METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Pirates, 5-1, last night...New York has won three straight games...The Mets are 74-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 33-10-3 in 46 series this year...Today, the Mets finish a seven game homestand (3-3) against the Cubs (0-3) and Pirates (3-0)...Following this series, the Mets travel west for a seven-day, six-game road trip to Milwaukee (three games) and Oakland (three games).

BRING OUT THE BROOMS: The Mets are looking for their sixth sweep of the season today...It would be their first sweep of the Pirates since July 26-28, 2019 and their first four game sweep of the club since September 13-16, 2010 at Citi Field.

DAY TRIPPER: The Mets have won 11 of their last 13 games in the sunshine...Overall, New York is 36-17 in day games this season...The team's .679 winning percentage in the sunlight is the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 2.98 ERA with 138 walks and 515 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 2.98 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL.

I CAN ONLY COUNT TO THREE: Jacob deGrom enters today's start riding a 39-start streak of allowing three earned runs or fewer...He is tied with Jim Scott (1913-14) for the league record for consecutive starts with three earned runs or fewer allowed...A win today would give him the longest such streak by any starter in MLB history.

HISTORY LESSON: With a win on September 7, deGrom tied Jon Matlack for seventh in Mets history with 82 victories...With a win today, he will take sole possession of seventh place...Al Leiter is next in line with 95 wins.

DELIVING DAYLIGHTS: Among all major league pitchers with at least 50 career starts in day games, deGrom's 1.83 ERA during the day is by far the lowest all-time...The next-best daytime ERA belongs to Eddie Cicotte (2.22)...Clayton Kershaw is the next-closest active player (2.40 lifetime ERA in day games).

HURTS DONUT: The Mets were hit by four pitches last night...It was just the fourth time in franchise history and the second time this season (also, June 17 vs. Miami) that the team was plunked four times in a game...It was the seventh time this year the Mets were hit at least three times in a game...Since 1901, no team has had a trio of hit by pitches in the same game more times in one season...Five other teams have had three or more HBP in a game seven times in a season: 2021 Dodgers, 2021 Cubs, 2004 Pirates, 2001 Astros and 1908 New York Giants...Overall, the Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 101 times this year...The team's 97 HBP sets a franchise record...Since 1901, the Reds set the major league record in 2021 after they were hit by 105 pitches...Mark Canha has been plunked 21 times this year, which is second in the majors...His 21 hit by pitches are tied for the second-highest single-season total in franchise history...He joins Pete Alonso (2019) and Jeff McNeil (2019)...Brandon Nimmo set the record with 22 HBP in 2018.

HECK OR HIGHWATER: The Mets are once again a season-high 37 games over .500...Prior to this year, it is the most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60), their highwater mark for the year...The Mets have won 92 games...The last time they won more games was in 2006, when they tallied 97 victories...The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets own a 92-55 record through 147 games...That is the second-best record in franchise history through 147 games...Only the 1986 team (96-51) posted a better record.

ESC. KEY: Eduardo Escobar has played 20 games since returning from the Injured List...He is batting .373 (25-67) with 13 runs, three doubles, a triple, six home runs, 12 RBI with a .419 OBP and a .716 SLG...He has posted a 1.135 OPS in that span.

NEVER GONNA GIVE YOU UP: The Mets have won 64 games this season in which they never trailed, the most in the National League...The team's 64 "wire-to-wire" wins are the third-most in franchise history...Only the 1986 (69) and 1985 (66) teams have recorded more.

YOU CAN FIND ME IN ST. LUCIE: The St. Lucie Mets won the Florida State League East Division title on Thursday...The victory sends the Mets to the FSL Finals for the first time since 2011...They will play the Dunedin Blue Jays in the Florida State League Championship Series...Game 1 of the best-of-three FSL Finals is Sunday night...Game 2 will be Tuesday at Clover Park at 6:10 p.m. and if necessary Game 3 will be Wednesday at Clover Park at 6:10 p.m...The Mets are seeking their first FSL title since 2006.

GRAND CENTRAL STATION: The Mets are 20-9 against the NL Central this year...They are in a stretch of 10 straight games (3-3) against the division...The Mets have posted a 2.85 ERA with 81 walks and 317 strikeouts against the division...They are hitting .260/.349/.399 against the Central...The team's 20 wins against the division are the most since they went 22-10 in 2016...The team's .690 winning percentage is the second-highest in franchise history...The 2007 team was 28-12 (.700) against the Central.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 27-17 against the Pirates since Citi Field opened in 2009...They have won eight of their last 10 games against the club at home.

COMMUNITY HERO: As part of Major League Baseball's Commissioner's Community Ticket Initiative, the Mets are highlighting organizations that have gone above and beyond in their community through their Community Hero Program...In honor of Hispanic Heritage Month, the Mets are honoring Make the Road New York as their Community Hero. Make the Road serves the Latino community by operating neighborhood-based community centers in Brooklyn, Queens, Staten Island, Long Island and Westchester... Make the Road's work tackles a variety of critical issues including helping low-income tenants, improving public education, and ensuring justice via civic engagement...Staff and volunteers from Make the Road will be honored with tickets, gift bags, and a pre-game ceremony ahead of today's game against the Pirates.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have won 49 games at home this year...That is tied for their highest total at Citi Field in franchise history...It's the most at home since 2015, when the team also won 49 games at Citi Field in 2015...The last time team won more games was in 2006, when the Mets went 50-31 at Shea Stadium...Overall, the Mets are 49-26 at Citi Field...New York's 49 wins at home are tied for second in the NL...They are fourth in National League with a .653 winning percentage at home...The team's .653 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage...The Mets have posted a 3.08 ERA with 211 walks and 749 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL...The Mets have struck out 749 at home this year, which is the second-most in the NL...That is already the fifth-most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 107 strikeouts...That is 17 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)... Díaz has posted a 0.75 ERA (three earned runs/36.0 innings) with 17 hits, eight walks and 69 strikeouts in 35 appearances since the start of June.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,407 batters this season, which places them a top the majors...The team's 1,407 strikeouts are already the fourth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.68 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06... More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.0 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .603 winning percentage (34-20) following the All-Star break...The team's 34 wins are tied for fourth-most in the majors...The Mets are batting .267/.342/.468 with 60 home runs in 54 games following the break... This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets rank fourth in average, second in OBP and fifth in SLG following the break.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso is batting .326 (14-43) with six runs, two doubles, three home runs, eight RBI, four walks with a .388 OBP and a .581 SLG over his last 11 games... He has now hit 62 home runs at home...That places him 10th all-time in franchise history... Kevin McReynolds in ninth with 64.

RIB EYE STEAKS: Francisco Lindor has recorded a career-high 94 RBI this season...His 94 RBI are a franchise record for a shortstop...Pete Alonso is second in the majors and owns the National League lead with 114 RBI this season...Only five times in franchise history have the Mets had multiple players with 100 more RBI on the same team...The 2008 Mets were the last team to accomplish this feat (Carlos Beltrán, Carlos Delgado and David Wright).

LINDOR CITY: Francisco Lindor has hit 24 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 homer runs in 2018, for the most home runs by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .298/.372/.466 with 34 runs, nine doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 28 RBI, 22 walks with an .838 OPS in 54 games following the All-Star break... Lindor ranks sixth in the National League with a 6.2 fWAR this season.

TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: Tomás Nido is batting .301 (25-83) with 13 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, 11 RBI, five walks with a .337 OBP and a .482 SLG in 30 games since the All-Star Break...He is 9-18 (.500) with five runs, three doubles, two home runs, five RBI, a walk with a .526 OBP and a 1.000 SLG over his last five games.

deGROM NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Took his second loss of the season and his first since August 18 at Atlanta... Threw a season-high 96 pitches in 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on five hits with 10 strikeouts as New York fell to Chicago (NL), 4-1...Marked the third outing this season with 10-or-more strikeouts and his second such game in which he did not issue a walk.

RIGHT WHERE HE LEFT OFF: Since returning from the IL on August 2, deGrom has been one of MLB's top pitchers, ranking among league leaders in WHIP (0.59, first), strikeout rate (41.5 percent, first), strikeouts (73, first), opponent average (.147, first), ERA (2.01, 10th) and wins (five, tied for seventh).

HISTORY LESSON: With a win on September 7, deGrom tied Jon Matlack for seventh in Mets history with 82 victories...With a win today, he will take sole possession of seventh place...Al Leiter is next in line with 95 wins.

HIGH QUANTITIES OF QUALITY: Nearly three-quarters of deGrom's starts have lasted at least 6.0 innings with three earned runs or fewer allowed...He has recorded 153 quality starts in 206 career outings (74 percent)...Additionally, deGrom has allowed one or no runs in 101 of his 206 starts (49 percent)...No pitcher in the history of the game has more starts like that through 206 career games.

THIS IS GETTING RIDICULOUS: Through his first eight starts, deGrom has yielded just 25 hits and four walks while striking out 73 batters...It's the second straight year he has allowed 25 hits or fewer, struck out 70 or more and issued fewer than 10 walks in his first eight outings...All other pitchers in MLB history have combined to do that one time (Corbin Burnes, 74 K, 5 BB and 25 hits allowed last year)...DeGrom allowed 22 hits and seven walks and had 82 strikeouts through eight starts in 2021.

I <3 STREAKS: Enters today's start riding a 39-start streak of allowing three earned runs or fewer...Is tied with Jim Scott (1913-14) for the MLB record for consecutive starts with three earned runs or fewer allowed...Further, deGrom has not allowed more than five hits or three runs in any of his last 28 starts...Tony Gonsolin (29 straight) has the longest streak, done mostly while deGrom was on the IL this season...DeGrom can re-tie Gonsolin today...DeGrom has not allowed more than four runs or eight hits in any of his last 58 starts...Can tie the longest streak of that variety today as well (see chart below).

IN deCITI: Has allowed more than three earned runs only twice in his last 37 starts in Queens, posting a 1.66 ERA (43 ER/233.2 IP) at home since May 1, 2019...Has allowed two earned runs or fewer in his last 24 home starts dating back to September 9, 2019...Has allowed one or zero earned runs in 18 of those starts...He had a 1.20 ERA (8 ER/60.0 IP) in 2021...His 2.07 career home ERA is the best among active pitchers (min. 500.0 innings) and the fifth-lowest since ER became an official stat in 1913...The four pitchers with a better home ERA all had their careers end before 1930.

deLIVING DAYLIGHTS: Among all major league pitchers with at least 50 career starts in day games, deGrom's 1.83 ERA during the day is by far the lowest all-time...The next-best daytime ERA belongs to Eddie Cicotte (2.22)...Clayton Kershaw is the next-closest active player (2.40 lifetime ERA in day games).

AGAINST THE PIRATES: Will face Pittsburgh for the second time in his last three starts...Has gone 2-3 with a lifetime 2.08 ERA (11 ER/47.2 IP) against the Pirates...In his last outing against Pittsburgh, deGrom recorded his second shutout of the season as New York won 10-0.

THE EXCELLENCE IS SUSTAINABLE: Since 2018, deGrom owns a 1.94 ERA in 99 starts...That is the best mark in the major leagues in that span (min. 500.0 IP)...He has 323 strikeouts in 35 starts since 2020...He and Dwight Gooden are the only Mets pitchers ever to fan 300 or more in a span of 35 games...See the chart below for an overview of his 2018 and 2019 Cy Young Award-winning seasons compared to his last three seasons combined:

200 CLUB: On August 7, 2022 against Atlanta, deGrom set the MLB record for most strikeouts through a pitcher's first 200 career starts with 1,523...He surpassed the previous record set by Yu Darvish with 1,517...Through his first 200 games, deGrom recorded a 2.50 ERA...Only five pitchers have had a lower ERA through 200 career games (min. 1,000 IP): Dutch Leonard (2.09), Carl Mays (2.23), Reb Russell (2.28), and Baseball Hall of Famers Red Faber (2.41) and Tom Seaver (2.42).

AUGUST IS THE HOTTEST MONTH: In his first month back in over a year, deGrom finished the month of August among the MLB leaders in several categories...He led the majors in strikeouts (55), WHIP (0.55), opponent's batting average (.136), opponent's OPS (.388) and K/BB (18.33).

- Has an RBI in five straight games, tied for the longest streak of his career.
- His 114 RBI this year are tied for 10th in a single season in Mets history...His career-high is 120 RBI (2019)...The Mets record is 124 RBI (done twice).
- Ranks tied for sixth in MLB and tied for third in the NL with 35 home runs...Leads the NL and second in MLB with 114 RBI...Ranks 15th in the NL with 80 runs.
- Ranks 14th in MLB and eighth in the NL with a .506 SLG...Is 15th in the majors and seventh in the NL with an .852 OPS.
- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (eight) and is fifth in games with multiple RBI (28) this season.
