YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Orioles fell to the Athletics, 3-2 in 10 innings...**Corbin Burnes** surrendered one run in 6.0 innings to earn his third quality start of the year, tying him for the team lead with **Grayson Rodriguez**...**Cedric Mullins** hit his sixth homer of the year in the fourth inning while **Ryan O'Hearn** tallied two hits and an RBI in the loss.

KIMBREL COUNT: **Craig Kimbrel** recorded the 424th save of his career Wednesday afternoon in Anaheim, tying John Franco for sixth in MLB history; only Boston's Kenley Jansen (425) has more among active players...Kimbrel has 1,209 strikeouts, the fourth-most all-time as a reliever behind Hoyt Wilhelm (1,363), Goose Gossage (1,340), and Lee Smith (1,225); the 1,209 punch outs by Kimbrel are the most by a player in MLB history who has never started a game.

HOMER HAPPY: The Orioles lead MLB with 38 home runs, the second-most homers through the first 25 games in O's history, behind 39 by the 2005 team; the most homers through Baltimore's first 26 games of a season is also 39 by the 2020 and 2005 teams.
 ⚾ The Orioles are one of two MLB teams (also Los Angeles-NL) with four players who've hit at least five home runs: **Gunnar Henderson** (8), **Colton Cowser** and **Cedric Mullins** (6), and **Jordan Westburg** (5).

THEY'VE GOT POP: The O's lead the AL and are second in MLB with a 90.3 mph average exit velocity, per Statcast (see box at right)...The O's lead the AL and rank second in MLB with 66 barrels, and also lead in the AL and are third in MLB with 302 hard-hit balls (95+ mph)...**Gunnar Henderson** ranks second among all hitters with a 95.6 mph average exit velo (see box at right).

RUN IT UP: The Orioles lead the AL and rank sixth in MLB with 138 runs scored...Their +28 run differential is third in the AL, while their 5.52 runs per game leads the AL and ranks third in MLB.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT: The Orioles are slashing .192/.243/.348 (87-for-454) in two-strike counts...They lead MLB in slugging, OPS (.591), and extra-base hits (38) with two strikes, and are second in home runs (15)...**Jordan Westburg** has hit .318/.375/.636 (14-for-44) in two-strike counts with three doubles, one triple, and three home runs...He leads MLB in two-strike slugging percentage and OPS (1.011), ranks tied for second in two-strike extra-base hits (7), trailing teammate **Gunnar Henderson** (8), and is third in two-strike batting average.

WESTY AND HIS BESTY: **Colton Cowser** and **Jordan Westburg** have been named AL Player of the Week in back-to-back weeks, with Cowser winning for the period of April 8-14 and Westburg for the period of April 15-21...The O's are the first team to win consecutive Player of the Week honors since the Braves for the weeks of August 14 and 21, 2023 (Olson/Rosario), and the first AL team since the Astros for the weeks of August 7 and 14, 2023 (Valdez/Altuve)...The last time the Orioles earned back-to-back Player of the Week honors was 1981, when Orioles Legend and National Baseball Hall of Famer **Eddie Murray** won two straight for the weeks of September 13 and 20...Overall, it is the third time Baltimore earned back-to-back weekly honors after **Don Baylor** won on August 10, 1975, followed by Orioles Legend and National Baseball Hall of Famer **Jim Palmer** and **Ken Singleton** winning co-honors on August 17.

ELECTRIC AVENUE: **Cedric Mullins** earned his MLB-leading seventh career Electric Play of the Week award for his **diving catch** on April 15 vs. Minnesota...Mullins went full extension in center field to rob Kyle Farmer for the last out of the top of the first inning...The Orioles have an MLB-best 13 Play of the Week awards since 2019.

FEELS GOOD TO BE HOME: The Orioles began a seven-game homestand last night against the A's (3 G) and Yankees (4 G)...The O's are 8-5 at home to start the year...Last season, the Orioles went 49-32 (.605) at Oriole Park, the third-best record in ballpark history (since 1992), behind the 2014 and 2016 teams who went 50-31 (.617) at Camden Yards...Marked the third-best home record in the AL in 2023 behind Tampa Bay at 53-28 (.654) and Texas at 50-31 (.617), and tied for the fifth-best in MLB.

WAR OF THE VOWELS: The O's and A's are meeting for the first of two regular-season series with this weekend's three-game set in Baltimore...The Orioles will travel to Oakland for a three-game set from July 5-7...The Birds went 6-1 against the Athletics last year, taking three out of four in Baltimore from April 10-13 before completing a three-game sweep in Oakland from August 18-20.

O THE PLACES YOU'LL GO: The Birds went 4-2 on their six-game road trip against the Royals (2-1) and Angels (2-1) from April 19-24...The O's are off to an 8-4 road start this year...Last season, the Orioles went 52-29 (.642) away from Camden Yards, tied with the Braves for the best road record in MLB and tied with the 1997 O's squad for the best road record in club history (since 1954); marked the third time an O's team reached 50 road wins, joining 1997 (52) and 1980 (50).

SWEEPLESS IN BALTIMORE: The Orioles have gone 99 consecutive regular-season series of at least two decisions (no ties) without being swept...According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, that is the fourth-longest regular-season streak in MLB history, trailing the 1942-44 St. Louis Cardinals (124), 1906-09 Chicago Cubs (115), and 1903-05 New York Giants (105)...Baltimore's current streak is the longest in O's history, ahead of 46 such series from 1971-72...The Birds have not been swept in a regular-season series of at least two games since May 13-15, 2022 at Detroit (0-3), and not at home in a series of at least two games since August 27-29, 2021 vs. Tampa Bay (0-3)...The Orioles were swept by the Rangers in three games in the 2023 ALDS.
 ⚾ The 2023 Orioles (52 series) were the fourth MLB team since 2000 to go a full regular season without being swept in a series of at least two decisions, joining the Braves teams of 2022 (51 series), 2004 (52 series), and 2002 (52 series).

THE SKIPPER: Manager **Brandon Hyde** is in his sixth season in Baltimore...In 2023, he led the O's to an AL-best 101-61 record, their second straight winning campaign and the first time since 1997 that the Orioles claimed the top seed in the AL...He made his Postseason managerial debut in the ALDS, and was named the Baseball Writers' Association of America (BBWAA) AL Manager of the Year, becoming the fourth Orioles manager to win the award...He was also voted the Sporting News American League Manager of the Year by fellow AL managers for the second consecutive year...Hyde was named the 20th manager in Orioles history on December 14, 2018...His 331 wins rank fifth all-time among Orioles managers, trailing **Hank Bauer** (407), **Paul Richards** (517), **Buck Showalter** (669), and Orioles Legend and National Baseball Hall of Famer **Earl Weaver** (1,480).
 ⚾ Today, the first 20,000 fans ages 15 and over will receive a **Brandon Hyde 2023 AL Manager of the Year Bobblehead**.

HERE'S TO YOU, HENNY: Earlier this year, the Orioles named the press box at Oriole Park at Camden Yards the Jim Henneman Press Box in honor of longtime Baltimore sportswriter and official scorer **Jim Henneman**, who has covered Baltimore sports for eight decades...To celebrate this recognition, "Henny" will throw out the ceremonial first pitch, which will be caught by Orioles Head Athletic Trainer **Brian Ebel**.

QUICK HITS: Scheduled to make his fifth start of the season this afternoon against his former team...Made his fifth Opening Day roster...Began the 2023 campaign in the starting rotation with the big-league club; had four stints with the Orioles after being optioned to Triple-A Norfolk on April 14, May 21, and September 13; recalled from the Tides on May 16, June 10, and October 1..Owned a 1-4 record with a 4.81 ERA (31 ER/58.0 IP) in 12 starts and pitched to a 3.26 ERA (7 ER/19.1 IP) in 12 relief appearances with the O's...Did not appear on the ALDS roster...Acquired by the Orioles along with RHP Kyle Virbitsky from the Oakland Athletics in exchange for INF Darelle Hernaiz on January 26, 2023.

LAST TIME OUT: Picked up the win on Sunday in Kansas City, allowing four hits and two walks with two strikeouts across 6.2 shutout innings...Marked his longest start as an Oriole and his first win since June 10, 2023 against the Royals in Baltimore...Threw 93 pitches, 58 strikes.

AGAINST THE ATHLETICS: Making his third career start against the Athletics and his first since August 19, 2023...Allowed seven runs across 9.0 innings in his two career starts against the A's; both of his prior appearances came with the Orioles in 2023 after spending the two previous seasons in the Oakland organization.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Owns a lifetime 9-19 record and 4.25 ERA (98 ER/207.1 IP) in 38 career appearances (37 GS) against the AL West; his 26 home runs allowed are the most against any division...Opponents are slashing .263/.309/.408 (214-for-1873).

HOME SWEET HOME: Posted a 5.03 ERA (22 ER/39.1 IP), allowing 42 hits (3 HR), 14 walks, and four hit batters with 33 strikeouts across 12 appearances (6 GS) at home in 2023.

DAY MAN: Registered a 5.52 ERA (18 ER/29.1 IP) and a .822 opponent OPS across 10 day appearances (5 GS) last season compared to a 3.75 ERA (320 ER/48.0 IP) and an .677 opponent OPS in 14 night appearances (7 GS).

APRIL SHOWERS: Owns a 5-7 record and a 4.67 ERA (46 ER/88.2 IP) across 17 career starts in April, allowing 97 hits (11 HR) and 26 walks with 69 strikeouts...Opponents are slashing .276/.332/.435 (97-for-352).

2023 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed a career-high 4.0 innings of relief on July 18 vs. Los Angeles-NL...Did not allow more than one earned run in five straight starts from June 26-August 19, the longest such streak of his career...Pitched for Norfolk in Game Two of the International League Championship Series on September 27 vs. Durham; tossed 3.0 scoreless innings with two hits and five strikeouts.

Scheduled to make his third start of the season and third career appearance against the Athletics...Secured the win on April 22 at Los Angeles-AL after completing 5.2 scoreless innings; allowed four hits and two walks with five strikeouts...Marked his first win since June 23, 2016 at Pittsburgh with San Francisco...Became the first pitcher with an outing of 5+ innings and no runs allowed in each of his first two appearances after not appearing in MLB for 5+ years since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893, per the *Elias Sports Bureau*...Owns a lifetime 5.19 ERA (5 ER/8.2 IP) across two appearances (1 GS) against Oakland...Spent the previous five seasons in Japan (2019-21) and Korea (2022-23)...Went 4-7 with a 3.92 ERA (47 ER/108.0 IP) in 19 starts with the Samsung Lions in 2023.
