TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 10-game road trip tonight with the 2nd of 3 games against the St. Louis Cardinals (1-0)...Seattle began the road trip with a 3-game series at the Los Angeles Angels (1-2) and a 4-games series at the Oakland Athletics (2-2)...following the conclusion of the current series vs. St. Louis, the Mariners return home for a 9-game homestand vs. San Diego (2 G, Sept. 10-11), Texas (4 G, Sept. 12-15) and New York-AL (3 G, Sept. 17-19)...tonight's game in St. Louis will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners defeated the Cardinals by a 6-1 score last night, their 3rd-consecutive win...with 20 regular season games remaining, the Mariners are 4.5 games back of Houston for the AL West Division lead and 5.0 games back of Kansas City for the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot.

- **A Forgotten Land** - The Mariners are making their first visit to Busch Stadium since 2013 and just the fourth visit to St. Louis in franchise history...prior to this season, Seattle had visited every ballpark in the National League at least once since 2019.
- **Take Five** - The Mariners are 47-4 (.922) when they score 5+ runs in a game, best such record in MLB... Seattle is 25-66 (.275) when scoring 4-or-fewer runs.
- **#BoneKnows** - Seattle has the 3rd-highest infield (1B/2B/3B/SS) fielding percentage (.985) in the AL.
- **Approaching Milestones - Cal Raleigh** (89 RBI) is on pace to become the 20th Mariners hitter with 100 RBI in a season (last: **Julio Rodriguez**, 103 in 2023)...**Logan Gilbert** (181 SO) is on pace to become the 9th different Mariners pitcher with 200 strikeouts in a season (last: **Luis Castillo**, 219 in 2023)
- **A Pair of Icons** - Cardinals legend Stan Musial and Mariners great Ken Griffey Jr., who are both members of the Baseball Hall of Fame, were both born on Nov. 21 in Donora, PA, Griffey Jr. in 1969 and Musial in 1920...the pair of HOFers combined for 4 MVPs, 37 All-Star Games, 6,411 hits, 1,105 home runs, 3,787 RBI and 11,405 total bases over 44 Major League seasons.

IN THEIR DAN WILSON ERA...the Mariners are 8-6 in 14 games since **Dan Wilson** was named Manager (8/23-c)...during that span, they have outscored their opponents by 28 runs (75 R, 47 RA)...the Mariners offense is batting .241 (111x460) with 75 runs (5.38 R/G), 24 doubles, 16 home runs and 71 RBI, getting on base at a .348 clip and slugging .398 (.746 OPS) with a 120 wRC+, T-4th best mark in the Majors and 2nd-best in the AL during that span...Mariners pitchers hold a 3.34 ERA (46 ER, 124.0 IP) with 27 walks, 139 strikeouts a 0.95 WHIP and holding opposing hitters to a .200 batting average since Aug. 23.

STINGY STARTERS...Mariners starters have recorded 29 starts of 6.0 scoreless innings this season, the most in the Majors, ranking ahead of Houston (23)...**Bryce Miller** leads the Majors with 8 such starts, while **Logan Gilbert** (7, T-2nd in MLB), **Bryan Woo** (5), **Luis Castillo** (5) and **George Kirby** (4) make up the Mariners total...Miller's 8 starts of 6.0+ scoreless innings are tied for the Mariners record with Hisashi Iwakuma (2013)...Seattle also paces the Majors with 17 starts of 7.0+ scoreless innings.

THE TWO-WAY PROWESS OF CAL...Mariners catcher **Cal Raleigh** leads the Major Leagues in both home runs among catchers (29) and catcher caught stealing (24).

- **Don't Run On Call** - Since "catcher caught stealing" has been tracked (1974-c), only 2 catchers have led the Majors in CCS in back-to-back seasons: Jim Sundberg in 1975-76 (Sundberg tied for the Major League lead in '75) and Hall of Famer Gary Carter in 1982-83...Raleigh, who led the Majors in 2023 with 24 CCS, would become the 3rd catcher to do it if he can hold his current lead.
- **Most HR / Most Runners Thrown Out** - After leading the Majors in homers among catchers (30) and CCS (24) in 2023, **Cal Raleigh** is trying to lead in both categories again in 2024...if he can hold his current lead in both categories, he would become the first (since 1974) to lead MLB catchers in home runs and CCS multiple times...prior to Raleigh leading MLB in both categories last season, only Lance Parrish (1990) and Mike Piazza (1993) had done it.

VIC THE ENTERTAINER...**Victor Robles** is batting .400 (20x50) with 11 runs, 5 doubles, 1 home run, 11 RBI and 6 stolen bases, getting on base at a .456 clip and slugging .560 (1.016 OPS) over his last 15 games (8/17-c)...since making his Mariners debut on June 5, Robles is batting .307 (54x176) with 27 runs, 13 doubles, 4 home runs, 19 RBI and going 19-for-19 in stolen bases, getting on base at a .408 clip and slugging .408 (.765 OPS)...among players with 190 plate appearances since June 5, Robles ranks among the AL leaders in batting average (10th), on-base percentage (11th), stolen bases (T-7th) and wRC+ (15th, 140).

BEST STAFF IN THE LAND...the Mariners pitching staff leads the Major Leagues in ERA (3.51)...Seattle is attempting to lead the American League in ERA in back-to-back seasons (3.74 ERA in 2023) and the Majors in ERA for the first time since 2001 (3.54 ERA)...this season, the Mariners pitching staff leads MLB in opponent batting average (.222), WHIP (1.09), fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.33), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.44), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.80), opponent OPS (.655) and quality starts (84).

BORN TO RUN...the Mariners are 121-for-147 (82.3%) in stolen base attempts this season, tied for the best stolen base percentage in the American League with Toronto...Seattle is on pace to set the franchise record in stolen base percentage, surpassing the 80.6% mark achieved by the 2001 team...**Dylan Moore** (29 SB) is 1 stolen base away from becoming the 16th player in franchise history with a 30+ SB season (last: **Julio Rodriguez**, 37 SB, 2023)...**Victor Robles** is 19-for-19 in SB with the Mariners, passing Henry Cotto (1988) for most successful attempts without being caught to begin a Mariners career.

J-ROD IS BALLING...over his last 36 games (7/4-c), center fielder **Julio Rodriguez** is batting .308 (40x130) with 21 runs, 7 doubles, 7 homers, 20 RBI and 13 walks, getting on base at a .385 clip, slugging .523 with a .908 OPS...Julio has hit safely in a season-high 9-consecutive games (8/28-c), batting .389 (14x36) with 10 runs, 1 double, 3 home runs, 9 RBI and a 1.132 OPS while walking more (6) than he has struck out (4) during the streak.

HE'S RALEY HOT...**Luke Raley** is batting .278 (20x72) with 13 runs, 4 doubles, 7 home runs, 18 RBI and 11 walks over his last 25 games (8/2-c), getting on base at a .386 clip and slugging .625 (1.011 OPS)...since Aug. 2, Raley's 1.011 OPS ranks 5th in the Majors (min. 50 PA).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners were hit-by-pitch twice in yesterday's game, bring their season total to an MLB-leading 99, ranking ahead of Minnesota (88 HBP), and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...Seattle also led the Majors in HBP in 2023 after being plunked a franchise-record 111 times and are looking to become the first team to lead the Majors in hit-by-pitch in back-to-back seasons since Cleveland (2008-09), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that since 1900, only 8 teams have recorded 100+ HBP in a season and only the 2022-23 New York Mets have done so in consecutive seasons?...the MLB record for most hit-by-pitch is 112, set by the Mets in 2022.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 29th start of the season and 1st against St. Louis...he will also make the 117th start of his MLB career and 1st career start against the Cardinals.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on 9/2 at Los Angeles-AL...pitched 6.0 innings allowing 4 runs (4 earned), on 4 hits, with 1 walk, 9 strikeouts, and 1 HR.

LUCKY 7...tied for the most starts of 7.0+ scoreless IP in MLB...has totaled 5 of those outings (38.0 IP) this season (8/10 vs. NYM, 7/14 at LAA, 6/22 at MIA, 6/16 vs. TEX and 5/4 at HOU) tied with Zack Wheeler-PHI.

28 OUTINGS...through his 28 starts of the season, opposing hitters are batting .199 (128x644) against Gilbert...Randy Johnson is the only pitcher in franchise history has ever finished a season with a sub-.200 opponent average against (1997, .194)...so far this season he has allowed 163 baserunners, 2nd-fewest in franchise history through 28 starts...trailing only Bryce Miller from this season with 157 baserunners allowed.

SPLIT SECOND DECISION...hitters this season are batting .104 (8x81) against Gilbert's splitter with 3 doubles and 1 home run...the .104 average is the 3rd-lowest in the Majors and the 2nd-lowest in the AL against a splitter (min. 60 PA).

TOP OF HIS LEAGUE...among qualified AL pitchers this season, Gilbert ranks 1st in WHIP (0.90), 1st in quality starts (21), 2nd in innings pitched (177.2), 1st in Opp. AVG (.199), 4th in strikeouts (181) and tied for 3rd in ERA (3.19).

WHIPPING IT UP...this season Gilbert has posted a 0.901 WHIP...it is the lowest qualified WHIP in franchise history, on pace to be 1 of 3 pitchers to post a sub-1.00 WHIP in a single season...since making his MLB debut, Gilbert is tied for the lowest WHIP in the American League (1.08) (min. 500 IP).

ALL I DO IS WIN...over his career has made 60 starts away from T-Mobile Park...in those starts he is 26-10 for a .722 win percentage, the 2nd-best in MLB history (min. 50 GS)...he is trailing Shane Bieber-CLE (37-14, .725).

FEELING SUPPORTED...is 36-0 in his career when the Mariners score 3 or more runs while he is in the game...in those games the Mariners are 44-10.

QUALITY MIDSET...21 of his 28 starts have been quality starts tied for 1st in the Major Leagues and 1st in the AL...he has gone 6.0+ innings in 23 of his 28 starts...the Mariners are 12-11 when he pitches in 6.0+ innings.

ALL-STAR CALIBER...on July 7, was named to the 2024 American League All-Star team, his 1st All-Star selection...in 20 starts through the All-star break led AL starters with 132.1 IP, 2nd in ERA (2.79), 3rd in strikeouts (124), and gave up the 3rd fewest hits (88).

SHUTDOWN STARTER...made back-to-back starts with 8.0 scoreless innings pitched from 6/16-6/22...since the beginning of the 2020 season, only Nathan Eovaldi-TEX (3 G, 4/29-5/11/21) has gone 8.0+ scoreless innings in consecutive starts...he became the first Seattle pitcher since Mike Montgomery (6/23-6/30/15) to do so.

MID-SEASON FORM...over 5 starts in June, he posted a 2-1 record with a 1.51 ERA (6 ER, 35.2 IP) and 31 strikeouts to 1 walk...his ERA marked the 2nd-lowest of his career during a single month (March/April 2022, 0.40 ERA)...Gilbert's 0.62 WHIP was the best mark in the Majors during June...his WHIP was also the lowest during a single month in his career.

GET AHEAD, STAY AHEAD...he is posting a 67.4% 1st pitch strike rate, the highest of his career...among pitchers with 100.0+ IP, this is the 7th-highest in the AL.

MARINERS MILESTONES...currently is 9th in franchise history with 672 strikeouts...he is 42 strikeouts away from tying Hisashi Iwakuma with 714 strikeouts...he moved into the top-9 after striking out 10 batters on 8/27 vs. Tampa Bay.

100 AND COUNTING...made his 115th career start on 8/27 vs. TB...he had the 4th-most strikeouts (663) in a players' first 115 games with the franchise...behind only Randy Johnson (714), Mark Langston (681) and Félix Hernández (665)...only 14 pitchers in franchise history have had each of their first 100 appearances be starts.
