METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off yesterday...On Wednesday, the Mets defeated the Angels, 6-3, to complete a three-game sweep...The Mets have won four straight games after losing three straight...Today, the Mets begin their final west coast swing of the season, a six-game trip against the Giants (three games) and Padres (three games).

BILLY THE KID: Congrats to Billy Wagner who will be inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame this weekend...Wagner spent parts of four years with the Mets from 2006-09, going 5-5 with 101 saves, a 2.37 ERA (50 ER/189.2 IP), 54 walks and 230 strikeouts...He was selected to the All-Star team in 2007 and 2008.

METSIES GO WEST: The Mets will play nine straight games against the NL West... They face the Giants for three games, the Padres for three and head to Citi Field to face the Giants for three games...The Mets are 13-6 against the NL West this season...New York went 17-15 against the NL West in 2024.

MULTIPLICITY: On Wednesday, Brandon Nimmo, Francisco Lindor, Pete Alonso and Starling Marte each recorded multiple hits...The Mets are 15-0 when four or more players record multiple hits in a game...Jeff McNeil is 13th on the Mets all-time list with 239 multi-hit games, while Pete Alonso oranks T14th (231)...Brandon Nimmo is 16th with 225 multi-hit contests.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in 17 straight games...He is slashing .323/.411/.565 (20-62) with four home runs, three doubles, 14 RBI and 14 runs during that span...Over his last 50 games dating back to May 26, is slashing .312/.384/.534 (59-189) with 11 home runs, nine doubles, 30 RBI and 32 runs...His 59 hits during that span are tied for the second-most in the majors and tied for the most in the NL.

GIANTS-METS NOTES: The Mets are looking for their first series victory in San Francisco since they went 2-1 from August 31-September 2, 2018...Overall, the Mets are 36-44 lifetime at Oracle Park.

AROUND THE WORLD IN 80 DAYS: Pete Alonso is the first Met ever to have 80+ RBI through the team's first 103 games of a season in multiple years (also: 86, 2022)...Joins Carlos Beltrán (89, 2006), Mike Piazza (85, 2000), David Wright (81, 2006) and Todd Hundley (80, 1996) as the only Mets with 80+ RBI through the team's first 103 games of a season...His 75 career games with three or more RBI are tied with Aaron Judge for the most such games in the majors since 2019.

SAN FRANCISCO LINDOR: On Wednesday, Francisco Lindor snapped an 0-31 drought with an RBI single in the third...His 31 straight at-bats without a hit was the longest drought of his career...Courtesy of Elias...He has five multi-RBI games since July 2, which are tied for the fourth-most in the majors during that span.

SAFE AT HOME: The Mets lead the majors with an 89.0% stolen base rate...They have been caught stealing only 10 times this year, which is the fewest in the NL and second-fewest in the majors (Detroit, 10)...Juan Soto has stolen a career-high 13 bases this year...Brandon Nimmo has swiped 11 bases...His career-best is 15 which he accomplished in 2024.

DON'T STEAL THIS ALBUM: Among catchers with 250 or more innings behind the plate this year, Luis Torrens ranks second in the majors with 42.4 percent caught stealing (19 SB, 14 CS, 471.2 IP)...Only Salvador Perez is better (50.0 percent caught stealing, 9 SB, 9 CS, 451.0 IP).

OUCH: Mets batters have been hit by 59 pitches this season, which is tied for the most in the majors with the Twins and Mariners...Nimmo has been plunked 86 times in his career which is the second-most in franchise history.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 21 saves this season, surpassing his season total from 2024...He is one of 11 pitchers in Major League history to record at least 20 saves in at least seven of their first nine seasons (since saves became an official stat in 1969), joining Craig Kimbrel, Jonathan Papelbon, Troy Percival, Trevor Hoffman, Bruce Sutter, Aroldis Chapman, Kenley Jansen, Huston Street, Mariano Rivera and Robb Nen.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Díaz owns a 15.0 scoreless streak dating back to June 6... He has allowed just one earned run over his last 30 appearances, posting a 4-0 record with 15 saves and a 0.29 ERA since April 23...Over the longer span, has 46 strikeouts and a .136 (14-103) opponents' batting average.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed a season-high-tying five runs (four earned) over 5.1 innings on July 19 vs. Cincinnati...Was the second time Holmes has allowed five runs in his last three starts (7/8 at BAL)...Struck out three batters, issued two walks and hit one batter.

THE GAME OF RISP: Over his last two starts, opposing batters are 8-12 with two doubles and nine RBI against Holmes with runners in scoring position...In his first 17 starts of the season, Holmes held opposing batters to a .111 (7-63) average with runners in scoring position...Overall, Holmes has held opposing batters to a .200 (15-75) average with runners in scoring position, the 14th-best mark in the NL(min. 70 batters faced w/RISP).

ROAD IMPROVEMENT: In 162 career road outings, Holmes has pitched to a 4.21 ERA (100 ER/213.2 IP)...In 106 road games since 2022, Holmes has posted a 2.97 ERA (48 ER/145.2 IP), a 3.91 earned run average improvement from his first 56 career road games...Since 2022, Holmes ranks 14th in the majors in road ERA (min. 120.0 IP).

STAYING GROUNDED: Since 2019, Holmes' 64.5% groundball rate is the third-highest mark in the majors during that span behind Aaron Bummer's 65.8% clip and Andre Pallante's 65.1% rate (min. 1000 BF)...In each of the last four seasons, Holmes' groundball rate has ranked in the top five in the majors, including a league-leading 77.0% mark in 2022 (min. 250 BF each season).

ALLOWING HOLMES RUNS: Over his last 13 starts, Holmes has allowed 11 home runs...In his first seven starts of the season, Holmes did not allow a homer and became the sixth pitcher in franchise history to not allow a home run through their first seven starts with the team...Holmes allowed two home runs in three of his four starts from May 14 - June 1 after he had never surrendered multiple home runs in his first 319 career Major League games...At the time, it was the fifth-longest active such streak by a pitcher to begin their Major League career...Holmes has not allowed a home run over his last 19.1 innings dating back to July 2.

10 K CLAY: On April 8 vs. Miami, Holmes made his Mets Citi Field debut...The right-hander allowed four runs over 5.1 innings, issued three walks and struck out a career-high 10 batters...Holmes became the fifth Met all-time to record 10 or more strikeouts in their home pitching debut joining Dennis Ribant (10 K on 8/17/1964 vs. PIT), Dick Selma (13 K on 9/12/65 vs. HOU), Aaron Harang (10 K on 9/12/13 vs. WAS) and Max Scherzer (10K on 4/19/22-G2 vs. SF)...Courtesy of *Elías*...Holmes struck out five straight batters starting at his final batter of the third inning until the first batter he faced in the fifth...His 5.1 innings were the second-most he has ever thrown in an outing behind his 6.0 innings pitched in his second career big league start on July 14, 2018 with Pittsburgh.

NEW ROLE WHO DIS: In his new role as a starting pitcher, Holmes has established career highs in both innings (108.2) and strikeouts (86)...He has also earned a career-high-tying eight wins...Holmes started for the Mets on Opening Day (3/27 at HOU) in just his fifth career major league start...The first four starts of Holmes' career came in his first big league season, 2018 with Pittsburgh...Holmes is 9-7 with a 4.00 ERA (55 ER/123.2 IP) in 24 career starts...He is just the 10th pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to start Opening Day having made four or fewer career starts prior, joining Marty Pattin (4, 1969), Tom Hall, (4, 1969), Fernando Valenzuela (1981, 0), Al Holland (1982, 3), Dave Nied (1993, 2), Tanner Scheppers, (2014, 0), Dustin May (2020, 4), Garrett Crochet (2024, 0) and Sean Burke (2025, 3)...Courtesy of Sarah Langs.

LET'S TAKE A LOOK BACK AT LAST SEASON: In 2024, Holmes made 67 relief appearances with the Yankees and pitched to a 3.14 ERA (22 ER/63.0 IP)...His career-high 30 saves ranked fourth in the American League and eighth in the majors...In his final outing of 2024, September 29 vs. Pittsburgh, Holmes locked up his 74th career save and moved into a tie with John Wetteland for seventh-most in Yankees history (since saves became an official stat in 1969)...Did not allow an earned run in his first 20 games of the season from March 28 - May 19, marking the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history, trailing only Dellin Betances' season-opening 26-game streak in 2015 (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...His 20.0IP over that span were the most by any major league reliever who had not allowed an earned run during that stretch...Also did not allow an earned run in 23 games from September 25, 2023 - May 19, 2024, the second-longest streak of his career, trailing only a 29-game stretch from April 9 - June 18, 2022...Did not allow an earned run in 29 of his first 30 appearances of the season from March 28 - June 9, going 1-1 with 19 saves and a 1.23 ERA (4 ER/29.1 IP) over that stretch...His 19 saves were tied with Cleveland's Emmanuel Clase (19) for the second-most over that span, trailing only St. Louis' Ryan Helsley (21)...Allowed 14 runs (10 ER) in 14 games from June 13 - July 30...Was named to his second career All-Star team (also: 2022)...Over his final 22 appearances of the year, held

opponents to a .188 (12-64) average and was unscored upon in 17 of those appearances...Appeared in 13 Postseason games and went 3-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER/12.0 IP) and 12 strikeouts...Pitched in the Yankees first eight Postseason games...Became the fifth pitcher in major league history to appear in each of their club's first eight postseason games, joining Tyler Matzek (2021 with Atlanta), Greg Holland (2014 with Kansas City), Wade Davis (2014 with Kansas City) and Jesse Orosco (1996 with Baltimore)...Became the 11th relief pitcher in major league history with three or more wins in a single Postseason and the third Yankee to accomplish the feat (also: Sparky Lyle, 1977 and Mike Stanton, 2000).

REELIN' IN THE YEARS: Holmes was selected by Pittsburgh in the ninth round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Slocomb High School (AL)...He was signed by Pirates scout Darren Mazerowski, the son of Hall of Famer Bill Mazerowski...The 6-5, 245-pounder made his major league debut on April 6, 2018 with Pittsburgh vs. Cincinnati and appeared in 91 career games with the Pirates from 2018-2021...Was acquired by the Yankees on June 26, 2021, in exchange for INF Hoy Park and INF Diego Castillo...Established career highs in games (69), innings (70.0 IP), wins (8) and strikeouts (77) during the 2021 season...Became the Yankees closer in 2022 and recorded 74 saves from 2022-2024, the third-most in the AL and the 11th-most in the majors during that span...Earned a career-high 30 saves in 2024 and became the 11th pitcher in Yankees franchise history to record 30+ saves in a season...Is a two-time American League All-Star (2022, 2024) and was twice named American League Relief Pitcher of the Month (May 2022, Sept./Oct. 2023)...Over 16 career Postseason appearances, is 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA (3 ER/20.0 IP), a 0.90 WHIP and a .172 (11-64) batting average.
