THE LATEST (AND LONGEST):

- ★ The Blue Jays lost Game 3 of the World Series, 6-5, to the Dodgers in Chavez Ravine last night...The game lasted 18 innings, matching Game 3 of the 2018 Fall Classic for the longest World Series game in MLB history...The affair took six hours and 39 minutes to complete, the longest game in Blue Jays history (regular+postseason)...The team used 23 players in the game (14 position players, nine pitchers)...The offense had a World Series record 67 at-bats on the night.
- ★ The team holds an all-time record of 8-4 in postseason game 4's, including winning each of their World Series game 4's in the early 90's (2-1W in 1992 vs. ATL & 15-14W in 1993 at PHI), and winning both of their game 4's this postseason (5-2W at NYY & 8-2W at SEA).

THIS IS YOUR CAPTAIN SLUGGING:

- ★ Alejandro Kirk blasted a go-ahead, three-run homer to center in the top of the 4th inning, his fifth longball of the postseason...His five homers are the most in a single postseason by a Mexican-born player, and are tied with Vinny Castilla for the most by a Mexican-born player in a postseason career...The five longballs as a catcher are tied with Sandy Alomar Jr. (1997) and Cal Raleigh (2025) for the most ever in a single postseason...Also singled and drew a pair of walks, finishing the game 2-for-4, his fourth multi-hit effort of this postseason...Has hit safely in 14 of his 19 career postseason games, slashing .292/.373/.542 with eight extra-base hits, 13 RBI, nine walks, and 10 strikeouts (.915 OPS).

WHAT A RELIEF:

- ★ Blue Jays relievers combined to allow three runs over 12.2 innings of work last night, giving up 11 hits and nine walks with 10 strikeouts...The 12.2 innings are the second-most by a team's bullpen in a single postseason game in MLB history, trailing only the Dodgers' 13.1 frames from last night...Over the last five games, the Blue Jays bullpen has posted a 2.51 ERA (8 ER/28.2 IP) while holding hitters to a .172 batting average.

ON A GUERRE-ROLL:

- ★ Vladimir Guerrero Jr. reached base safely four times last night, going 2-for-7 with a pair of walks and a pair of runs scored...His 24 knocks are the most in a single postseason in Blue Jays history, and are tied for seventh-most in MLB history...Enters Tuesday night five hits behind Randy Arozarena (29H in 2020) for the most ever...Over his 14 postseason games this year, has slashed .414/.493/.776 with three doubles, six homers, 12 RBI, and nine walks (1.269 OPS).
- ★ Guerrero Jr. (24H) and Clement (22H) are the third set of teammates in MLB history to each record at least 22 hits in a single postseason, and the only Blue Jays pair to accomplish the feat...The other two sets of teammates to do so were Pablo Sandoval & Hunter Pence for the Giants in 2014 and David Freese & Albert Pujols for the 2011 Cardinals.

FEEL THE ERN:

- ★ Ernie Clement extended his postseason hitting streak to nine games on Monday night with a 4th-inning single to right...Surpassed Nico Hoerner (8G) for the longest hitting streak of the 2025 postseason...Marks the fourth-longest hitting streak in a single postseason in franchise history (Pat Borders - 12G in 1992, Roberto Alomar & Devon White - 10G in 1993)...In his 14 postseason games, is batting .386 (22-for-57) with three doubles, a triple, a home run, eight RBI, and a .926 OPS...His 22 hits trail only Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (24 in 2025) for the most in a single postseason in franchise history.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN:

- ★ The Blue Jays finished the regular season with a 40-41 road record (T-6th in the AL)...**Blue Jays hitters led all AL clubs this year in road AVG (.260) and in road strikeout rate (18.3%)**, while ranking 3rd in road OBP (.327), 3rd in road OPS (.733), T-4th in runs per road game (4.53), and 6th in road SLG (.407)...On the pitching side, Toronto hurlers rank 5th in the AL in road strikeout rate (22.8%), 6th in road walk rate (8.6%), 7th in road K/BB (2.66), and 11th in road WHIP (1.34).

THE LAUER HOUR:

- ★ Eric Lauer entered last night's game with one out in the bottom of the 12th inning...Proceeded to throw 4.2 shutout frames, scattering a pair of hits and four walks with two strikeouts on 68 pitches (45 strikes)...Since 1985, the only longer shutout relief appearance in the World Series came from Madison Bumgarner, who threw 5.0 shutout innings for the Giants in Game 7 of the 2014 Fall Classic against the Royals.

GIVE 'EM A HAND:

- ★ The Blue Jays have scored 88 runs through 14 postseason games, 27 more than the next closest team (LAD - 61R), averaging 6.29 runs per game...Plated at least five runs in a game 75 times during the 2025 regular season, T-2nd most in the AL (T-5th in MLB)...**When scoring at least five runs, the team posted a 71-4 record, an MLB-best .947 win%** (2nd: MIL - .910%), the best single-season mark in franchise history (2nd: .864% in 1985).

THE BIG INNING:

- ★ In the 2025 regular season, the team scored at least four runs in a frame on 46 occasions, trailing only the Brewers (53) for the most in the Majors...Went 36-1 in games in which they recorded a four-run inning this season...Have plated at least four runs in an inning eight times through 14 postseason games.

- ★ The Blue Jays went 1-2 against the Dodgers this season in Chavez Ravine, dropping the first two contests before winning the finale on Aug. 10 by a 5-4 score...Have gone 4-5 over their last nine regular season meetings with the Dodgers, dating back to the start of 2023...Are facing Los Angeles in the postseason for the first time ever...Have met the Dodgers more than three times in a season only once, going 3-3 vs. LAD in 2007.
- ★ Vladimir Guerrero Jr. went 3-for-11 (.273) over the three-game series in LA this season, notching two doubles, a homer, and two RBI for a 1.061 OPS...Over 15 career contests vs. LAD (reg+post), has hit .339 (20-for-59) with five extra-base hits, five RBI, and nine walks (.492 SLG, .918 OPS).
- ★ George Springer met the Dodgers in the 2017 World Series as a member of the Astros, coming out on top in the seven-game affair...Was named World Series MVP, batting .379 (11-for-29) with three doubles, five homers, seven RBI, and five walks for a 1.000 SLG and a 1.471 OPS...Is one of three players all-time to record five home runs in a single World Series (Chase Utley in 2009 vs. NYY & Reggie Jackson in 1977 vs. LAD).
- ★ Mason Fluharty entered the game on Aug. 10 at LAD with one out and the bases loaded in the bottom of the 9th inning, striking out Shohei Ohtani and inducing a game-ending groundball from Mookie Betts to earn his first career MLB save...Became the first player since Trevor Hoffman on Sept. 15, 2002 to pick up a save by retiring two former MVP's with the bases loaded (Barry Bonds & Jeff Kent).

STARTING PITCHER

Shane Bieber, RHP #57

Born: Orange, CA AGE: 30

TODAY'S GAME:

- ✦ Making his 7th career postseason start and his 4th in a Blue Jays uniform... In his last time out, started Game 7 of the ALCS against the Mariners at Rogers Centre, surrendering a pair of runs over 3.2 innings.
- ✦ Started Game 3 of the American League Championship Series at T-Mobile Park vs. SEA, on 9/15, earning the win after tossing 6.0 frames of 2-run ball on 4 hits and a walk with 8 strikeouts...Was his 2nd career postseason quality start...His 8 punchouts matched a career best for a postseason outing (2022 ALWC Game 1 vs. TB).
- ✦ Started Game 3 of the American League Division Series at Yankee Stadium vs. NYY, on 10/7, surrendering 3 runs (2 ER) over 2.2 innings on 5 hits and 1 walk with 3 strikeouts.
- ✦ In his 5 career playoff starts, has posted a 4.72 ERA (14 ER/26.2 IP) with a 28.1% strikeout rate.

2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

- ✦ Earned his 4th win of the season on 9/26 vs. TB, pitching 5.0 innings surrendering 2 runs on 5 hits and a 2 walks with 3 strikeouts.
- ✦ Allowed 2 runs over 6.1 frames of work on 9/20 at KC, giving up 4 hits and a walk with 4 strikeouts on 87 pitches (58 strikes)...Has pitched at least 5.1 innings in each of his six starts with the Blue Jays, surrendering two runs or fewer in 4 of them...Is the first Blue Jay since David Price in 2015 to pitch at least 5.1 frames in each of his first 6 career outings with the team.
- ✦ Threw 6.0 innings of 1-run ball on 4 hits and 1 walk with 5 strikeouts on 9/14 vs. BAL, throwing 67 strikes on 97 pitches (69%)...Notched a season-high 18 whiffs on the day, his most in a start since 3/28/24 at OAK (18), recording multiple whiffs with all 5 pitches.
- ✦ Made his 1st start at Rogers Centre as a Blue Jay on 8/29 vs. MIL, surrendering 2 runs over 5.1 innings on 5 hits and 0 walks with 6 strikeouts...His 15 strikeouts are tied for the 3rd-most through a pitcher's first 2 starts with the team in franchise history, trailing only David Price (18) and Roger Clemens (16)...Became the 2nd pitcher in franchise history to record 15+ strikeouts and 0 walks through his first 2 games in a single season, joining J.A. Happ (17K & 0BB in 2017).
- ✦ Made his Blue Jays debut on 8/22 at MIA, and his first start of the season after recovering from Tommy John surgery, allowing just one run over 6.0 innings on a pair of hits and no walks with 9 strikeouts...Became just the fourth pitcher in franchise history to strike out nine or more batters in their Blue Jays debut, joining David Price (11 on 8/3/15 vs. MIN), Roger Clemens (9 on 4/2/97 vs. CWS) and Steven Matz (9 on 4/5/21 at TEX), while becoming the first pitcher in franchise history to strike out nine or more batters and walk zero in their Blue Jays debut.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS:

- ✦ AL Cy Young Award winner (2020), a two-time All-Star (2019 & 2021), an All-Star Game MVP (2019), and a Gold Glove Award winner (2022).
- ✦ Was unanimously named the AL Cy Young Award winner in 2020 after becoming the ninth pitcher since 1913 to capture MLB's Triple Crown, leading the Majors in wins (8), ERA (1.63), and strikeouts (122).
- ✦ Was acquired by TOR at the trade deadline from the Guardians in exchange for RHP Khal Stephen on 7/31.
- ✦ Drafted in the 4th round (122nd overall) by the Guardians in 2016.

VS. THE DODGERS:

- ✦ Making his 2nd career start against the Dodgers...Has made 4 career starts against NL West opponents, posting a 4.10 ERA and a 1.18 WHIP.

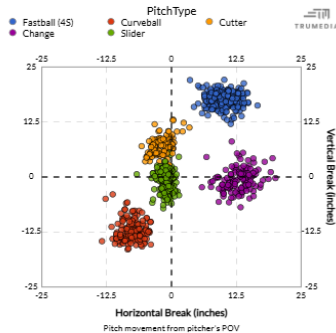
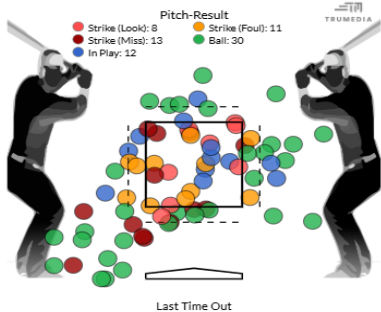
