SRF TOPS IN ATTENDANCE AGAIN

◆ SRF led all of MLB in Spring Training attendance for the 15th consecutive season.

- In Cactus League action, the D-backs ranked second in average home attendance this Spring (10,814), behind the Cubs (12,953).

- The bid will tie him with Madison Bumgarner, Zack Greinke and Ian Kennedy for third most Opening Day starts in club history, behind Randy Johnson (6) and Brandon Webb (4).

- ◆ Went 3-4 with a 5.04 ERA (29 R-28 ER in 50.0 IP) and 47 strikeouts over 10 starts in his first season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Began the season on the 15-day injured list (left shoulder strain) and was transferred to the 60-day on April 17...reinstated on Aug. 6.
- ◆ Earned the win in his first start of the season and first start as a D-back on Aug. 7 @ Guardians in Game 2 of the doubleheader.
- ◆ Signed by the D-backs as a free agent on Dec. 8, 2023.

No. 33 - LHP A.J. Puk

- ◆ Went 0-1 with 2 saves, a 1.32 ERA (4 ER in 27.1 IP) and 43 strikeouts over 30 games in his first season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Recorded a career-high and Major League-best 25-game scoreless streak from Aug. 4-Sept. 27...his 23.2 straight scoreless innings were the third longest by a reliever this season, behind Kevin Kelly/TB (24.1) and Raisel Iglesias/ATL (24.1 IP).
- ◆ Set career highs in innings (71.1) and strikeouts (88), while matching his career mark for games with (also: 62 in 2022) and posted career bests in opponent AVG (.195) and WHIP (1.11).
- ◆ Acquired from the Marlins for INF Deyvison De Los Santos and OF Andrew Pintar on July 25.

No. 37 - RHP Kevin Ginkel

- ◆ Entering his seventh season with Arizona, is currently the longest tenured D-backs reliever.
- ◆ In 2024, went 8-3 with 5 saves, a 3.21 ERA (25 ER in 70.0 IP) and 77 strikeouts over 72 games in his sixth season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Recorded career highs in games, saves, innings and strikeouts.
- ◆ Ranked among NL relievers in wins (T-4th, 8), games (T-6th, 72), BB/9.0 IP (6th, 1.93) and K/BB (8th, 5.13) [min. 50 G].
- ◆ Led D-backs relievers in wins, K/BB and BB/9.0 [min. 45 G].
- ◆ Allowed just 4 of his 29 (13.8%) inherited runners to score.
- ◆ Did not allow an earned run in a season-best 12 straight games (13.1 IP) from Aug. 5-31, going 1-0 with a 0.90 WHIP, opponent .159 AVG/.467 OPS, 5 walks and 17 strikeouts in that span.

- ◆ Placed on the 15-day IL on July 31 (sprained right elbow) and missed the rest of the regular season
- ◆ Made his first Opening Day roster.
- ◆ Led the club with 12 relief appearances of 2.0+ innings...worked 3.0 innings 3 times and 2.0+ innings 9 times.
- ◆ Did not allow an earned run in a season-high 10 straight games (1 R in 11.0 IP) and no extra-base hits from May 11-June 1.

- ◆ Named the 2024 D-backs' Rookie of the Year by the Arizona Chapter of the BBWAA after going 5-6 with 8 saves, a 2.48 ERA (20 ER in 72.2 IP) and 91 strikeouts over 64 games.
- ◆ His 100.3 MPH AVG fastball ranked first among NL relievers and third in the Majors, behind Mason Miller/OAK (100.9) and Jhoan Duran/MIN (100.5) [min. 50 G].
- ◆ His 413 pitches of 100.0+ MPH in 2024 led the NL and ranked second in the Majors, behind Mason Miller/OAK (503).
