METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets were postponed yesterday after an off-day on Monday...On Sunday, the Mets fell to the Pirates, 12-1, in Pittsburgh...The Mets have dropped three straight after winning back-to-back games...New York is 19-25 on the road compared to 29-12 at Citi Field in 2025...Tonight the Mets start a six-game homestand against Milwaukee (three games) and the Yankees (three games).

TWINBILLS: The Mets are set to play their second doubleheader of the season...The Mets were swept in a doubleheader on May 4 in St. Louis...The Mets have played 34 double dips since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in 30 of those 34 twinbills over the last four years...New York has swept nine of their last 21 doubleheaders...Of the 34 doubleheaders, the Mets have swept 12, split 18 and have been swept four times...The last time the Brewers and Mets played a twinbill was July 7, 2021...The teams split two games at Citi Field.

IN THE CITY: The Mets are 29-12 at home which is tied for the best start at home in franchise history with the '15 and '88 teams...Their 29-12 (.707) home record is the best mark in the majors...The Mets have posted a 2.88 ERA at home, the second-best mark in the majors and the best in the National League.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: Congrats to RHP Jonah Tong and OF Carson Benge have been selected to participate in the 2025 All Star Futures Game on Saturday, July 12 at Truist Park in Atlanta...Tong, the Mets #4 prospect and #92 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100 prospects leads all of minor league baseball with 115 strikeouts and is second in the minors with a 1.73 ERA in 14 starts...He is also second in MLB and first in all of Double-A with a .137 opponent's batting average, while his strikeout percentage (K%) of 40.5% is second in all of MLB...Tong was selected by the Mets in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy...Benge, the Mets #3 prospect and #81 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100, was promoted to Binghamton on June 23 after starting the year with High-A Brooklyn...Benge slashed .302/.417/.480 with an .897 OPS in 60 games with the Cyclones...He was selected by the Mets with the 19th overall pick in the 2024 draft out of Oklahoma State.

IN GOOD COMPANY: Juan Soto joined Darryl Strawberry (May, 1987), as the only Mets player to have 10 ore more home runs and 20 or more walks in a calendar month...Courtesy of Sarah Langs...In 27 games last month, Soto hit .322/.474/.722 with 25 runs, three doubles, 11 home runs, 20 RBI, 25 walks and two steals.

WALK TO ME: Soto recorded 25 walks in the month of June, the most by a Met in a single calendar month since Brandon Nimmo's 29 walks in September of 2018...He has recorded a Major League-leading 68 walks this season, the most by a Met through the team's first 84 games in franchise history...His 68 walks through the team's first 85 games are the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024).

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: According to Elias, Francisco Lindor has hit 257 home runs and stolen 196 bases as a shortstop...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

JEFF McHITS: Jeff McNeil hit .264/.3232/.483 with 10 runs, four doubles, five homers, 14 RBI, six walks and an .806 OPS in 24 games last month...He has safely hit in four of his last five games, batting .353 (6-17) with two runs, two doubles, three RBI and two walks...McNeil has posted a .280/.378/.493 slashline at home compared to a .233/.307/.467 line on the road.

UPCOMING MILESTONES: Francisco Lindor is two steals away from 200 career SB and one steal away from 100 as a Met...He would become the 12th Met to reach 100 stolen bases and the sixth Met to record at least 100 homers and 100 steals with the team (also: Darryl Strawberry, David Wright, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán and José Reyes).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers...Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Over the last 32 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .317 (39-123) with 18 runs, six doubles, seven homers, 16 RBI, 10 walks, six steals and an .914 OPS...In 25 games when batting in the two-spot, Nimmo is hitting .323/.388/.581 with six doubles, six homers, 13 RBI, eight walks and four steals.

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 5.0 innings of one-run ball and earned his eighth win of the season on June 25 vs. Atlanta...Allowed three hits, issued four walks and struck out two...Marked his eighth start of 5.0 or more innings and one or zero runs allowed, tied for the fifth-most such outings in the NL and tied for the 13th-most in MLB.

WHAT UP HOLMES?: Holmes is one of seven pitchers in franchise history to win eight or more games and strike out 75 or more batters, while sporting a sub-3.00 ERA in their first 16 games with the franchise...The others are Mark Clark, Al Leiter, Pedro Martínez, Steven Matz, Max Scherzer and Frank Viola.

THE GAME OF RISP: This season, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .117 (7-60) average with runners in scoring position, the third-best mark in the majors trailing only teammate Kodai Senga and Seranthony Domínguez (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP)...Out of the seven hits Holmes has allowed this season with runners in scoring position, only one has gone for extra bases...He is one of 14 pitchers in the majors to allow one or zero extra-base hits with runners in scoring position (min. 50 batters faced w/RISP).

STAYING GROUNDED: Since 2019, Holmes' 64.4% groundball rate is the third-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 66.3% clip and Andre Pallante's 65.7% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season).

ALLOWING HOLMES RUNS: Over his last nine starts, Holmes has allowed 10 home runs...In his first seven starts of the season, Holmes did not allow a homer and became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the team...Holmes allowed two home runs in three of his four starts from May 14 - June 1 after he had never surrendered multiple home runs in his first 319 career Major League games...At the time, it was the fifth-longest active such streak by a pitcher to begin their Major League career game.

10 K CLAY: On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elías*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

NEW ROLE WHO DIS: In his new role as a starting pitcher, Holmes has established a career-high 88.0 innings pitched and has earned a career-high-tying eight wins...He is three strikeouts away from matching his career high (78, 2021)...Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 8-5 with a 3.77 ERA (41 ER/98.0 IP) in 19 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30...Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)...Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances...Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with

Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

REELIN' IN THE YEARS: Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazeroski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazeroski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.
