METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets earned a 10-5 victory over the Marlins yesterday at Citi Field...The Mets finish their first homestand of the season, a six-game stand (5-0) against the Blue Jays (3-0) and the Marlins (2-0)... Following this homestand, the Mets are off on Thursday before the start of a six-game road trip against the A's (three games) and Twins (three games).

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets are on a season-high six-game winning streak...The team has won seven of their last eight contests...New York is a season-high five games over .500...The Mets are first place in the NL East for the first time this year...Last year, New York owned a season-best nine-game winning streak from August 29-September 7, 2024.

BRING OUT THE BROOMS: The Mets are seeking their second sweep of the season today...The Mets last swept the Marlins from July 29-31, 2022 in Miami...They last swept the Fish at Citi Field in a four-game series from August 5 (doubleheader) - August 7, 2019.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets notched their third straight series victory and their second at home...The Mets have not lost a series at home since August 13-15 against the Athletics...Including the current series, they have won the last eight series at Citi Field.

IN THE CITI: The Mets moved to 5-0 at home this season...For the fifth time in franchise history and for the first time in 10 seasons, the Mets have won their first five games at home (also: 1985, 1988, 2005 and 2015)...The Mets have posted a 1.60 ERA (8 ER/45.0 IP) at home this year...That is the third-best mark in the majors and the second-best mark in the National League.

THIS ONE GOES TO 11: Mets pitchers have collected 106 strikeouts this season, which is tied for the sixth-most strikeouts through the team's first 11 games in a season (117K in 2018, 114 K in 2021, 113 K in 2022, 111 K in 2019, 108 K in 2024, 106 K in 2020).

MEGILL, MY BELLE: Tylor Megill is set to make his third start of the season...The right-handed pitcher is 2-0 with a 0.87 ERA (1 ER/10.1 IP), four walks and 10 strikeouts in 2025...He has appeared in five career games (four starts) against the Marlins, going 2-2 with a 3.74 ERA (9 ER/21.2 IP), eight walks and 24 strikeouts...In 40 career appearances at Citi Field (37 starts), Megill is 14-9 with a 3.69 ERA, 77 walks and 201 strikeouts.

ALWAYS JUAN: Juan Soto is on a six-game hitting streak...He has now reached base safely in each of his first 11 games as a Met, a career-high season-opening streak...His 11-game streak is currently tied for the sixth longest season-opening on-base streak in the majors this season...Has reached base two or more times in seven games...Overall, he is batting .308 (12-39) with 10 runs, four doubles, one home run, four RBI, nine walks with a .925 OPS.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: Mets relievers have combined to post a major league-best 1.27 ERA (6 ER/42.2 IP) this season...New York relievers have stranded 23 of 27 inherited runners (82.6 percent) the third-best mark in the majors (min. five inherited runners)...Max Kranick and Reed Garrett have both stranded all six inherited runners this season, that is tied for the most in the majors without allowing an inherited runner to score.

MAX POWER: Max Kranick has stranded all six of his inherited runners, tying teammate Reed Garrett for the most in the majors without allowing an inherited runner to score...He extended his career-high scoreless inning streak to 12.0 IP (since: 5/7/22 at Cincinnati with Pittsburgh), including 7.0 innings pitched this season...He has retired 21 of 22 batters faced this season, holding his opponents to a .045 average.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not lost a season series against the Marlins since 2017...The Mets are 86-57 against the Marlins since Citi Field opened in 2009.

LINSANITY: Francisco Lindor has recorded a leadoff hit in five straight games, the longest such streak by a Met since José Reyes' seven leadoff hits from June 25 - July 2, 2011...Courtesy of Sarah Langs...He hit his 249th career home run yesterday, which is tied with José Valentín for the fifth-most in major league history among shortstops (min. 60% career games at SS)...Lindor has hit safely in his last seven games and is batting .346 (9-26) during that span.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has 15 RBI since March 31, the most in the majors in that span...He ranks third in the majors in RBI...He has hit five doubles this season, tied for the ninth-most by a Met through the team's first 11 games of a season...His eight extra-base hits are tied for the eighth-most by a Met in that span...Yesterday, he scored his 500th career run on Marte's two-run single in the fifth...He is one of 12 players in franchise history with 500 or more runs...He also drove in his 600th career run with his bases-clearing double in the sixth...Alonso is one of six players in franchise history 600 or more RBI.

WE REMEMBER: The New York Mets announced that the team will wear a tribute uniform patch all season long to honor Mets Hall of Famer Ed Kranepool...Kranepool passed away on September 8, 2024, at age 79...Kranepool played for the Mets from 1962-1979, spending his entire 18-year career with the Mets...He was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a 1965 All-Star and the club's all-time leader in games played...Kranepool remains in the Mets all-time top 10 in many statistical categories including plate appearances, hits, at-bats, total bases, doubles, RBI, walks and runs scored...He was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 1990.

LAST TIME OUT: Megill made his second start of the season in the Mets' home opener on April 4 vs. Toronto...He earned his second win of the season after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings (2 H, 3 BB, 4 K)...He retired 16 of his 21 batters faced, including eight straight batters from the third out in the third inning to the first out in the sixth.

SO FAR SO GOOD: In two combined starts this season, he has gone 2-0 with a 0.87 ERA (1 ER/10.1 IP), four walks and 10 strikeouts...Has held opponents to a .143/.225/.200 slash line...He has retired the first batter faced of an inning in 11-of-12 opportunities this season, striking out five...Among pitchers who have faced at least 40 batters this season, he is tied for sixth in opponents' SLG (tied for third in NL), seventh in opponents' OPS (fifth in NL), 10th in ERA (sixth in NL) and tied for 11th in opponents' BA (tied for fifth).

TYLOR MADE: The Mets recorded the win in each of Megill's last eight starts, dating back to August 30, 2024...Tylor has gone 4-0 with a 1.96 ERA (9 ER/41.1 IP), 14 walks and 46 strikeouts during that stretch...He also has held opposing batters to a .200/.268/.280 slash line in those games...In that span, he ranks fourth in opponents' SLG (second in NL) and sixth in ERA (fifth in NL) among major league pitchers (min. 40.0 IP).

STARTING OFF STRONG: Megill has made 13 career starts in the months of March and April, going 9-2 with a 2.54 ERA (19 ER/67.1 IP), 25 walks and 60 strikeouts in those games...Since making his first Opening Day roster in 2022, Megill's nine wins in March/April are tied for the most in the majors (first in NL)...His 2.54 ERA in March/April is the tenth-lowest (third in NL) among pitchers since 2022 (min. 50.0 IP).

HOMECOMING: Megill got the nod in the Mets home opener on April 4...He is one of 11 pitchers to start the home opener since Citi Field's inaugural season in 2009 and joins Johan Santana (2010 and '12), Jacob deGrom (2015-16, '20) and Noah Syndergaard (2017-19) as the only pitchers to take the mound on the home opener multiple times (also: 2023)...The Mets are 24-16 when Megill pitches at home...He has gone 14-9 with a 3.69 ERA (81 ER/197.1 IP) and 201 strikeouts in 40 games (37 starts) at Citi Field.

HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL: In four Spring Training starts, Megill went 0-2 with a 4.24 ERA (8 ER/17.0 IP)...He allowed just one home run to 66 total batters faced...The right-hander last pitched on March 22 against Washington, tossing a spring-high 88 pitches over 5.1 innings.

2024 RECAP: Over 16 games (15 starts) in 2024, Megill went 4-5 with a 4.04 ERA (35 ER/78.0 IP), adding 32 walks against 91 strikeouts...The right-hander allowed three runs or less in 11 of his 15 starts, including each of his last six starts of the season (August 30 - September 30)...He recorded at least six strikeouts in nine starts, tied for his most such starts in a single season (also: 2021)...Among National League pitchers, his 10.50 K/9.0IP ratio was tied for the ninth-best (min. 75.0 IP)...Megill pitched in the Postseason for the first time in his career, making appearances in Game 2 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia (1 ER/1.1 IP) and in Game 3 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL (4 ER/3.0 IP)...Was on the 15-day Injured List from April 1 - May 20 with a right shoulder strain...In seven starts with Triple-A Syracuse in July and August, Megill went 2-0 with a 4.67 ERA (18 ER/34.2 IP) with 41 strikeouts...Also made four combined rehab appearances (April 27 - May 12) with Brooklyn (A+), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA), posting a 0.64 ERA (1 ER/14.0 IP) with one walk and 23 strikeouts.

CAREER HIGHS: Megill established career bests in ERA (4.04), K/9.0IP (10.50), HR/9.0IP (0.92) and FIP (3.62) in 2024, surpassing his previous season records of a 4.52 ERA (2021), 9.94 K/9.0IP ratio (2021), 1.28 HR/9.0IP ratio (2023) and 3.82 FIP (2022).

FAMILY MATTERS: His brother, Trevor, plays for the Milwaukee Brewers...Tylor and Trevor both debuted in the majors in 2021...*Elias* notes that there have been three other pairs of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000: Scott and Tyler Heineman (2019), Joe and A.J. Jimenez (2017) and Donovan and Jhonatan Solano (2012)...The Megill brothers join teammates Luisangel Acuña (Ronald Acuña Jr.) and Edwin Díaz (Alexis Díaz) as three of 13 pairs of siblings to both make 40-man rosters this season...Courtesy of *Elias*.

CAREER NOTES: Made his third career Opening Day roster (also: 2022, '24)...Over parts of four Major League seasons with the Mets, Megill has combined to go 23-21 with a 4.45 ERA (174 ER/351.2 IP), 134 walks and 356 strikeouts over 76 games (69 starts)...Was originally drafted by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Arizona.

- Threw an inning in relief in the Mets win on April 8 against Miami...He surrendered his first run of the season, but he has already thrown 8.1 innings this year which is tied for the third-most by a reliever this season.
- Pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on April 5 against Toronto, which extended his career-high season-opening scoreless streak to 7.1 innings...He had retired 22 of his 26 batters faced during the streak (3 H, BB)...Was the 10th time in his career and second time this season that he has pitched at least 2.1 innings.
- Got the final two outs and picked up the save in the Mets 6-5 win on April 2 at Miami...It was his first career save after not recording one in his first 118 career appearances.
- Pitched 2.1 scoreless innings on Opening Day (March 27) against Houston.
- Made his second career Opening Day roster and his first with the Mets.
- Appeared in nine Grapefruit League games and finished with a 1.69 ERA (2 ER/10.2 IP) and 14 strikeouts.
- Began last season with Miami before he was acquired by the Mets on July 30 in exchange for INF Wilfredo Lara.
- Finished last season with a 5.14 ERA (12 ER/21.0 IP) and 51 strikeouts over 39 games between the Marlins and Mets.
