METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Rockies, 8-2, on Saturday afternoon...The Mets are a season-high 14 games above .500...The Mets have won six of their last seven games...The Mets are in a stretch of 10 straight games (2-0)...The Mets finish a nine-game homestand (6-2) against the Dodgers (2-1), White Sox (2-1) and Rockies (2-0) today... Following this series, the Mets head back on the road to Los Angeles (four games) and Colorado (three games).

IN THE CITI: They are 23-7 at home this season, tied with the 1986 team for the best home start in franchise history...Their 2.55 ERA at home is the best in the majors...It is the sixth-best mark in franchise history through their first 30 home games of the season...Only the '21 team (2.15), the '85 team (2.23), the '76 team (2.35), the '71 (2.39), and the '68 team (2.41) have better ERA's through as many home games...Their .767 home winning percentage is also the best in the majors.

ODDS + ENDS: The Mets are 9-1 in home series this season and 12-6-1 on series for the year...They improve to 14-4 when hitting multiple home runs in a game this season and 8-0 when hitting three or more homers in a game...Yesterday marked their 15th comeback win of the year...All nine starters recorded a hit yesterday...It was the fourth time this season that has happened.

ON THE RECORD: The Mets enter the day with a 36-22 record this season...That is tied with the 1972 team for the fourth-best start to a season in franchise history, only the 1986 (42-16), 2022 (38-20) and 1988 teams (38-20) had better season-opening records.

THE STRAND: The Mets have stranded 73.9% runners this season, which is the sixth-best mark in the majors and the second-best mark in the National League...The Mets bullpen ranks second in the majors with a 2.78 ERA...They have allowed 15 home runs this season, tied for the third-fewest in the majors.

TRIPLES ARE BEST, TRIPLES ARE SAFE: The Mets have recorded 13 triples through 58 games this season...The 2024 team recorded 15 triples through 162 games...Seven different Mets have recorded a triple this season.

LUCKY LINDOR: The Mets have won the last 25 games in which Francisco Lindor has homered...The streak that goes back to July 9, 2024 is the longest streak in team history...Prior to Lindor's streak, the longest was 21 straight wins when George Foster homered between July 3, 1985, and June 29, 1986...It is tied for the second-longest such streak in Major League history with Lou Gehrig (1927-28) and Ken Caminiti (1997-1998)... Carl Furillo (29, 1951-53) holds the record...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

PITCHING IN: The Mets lead the majors with a 2.84 ERA and are sixth with 518 strikeouts...They are tied for sixth with five shutouts...New York's starting staff has posted a 2.89 ERA this year, the second-best in the majors.

ROCKIES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 31-23 against the Rockies at Citi Field since the ballpark opened in 2009.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit seven lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Michael Conforto for the sixth-most in team history...Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra are tied for fourth with eight leadoff homers.

HIGH-FIVE: Brandon Nimo is on a five-game hitting streak, batting .421 (8-19) with five runs, one double, one home run, two RBI, two walks with a 1.108 OPS in that span...He is slashing .281/.347/.528 with five home runs and 21 RBI in 23 day games...This compares to a .193/.248/.330 line with four homers and eight RBI at night.

BRETT THE MET: In 16 starts since being recalled from Triple-A Syracuse on May 5, Brett Baty is hitting .304/.350/.625 (17-56) with 10 runs, one double, one triple, five homers, 16 RBI, three walks, one stolen base, one hit by pitch and a .975 OPS...At Citi Field this season, has hit .309/.373/.647 (21-68) with 10 extra-base hits and 16 RBI in 25 games.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 36 times this year, which is the second-most in the majors...New York was hit 92 times last season, the third-most in the majors and the most in the Senior Circuit...Pete Alonso owns the franchise record, having been hit by 91 pitches in his career... Brandon Nimmo is second with 81, followed by Jeff McNeil at 77 HBP.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Diaz has not allowed a hit in 30 consecutive at-bats, the longest active streak in the majors...He has not allowed an earned run over his last 13 games, recording six saves and allowing four hits, five walks and 19 strikeouts during that span...He has not allowed a hit over last nine appearances, is the longest streak of his career...He has 54 career saves with three or more strikeouts, the most such games in the majors since 2016.

REEDING RAINBOW: Reed Garrett has pitched to a 0.73 ERA (2 ER/24.2 IP) this season, the third-best mark in franchise history by a pitcher through their first 25 games of the season, behind Doug Sisk (0.50, 1984) and Francisco Rodríguez (0.70, 2009)...Is unscored upon over his last seven appearances (8.0 IP) and has 10 strikeouts during that span.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed one run over 5.2 innings on May 26 vs. Chicago-AL...Allowed four hits, issued three walks and recorded three strikeouts...Has pitched into the sixth inning in each of his last five starts...Had only three such starts through his 10 career starts...Threw a career-high 102 pitches, the first time he threw 100+ pitches in an outing...Over his last eight starts, is 4-2 with a 2.56 ERA (13 ER/45.2 IP).

WHAT UP HOLMES?: Holmes is one of seven pitchers in franchise history to win five or more games and strike out 50 or more batters, while sporting a sub-3.00 ERA in their first 11 games with the franchise...The others are Max Scherzer, Pedro Astacio, Al Leiter, Pedro Martínez, R.A. Dickey and Steven Matz.

HOLMES SWEET HOLMES: In five home starts this season, Holmes is 2-1 with a 3.41 ERA (11 ER/29.0 IP)...The righty has pitched into the sixth inning in each of his five home starts this season and one run in three of those five starts.

NEW PITCH ON THE BLOCK: Holmes has added a new pitch to his arsenal, the "kick change." He has thrown the pitch 15.7% of the time, his third-most used pitch behind only his sinker (38.1%) and his sweeper (16.4%)...The right-hander has held opposing batters to a .206 (7-34) average in at-bats ending with the pitch and has produced a 35.4% whiff rate...His 38.2% K-rate with his "kick change" is the fifth-best mark among all major leaguers who possess a changeup in their arsenal (min. 10 Plate Appearances).

10 K CLAY: On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

NEW ROLE WHO DIS: Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 6-5 with a 3.94 ERA (33 ER/75.1 IP) in 15 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

STAYING GROUNDED: Since 2019, Holmes' 65.4% groundball rate is the third-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 66.9% clip and Andre Pallante's 65.9% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season).

CLAYMATION: Holmes became the seventh Mets pitcher to make their team debut as the club's Opening Day starter...The others are Roger Craig (4/11/62 at STL), Don Cardwell (4/11/67 vs. PIT), Mike Hampton (3/29/00 vs. CHC), Tom Glavine (3/31/03 vs. CHC), Pedro Martínez (4/4/05 at CIN) and Johan Santana (3/31/08 at FLA)...Courtesy of *Elias*...Additionally, Holmes celebrated his 32nd birthday on Opening Day...He became the seventh pitcher in major league history to start Opening Day on their birthday joining Vic Willis (4/12/1906 PIT at STL), Marty Pattin (4/6/1971 MIL at MIN), Bert Blyleven (4/6/73 MIN at OAK and 4/6/79 PIT vs. MTL), Catfish Hunter (4/8/76 NYY at MIL), Jon Lieber (4/2/01 CHC vs. MTL) and Ryan Drese (4/5/05 TEX at LAA)...Courtesy of *Elias*.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30...Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)...Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances...Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league

history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

REELIN' IN THE YEARS: Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazerowski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazerowski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.
