**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees begin their six-game homestand tonight with the first game of a three-game set vs. the White Sox (through Thurs.)...will also face the Reds in a three-game series this weekend (Fri.-Sun.)...went 5-1 on their recent road trip after sweeping a three-game series at Cleveland and winning two-of-three games at Toronto.

- ▶ **Their 43-27 (.614) record is the best in the American League and the fourth-best record in the Majors.**
- ▶ Have won six of their last seven games (since 6/7) and seven of their last nine games (since 6/4)...are 13-5 in their last 18 games (since 5/24), 15-8 in their last 23 games (since 5/18) and 35-20 in their last 55 games (since 4/13).
- ▶ Are a season-high 16G over .500.
- ▶ The Yankees'+107 run differential this season is the best in the AL and tied for third-best in the Majors...have outscored their opponents, 106-64, over their last 18 games (since 5/24).

**WHERE WE LEFT OFF:** The Yankees clinched a series win after defeating the Blue Jays, 8-3, on Sunday at Rogers Centre...**RHP Will Warren** (4.0IP, 8H, 2R/ER, 3BB, 1K, 0HR) started and did not record a decision...**SS Anthony Volpe** (2-for-4, 1R, 2RBI) hit go-ahead RBI singles in the second and sixth innings...**C Ali Sánchez** (2-for-3, 1 double, 1RBI) hit an RBI double in the second inning...**DH Ben Rice** (2-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI) hit his 19th home run of the year with a go-ahead two-run shot in the ninth inning...**2B/3B/LF José Caballero** (1-for-5, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) hit his sixth HR of the year with a three-run shot in the ninth inning...**1B Paul Goldschmidt** (3-for-5) recorded a season-high-tying 3H...**Yankees relievers** allowed only 1R/ER in 5.0IP (3H, 1HR, 5K)...**RHP Camilo Doval** (1.0IP, 2K) earned his third win of the year after tossing a perfect eighth inning.

**GOOD AS GOLD:** INF Paul Goldschmidt recorded a season-high-tying 3H on Sunday at Toronto...**has hit safely in 16 of his last 17 games (since 5/25), batting .347/.377/.556 (25-for-72) with 9R, 3 doubles, 4HR, 17RBI, 4BB, 1SF and 1SB over that span.**

- ▶ Has recorded 8RBI in his last seven games (since 6/7) and 17RBI in his last 15 games (since 5/27).
- ▶ Is batting .326/.384/.568 (43-for-132) with 19R, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 8HR, 28RBI, 11BB, 2HP, 1SF and 1SB over his last 36 games (since 4/26).
- ▶ **Has hit .419/.537/.677 (13-for-31) with 2 doubles, 2HR, 21RBI, 7BB, 1SF and 2HP with RISP this season...** as a Yankee (since 2025), has hit .336/.425/.457 (47-for-140) with 8 doubles, 3HR, 55RBI, 21BB/5IBB, 3HP and 3SF with RISP.

**RICE RICE BABY:** C/INF Ben Rice hit his 19th home run of the year with a go-ahead two-run shot in the ninth inning on Sunday at Toronto...nine of his 19HR this year have given the Yankees the lead, including six of his last 8HR and seven of his last 10HR.

- ▶ Has hit .293/.387/.611 (70-for-239) with 51R, 15 doubles, 2 triples, 19HR, 47RBI, 36BB/31BB, 2HP, 2SF and 2SB in 65 games this season...has reached base safely in 50-of-61 starts...36 of his 70H this year have been XBH (15 doubles, 2 triples, 19HR).

**FAST AND FURIOUS:** Yankees baserunners have recorded 19SB over their last 12 games (since 5/31)...their 70SB this season are the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors.

- ▶ **Their 70SB this season are their most through their first 70 games of a season in the last 25 seasons (since 2002) and most since recording 79SB in 2001...**marks only the third time in the last 37 years (since 1990) the Yankees recorded as many stolen bases through their first 70 games of a season (79SB in 2001 and 88SB in 1998).
- ▶ **INF Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (20SB) stole two bases on Sunday at Toronto and reached the 20SB plateau for the fifth time in his career (also 23SB in 2021, 22SB in 2022, 40SB in 2024 and 31SB in 2025)...is one of only four players in the Majors to record at least five 20SB seasons since 2021, joining José Ramírez (six), Randy Arozarena (five) and Bobby Witt Jr. (five)...ranks third in the AL and fifth in the Majors in stolen bases this season...is only the second Yankee in the last 25 years (since 2002) to record at least 20SB through the team's first 70 games of a season, joining Brett Gardner (23SB in 2010).
- ▶ **INF/OF José Caballero** (15SB) ranks fifth in the AL and is tied for 10th in the Majors in stolen bases.

**MATCHING UP:** The Yankees are 11-2 in their last 13G vs. the White Sox (since 2024) and 13-4 in their last 17G (since 6/8/23-G2).

**HIGH VOLTAGE:** INF Anthony Volpe hit go-ahead RBI singles in the second and sixth innings on Sunday at Toronto...is batting .316/.458/.316 (6-for-19) with 9RBI and 5BB with RISP this year.

**2026 HOPE WEEK:** This week, the Yankees are celebrating the 17th edition of **HOPE Week (Helping Others Persevere & Excel)**, an ambitious, week-long, multifaceted community outreach program undertaken by players, coaches and employees within the organization...the initiative is rooted in the belief that acts of goodwill provide hope and encouragement to more than just the recipient of the gesture...over each of the five days of HOPE Week, the Yankees will reach out to an individual, family or organization worthy of recognition and support, providing honorees with a day celebrating their accomplishments...this year's outreach will take place in the community and at Yankee Stadium.



- ▶ During Monday's HOPE Week event, the Yankees honored **Jatee Kearsley** and her Bed-Stuy bakery, **Je T'aime Pâtisserie**, which brings affordable, finely crafted food within reach of families in challenging financial circumstances...presently, Kearsley is struggling to keep her bakery afloat, resisting suggestions such as moving to Manhattan, raising prices or eliminating her acceptance of EBT and SNAP...while these changes would ease her financial situation, it would also require her to compromise her principles...**Yankees players Carlos Rodón, Cam Schlichter, Will Warren, Spencer Jones, J.C. Escarra and Ryan Yarbrough**, along with **Pitching Coach Matt Blake** and **Legends Global Yankee Stadium Executive Chef Robert Flowers** joined Kearsley, a small group of her friends and family for a day of baking at Je T'aime Pâtisserie.
- ▶ Earlier today, the Yankees honored **Dunia Sibomana-Rodriguez** and the non-profit **Smile Rescue Fund for Kids**...the Smile Rescue Fund for Kids brought Dunia to the United States and performed over a dozen surgeries on him to repair severe facial and limb trauma that was caused by a childhood chimpanzee attack in his original home in the Democratic Republic of the Congo...now a graduating high school senior and wrestling star, Dunia is heading off to the University of North Carolina on scholarship this fall...**Yankees players Aaron Judge, Giancarlo Stanton, Ben Rice, Paul Goldschmidt, David Bednar, Anthony Volpe** and **Yankees Assistant Pitching Coach Preston Claiborne** joined Dunia's family and friends and surprised him with a going away party at Yankee Stadium.
- ▶ Since the start of HOPE Week in 2009, the Yankees have gone 44-28 (.611) during the event...the Yankees have gone .500-or-better in 11-of-16 years of HOPE Week and have gone undefeated during HOPE Week four times (5-0 in 2009, 4-0 in 2014, 5-0 in 2016 and 5-0 in 2019)...are 31-20 in their last 51 HOPE Week games (since 7/10/13).

**WHAT A RELIEF:** Yankees relievers allowed only 1R/ER in 5.0 innings on Sunday at Toronto...have posted a 1.60 ERA (33.2IP, 6ER) and 35K over their last nine games (since 6/4).

- ▶ **SAVED BY THE BELL:** INF/OF Cody Bellinger is hitting .281/.369/.516 (43-for-153) with 23R, 11 doubles, 2 triples, 7HR, 31RBI, 23BB, 5SB and 3SF over his last 41 games (since 4/28).
- ▶ Is batting .295/.360/.426 (18-for-61) with 4 doubles, 2 triples, 28RBI, 9BB and 5SF with RISP this season.
- ▶ According to FanGraphs, his 15 DRS are the most in the Majors...is tied for second in the Majors in go-ahead RBI (13, tied for second in AL) and tied for eighth in game-winning RBI (seven, tied for fifth in AL).

**HIP HIP JOSÉ:** INF/OF José Caballero hit his sixth HR of the year with a three-run shot in the ninth inning on Sunday at Toronto... has hit 6HR in 59 games this year after hitting 5HR in 126 games in 2025.

- ▶ Is batting .333/.419/.500 (12-for-36) with 3 doubles, 1HR, 15RBI and 6BB with RISP this year.
- ▶ Has reached base safely in 35 of his last 44 games with a PA (since 4/13), batting .288/.344/.466 (42-for-146) with 23R, 8 doubles, 6HR, 17RBI, 10BB, 3HP, 1SF and 10SB over that span.

**FOR STARTERS:** Yankees starters have posted a 3.28 ERA (384.0IP, 140ER) and 370K in 70 starts this season...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 57 starts this season, the most in the AL and tied for the third-most in the Majors...marks their third-most in franchise history through their first 70 games of a season, trailing only their 59 starts in 2024 and 58 starts in 2022.

- ▶ Lead the Majors in opponents' SLG (.343), rank second in ERA (3.28, first in AL), opponents' BA (.217, first in AL), opponents' OPS (.631, first in AL) and HR/9.0IP (0.91, first in AL), third in WHIP (1.14, second in AL), fourth in opponents' OBP (.288, third in AL), and eighth in strikeout rate (23.5%, fourth in AL), innings pitched (384.0, fourth in AL), strikeouts (370, fourth in AL) and K/BB (2.87, fourth in AL).

## HOPE WEEK SCHEDULE — JUNE 17-19

**WEDNESDAY:** The Yankees will spotlight Bronx-based organization **First Tee Metropolitan NY**, a youth development organization which uses the game of golf as a vehicle to teach life skills, shape character and prepare students for long-term success both on and off the course. While its roots are in sport, its branches extend into education, leadership and college readiness through its "Path to College" program, which is designed to equip middle and high school students with the practical tools and emotional readiness required to pursue higher education through the college application process and beyond. First Tee stands as a testament to the power of holistic youth development. Through their model, a generation of young people are learning that the skills they build on the golf course can help them unlock a lifetime of possibilities far away from the fairway.

*HOPE Week Surprise:* The Yankees will tour First Tee's facility at Mosholu Golf Course in the Bronx, N.Y., participate in putting drills with students and coaches, and have lunch with the group. Later that afternoon, the group will be guests of the Yankees for batting practice and the team's 7:05 p.m. game vs. Chicago-AL.

**THURSDAY:** The Yankees will celebrate **Brian Schwartz** and his national 501(c)3 nonprofit "**I Want To Mow Your Lawn**," which provides older adults, veterans, and neighbors facing physical or financial hardship with free, temporary lawn care relief provided by generous volunteers. The acts of help originated during the isolation of the pandemic and became a national movement that continues to this day.

*HOPE Week Surprise:* Yankees players and coaches along with Yankee Stadium Head Groundskeeper Danny Cunningham will join Brian Schwartz in surprising a family at a residential home in Leonia, N.J. (near the GWB) with free lawn maintenance and gardening around their property. They will then be guests of the Yankees for batting practice and the team's 7:05 p.m. game vs. Chicago-AL.

**FRIDAY:** The Yankees will honor the **Bronx Legends Boxing Academy** and its founder **Jay Bulger**. The organization, which operates at a boxing gym just 1.5 miles north of Yankee Stadium, changes young people's lives through discipline and determination. It also fosters a culture of mentorship, integrating academic support, tutoring and SAT preparation into its holistic mission. The philosophy is simple — discipline learned in the ring must carry over into the classroom.

*HOPE Week Surprise:* Yankees players and coaches will surprise students from Bronx Legends Boxing Academy and tour the facility, participate in meditation, watch the students practice light sparring and eat lunch together. They will then be guests of the Yankees for batting practice and the team's 7:05 p.m. game vs. the Reds.
