Kyle Seager belted his 2nd career Opening Day home run last night (also: 4/4/16 at TEX)...he becomes the 7th Mariners in club history with multiple Opening Day home runs, joining Ken Griffey Jr. (8), Richie Sexson (3), Tino Martinez (2), Russ Davis (2), Jim Presley (2) and Dustin Ackley (2).

With a start today, **Taijuan Walker** would become the 46th two-time Mariner in club history (at least two different stints with the club)...Walker previously spent four years with the Mariners (2013–16)...Mike Blowers, Raúl Ibañez, Norm Charlton & Jeff Nelson are the only players with three separate stints.

With 199 career home runs, **Kyle Seager** is one homer away from becoming the 4th player in club history to hit 200 career home runs <u>as a Mariner</u>, joining **Ken Griffey Jr.** (417), **Edgar Martinez** (309) and **Jay Buhner** (307).

TODAY'S TILT... the Mariners continue their opening series against the Houston Astros today at Minute Maid Park...today is the second (0-1) of a 4-game series at the Astros...following Monday's game, the Mariners will travel to Anaheim for a 3-game series at the Angels: July 28-30...today's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the **Mariners Radio Network**.

<u>ODDS AND ENDS</u>...the Mariners continue their opening series against the Astros...are playing their second (0-1) of 20 consecutive games to open the 2020 season...are next scheduled to have an off day on August 13.

- First Opening Day 10 Mariners players are making their first appearance on an Opening Day roster: Justin Dunn, Kyle Lewis, Shed Long Jr., Tim Lopes, Matt Magill, Anthony Misiewicz, José Marmolejos, Austin Nola, Yohan Ramirez, Justus Sheffield and Evan White.
- Service Time the Mariners have three players with at least seven years of Major League service time: Kyle Seager (8.085), Bryan Shaw (8.081) and Dee Gordon (7.154)...14 players on the Mariners roster have less than 1 year of service time...(service time as of Opening Day).
- Young & Old third baseman Kyle Seager (32 years, 265 days) is the oldest player on the Mariners Opening Day active roster...left-handed pitcher Nick Margevicius (24 years, 37 days) is the youngest player on the Mariners Opening Day active roster.
- International Game the Mariners Opening Day roster is represented by four countries: Cuba (Nestor Cortes), Dominican Republic (Yohan Ramirez), Japan (Yusei Kikuchi), United States (27 players).
- 2019 in Review Completed the 2019 season 68-94 (.420), finishing 5th in the American League West (39.0 games behind division-winner Houston)...went 35-46 (.432) at home and 33-48 (.407) on the road...were 23-26 in one-run games and 9-4 when games went to extra-innings.

GOODBYE BASEBALL...after belting 6 home runs in 18 games last season – and becoming the first player in Major League history to homer in 6 of his 10 career games – **Kyle Lewis** picked up right where he left off last night...Lewis crushed a 438-foot home run off Justin Verlander in the 2nd inning last night... Lewis' 7 home runs in his first 19 career games are 2nd-most of any Mariner in his first 20 career games... trails only Alvin Davis (9), while ranking ahead of Bucky Jacobsen (6), Greg Pirkl (6), Dae-Ho Lee (5), Wladimir Balentien (5) and Justin Leone (5)...via *STATS INC*.

<u>WELCOME TO THE SHOW</u>...four Mariners made their Major League debuts last night: **Evan White, José Marmolejos, Anthony Misiewicz** and **Yohan Ramirez**...four debuts on Opening Day are the most in club history (previous: 2, 1989, Ken Griffey Jr. and Omar Vizquel)...the Mariners are the first team to have four players make their Big League debut on Opening Day since the Chicago Cubs in 1957 (Dick Drott, Cal Neeman, Bob Will and Casey Wise).

FIRST THINGS FIRST...Evan White made his Major League debut last night, batting 2nd and starting at first base...White recorded his first Major League hit – a single – off Enoli Paredes in the top of the 9th inning...White became the 5th Mariner in club history to debut on Opening Day and record his first Major League hit, joining José Báez (4/6/77 vs. CAL), Ken Griffey Jr. (4/3/89 at OAK), Ichiro Suzuki (4/2/01 vs. OAK) and Kenji Johjima (4/3/06 vs. LAA).

MARINER MILESTONES...with his 4th-inning home run last night, Kyle Seager equaled Alvin Davis for the 4th-most RBI in club history with 667 career RBI...Hall of Famer Edgar Martinez (1,261) holds the all-time club record, followed by Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. (1,216) and Jay Buhner (951)...Seager's home run last night also marked his 199th career home run...with his next homer, Seager will become the 4th player in club history to record at least 200 home runs for the Mariners; he will join Griffey (417), Martinez (309) and Buhner (307)...since his debut season of 2011, Seager ranks 7th among left-handed batters in RBI (667) and 8th in home runs (199).

<u>IT'S A SPRINT</u>...as part of its COVID-19 response, Major League Baseball has restructured the 2020 schedule to span only 60 games compared to the normal 162...the Mariners will face off against the AL West in 40 games and the NL West in 20 games...with the shorter season, each game in the 2020 season carries the equivalent weight of 2.7 regular season games in a typical MLB season...the trade deadline will take place on August 31.

YOUTH MOVEMENT...the Mariners fielded the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days (ages on 7/24)...ranked ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.

WHO ARE THESE GUYS?...Dee Gordon and Marco Gonzales are the only players remaining on the Mariners active roster from the 2019 Opening Day lineup (Mitch Haniger is currently on the IL, and Kyle Seager was on the IL for Opening Day last season)...the Mariners did not return a position player from their Opening Day starting lineup in 2019 to 2020.

<u>SUMMER CAMP RECAP</u>...the Mariners played 12 intrasquad games at T-Mobile Park during Mariners Summer Camp...**Kyle Lewis** led the way on offense, batting .435 (10x23) with 4 home runs, 7 RBI and 5 walks in 9 games...**Justin Sheffield** was a standout for the pitching staff, tossing 9.0 innings and allowing just 1 run (1.00 ERA) with no walks and 13 strikeouts over 3 outings.

AS YOU KNOW....Austin NoIa started behind the plate for the Mariners last night, becoming the Mariners 5th different Opening Day starting catcher in the last five years....AND AS YOU MAY KNOW....Austin's brother, Aaron, was the Phillies starting pitcher last night in Philadelphia...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...that Austin and Aaron are the first brothers to start at pitcher and catcher on Opening Day in the same season since 1943?...on April 21, 1943, right-hander Mort Cooper and his brother, Walker, started for the St. Louis Cardinals on Opening Day against the Cincinnati Reds at Crosley Field...Mort fired 10.0 scoreless innings but eventually surendered a walk-off single to Max Marshall in the bottom of the 11th...Johnny Vander Meer earned the win for the Reds after tossing 11.0 scoreless innings...the Nolas are the 4th pair of brothers to start at pitcher and catcher on Opening Day in the same year since 1907 (not necessarily same game or team), joining Mort (P) and Walker Cooper (C): 1943, Wes (P) and Rick Ferrell (C): 1931-32, '35-'38 and Milt (P) and Alex Gaston (C): 1926...courtesy of STATS INC.

 27-year-old right-hander is making his 98th career appearance, his 95th career Major League start & his 1st start this season.
- Mariners supplemental first round selection (43rd overall) in the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft on of Yucaipa High School.
- Made his Major League debut with the Mariners on Aug. 30, 2013 at Houston; picked up the win, tossing 5.0 innings and allowing only 1 run on 2 hits with 1 walk and 2 strikeouts...at 21 years, 17 days old, was the youngest Mariners starter to win his debut in club history.
- Pitched in the 2011 and 2012 MLB All-Stars Future game...also named to the Southern League All-Star team in 2012 (starting pitcher) and 2013 (DNP). Named Mariners MiLB Pitcher of the Year in 2011 & 2013.
- Traded to Arizona Diamondbacks along with Ketel Marte (inf) in exchange for Zac Curtis (lhp), Mitch Haniger (of) and Jean Segura (inf) on Nov. 23, 2016.
- Signed with Seattle as a free agent on Feb. 12, 2020.

SPRING RECAP...made only 1 Cactus League start for the Mariners on March 3, tossing 3.0 innings and allowing 1 run on 4 hits with no walks and 4 strikeouts...also made one intrasquad start, tossing 2.0 innings with 2 strikeouts.

<u>SUMMER CAMP RECAP</u>...made 2 intrasquad starts at Mariners Summer Camp, tossing 5.1 scoreless innings with 4 walks and 9 strikeouts...picked up the win in his last Summer Camp start, tossing 3.1 scoreless innings, while walking 3 and striking out 6.

WALKER vs. ASTROS

Making his 13th career start vs. the Astros...is 5-4 with a 4.57 ERA (31 ER, 61.0 IP) in 12 starts vs. Houston...Walker last faced the Astros on Aug. 16, 2017 here in Houston...he took the loss after allowing 5 runs (3 earned) over 5.0 innings in a 9-5 loss as a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks...here is how Walker has fared vs. current Astros:

VS. HOUSTON...has made 12 career starts against Houston, going 5-4 with a 4.57 ERA (31 ER, 61.0 IP), while striking out 66 and walking 18...has tied his career-high with 11 strikeouts in two separate outings against the Astros: 6/20/15 vs. HOU (6.1,5,3,3,0,11,HR-2) and 4/25/16 vs. HOU (7.0,6,1,1,1,11)... last start against Houston was with Arizona on 8/16/17 at Minute Maid Park, tossed 5.0 innings and allowed 5 runs (3 earned) on 2 walks and 3 strike-

RECOVERY...missed most of the 2019 season recovering from Tommy John surgery... performed by Dr. David Altchek on April 25, 2018...suffered the original injury (torn right ulnar collateral ligament) on April 14, 2018...appeared in only 4 Major League games between the 2018 & 2019 seasons combined.

1-HITTER...recorded a 1-hitter on July 31, 2015 at Minnesota (9.0,1,1,1,1,11,HR)...was the 12th 1-hitter (11th of the 9-inning variety) and the 15th start allowing 1 or 0 hits in Mariners history...became the 3rd-youngest pitcher to toss a 1-hitter in club history at 22 years, 352 days old, trailing only Félix Hernández-21.003, and Gil Meche-21.279).

HIATUS...appeared in 3 seasons in the Diamondbacks organization (2017-19), going 9-9 with a 3.47 ERA (66 ER, 171.1 IP), while striking out 156 and walking 66...posted a career-best 3.49 ERA (61 ER, 157.1 IP) over 28 starts in 2017, while striking out 146 and walking 61.

WELCOME BACK...signed with the Mariners as a free agent to a one-year deal on Feb. 12, 2020...was originally drafted by the Mariners in the first round (43rd overall) in the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of Yucaipa High School (CA)...traded to Arizona on Nov. 23, 2016 along with Ketel Marte (inf) in exchange for Zac Curtis (lhp), **Mitch Haniger** (of) and Jean Segura (inf)... overall, has appeared in parts of 4 Major League seasons with the Mariners, going 22-22 with a 4.18 (166 ER, 357.0 IP), while striking out 332 and walking 99 in 65 games (62 starts).

THE YOUNG VET...leads all Mariners starters with 528.1 innings pitched despite being the 3rd-youngest pitcher in the Mariners Opening Day rotation...at age 27.346 on Opening Day, Walker was younger than Yusei Kikuchi (29.037, 161.2 IP), Kendall Graveman (29.216, 446.0 IP) and Marco Gonzales (28.159 447.0 IP)...Justus Sheffield was the youngest pitcher in the Mariners Opening Day rotation at age 24.072 with 38.2 IP, trailed only by Justin Dunn (24.305, 6.2 IP)....Walker entered the season with the 4th-most service time on the Mariners Opening Day roster with a mark of 5 years, 142 days, trailing only **Kyle Seager** (8.085), **Bryan Shaw** (8.081) and **Dee Gordon** (7.154)

HE WILL REMEMBER HIS FIRST...at 21 years, 17 days old, Walker was the youngest Mariners starting pitcher to win his MLB debut (8/30/13 at HOU)... was the 11th pitcher in Mariners history to win his starting debut and the 2nd (Pat Rice, 5/18/91 @NYY) to allow 0 ER AND earn a win...Erik Hanson (9/5/88 @MIN) is the only other starter to allow 0 ER in his debut, but he lost 2-0.

10 WINS...in 2015, became just the 4th Mariners starter to to post a 10 win season before before his age 23 season...was the first since Félix Hernández won 14 as a 21-year-old in 2007...others to win 10 games before 23: Félix Hernández (12 wins in 2006 at age 20; 14 wins in 2007 at age 21), Dave Fleming (17 wins in 1992 at age 22) and Freddy García (17 wins in 1999 at age 22).

EVEN YOUNG FOR HIS AGE ... at 22 years, 289 days at the time of his start vs Cleveland on May 29, he became the 3rd-youngest pitcher in club history to record an outing of 8.0+ innings, 0 runs allowed with 8 or more strikeouts...only Félix Hernández accomplished the feat a younger age: 2x, June 21, 2007 vs. PIT at 21.074 (8.0,6,0,0,1,9) and April 2, 2007 vs. OAK at 20.359 (8.0,3,0,0,2,12).

<u>CAREER</u>...has appeared in parts of 7 Major League seasons with Seattle (2013-16 & 2020) and Arizona (2017-19), going 31-31 with a 3.95 ERA (232 ER, 528.1 IP), while striking out 478 and walking 165...was originally selected by the Mariners in the first round (43rd overall) in the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft...made Major League debut with Seattle on Aug. 30, 2013 at Houston.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP YUSEI KIKUCHI (0-0, ---) 29-year-old left-hander is making his 1st start of the season, his 33rd Major League start and his 5th career start against the Astros...2019 Recap...went 6-11

with a 5.46 ERA (98 ER, 161.2 IP) with 50 walks and 116 strikeouts in first Major League season...led American rookies with 161.2 innings pitched, ranking 4th in strikeouts (116)... Historic Debut... with his start March 21, 2019 at Oakland in the Tokyo Dome, became the first Japanese-born player to make his Major League debut in Japan...was just his second career start (3rd appearance) as a professional in the Tokyo Dome...while with the Seibu Lions, started against the Yomiuri Giants on June 8, 2018 at the Tokyo Dome; earned the win, going 7.0 scoreless innings and scattering 2 hits and 3 walks while striking out 3...in 2011, made a 1.0-inning relief appearance against the Giants in a preseason game. vs. HOU: Making his 5th career start against the Astros...went 0-2 in 2019 with a 5.40 ERA (12 ER, 20.0 IP), with 15 strikeouts to just 5 walks...3 of those 4 starts came here in Houston, where he was 0-1 with a 6.43 ERA (10 ER, 14.0 IP) with 5 home runs allowed.
