METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Cubs, 6-3, last night...The Mets are 71-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 32-10-3 in 45 series this year...The Mets continue a seven game homestand (0-3) against the Cubs (0-3) and Pirates (four games)...Following this series, the Mets travel west for a seven-day, six-game road trip to Milwaukee (three games) and Oakland (three games).

ROBERTO CLEMENTE DAY: Today marks the 21st annual Roberto Clemente Day, which was established by Major League Baseball to honor Clemente's legacy as a humanitarian and to formally acknowledge club nominees of the Roberto Clemente Award...As part of the league-wide celebration, The Mets and Major League Baseball are partnering with Rise Against Hunger to host a volunteer event at Citi Field with former Roberto Clemente Award winners before tonight's game...Los Mets and Somos, the Latino employee resource groups from the Mets and MLB, will also be in attendance to help pack over 10,000 meals that will be distributed to Central America, South America and Africa...The Mets Roberto Clemente Nominee, James McCann, will be honored on the field before tonight's game for his outstanding efforts in the community...McCann, a first-time Roberto Clemente Award nominee, has been a prominent figure in the New York City community during his two seasons with the Mets, dedicated to helping families with children receiving care in the Newborn Intensive Care Unit (NICU).

WE ALL WEAR 21: In honor of Roberto Clemente day, all players and on-field personnel on both the Mets and Pirates will wear the number 21...Throughout the league, the Roberto Clemente Day logo will appear on base jewels and official dugout lineup cards.

A SPECIAL DAY AT CITI: Fourteen winners of the prestigious Roberto Clemente Award presented by Capital One, spanning nearly every decade the Award has been given, will help Major League Baseball and the Clemente family honor the legacy of one of baseball's greatest humanitarians...All Clemente Award winners will participate in a volunteer event at Citi Field with Rise Against Hunger to package food for those in need throughout New York City...A special media availability with several Clemente Award recipients and a representative from the Clemente Family will take place in the Shannon Forde Press Conference Room at approximately 5:30 p.m.

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: The Mets have lost three straight games...The matched their longest of the season...The only season in which the Mets never had more than a three-game losing streak was 1972...That season their longest losing streak was three games...The Dodgers (two games) and Athletics (three games) did not have losing streaks longer than three games in 2020...Prior to that, the last such team was the 2018 Red Sox (three games)...The last such National League team prior to 2020 was the 2014 Dodgers (three games)...Courtesy of Elias.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has homered in back-to-back games and three times in his last six games...He is on an eight-game hitting streak, batting .333 (11-33) with four runs, a double, three home runs, five RBI, two walks with a .371 OBP and a .636 SLG...He has not hit 62 home runs at home...That places him 10th all-time in franchise history...Kevin McReynolds in ninth with 64.

RIB EYE STEAKS: Francisco Lindor has recorded 92 RBI this season...That is tied for his career-high of 92 set with Cleveland in 2018...Pete Alonso is second in the majors and owns the National League lead with 111 RBI this season...Only five times in franchise history have the Mets had multiple players with 100 more RBI on the same team...The 2008 Mets were the last team to accomplish this feat (Carlos Beltran, Carlos Delgado and David Wright).

NO MINOR THING: Two Mets minor league affiliates continue their playoff run tonight...The Brooklyn Cyclones defeated the Aberdeen IronBirds, an affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles, 8-1, in Brooklyn on Tuesday...The two teams continue their best-of-three series in Brooklyn...The St. Lucie Mets defeated the Palm Beach Cardinals, 6-1, in Jupiter on Tuesday night...The two teams continue their best-of-three series tomorrow night in St. Lucie.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets are 46-26 at Citi Field...New York's 46 wins at home are fourth in the NL...They are fourth in National League with a .639 winning percentage at home...The team's .639 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage...The Mets have posted a 3.15 ERA with 205 walks and 714 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL...The Mets have struck out 714 at home this year, which is the second-most in the NL...That is already the sixth-most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 24-17 against the Pirates since Citi Field opened in 2009...They have won five of their last seven games against the club at home.

HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG: Edwin Diaz leads major league relievers with 105 strikeouts...That is 15 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Diaz has posted a 0.79 ERA (three earned runs/34.1 innings) with 17 hits, seven walks and 67 strikeouts in 34 appearances since the start of June.

30 FOR 39: Diaz is tied for seventh in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,372 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...Only the Braves with 1,381 have struck out more...The team's 1,372 strikeouts are already the sixth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.64 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.8 percent), the second-highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

HERE'S THE CATCH: As a team, Mets catchers are batting .372/.429/.628 in 13 games this month...Their .372 batting average is the highest in the National League and second-highest in the majors...Tomás Nido is batting .300 (24-80) with 13 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, five walks with a .337 OBP and a .488 SLG in 29 games since the All-Star Break...He is 8-15 (.533) with five runs, three doubles, two home runs, four RBI, a walk with a .563 OBP and a 1.133 SLG over his last four games...James McCann is batting .300 (10-32) with six runs, two doubles, an RBI, four walks, a steal with a .389 OBP over his last 11 games.

WINNING!: The Mets are seeking their 90th win today...It would be their most wins since they also recorded 90 in 2015...The Mets have clinched a winning record both at home and on the road...It is the first time the team has posted record winning records at home and on the road since 2016, when they collected 44 wins and home and 43 on the road.

LINDOR CITY: Francisco Lindor has hit 23 home runs this season...He is tied with Asdrubal Cabrera for most home runs by a Mets shortstop in a single season, which was accomplished in 2018...He is batting .304/.382/.469 with 33 runs, nine doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 26 RBI, 22 walks with an .851 OPS in 51 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the National League with a 6.1 fWAR this season.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil is batting .348 (16-46) with five runs, two doubles, seven RBI, five walks, two steals with a .411 OBP in 13 games in September...He is slashing .353/.391/.495 in 49 games following the All-Star break...His .353 average is third in the NL...Dating back to August 20, McNeil has just four strikeouts in his last 100 plate appearances...Overall this season, McNeil ranks sixth among qualified hitters and second in the NL with an 11.2 percent strikeout rate.

ABOVE AVERAGE: Jeff McNeil is third in the majors and in the National League with a .321 batting average...He is behind only Freddie Freeman (.329) and Paul Goldschmidt (.324) for the major league lead...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso has collected 26 game-winning RBI this year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985) with 24...That is the most by any player since the statistic was officially tracked in 1974...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) with 27 each are the only players with more in a season (data incomplete pre-1974)...Alonso has 10 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 12 of the Mets' 31 second-half wins.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha has safely reached base in 10 straight games...Over his last 27 games, Canha is batting .286 (26-91) with 14 runs, 11 doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI, seven walks with a .369 OBP, a .571 SLG and a .940 OPS...He has recorded 19 extra-base hits in 46 games since the break compared to 15 he collected in 77 first-half games...Canha slugging .472 in the second half (.381 SLG in the first half).

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball on September 10 at Miami...Gave up four hits and struck out six without issuing a walk...Was his first start without allowing a free pass since June 6 (13 starts between)...Did not walk a batter in five of his first 11 starts this season.

CLEMENTE DAY: Today, MLB celebrates the 21st annual Roberto Clemente Day... In 2019, Carrasco was presented with the Roberto Clemente Award prior to Game 3 of the World Series at Nationals Park...The award is presented annually to the player that best represents the game through character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, on and off the field... Carrasco formed two foundations in 2016, one based in the United States and one in his home country of Venezuela...He and his family have raised nearly \$2.7 million, primarily sending medical supplies to Venezuela, the Dominican Republic and Puerto Rico.

GOTTA EARN 'EM: Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his last 10 starts since July 3, the longest such streak of his career...Allowed three earned runs or fewer in 14 straight appearances (five starts) from September 6, 2019-August 18, 2020 and in 32 straight games (six starts) from April 30-September 7, 2014...His 16 starts this season with two earned runs or fewer are tied for the most on the club with Chris Bassitt.

VS. PITTSBURGH: Has faced the Pirates three times in his career, most recently on September 25, 2020 in Cleveland...Allowed two runs on three hits (one home run) and three walks with eight strikeouts through 6.0 innings of the no decision... Is 2-1 with a 5.51 ERA (10 earned runs/16.1 innings) in three starts against the NL Central this season, having faced the division most recently on August 9 (CIN).

QUALITY CONTROL: Has 10 quality starts this season after notching just two such starts last year...Has double-digit quality starts in a single season for the first time since doing so in four straight seasons from 2015-2018...Registered three straight quality starts from July 30-August 9 for the first time since finishing 2020 with six in a row...Has made seven starts with more than 6.0 innings this year, the third-most on the club.

WINNER, WINNER: Carrasco won five straight decisions from July 3-August 9, his second-longest win-streak of the season...Won six consecutive decisions from May 3 (G2)-June 6, matching his single-season career-high from the end of the 2017 season...His 14 wins on the season are tied for the seventh-most in the majors...He has reached double-digit victories for the fifth time in his career (also, 2015-2018) and earned 10 wins prior to the All-Star break for the fourth time in his career (also, 2015, 2017 & 2018).

CLUTCH COOKIE: Did not allow a run in 22.2 consecutive innings from July 14-August 4, surpassing his previous career-long scoreless streak of 22.0 innings from July 30-August 11, 2015...He threw three straight scoreless starts for the first time in his career from July 14-30...He has three scoreless innings streaks of at least 10.0 innings in a single season for the first time since 2018...His six scoreless starts of at least 5.0 innings are tied for fifth-most in the National League.

VENEZUELAN BORN: Carrasco ranks sixth all-time in strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher...Struck out the 1,400th batter of his career on May 27 vs. Philadelphia, the fourth-highest strikeout total among active pitchers who have not been selected to an All-Star roster...Became one of nine Venezuelan-born pitchers to eclipse 1,400 career innings pitched on July 24 vs. San Diego...Is the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach the 100-win milestone and the fifth-fastest to accomplish the feat when he did so in his 274th career game on July 30 at Miami.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP TAIJUAN WALKER (11-4, 3.48)

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the win on September 11 at Miami, his first victory since August 10... Tossed 7.0 innings of one-run ball with five hits (one home run) and 10 punchouts...Was his second double-digit strikeout game of the season.

GOT 'EM: Walker's five pickoffs this season are a career-high and the second-most in the majors behind six from Robbie Ray (SEA)...Previously had four pickoffs during the 2021 and 2015 seasons...Since 2021, his nine pickoffs are tied for the most in MLB with Max Fried (ATL) and Ryan Weathers (SD).
