Randy Arozarena and **José Ramírez-CLE** are the only MLB players with 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in each of the last 4 seasons (2021-c).

The Mariners starting rotation has recorded 90 quality starts this season, leading the Majors by a wide margin...with 5 more quality starts, the Mariners would tie the franchise record 95 quality starts set by the 1990 Mariners.

111

The Mariners offense has been hit-by-a-pitch 111 times this season, 1 shy of tying the Modern Era record (since 1900) set by the 2022 New York Mets (112 HBP)...the 2023 Mariners recorded 111 HBP, 2nd-most since 1900.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue the final road trip of the 2024 regular season with the finale of 3 games at the Texas Rangers (2-0)...Seattle will also visit the Houston Astros (3 G, 9/23-9/25) to finish the 2024 road slate...the Mariners are coming off a 9-game homestand (5-4) against the San Diego Padres (1-1), Texas Rangers (3-1) and New York Yankees (1-2)...today's game against Texas will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Dave Sims** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call, and broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Aaron Goldsmith** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners beat the Rangers by an 8-4 score in last night's series middle game.. Seattle has won 3 consecutive games, improving to 11-5 (.688) over their last 16 games (9/4-c), tied for the best record in MLB during that span with the Tigers, Yankees and Mets...with 7 regular season games remaining, Seattle is 5.0 games back of Houston for the AL West Division lead and 1.5 games back of Minnesota for the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot.

- **Brooms** - The Mariners are looking for their 7th series sweep of the season with a win today...Seattle has recorded sweeps vs. Cincinnati (3 G, April 15-17), vs. Los Angeles-AL (3 G, May 31-June 2), vs. Texas (3 G, June 14-16), at San Diego (2 G, July 9-10), at Chicago-AL (3 G, July 26-28) and vs. New York-NL (3 G, Aug. 9-11).
- **Gimme Five** - The Mariners have won 20 consecutive games when scoring 5+ runs, last losing in a 5+-run offensive effort on July 29 at Boston (7-14)...overall, Seattle is 54-4 (.931) when scoring 5+ runs this season, best record in MLB...Seattle is 26-71 (.268) when scoring 4-or-fewer runs.
- **So Close** - The Mariners have played in 52 one-run games this season, tied for most in the Majors with Detroit...Seattle is 26-26 in those contests.

LAST 26 GAMES...Seattle is 16-11 (.592) over 27 games in the **Dan Wilson** and **Edgar Martinez** era (8/23-c), sporting a +40 run differential (136 R, 96 RA)...Seattle's .592 winning percentage during that span is tied for 2nd-best in the American League (also: New York-AL), trailing only Detroit (19-8, .704)...during that span (8/23-c), Seattle owns a 5-2-2 series record with 8 of its 11 losses coming in 1-run games.

OFFENSIVE STUFF...over their last 16 games (9/4-c), Seattle's offense ranks 1st in MLB in batting average (.285), 1st in on-base percentage (.372), 1st in OPS (.837), 2nd in hits (159), 3rd in runs (89) and T-4th in extra-base hits (55)...during that span, the Mariners offense has recorded 10+ hits in 10 of 16 games and 4+ walks in 13 of 16 games, while striking out 10+ times in only 6 of those 16 contests.

FIRST 3 SEASONS OF THE J-ROD SHOW...center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .273 (146x535) with 70 runs, 16 doubles, 19 home runs, 63 RBI, 23 stolen bases and 38 walks in 136 games this season, toting a .327 on-base percentage, .409 slugging percentage and .736 OPS (118 OPS+)...with 1 more home run this season, Julio would join Bobby Witt Jr.-KC as the only 2 players in MLB history to record 20 HR and 20 SB in each of their first 3 MLB seasons.

- **75 HR / 75 SB** - With 79 career home runs and 85 career stolen bases coming into play tonight, Rodríguez is 1 of 2 players in MLB history with 75+ homers and 75+ steals through a player's first 3 career seasons (other: Bobby Witt Jr.-KC, also 2022-24).
- **15+ bWAR** - Julio has accumulated 15.6 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*), 1 of 7 center fielders in MLB history with 15.0+ bWAR through their first 3 career seasons, along with Mike Trout (2011-13), Joe DiMaggio (1936-38), Oscar Charleston (1920-22), **Ken Griffey Jr.** (1989-91), Austin Jackson (2010-12) and Earl Averill (1929-31).
- **Lately** - Over his last 22 contests (8/28-c), Julio is batting .371 (36x97) with 22 runs, 4 doubles, 8 homers, 23 RBI, 9 walks and 5 stolen bases, getting on base at a .417 clip, slugging .660 with a 1.076 OPS...Julio has hit safely in 18 of those 22 games.

SWEET VICTORY(Y)...outfielder **Victor Robles** has reached base safely in 12 consecutive games with at least 1 PA (9/4-c), batting .528 (19x36) during that span...since his first game with the Mariners on June 5, Robles is batting .337 (68x202) with 33 runs scored, 16 doubles, 4 home runs, 21 RBI, 14 walks and 27 stolen bases (1 CS), while reaching base at a .404 clip and slugging .475...during that span (6/5-c), Vic's .337 average is 4th-best in MLB (min. 200 AB), trailing only Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (.344), Vladimir Guerrero Jr.-KC (.343) and Aaron Judge-NYY (.341).

CAL RALEIGH: DOING IT ALL...catcher **Cal Raleigh** has solidified himself as one of the best catchers in the Majors over several seasons...his 87 home runs over the last 3 seasons (2022-c) lead MLB catchers, while his 13.3 Wins Above Replacement (*FanGraphs*) since 2022 rank T-1st in the Majors to only Adley Rutschman-BAL (13.3)...Raleigh has firmly placed himself as the frontrunner for both the American League Silver Slugger and Gold Glove Awards this season:

- **Silver Slugger Candidate** - Cal leads MLB catchers with 30 home runs...after pacing the Majors with 27 home runs in 2022 and 30 in 2023, he is set to become the first catcher to lead the Majors in homers in 3+ consecutive seasons since Mike Piazza did it in 4 consecutive seasons (1999-2002).
- **Gold Glove Candidate** - Cal leads the Majors in catcher caught stealing (26), ranking ahead of Will Smith-LAD (24) and Alejandro Kirk-TOR (23)...after leading the Majors in CCS last season, Raleigh could become the 3rd catcher to lead the Majors in consecutive seasons, joining Jim Sundberg in 1975-76 (Sundberg tied for the Major League lead in '75) and Hall of Famer Gary Carter in 1982-83.

ASTOUND ON THE MOUND...Seattle's overall pitching staff leads the Major Leagues in ERA (3.51), opponent batting average (.221), fewest runs allowed (585), WHIP (1.08), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.80), fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.33), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.41), opponent OBP (.277), opponent OPS (.652) and quality starts (90) this season.

AS YOU KNOW...outfielder **Julio Rodríguez** has tallied 3 home runs in 2 games on the current road trip, while picking up back-to-back games with 4+ RBI for a total of 9 RBI so far on the trip, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Julio is the first Mariners batter to record back-to-back 4 RBI games since Edwin Encarnacion on April 7-8, 2019?...Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** (who happens to be with the club in Texas) is the only player in club history to tally 4+ RBI in 3 consecutive games (Sept. 11-13, 1995)...Jay is 1 of 8 players in MLB history (1901-c) to record 4+ RBI in 3 straight games, with Chris Davis-BAL being the last to do it from April 3-5, 2013...no player has ever tallied 4+ RBI in 4 consecutive games.

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 24-year-old right-handed pitcher is making his 21st start of the season tonight and his 2nd against Texas... marks his 39th Major League start and 4th career start against the Yankees.

LAST TIME OUT...L#3 on 9/17 vs New York-AL...pitched 4.2 innings and allowed 7 runs on 9 hits (2 home runs), 1 walk with 7 strikeouts.

BEST IN THE WEST...in 16 starts against AL West teams in his career he has a 3.30 ERA (29 ER, 79.0 IP) with 77 strikeouts and 18 walks in his career...he has a 2.95 ERA (12 ER, 36.2 IP) in 2024 with 26 strikeouts and 3 walks against AL teams in 7 starts.

A SEASON TO REMEMBER...this season, Woo has pitched 110.1 innings and posted a 0.88 WHIP...the lowest WHIP in franchise history with 100.0+ IP prior to this season was Cliff Lee in 2010 (0.95)...Logan Gilbert this season (0.88) and Woo this season (0.88) would both be Mariners franchise records.

IN RECENT MEMORY...is holding current AL West hitters to a .228 (67x294) average while walking 18 batters with 77 strikeouts.

MAKING UP FOR MISSED TIME...among AL pitchers with at least 100.0 IP, he is 1st in on-base percentage against and in WHIP (0.82), (.234), 2nd in OPS against (.569), 3rd in ERA (2.48), T-6th in opponent slugging percentage (.340) while ranking 7th in batting average against (.209).

LIKE HE NEVER LEFT...has allowed 103 baserunners across his 20 starts (110.1 IP)...he is the only pitcher in MLB history to allow 103-or-less baserunners through his first 20 starts of a season.

PITCHING POWERHOUSE...is averaging 14.1 pitches-per-inning, the best mark in the Majors this season with a minimum of 100.0 IP.

A MONTH TO REMEMBER...in the month of August, he made 6 starts and went 2-1 with a 2.23 ERA (10 ER, 40.1 IP) and 34 strikeouts to 3 walks...Woo tossed 6.0+ innings in every outing and 5 of the 6 were quality starts...he is the 3rd pitcher in franchise history to throw 40.0+ innings in a single month and produce a WHIP below 0.700 during that month...the only others to do so are James Paxton in May 2018 (43.0 IP, 0.698 WHIP) and Félix Hernández in August 2012 (41.2 IP, 0.576 WHIP).

NO TRAFFIC...through 38 career starts, he has allowed the fewest baserunners in franchise history (217)...the next closest over their first 38 starts with the Mariners is Bryce Miller with 237.

DIGGING DEEPER...in his first 29 career starts, Woo had not pitched into the 7th inning...he has since gone into the 7th inning in 7 of his last 9 starts...6 outings came in consecutive starts (8/2-31) and he was 2-1 with a 2.23 ERA (10 ER, 40.1 IP) and a .171 (25x146) average against.

THIRTY WOO...recorded 182 strikeouts through his first 37 career starts...became the 12th player in franchise history with at least 180 strikeouts in his first 37 career starts, joining Félix Hernández (221), Mark Langston (213), Logan Gilbert (210), Hisashi Iwakuma (207), George Kirby (204), Erik Hanson (203), Taijuan Walker (200), Bryce Miller (191), Freddy García (189), Roenis Elías (186), and James Paxton (181).

KEEPING HITS TO A MINIMUM...in his first time through the lineup this season he is holding opponents to a .189 average (33x176) surrendering 3 home runs, walking 5 batters, and striking out 44...in his second time through the lineup he is holding opponents to a .198 average (33x167) surrendering 4 home runs, walking 3 batters and striking out 33 batters.
