games (10/6/04-9/30/20)...Baltimore has dropped all five home playoff games during that time, tied for the second-longest active losing streak at home in Postseason games with Colorado (since 10/27/07), behind Houston (6; since 10/8/23)...The Birds have won two series in team history when losing the series opener in a multi-game series, both during the 1983 World Series run in the ALCS vs. Chicago (L, 2-1) on October 5 and the World Series vs. Philadelphia (L, 2-1) on October 11...Baltimore is 5-11 in the Postseason when facing elimination, which includes 1-1 in the one-game Wild Card Games in 2016 at Toronto (L, 5-2 in 11 innings) and 2012 at Texas (W, 5-1)...The 0's have never won a multi-game playoff series when facing elimination at any point in that series.

THAT'S A WRAP: The Orioles completed the 2024 regular season with a 91-71 record, finishing in second place in the AL East, 3.0 games behind the first-place Yankees...The O's finished with a third consecutive winning season for the first time since 2012-14...The club made the playoffs in at least two straight seasons for the fourth time, joining 1996-97, 1973-74, and 1969-71 (3).

WHAT'S TRENDING: Baltimore made the Postseason for the second straight season after winning the AL East with a 101-61 record in 2023...The club was swept in the ALDS against Texas last year, dropping the first two games at Camden Yards...The Orioles finished the regular season by winning five of six on the final road trip from September 24-29 at New York-AL (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0); before that stretch, the O's had lost seven of 10 and 10 of 14...The team was 38-40 (.487) since July 1, 33-33 (.500) since the All-Star break, and 26-27 (.491) since August 1 to end the year.

O: Baltimore is 192-132 (.593) in the regular season since the start of 2023, the best record in the AL and the third-best winning percentage in MLB during that time, behind the Dodgers (.611, 198-126) and Braves (.596, 193-121).

HOMER HAPPY: The Orioles finished the regular season with 235 home runs, second in MLB behind the Yankees (237)...The 235 homers are the third most in a single season in Orioles history behind 1996 (257) and 2016 (253)...The club paced MLB with 139 long balls through June, including going deep in a franchise-record 22 straight games from June 1-23.

Ob. Baltimore had nine players with at least 10 home runs, tied with the Dodgers and Red Sox for the second most in MLB behind the Braves (11): Anthony Santander (44), Gunnar Henderson (37), Colton Cowser (24), Adley Rutschman (19), Cedric Mullins and Jordan Westburg (18), Ryan O'Hearn (15), Ryan Mountcastle (13), and Ramón Urías (11); the team record is 10 players, done in 2019, 2000, and 1998

(15), **Ryan Mountcastle** (13), and **Kamon Urias** (11); the team record is 16 p. 83-61. Sec., assumed and 1998. Henderson and Santander were one of two duos with at least 35 home runs, along with New York-AL's Aaron Judge (58) and Juan Soto (41); the 0's did not have a player reach 35 homers last season, and this year marked the first time since 2016 that the team has had multiple players with 35+home runs (Trumbo, 47; Davis, 38; Machado, 37). The Birds hit 13 leadoff homers, the most by the club in a single season and second in MLB this year behind the Phillies (15); Henderson hit 10 of those, second most in one season by an Oriole behind **Brady Anderson**, who hit all 12 for the club in 1996; Cowser (2) and Westburg (1) have the other three for the 0's in 2024.

TOP GUNN: Gunnar Henderson set the 0's record for most home runs by a shortstop with 37, passing Cal Ripken, Jr. (1991) and Miguel Tejada (2004), who held the 0's record with 34 entering this season.

Ø₃ He was voted the 2024 Most Valuable Oriole by members of the local media; he's the eighth player to earn MVO in back-to-back seasons and the first since Adam Jones in 2011-12.
Ø₃ Henderson earned AL Player of the Week on September 9, the second such award of his career.
His 118 runs scored ranked fourth in the AL and sixth in MLB, and were the most by an Oriole since Roberto Alomar set the club record with 132 in 1996; he's the sixth player in 0's history (since 1954) to score 100 runs in back-to-back seasons after scoring exactly 100 times last year, joining Manny Machado (2, 2015-16), Jones (2, 2012-13), Brian Roberts (3, 2007-09), Brady Anderson (2, 1995-96), and Ripken, Jr. (3, 1983-85).

He's the ninth player in 0's history with multiple 30-homer seasons, joining Manny Machado (3, 2015-17), Chris Davis (4, 2012-13, 15-16), Adam Jones (2, 2012-13), Rafael Palmeiro (4, 1995-98), Eddie Murray (5, 1980, 82-83, 85, 87), Boog Powell (4, 1964, 66, 69-70), Frank Robinson (3, 1966-67, 69), and Jim Gentile (2, 1961-62). HOLY COWSER: Colton Cowser tied for the MLB rookie lead with 24 home runs with San Diego's Jackson Merrill...He's the 10th rookie in team history (since 1954) to hit at least 20 homers and the first since Gunnar Henderson (28) last year...He also the ninth rookie in 0's history to record 20 doubles and 20 home runs in a season and the first since Henderson (29-2B, 28 HR) in 2023...Among rookies, Cowser led the AL and ranked third in MLB with 4.1 fWAR, behind San Diego's Merrill (5.3) and Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes (4.3)...He finished among AL rookies in in runs scored (1st, 77), total bases (1st, 223), extra-base hits (1st, 51), slugging percentage (2st, 447), walks (2st, 52), doubles (3st, 724), RBI (3st, 68), OPS (3st, 768), and hits (5st, 721).

Obs. The 0's have the reigning AL Rookie of the Year in Gunnar Henderson; four American League and nine National League teams have had a player win Rookie of the Year in back-to-back seasons, with the Dodgers being the last to do so in 2016 (Bellinger) and 2017 (Seager); the last AL team was the Athletics in 2004 (Crosby) and 2005 (Street).

Obs. His 11 Outs Above Average were more than all other 0's defenders combined, per Statcast; eight of those have come in left field, two behind Toronto's Daulton Varsho for the most among MLB left fielders.

THE ROYAL FAMILY: The Orioles and Royals meet for the first time since late April in this AL Wild Card Series...Baltimore won the season series, 4-2, after winning two of three at Oriole Park from April 1-3 and at Kauffman Stadium from April 19-21...The Birds tallied a pair of walk-off wins at Camden Yards, with Jordan Westburg launching at wo-run home run in the ninth inning on April 1 with the score tied, and James McCann delivering a two-out, two-run single in the ninth inning with the O's down a run on April 3...In Kansas City, the Orioles used a seven-run second inning off Cole Ragans on April 20 in a 9-7 win, while Colton Cowser and Westburg hit back-to-back home runs off Seth Lugo in a 5-0 victory on April 21.

O: The clubs have met once in Postseason play; Kansas City swept the ALCS in 2014, winning the four games by a combined six runs, with every game being within at least a run entering in the ninth inning.

OUICK HITS: Scheduled to make his 12th career Postseason appearance (2 GS) in Game 2 of the American League Wild Card Series today against the Royals...Went 10-9 with a 3.59 ERA (66 ER/165.1 IP) across 28 starts for the Rays (19 GS) and Orioles (9 GS) this season...Reinstated from the 15-day Injured List prior to his start on September 1; placed on the IL (right shoulder inflammation) on August 20, retroactive to August 17; marked his second stint on the IL this season after being reinstated on June 5 (lower back inflammation)...Won his first five starts to begin his Orioles career, joining Jack Harshman (1958) as the only Orioles to win each of their first five appearances with the club in team history; Eflin is the first to win each of his first five with all of them being starts and the first Oriole to win each of his first five with the team since Ben McDonald (7/21-8/13/90)...Was acquired by the O's from the Tampa Bay Rays in exchange for minor leaguers RHP Jackson Baumeister, INF/OF Mac Horvath, and OF Matthew Etzel on July 26...Became the first MLB pitcher since Andrew Cashner in 2019 to make back-to-back starts against the same opponent with different franchises in the same season (BAL and BOS against TOR), per the Elias Sports Bureau; no pitcher had been acquired by the Orioles in the same season and faced the same opponent he did in his previous start in franchise history (since 1954)...His 16 wins in 2023 were tied with Toronto's Chris Bassitt for the most in the American League, becoming the third Rays pitcher to lead the AL in wins and helping him finish sixth in the AL Cy Young award voting...Signed a three-year contract with the Rays on December 13, 2022...Spent seven seasons with the Phillies, going 36-45 with a 4.49 ERA (329 ER/659.1 IP) in 127 outings (115 GS) from 2016-2022...Acquired by Philadelphia from Los Angeles-NL on December 19, 2014 in exchange for Jimmy Rollins and cash considerations...Traded to the Dodgers a day prior as part of a package for Matt Kemp...Originally selected by the

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Eflin is 0-1 with a 5.17 ERA (9 ER/15.2 IP) in 11 career Postseason outings (1GS)...Made his first career Postseason start last season, taking the loss in Game 1 of the American League Wild Card Series against the Texas Rangers on October 4 at Tropicana Field (w/TB)...Allowed five runs on nine hits (2 HR) and two walks (1 IBB) in 5.0 innings...Appeared in 10 playoff games in relief for the Phillies in 2022, posting a 3.38 ERA (4 ER/10.2 IP) en route to an NL pennant.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision on September 25 at New York-AL after allowing three runs on four hits (1 HR) and a career-high five walks with one strikeout in 4.2 innings; marked the first time walking more than one batter since July 19 at New York-AL (4), a streak of nine straight starts....13 of his 16 runs surrendered as an Oriole scored via home runs...Failed to complete 5.0 innings for the first time as an Oriole after going at least 5.0 innings and allowing three or fewer runs in all eight of his previous starts to begin his career with Baltimore; the only Orioles starters to have had longer streaks to begin their career with the team this century are Jeremy Guthrie in 2007(11) and current teammate Corbin Burnes this season (15)...Threw 92 pitches, 51 strikes.

AGAINST THE ROYALS: Has gone 3-1 with a 5.09 ERA (13 ER/23.0 IP) in four career starts against Kansas City...Earned the win at Kansas City earlier this season on July 4 after allowing a season-high-tying six runs (5 ER) on seven hits (1 HR) and one walk with three strikeouts in 5.0 innings (w/TB).

PLAYOFF READY: This year, Eflin made nine starts against teams that qualified for the 2024 Postseason, going 2-4 with a 3.81 ERA (22 ER/52.0 IP) and a 1.19 WHIP.

WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT: Effin issued 24 walks in 165.1 innings this season, 10 of which came in four outings against the Yankees; his 1.31 BB/9 was the second best in MLB among qualified pitchers, trailing only Seattle's George Kirby (1.08)...His 3.5 walk percentage ranked in the 98th percentile in MLB this season, the third-best mark among qualified pitchers, per *Statcast*, trailing Seattle's Bryan Woo (2.8) and George Kirby (3.0); the 3.5% walk rate was the second-lowest mark of his career after posting a 3.4% rate last season; the lowest walk rate by an Oriole in the *Statcast* era is Tommy Hunter (3.3, 2011)...12 of his 28 starts this season were walkless, the fourth most in MLB, trailing Chicago-AL's Garrett Crochet (13), Seattle's George Kirby (14), and St. Louis' Miles Mikolas (15); had 13 such starts last year, tied for second most in MLB with Mikolas, while trailing Kirby (16).
