FROM 100 TO POSTSEASON

The Reds are trying to become the **third team** ever to make the playoffs following a **100-loss season** (2017 Twins, 2020 Marlins) and the **fourth Postseason team** with a **losing home record** during the regular season (**1981 Royals**, 19-28; **2001 Braves**, 40-41; **2020 Marlins**, 11-15)...courtesy @EliasSports.

ELIMINATED

On Fri, 9/22 the Redlegs were eliminated from **NL Central Division** title contention...fell short in their bid to become the **first team** ever to **win a division** after **losing at least 100 games** the season before (62-100)...last season, the Reds were eliminated on **9/10**.

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES

The Reds finished **62-100** (.383) in **2022** and are **82-78** (.513) so far **this season**...among all **Major League** teams from **2022** to **2023**, the Reds rank second to the **Rangers** (89-71, .556) for the largest increase in **wins** (+20, Tex +21) and largest increase in **winning percentage** (+.130, Tex +.136)...courtesy @EliasSports.

ROLLER COASTER

From **4/24-7/31** the Reds went **52-34** (.605), the second-best record in the **Major Leagues** behind the **Braves** (53-29, .646)...through games of **July 31**, the Reds led the **NL Central** by 1.5 games over the **Brewers** and by 5.0 games over the third-place **Cubs**...since then are **23-29**, including **10-17** in **August** and **13-12** in **September**.

KOMEBACK KIDS

The **Reds** and **Orioles** lead the Major Leagues with **48 come-from-behind wins**...the Reds won **24 games** in their **final plate appearance**, including **10 walkoff wins**...Cin's single-season club record for comeback wins is **54** (1976).

- Vice President / Assistant General Manager **Brad Meador** was promoted to **Senior Vice President / General Manager**.

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Adam Wainwright's Cardinals** and **Game 4** (2-1) of a **5-game road trip** to complete the 2023 championship season (1-1 at Cle).
- The Reds last swept the Cardinals **here**, in a series of at least 3 games, from **6/3-6/6, 2021 (4g)**.

SERIES NOTES

- The 19 runs in last night's win were the most ever scored by the Reds vs the Cardinals in a 9-inning game...the Reds also scored 19 runs in a 10-inning win on 7/1/1956...the 17-run margin of victory was Cin's second-largest vs StL (19-1 win on 8/12/1882...courtesy @SlangsOnSports).
- The Reds have lost **10** of the **last 15 games** at **Busch Stadium** but **won 3** of the **first 4 meetings** here this season.

BIG ROAD MACHINE

- The Reds are trying to become **fourth Postseason team** to post a **losing home record** during the regular season (**1981 Royals**, 19-28; **2001 Braves**, 40-41; **2020 Marlins**, 11-15)...courtesy @EliasSports
- Beginning **5/26** the Reds are **37-20** (.649) over their **last 9 road trips** covering **18 road series**...is the **best road record** in the Major Leagues during that span (Tor, 33-19, .635 & Hou, 34-20, .631).
- The Reds won **12** of their **previous 18 completed road series**, including a streak of **7 straight road series wins** snapped by the Brewers in the last series before the All-Star Game break.

ROTATION

- Rookie pitchers** have made **60 starts** for the Reds, including **18** of the Reds' **25 games** so far in **September**...**rookie pitchers** are projected to start **19** of the Reds' **27 games** in **September/October**.
 - LHP Brandon Williamson** (23gs), who began the season at Class AAA Louisville, went 1-1, 5.89 in 4 starts in September.
 - LHP Andrew Abbott** (21gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, went 0-2, 6.10 in 5 starts in September.
 - RHP Connor Phillips** (4gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, is 1-0, 5.66 in 4 starts in September.
 - RHP Lyon Richardson** (4gs), who began the season at Class A Daytona, went 0-1, 8.68 in 2 starts in September.
 - RHP Carson Spiers** (2gs), who began the season at Class AA Chattanooga, went 0-1, 9.00 in 2 starts and 1 relief appearance in September.
 - RHP Fernando Cruz** (2gs), who last year at age 33 made his Major League debut with 14 apps, started the 7-0 loss on 9/19 vs Min.
- Richardson, Abbott, Spiers, Williamson** and **Phillips** made their **Major League debuts** this season.

ROSTER NOTES

- 65 players** have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds, second-most of any team in the Major Leagues this season (LAA, 66) and **1 player** shy of the single-season club record established in **2022**.
- 40 pitchers**, including position players **C Luke Maile** (4 times) and **IF Jason Vosler** (twice), have appeared in **at least 1 game** for the Reds, a new **single-season club record** (38 pitchers, 2022).
- 17 pitchers** have **started at least 1 game** for the Reds, tying the **single-season club record** (2003, 2022)...**17 starters** tie the Dodgers for most in the National League...the Athletics lead the Major Leagues with **24 starters**.
- The Reds have **9 rookies** on today's roster.
 - RHP Fernando Cruz**, **IF Elly De La Cruz**, **IF Christian Encarnacion-Strand**, **IF Noelvi Marte**, **IF/OF Spencer Steer**, **LHP Andrew Abbott**, **RHP Connor Phillips**, **RHP Carson Spiers** and **LHP Brandon Williamson**.
- Had a season-high **12 rookies** on the 27-player roster for the **8/23** day/night doubleheader at LAA.
- 16 Reds players** made their **Major League debuts** this season, the most of any team in the majors...listed below in the order in which they debuted:
 - RHP Casey Legumina**, **RHP Levi Stoudt**, **IF Matt McLain**, **LHP Brandon Williamson**, **RHP Eduardo Salazar**, **OF TJ Hopkins**, **LHP Andrew Abbott**, **IF Elly De La Cruz**, **RHP Ricky Karcher**, **RHP Randy Wynne**, **RHP Jake Wong**, **IF Christian Encarnacion-Strand**, **RHP Lyon Richardson**, **IF Noelvi Marte**, **RHP Carson Spiers**, **RHP Connor Phillips**.
- 23 rookies** played in at least 1 game for the Reds, the most of any team in the Major Leagues and tied for **fourth-most in club history** (**26** in 1909, **25** in 2016, **24** in 1914 & 2017, **23** in 2022)...courtesy @EliasSports.

LET THE KIDS PLAY

- Reds rookies have produced **67 HR**, **233 RBI**, **50 go-ahead RBI** and **75 stolen bases**...are the most **HR**, **RBI** and **go-ahead RBI** totals by any Major League team's rookies and second-most **stolen bases** total by any team's rookies (Oak, 87sb)...courtesy @EliasSports.
- Have established single-season club records for **HR** (67) and **stolen bases** (75) **by rookies**...have produced the Reds' second-most **RBI** (260 in 1935) in a season **by rookies**...courtesy @EliasSports.
- With **67 HR** the Reds have established a new franchise record for home runs in a season by rookies (**Spencer Steer** 23, **Matt McLain** 16, **Elly De La Cruz** 13, **Christian Encarnacion-Strand** 13, **Noelvi Marte** 2)...the **2008 team** recorded **54 home runs** by rookies (**Joey Votto** 24, **Jay Bruce** 21, **Chris Dickerson** 6, **Ryan Hanigan** 2, **Paul Janish** 1).
- The Reds are the first team in Major League history with **3 rookies**, in a single season, with at least **10 HR & 10 stolen bases** each (**Elly De La Cruz**, **Matt McLain**, **Spencer Steer**).
 - For the first time since **1890**, when Cincinnati joined the **National League**, **4 Reds rookies** have produced **at least 10 HR**...prior to this season, never had more than 2 rookies in the same season with 10 HR...courtesy @EliasSports.
 - The Reds have 3 rookies with at least 89 apps (**Spencer Steer** 155, **Elly De La Cruz** 96, **Matt McLain** 89)...most recently produced in the same season 3 rookies with at least 89 apps in 2009 (**Chris Dickerson** 97g, **Paul Janish** 90g, **Ryan Hanigan** 90g).
- Elly De La Cruz** is the only Major League player since **RBI** became an official statistic in 1920 to produce in his first 95 career apps at least 88 hits, 13 HR, 40 RBI and 35 stolen bases...Gary Redus (1983), Barry Bonds (1986) and Chris Sabo (1988) are the only other players with least 80 hits, 10 HR, 40 RBI and 30 steals in their first 95 career games.

Tonight's Pitcher - #34 Connor Phillips, RHP

RED HOTS

- At 22 years old, tonight is making his fifth Major League start.
- Earlier this week was named an MiLB Class AA All-Star.
- In last Sat's 13-12 loss vs Pit, left with a 9-1 lead but was charged with 2 runs scored off Alex Young...the Reds held a 9-0 lead through the third inning.
 - Entering Sat's games, in 2023 Major League teams were 205-0 when trailing by 9+ runs at any point in a game.
 - Dating back to a 10-9 loss in 10 innings on 4/28/2004 at Mil (led 9-0), the Reds had won 111 consecutive games when leading by at least 9 runs.
 - Was the biggest comeback win in Pirates history...they entered that game 0-819 when trailing by at least 9 runs.
- On 9/18 vs Min, in his third career start, earned his first Major League win.
 - Became only the fourth Reds pitcher, within his first 3 career apps, to throw at least 7.0 innings with 3 or fewer hits allowed, 2 or fewer runs allowed, 1 or fewer walks allowed and 7 or more strikeouts...joined Travis Wood (7/10/10 at Phi), Johnny Cueto (4/3/08 vs Ari) and Mo Sanford (8/9/91 at SD).
- Made his first 2 Major League apps on 9/5 vs Sea and 9/13 at Det after he was added to the roster as a substitute player when reliever RHP Fernando Cruz and starters RHP Hunter Greene, RHP Ben Lively & Brandon Williamson went on the COVID-19 injured list.
 - In the 7-6 walkoff win on 9/5 vs Sea made his Major League debut after 66 minor league apps, including 65 starts...was his 12th career appearance and 11th start above Class AA.
- Was returned to Louisville as a substitute player on 9/14, when RHP Ben Lively was reinstated from the COVID-19 injured list.
- Didn't pitch for the Bats before he rejoined the Reds in time to make the start on 9/18 vs the Twins.
- Was a non-roster invitee to 2023 Major League spring training camp.
- His fastball and slider are rated the best in the organization.
- Was selected by the Mariners in Compensation Round B (64th overall) of the June 2020 first-year player draft...was signed by Derek Miller.
- On 3/29/22 was acquired by the Reds as the player to be named in the 3/14/22 trade in which the Reds sent to the Mariners 3B Eugenio Suárez and OF Jesse Winker for RHP Justin Dunn, OF Jake Fraley and minor league LHP Brandon Williamson.
- In 2019 graduated from Magnolia West High School in Magnolia, Texas...played 1 season, in 2020, at McLennan Community College in Waco, Texas.
- 6-2, 209...born in Houston, TX...resides in Magnolia, TX.

Tomorrow's Pitcher - #21 Hunter Greene, RHP

RED HOTS

- Tomorrow will make his fifth start since a 9-day stint on the COVID-19 injured list (9/1-9/9)...will be his seventh career appearance and start vs the Cardinals.
- Was confirmed with COVID-19 following his start on 8/30...remained isolated in San Francisco for 5 days before returning to Cincinnati on 9/5...came off the COVID-19 injured list just prior to his start on 9/10 vs StL.
 - In his 7-1 win on 9/10 vs StL recorded his seventh career start of at least 6.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer...4 Reds pitchers held the Cardinals to 1 hit, an RBI-single off Greene by Andrew Knizner in the fourth inning.
 - His 7 starts of at least 6.0 innings and no more than 2 hits allowed are the most by a Reds pitcher in his first 42 career starts.
 - In the 5-3 loss vs 9/20 recorded a career-high 14 strikeouts, the most by a Reds pitcher since LHP Ron Villone had 16 strikeouts on 9/29/2000 at StL and the most by a Reds righthander since Mario Soto had 14 strikeouts on 9/30/1985 at SF...was his seventh 10-strikeout game in 44 career starts.
- Has made 7 starts since a 62-day stint on the injured list because of right hip pain (6/19-8/19).
 - In those 7 starts went 2-2, 6.42 (33.2ip, 34h, 27r, 24er, 16bb, 46k, 10hr, .252baa).
- Was the Reds' 2023 Opening Day starting pitcher.
- Was selected by the Reds in the first round (2nd overall pick) of the June 2017 first-year player draft.
