Pitch Selection

Tonight's opposing pitcher, RHP Taijuan Walker throws his fastball 30% of the time and his split finger 29% of the time.

The Braves are hitting .193 with a .316 slugging percentage against splitters this season, but against fastballs, the Braves are slugging .499, the second-highest mark in the majors.

Their average exit velocity on these pitches is 91.7 mph, the highest in all of baseball.

Walker has limited opposing hitters to a .177 average against his split and a .281 average against his fastball.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Mets continue a five-game series with the ninth of 19 meetings between the clubs this season...The team will meet a week from Monday in Atlanta for another four-game series...That will mark the last time the clubs will meet until the penultimate series of the season, September 30-October 2.

A The Braves and Mets also played a five-game series here last season, July 26-29, with Atlanta taking three of the games in the set...This series includes a doubleheader since Atlanta's originally scheduled first trip to New York, April 4-5, was canceled due to the lockout.

A The clubs last met July 11-13 for three games in Atlanta with the Mets taking two-of-three.

A The Braves went 10-9 against the Mets last season, taking the season set from their NL East rivals for the fourth consecutive season...The Braves are now 44-31 (.587) over this stretch, which began in 2018...They went 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018.

A The Braves have allowed 11 home runs to the Mets this season, including four last night, while only hitting 10 against them...For the season, the Braves have a National League-most 162 home runs to the Mets' 110.

A RHP Ian Anderson is 2-2 with a 3.42 ERA (10 ER/26.1 IP) in five career games, all starts, against the Mets...The native of Rexford, NY has taken all of his decisions against the here at Citi Field, compiling a 3.72 ERA (8 ER/19.1 IP) in the process...Both of his wins have come in his last two starts here (June 21, 2021 and May 4, 2022)... He went 5.1 innings both times.

A RHP Taijuan Walker is 1-1 with a 2.88 ERA (8 ER/25.0 IP) in five career games, all starts, against the Braves...The 29-year-old righty last faced Atlanta in 2021, going 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (5 ER/13.0 IP)...He pitched 5.0 innings in both of his decisions, and left his other start after 3.0 innings due to side tightness...3B Austin Riley is 3-for-6 with one home run against Walker in his career.

LOSS: The Braves dropped their second consecutive game last night, losing, 6-4, in the opener of this five-game series with the Mets...The defeat moved the Braves 4.5 games back of the front-running Mets in the NL East division race, the club's biggest deficit since they were 5.0 back after play on June 26.

A Atlanta was a season-high 10.5 games back after play on June 1.

A The Braves are trying to erase their biggest deficit in the division era to win a division title...The team's current record is 10 games in 1993.

A That 1993 club was 10 games behind first-place San Francisco in the NL West after play on July 22... The Braves ended up winning the division by one game with 104 wins.

THREE STRAIGHT LOSSES?: The Braves have lost two straight games 12 times this season after last night's 6-4 loss and Wednesday's 3-1 defeat.

A Atlanta is the only team in the majors without a three-game losing streak this season...This marks the deepest a team has gone into a season without a three-game skid since 2001, when the Mariners did not suffer through their first until games No. 147-150 (a four-game streak).

A That 2001 Mariners team also holds the major league record for the deepest any team has gone into a season without a three-game skid...Research courtesy of the Elias Sports Bureau.

A The Mariners won 116 games that season, tying the major league record for most victories in a single season first set by the 1906 Chicago Cubs.

A This also marks the deepest by games played the Braves have ever gone into a season without losing three games in a row...The previous franchise record was held by the 1884 Boston Beaneaters, which did not suffer through their first three-game losing streak until games 72-77, when they lost five straight...The Beaneaters had a tie in game No. 73, so their first three-game losing streak was game No. 72, 74 and 75.

A The last time the Braves lost three straight games was September 14-18, 2021...Since that date, the club is 86-50 (.632) in 136 games including the playoffs.

TWO OUTS: The Braves scored all four of their runs yesterday with two outs, and rank third in baseball with 211 such runs this season.

A The Braves are hitting .258 (308-for-1,193) with two outs this season, also third best in baseball... The club's .474 slugging in these situations is the best in the majors...The second-place Dodgers slug .446 with two outs.

A The Mets scored four of their six runs with two outs, and the Braves have now allowed 163 such runs this season, ninth fewest in baseball.

REHABILITATION: RHP Darren O'Day is set to begin a major league rehabilitation assignment with Single-A Rome today...The righty went to the 15-day injured list with a strained left calf muscle on July 13, retroactive to July 12.

A O'Day has missed 18 games on the injured list... Prior to his injury, he compiled a 4.15 ERA (10 ER/21.2 IP) in 28 games out of the bullpen.

ACUÑA JR. HOMERS: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. broke an 18-game homerless drought last night with his ninth home run of the season.

A Over those 18 games, Acuña Jr. hit .203 with two doubles and a .232 slugging percentage.

A Last night's drive was just his second home run on the road this season...He has a .687 OPS on the road and a .805 mark at home.

Tonight's Game

- A Makes his 21st start of the season and the 51st of his career.
- A Has made five career starts against the Mets, including one this season, and is 2-2 with a 3.42 ERA (10 ER/26.1 IP) in these games...Atlanta is 3-2 in his starts versus New York.
- A Pitched here at Citi Field, May 4, and earned the win after allowing five hits and one run over 5.1 innings...Walked four and fanned just one...Atlanta beat New York, 9-2.
- A Allowed seven earned runs over 8.2 innings in his first two career starts versus the Mets, losing both...In his three turns since, is 2-0 with a 1.53 ERA (3 ER/17.2 IP) and the Braves have won all three.
- A Last started on July 30 vs. Arizona and turned in his second scoreless start of the season, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with just one hit and one walk allowed...Fanned a career high-tying nine...Atlanta beat the D-backs, 6-2, for his ninth win of the season.
- A The start came one turn after allowing a career high-tying seven runs in just 3.0 innings to the Angels.
- A Went 3-1 with a 4.01 ERA (11 ER/24.2 IP) in July, and seven of the 11 runs he allowed came in that turn against Los Angeles...In his other four starts, went 3-0 with a 1.66 ERA (4 ER/21.2 IP).
- A Is allowing right-handers to bat .115 points higher than lefties this season...Right-handers are batting .317 (65-for-205) with an .892 OPS, while lefties are batting just .202 (38-for-188) with a .598 OPS.
- A Among pitchers with as many starts, Anderson's .317 average to righties is second highest in the majors, behind just Washington's Patrick Corbin (.322).
- A Conversely, the .202 mark he has limited left-handers to is 13th lowest in 56 qualified pitchers.
- A His difference in average between righties and lefties is the largest in baseball among pitchers with as many starts.
- A Made the 50th start of his major league career in his last turn against LAA.
- A Over his first 50 career games, compiled a 21-13 record with a 3.92 ERA (114 ER/261.2 IP) and 255 strikeouts.
- A Is one of just four pitchers in Atlanta franchise history (since 1966) to win at least 21 of their first 50 games, joining Kevin Milwood and Pat Jarvis, who each won 24, and Julio Teheran, who also won 21.

2022 Recap

- A Went 3-2 and pitched to a 6.91 ERA (22 ER/28.2 IP) over six starts in June, the highest ERA in the National League.
- A Only the White Sox' Lucas Giolito, who pitched to a 7.67 ERA, had a higher mark.
- A Anderson's ERA is the highest for a Braves starter in a single month (min.5 starts) since 2016, when Aaron Blair pitched to a 9.51 ERA in June and Matt Wisler posted an 8.89 ERA in July.
- A Started on June 30 at Philadelphia and allowed a career-most seven runs over just 2.0 innings, yielding seven hits and one walk while striking out just one...The Phillies beat the Braves, 14-4.
- A The 2.0-inning start was the shortest of his career, and the seven runs stand as the most he has allowed in a single start in his career.
- A He became the first Atlanta starter to allow at least seven earned runs in a start of 2.0 innings or fewer since Sean Newcomb, who did so on August 10, 2020, also at Philadelphia.
- A Pitched on June 19 at Chicago-NL and allowed just three hits over 6.2 scoreless innings...Walked two and struck out six in Atlanta's win, 6-0.
- A The outing was his first scoreless start of the year, and his first since going 5.2 innings without a run on August 29 of last season versus the Giants.
- A It was his longest scoreless start since a 7.0-inning effort on April 27 of last year, also against Chicago.
- A Started at Milwaukee, May 16, and allowed just four hits and one run over 6.0 innings, but took the loss after the Braves were shut out, 1-0.
- A Became the first Braves starter to lose a 1-0 defeat when going at least 6.0 innings since 2018, when Mike Foltynewicz took such a loss on August 24 vs. Miami.
- A LH Alex Wood was the last Atlanta starter to lose back-to-back 1-0 games, doing so April 17 and April 22, 2014, despite pitching 8.0 innings in both.

- A Made his season debut, April 10 vs. Cincinnati, and allowed a career-most five runs...Walked five in just 2.2 innings, and allowed exactly half of the batters he faced (8-of-16) to reach base safely.
- A Threw just 39 of his 74 total pitches for strikes.

Career Recap

- A Atlanta selected Anderson with the third overall pick in the 2016 draft...He was Atlanta's highest draft selection since 1991, when the Braves took Mike Kelly second overall.

Raisel Iglesias • RHP • 6-2 • 190 • 32 yrs • #53

Saves/Opp: 0/0 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 0/0 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 0/0

- Logged 16 saves and 2-6 record while pitching to a 4.04 ERA in 39 appearances with the Angels this season.
- Acquired by Atlanta from the Los Angeles Angels on August 1 in exchange for LHP Tucker Davidson and RHP Jesse Chavez.
- Ranks eighth among active pitchers with 156 career saves.
- Iglesias and teammate Kenley Jansen are the only two pitchers to record at least 30 saves in the previous four seasons.
- Named to All-MLB Second Team in 2021...His 34 saves were the second most in the American League last season.
- Leads the majors with 37 saves of 4-plus outs since the beginning of the 2017 season.
- Since 2017, his 134 saves are the third most in baseball...Trails teammate Kenley Jansen and Mets reliever Edwin Díaz.
- Made his Major League debut with Cincinnati on April 12, 2015 against St. Louis.

Kenley Jansen • RHP • 6-5 • 265 • 34 yrs • #74

Saves/Opp: 24/28 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 39/31 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/3

- Recorded his 20th save of the season against LAD on 6/25...With that save against his former team, he became just the 14th player in history to record at least 20 saves in 10 different seasons, tied for seventh most.
- Passed Jonathan Papelbon with his last save on June 23 and now ranks 10th among all-time saves leaders...He is three saves away from tying Joe Nathan for the ninth most career saves in baseball history.
- Ranks third in the National League with 24 saves.
- His career 2.43 ERA is the fourth lowest in history among players with as many appearances...Trails Hall-of-Famers Walter Johnson and Mariano Rivera, while Billy Wagner ranks third.
- His 374 career saves are the second most among active pitchers, trailing only Craig Kimbrel...Ranks 10th on the all-time save list and his 19 career postseason saves are second only to Mariano Rivera.
- Is a three-time N.L. All-Star and a two-time recipient of the Trevor Hoffman N.L. Reliever of the Year award.

- Pitching to a 1.61 ERA in 23 relief appearances and is averaging 1.1 innings pitched per outing...Has not surrendered an earned run in 18 of his 23 outings this year.
- Throwing strikes on 69.2% of his pitches, sixth highest rate in the NL (min. 10 appearances).
- His 7.75 rate of strikeouts per walks issued is seventh highest mark in baseball (min. 10 appearances).
- Pitched to a 7.20 ERA in five combined appearances (three in the postseason) last year...This year owns a 1.32 ERA.
- Had a 2.30 ERA in 14 outings with Triple-A Gwinnett this year...Made his debut on October 1, 2021 with Atlanta.
- Became just the second pitcher in major league history to make his first career start in the postseason (first in the world series)...The first was teammate A.J. Minter in the 2020 NLCS.

- Pitching to a 2.08 ERA since being reinstated from the IL...Had a 5.06 ERA prior to his IL stint.
- Made his first appearance since missing 46 games on the IL on 7/5 vs. STL...Pitched a scoreless frame.
- Was placed on the 15-day IL on May 14 with left shoulder inflammation, and was reinstated on 7/4.
- Struck out five of the six hitters he faced in two rehabilitation appearances with Triple-A Gwinnett.
- In 2021, owned a 3.31 ERA in the first half of the season...Pitched to a 1.78 ERA in the second half.
- Stranded 25 of 28 inherited runners and his 89.3% strand rate was the highest in baseball (min. 25 IR) last year.
- Set a new franchise record for appearances in a single postseason with 13...The previous mark of 11 was set by Mark Wohlers in 1995... Appeared in each of the Braves' first eight games, setting a new franchise-record mark and tying the MLB record held by Jesse Orosco, Wade Davis and Greg Holland for consecutive outings to open a postseason.
