**RAY REPORT**—The Rays continue a six-game, seven-day homestand against the Reds (1-2) and Twins (three to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...have lost back-to-back series (both 1-2) on the heels of consecutive sweeps over the Yankees (April 10-12) and White Sox (April 14-16)...are an AL-best 11-6 in their last 17 games since April 4 after a 2-5 start (Opening Day-April 3)...have gone 5-4 on a stretch of 27 games in 29 days from April 14-May 13, with off days coming on April 23 and 30...are 2.5 GB behind the Yankees for first place in the AL East...have been in first or second for 10 straight days...overall, they have spent six days in first, 10 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...with six games remaining this month, they are looking to hold a winning record at the end of April for the ninth time in franchise history, first since 2023 (23-6).

- ★ The Rays completed their tour of the NL Central with a 6-1 win over the Reds on Wednesday afternoon, salvaging the three-game set...of their first 24 games, 15 came against NL Central opponents (5-10)...they lost all five of those series, but are undefeated in series play vs. AL clubs (3-0-0), with their .889 (8-1) intraleague winning pct. leading the majors.
- ★ **Nick Martinez** worked 8.0 IP of one-run ball in Wednesday's win...at 35 years, 260 days, he became the second-oldest Ray to record 8.0 IP or more behind **Rich Hill** (41,075) on May 25, 2021 vs. KC (8.0IP)...Martinez's outing was the longest by any Ray since **Shane Baz** (8.0IP) on June 26, 2025 at KC and snapped the rotation's season-high streak of four straight starts yielding four runs or more.
- ★ The Rays scored first on Wednesday to snap a streak of six consecutive games allowing the opening run...they have scored the first run four times in their last 16 games (April 5-pres)...among AL clubs, only the Athletics (17G) and Royals (16G) have allowed opponents to score first more often than the Rays (14G)...their seven comeback wins are tied for second in the AL to the Orioles (8), and their five last at-bat victories are tied for the most in the majors (also: CIN, NYY, SD, STL).
- ★ The Rays have led the AL with seven wins in which they tallied 1 or 0 XBH...they pace AL clubs in singles (157) and are third in RISP average (.280) but rank 15th in extra-base hits (57).
- ★ Rays fielders have committed only one error in their last eight games, tied for the AL's fewest in that span (April 15-pres...also: BOS, KC, LAA) after having 19 in their first 16 games.
- ★ The Rays have lost back-to-back series openers after winning three straight...they have won two of their three openers vs. AL opponents, with the lone loss coming on April 3 at MIN (10-4).

**RECENT TRANSACTIONS**—Earlier today, the Rays acquired RHP **Casey Legumina** from the Mariners for minor league RHP **Ty Cummings**...to make room on the 40-man roster, RHP **Edwin Uceta** (right shoulder impingement) was transferred to the 60-day IL...Legumina, 28, has gone 5-7 with a 5.83 ERA (83.1IP, 54ER) in 73 career appearances (1 start) with the Reds (2023-24) and Mariners (2025-26)...he made eight appearances with the Mariners this season to a 4.63 ERA (11.2IP, 6ER) before being designated for assignment on April 21.

**LA MÁXIMA**—Junior **Caminero** is riding a career-high 12-game on-base streak and has hit safely in a career-high-tying eight consecutive games (also: July 13-25, 2025)...the latter streak is tied with **DET Kevin McGonigle** and **CWS Chase Meidroth** for the second-longest active run in the AL behind **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (9G)...Caminero is 11-for-36 (.306) with 1 2B, 4 HR, 8 RBI, and a 1.009 OPS during the hitting streak (April 15-pres)...he entered that stretch with 2 2B, 2 HR, and 4 RBI in his first 16 games...the major league leader in average bat speed (79.6 mph), Caminero ranks second in the AL with 32 batted balls hit at 100 mph or faster, trailing **Alvarez** (34)...he is responsible for the three highest exit velocities recorded by Rays hitters this season, six of the top seven, and 11 of the top 14.

**JONNY ON THE BASES**—**Jonathan Aranda** reached base safely in 8 of 13 PA (.615 OBP) last series vs. the Reds (2H, 5BB, 1HBP)...his five walks tied April 14-16 at CWS for the most in any three-game set of his career...he has walked in eight of his last nine games since April 14, tying **ATH Nick Kurtz** for the major league lead with 12 free passes in that span...he has reached base safely in half (14) of his 38 PA over that stretch despite going 6-for-25 (.240) at the plate, with the .500 on-base pct. tying for third in the majors...Aranda's 17.6 pct. walk rate is 7.9 pct. higher than his 2025 mark (9.7%), the eighth-largest year-to-year increase in the AL/11th largest in the majors...eight of his 19 BB have come vs. southpaws, tied with three others for the most among all LH hitters in the majors.

- ★ Through 24 games, his team-leading 19 RBI are tied with five other players for second in the AL to **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (26)...last season, he didn't record his 19th RBI until his 37th game...dating back to July 29, 2025, Aranda has 27 RBI in his last 30 games...he has drawn 20 BB in that span, making him the first Ray to meet those marks over any 30-game stretch since **Evan Longoria** (27 RBI, 20 BB) from Sept. 27, 2011-Aug. 11, 2012.
- ★ His six multi-RBI efforts are tied with three others for second in the AL behind **Alvarez** (7G).

**PLAYING THE HITS**—**Yandy Diaz** (T2nd, 32) and **Chandler Simpson** (T4th, 31) both rank among AL leaders in hits, close behind league-leading **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (33)...they are looking to become the first pair of Rays teammates to rank first and second in the AL in hits at the end of April...over the previous 12 seasons (2014-25), only two pairs of AL teammates have turned the trick: **NY Yankees Aaron Judge** (50) and **NY Yankees Paul Goldschmidt** (42) in 2025 and **TOR Bo Bichette** (38) and **TOR Matt Chapman** (38) in 2023, per Stats Perform...Diaz's 32 hits are already tied for seventh most before the end of April in club history and are the most since **Isaac Paredes** (32) in 2024...the franchise record is 40 hits, established by **Rocco Baldelli** in 2003.

- ★ Both Diaz and Simpson have reached base safely in each of their first nine home games, the first pair of Rays teammates to turn the trick since Diaz (15G) and **José Martínez** (12G) in 2020.
- ★ Diaz has reached base safely 46 times, third in franchise history through the Rays first 24 games to **Fred McGriff** (48) in 1998 and **Jonny Gomes** (47) in 2006...the two share the record through 25 games (48)...with six games left, Diaz is on pace to reach safely 57 times by the end of April, which would best **Tommy Pham** (52) in 2019 for the most TOB over such a span in Rays history.
- ★ Diaz enters this series 11 hits shy of 1,000 for his career...he is attempting to become the 20th Cuban-born player to reach the mark.
- ★ Simpson is 13-for-34 (.382) with 4 RBI and 5 SB across his first nine career games at Tropicana Field, the most hits by a Ray over such a span since **Sam Fuld** (13) in 2011.

**TALKIN' TWINS**—The Rays and Twins conclude a six-game season series this weekend after the Rays took two of three games from April 3-5 at Target Field in a set that featured **Kevin Cash's** 900th managerial win in the finale...the clubs will meet for the final time this regular season this Sunday, April 26, the earliest they have ever concluded a season series, surpassing 2002 (May 2)...the Rays are 5-1-1 in their last seven series against the Twins since the start of 2023...their 14-8 (.636) record vs. Minnesota in that span is third best by any AL team behind the Yankees (13-6/.684) and Guardians (26-13/.667)...14 of those 22 games were decided by two runs or fewer, including 11 one-run affairs.

- ★ The Rays are unbeaten (2-0-1) in the last three season series and are 5-2-3 in the previous nine (2016-25; clubs did not meet in 2020).
- ★ This series marks the start of back-to-back sets vs. AL Central competition (also: April 27-29 at CLE)...the Rays are 5-1 vs. the division this season after going 6-13 in their final 19 matchups with AL Central clubs in 2025.
- ★ Tonight marks **Taj Bradley's** first start against the Rays since he was traded to the Twins for RHP **Griffin Jax** at the 2025 trade deadline (July 31)...Bradley spent nearly three major league seasons with the Rays after being selected in the fifth round of 2018 First-Year Player Draft...his 378 SO with Tampa Bay rank third in franchise history by a pitcher the Rays drafted in the fifth round or later, trailing **James Shields** (1,250 SO - 16th rd.) and **Matt Moore** (494 SO - 8th rd.).

**RELATED BIRTHDAY**—Currently on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Durham, Rays left-hander **Garrett Cleavinger** celebrated his 32nd birthday yesterday.

**THIS DAY IN RAYS HISTORY**—On April 24, 2023, the Rays improved to 14-0 at Tropicana Field with an 8-3 win over the Astros, breaking a tie with the 2009 Dodgers for the best home start in the modern era (since 1900)...**Taj Bradley** recorded the win, becoming the fourth Rays pitcher to win each of his first three career starts along with **Josh Fleming** (2020), **Jake Faria** (2017), and **Jeremy Hellickson** (2010)...Tampa Bay moved to 20-3 overall, becoming the sixth club since 1901 to win at least 20 of its

**TONIGHT'S START**—Drew Rasmussen takes the mound this evening against the Twins for his fifth start of the 2026 season...marks his 135th career appearance (86th start) and seventh opposite Minnesota (fourth start)...has a five-decision winning streak dating back to June 25, 2025...allowed three runs or fewer in 28 of 31 starts last season and was named an All-Star for the first time in his career... established career highs in starts (31), innings pitched (150.0), strikeouts (127), and bWAR (4.5).

- ★ Min. 15.0 IP. Rasmussen leads major league pitchers in WHIP (0.66) and baserunners allowed per 9.0 IP (5.95) and ranks highly in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4th, 6.67), walks per 9.0 IP (5th, 1.37), and walk rate (T5th, 4.1%).
- ★ In 2025, he became the fourth Rays pitcher (5x) to record a sub-3.00 ERA while making 30 starts or more, joining Cy Young winners **Blake Snell** (1.89) in 2018 and **David Price** (2.56) in 2012, **James Shields** (2.82) in 2011 and **Price** (2.72) in 2010.

**LAST TIME OUT**—Rasmussen allowed a season-high four earned runs on two hits (both HR) and two walks with three strikeouts over 3.2 innings in an 8-7 win over the Pirates on April 18 at PNC Park...retired the first two batters he faced before yielding a walk and a home run to **Ryan O'Hearn** that made it 2-0...Rasmussen then retired eight straight batters (2SO) before surrendering his second walk of the day followed by his second long ball—a two-run shot by **Marcell Ozuna** that put the Pirates up by four...struck out his final batter before departing in the 4th due to a nearly two-and-a-half-hour rain delay...marked his shortest start since going 2.1 frames in a 6-5 loss to the Orioles in his final start of the year on Sept. 25, 2025...allowed multiple home runs for the first time since giving up a career-high three long balls on Sept. 2, 2025 vs. SEA.

- ★ Rasmussen has gone 42 straight regular-season starts (April 30, 2023–pres.) with four runs or fewer allowed, the longest active streak in the major leagues...it is the second-longest run in franchise history by a traditional starter behind **Shane McClellan** (44G, April 29, 2021–July 26, 2022)...his 31 starts with four runs or fewer last season tied for the most in the majors with **MIL Freddy Peralta**, **PHI Christopher Sánchez**, and **PIT Paul Skenes**.

**DREW-CY LUCY**—Across six career outings (three starts) against the Twins, Rasmussen is 1-1 with a 4.15 ERA (17.1IP, 8ER), 17 strikeouts, a .257 (18-for-70) opp. average, and a 1.27 WHIP...opposing hitters have reached base at a .307 clip against him...carries a 3.65 ERA (12.1IP, 5ER) in his three starts against the club.

- ★ He has not started against the Twins at Tropicana Field in his career...his last home start against them came on May 28, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field, when he tossed 6.0 innings of one-hit ball with one walk, one hit batter, and five strikeouts in a 5-0 win.

**DOMESTIC SWEET DOME**—Rasmussen is making his second home start of the campaign tonight...in his first start, he earned his first victory of the season after tossing 6.0 shutout innings and allowing just one hit with seven strikeouts in a 5-4 win on April 12 vs. NYY...in 66 career appearances (40 starts) at home, he is 14-10 with a 2.66 ERA (243.2IP, 72ER), 230 strikeouts, a .200 (176-for-882) opp. average, and 12 quality starts...this includes an 8-5 mark with a 2.51 ERA (136.0IP, 38ER) and 131 SO over 34 outings (22 starts) at Tropicana Field.

- ★ Has pitched to a 1.56 ERA (17.1IP, 3ER) with 20 strikeouts and a .161 (10-for-62) opp. average over his last seven appearances (two starts) at Tropicana Field, dating back to Aug. 13, 2024 vs. HOU.
- ★ In his 22 career starts at Tropicana Field, he has allowed more than three earned runs on only two occasions...has gone 8-4 with a 2.33 ERA (115.2IP, 30ER) in those 22 outings.

**MADE A DECISION**—Since May 17, 2025, Rasmussen has turned in a 10-1 record, with a pair of career-best-tying five-game winning streaks, including an active streak (June 25, 2025–pres.)...he and **MIL Quinn Priester** are the only pitchers in the majors over that span to win double-digit games and lose one or zero contests...Rasmussen is the only AL pitcher over that time with double-digit wins and three losses or fewer.

- ★ To go with his 10-1 record in that span, he has a 2.57 ERA (129.2IP, 37ER), 112 strikeouts to 30 walks, and a 0.96 WHIP.

**LEADING THE WAY**—Rasmussen paced the Rays rotation and ranked fourth in the AL (min. 150.0IP) with a 2.76 ERA (150.0IP, 46ER) last season, trailing only **DET Tarik Skubal** (2.21), **HOU Hunter Brown** (2.43), and **BOS Garrett Crochet** (2.59)... under the same parameter, he also ranked among AL leaders in WHIP (4th, 1.02), opp. slugging pct. (5th, .340), ground ball rate (5th, 49.0%), opp. OPS (6th, .611), opp. on-base pct. (6th, .271), fewest pitches per IP (6th, 15.4), opp. average (7th, .221), walks per 9.0 IP (8th, 2.22), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 3.43).

**GOOSE EGGS**—Rasmussen made 10 scoreless starts of 5.0 IP or more in 2025, the most in a single season in franchise history and tied with **LAD Yoshinobu Yamamoto** for third most in the majors behind **DET Tarik Skubal** (12) and **PIT Paul Skenes** (12)...his 22 such career starts are the second most in Rays history, behind only **Chris Archer** (24).

**RIGHT ON TIME**—Right-handed batters hit .198 (49-for-247) against him in 2025, sixth lowest in the AL and the sixth lowest mark in franchise history (min. 200AB)...under the same qualifier, his .551 opp. OPS vs. right-handed hitters was third in the AL, trailing only **TEX Nathan Eovaldi** (.512) and **BAL Trevor Rogers** (.519), and ranked second in club history to **Tyler Glasnow** (.492) in 2023.

**PLEASE TAKE ONE**—Rasmussen recorded an MLB-leading 13 starts of 5.0 IP or more without allowing an extra-base hit, most in a season in Rays history, ahead of **David Price** in his 2012 Cy Young-winning campaign (9)...it marked the most such starts by an AL pitcher over an entire season since **CAL Nolan Ryan** (13GS) in 1977.

- ★ Rasmussen yielded five hits or fewer in 17 consecutive starts to end the season, the longest single-season streak in franchise history (excluding openers) and the longest season-ending streak by a traditional starter in AL history...only **CIN Tony Cingrani** (18) in 2013 has recorded a longer season-ending streak.
