**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 3-game series vs 2023 Robert O. Fishel Award-winner Rich Rice's Rangers and the second game (1-0) of Cin's first road trip of 2026, a 7-game jaunt that includes an upcoming 4-game set at loanDepot park vs the Marlins (Mon-Thu).

- The Reds opened the season with 3-3 homestand vs the Red Sox (2-1) and Pirates (1-2).
- Following Thu's game at Mia, the Redlegs will return to Great American Ball Park for a 6-game homestand vs the Angels and Giants.

**TYLER THE CRE-8-OR:** In yesterday's 5-3 win vs Tex, C Tyler Stephenson belted a 2-run, go-ahead homer in the 9th inning off RHP Chris Martin.

- Stephenson's HR came on the eighth pitch of the plate appearance, marking the first of 2 HR in the majors yesterday in which a PA lasting at least 8 pitches resulted in a HR (NYM's Francisco Alvarez off SF's JT Brubaker, 8 pitches).
- The only other such home run in the majors this season came in Cincinnati on 3/29 when Bos' Willyer Abreu went deep off RHP Rhett Lowder in the 4th inning on the ninth pitch of the PA.
- It marked the second time in Stephenson's career that he homered in a PA lasting at least 8 pitches...the other came in the 7th inning of the Reds' 7-5 win on 6/30/23 off SD's Brent Honeywell (10th pitch of PA).
- Yesterday's also marked Stephenson's second career go-ahead HR in the 9th inning or later (also: 9/9/25 at SD).

**WILD WEST:** The Reds have won 35 of their last 62 games vs AL West opponents dating back to 2017 (.565).

**3-4-5:** Reds' 3,4,5 batters have combined to slash .296/.380/.605 in the first 7 games of the 2026 season (24-for-681, 7 HR 14 RBI, 35 times on base).

**SWITCH BLADE:** SS Elly De La Cruz has homered in each of the Reds' last 6 regular-season series dating back to 9/19/25 vs Chc...he's the first switch hitter in Reds history to homer in at least 6 consecutive regular-season series.

- The last Red prior to Elly to homer in 6 straight series was INF Christian Encarnacion-Strand (9/15/23-3/31/24).
- De La Cruz has now homered twice in 13 at-bats vs LHP this season... in 2025, he hit 5 HR in 199 at-bats vs lefties.

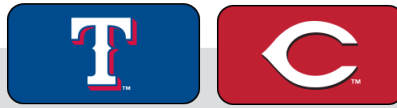

**EL CABALLO DE HIERRO:** SS Elly De La Cruz has appeared in each of the Reds' last 225 games...it marks the third-longest consecutive games played streak by a Red since 2000, behind Aaron Boone (241) and Joey Votto (226).

### SERIES NOTES:

- Cin is 15-14 all-time vs Tex, including 10-7 at Great American Ball Park and 2-2 here at Globe Life Field.
- Tex took 2 out of 3 in last year's series, including back-to-back 1-0 wins at GABP on 4/1 & 4/2...it was the first time since 1907 that the Reds lost consecutive games by a 1-0 score (6/2-6/3g1).
- In the 1-0 Rangers' win on 4/2/25, RHP Nathan Eovaldi produced the series' first-ever complete game (9ip, 4h, 0r, 0bb, 8k, 99TP).
- Cin's 14-3 win on 3/31/25 marked the largest margin of victory by either team in this all-time series.
- In 2023, the Reds swept Tex in a 3-game series from 4/24-4/26 at GABP, only the second sweep by either team in series history (also: 2004 at Cin, 3-0 Reds).

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** 1b Sal Stewart on Mon was named National League Player of the Week for 3/25-3/29...He's the 10th Reds rookie to win NL Player of the Week honors since the award's inception in 1973 (last: Rece Hinds, 7/8-7/14, 2024).

- Stewart is the fifth Red to win the award in the season's first week (others: Kal Daniels 1988, Eddie Milner 1984, Johnny Bench 1983, Dave Collins 1980).
- In the 3 games vs Bos, he went 7-for-10 with a home run, 3 doubles, 3 walks, and 5 hard-hit balls (exit velo of +95mph).

**SPRING RECAP:** The Reds finished 2026 Spring Training action with a 14-17 record, going 9-6 at Goodyear Ballpark (including when Cin was the "away" team vs Cle) and 5-11 on the road...the overall record reflects the 2 exhibition games the Reds lost vs the Brewers in Milwaukee on 3/23 and 3/24.

- Reds batters concluded their spring schedule ranked among Major League leaders in extra-base hits (129, 1st), average exit velocity (91.6 mph), home runs (55, T1st), total bases (535, 2nd), slugging pct (.499, 2nd), hard-hit balls (237, 2nd), and runs scored (182, 6th).
- The Reds' 55 home runs were their most in a single Spring Training season since 2006 (as far back as ST data is available), surpassing the previous best of 44 set by the 2024 club.
- Cin earned its 200th win all-time in Cactus League action with a 3-2 victory on 2/25 at CWS.

**THE SKIPPER:** Manager Terry Francona returns for his second season after guiding the 2025 Reds to their first Postseason berth since 2020 and their first during a full season since 2013...his 83-79 Reds were the 12th Postseason club he has managed in the majors.

- Francona finished as the runner-up to Mil's Pat Murphy for the 2025 National League Manager of the Year Award.
- He became the fifth skipper in Reds history to lead the team to the Postseason in his first year at the helm, joining Lou Piniella (1990), John McNamara (1979), Sparky Anderson (1970), & Patrick Moran (1919).
- Francona became the 12th manager in Major League history to lead 3 or more teams to the Postseason (Cin, Cle, Bos).
- His 2,037 career wins as a Major League manager lead all active skippers and rank 12th in Major League history.

**RHETT LOWDER** RHP #25

**2026 Record: 0-0, 3.60**

Born: 3/8/02, Albermarle, NC | Age: 24

**LAST TIME OUT:** Didn't factor in the decision in Sun's 3-2 win vs Bos (5.0ip, 3h, 2r/2er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr, 86 TP)...was his first Major League appearance since 9/28/24, a span of 547 days.

- Missed the entire 2025 regular season due to injuries (R forearm strain & L oblique strain).
- Had his career-opening 33.2-inning homerless streak snapped after allowing a 2-run HR to Wilyer Abreu in the 4th inning...marked the longest streak by a Reds pitcher to begin his career since Tom Browning (55.1ip, 1984-85).
- Became the seventh Reds pitcher since 1893 to allow 6 hits or fewer in each of his first 7 career starts, the first since Tony Cingrani did so in each of his first 24 Major League starts from 2013014.

**STILL A ROOKIE:** Still meets rookie qualifications despite entering the season with over a year of service time (1.031).

**SPRING RECAP:** Went 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA in 5 Spring Training appearances (15.0ip, 17h, 10r/6er, 6bb, 18k, 0hr).

- Made his final spring appearance on 3/24 in the 4-1 exhibition loss vs Mil at American Family Field (3.0ip, 4h, 2r/1er, 0bb, 3k, 50 TP).

### 2025:

- Missed the entire 2025 regular season with injuries... began the year on the 15-day injured list with a right forearm strain...made rehab appearances at R-ACL Reds, A-Dayton, and AAA-Louisville...suffered a left oblique strain while rehabbing at Louisville and was transferred to the 60-day IL on 6/4/25.
- Didn't pitch again until he made 4 apps with Peoria in the Arizona Fall League (9ip, 5r/5er, 1bb, 8k, 1bb, 2hr, 2hb, 145 TP)...was selected as an Arizona Fall League Fall Star.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned his first Major League win in Mon's 2-0 victory vs Pit (5.0ip, 1h, 0r, 3bb, 7k, 78TP).

- Was his 2026 season debut...became the seventh Reds pitcher since 1900 with 5.0+ scoreless innings pitched, and fewer than 2 hits with at least 7 strikeouts in his season debut (last: Brady Singer in 2025).
- Carried a no-hitter into the 5th inning before allowing a single to Spencer Horwitz to lead off the inning...at 4.0 innings, marked the longest no-hit bid of his big league career.

**SPRING RECAP:** Went 1-2 with a 4.76 ERA in 6 spring starts for the Reds (17.0ip, 14h, 9r/9er, 7bb, 22k, 3hr, 288 TP).

- Last pitched on Tue in the Brewers' 4-1 exhibition win at American Family Field (5.0ip, 4h, 2r/2er, 0bb, 7k, 1hr, 68TP).

**2025 REVIEW:** Went 0-3 with a 4.57 ERA over 13 appearances (8 starts) in his Major League debut.

- Was placed on the 15-day injured list on 8/12 with a grade 1 right flexor strain...was activated on 9/11 and made his next 5 appearances out of the bullpen to end the season.

### TOP PROSPECT:

Enters the season rated as one of the Reds' top prospects per *Baseball America* (#3) and MLB Pipeline (#5)...is considered by *Baseball America* as having the best slider and best control in the Cincinnati system.

### 1.51 ERA:

Has pitched to a 1.51 ERA (35.2ip, 6r/6er) through his first 7 career Major League starts, second-lowest by a Cin starter in that span since earned runs became an official stat in both league in 1913 (Reds Hall of Famer Tom Browning: 1.40, 1984-85).

### A STAR AT WAKE:

After his 2023 junior season at Wake Forest, was named ACC Male Athlete of the Year, ACC Pitcher of the Year for the second straight season, ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, *Baseball America* All-America first team, and Collegiate Baseball All-America first team...was a finalist for the National Pitcher of the Year and Dick Howser Trophy awards and a semifinalist for the Golden Spikes Award.

- He and teammate Chase Burns (2024) are the only pitchers from Wake Forest to win the ACC Pitcher of the Year Award.

### PERSONAL:

Graduated from North Stanly HS in New London, NC where he pitched a pair of no-hitters as a junior...twice was named to the North Carolina All-State team...was a member of the National Honor Society and Beta Club and president of the North Stanly chapter of the National Art Honor Society...as a junior led Wake Forest to its third College World Series (1949, 1955, 2023) after establishing program single-season records in wins (15) and strikeouts (143) while pitching the fourth-most innings (120.1) in school history... that season led the nation in wins while ranking fourth in both strikeouts and ERA (1.87)... in the 2023 College World Series, in his final collegiate appearance threw 7.0 shutout innings against eventual national champion LSU.

**ACQUIRED:** Selected in the first round (7th overall) of the 2023 MLB Draft...was signed by Charlie Aliano.

- Burns and Phillips became the eighth pair of Reds teammates since saves became an official stat in 1969 to earn their first win and save, respectively, in the same game...the last duo to do it was RHP Julian Aguiar and RHP Casey Kelly on 8/24/24 at Pit.
