SCORING CHANGES: Major League Baseball announced the following scoring change...During the June 2 game against the Dodgers in Los Angeles, Gavin Lux reached base in the bottom of the seventh on what was originally scored an error by Jeff McNeil...This has been changed to a hit.

METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Padres, 7-0, last night...The Mets are 13-9 against the NL West this year...With a win today, the Mets could claim their 14th series of the season...New York is 13-2-2 in 17 series this year...The Mets continue a 10-game, 11-day California road trip (3-3) at the Dodgers (2-2), Padres (1-1) and Angels (three games).

BLANK STREET COFFEE: The Mets were shut out for the second time this season...The team's two shutouts are tied for the second-fewest in the majors leagues...Mets pitchers have recorded nine shutouts this year, which is the most in the majors...The team recorded a total of eight shutouts in 2021.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets ranked second in the majors with 522 strikeouts this season...Only the Milwaukee Brewers (550) have struck out more batters this year...New York owns a 3.11 strikeout per walk ratio this year...That is the second-best in the NL behind only the Dodgers who have posted a 3.48 ratio.

HURTS DONUT: The Mets have been plunked a major league leading 40 times this year...The Mets have been hit nine times in the last eight games...The Mets have been hit 274 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors and 22 times more than the second-place team, the Chicago Cubs...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 60 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 46 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 42 HBP and Jeff McNeil is ninth at 36 HBP.

PETCO PARK, WHERE THE METS GO: Tomás Nido has hit safely in all five career games at Petco Park...He is 8-18 (.444) with two runs, a home run, three RBI and two walks at the ballpark...Mark Canha is 9-23 (.391) with five runs, a double, a home run, three RBI and four walks in six career games at Petco Park...Jeff McNeil is 7-18 (.389) with four runs, three doubles, an RBI and a walk in five contests at the yard...Eduardo Escobar owns a .273 (36-132) batting average with 16 runs, seven doubles, a triple, four home runs, 22 RBI and 11 walks in 34 career games in SoCal.

FOGO POWER: Over his last 15 games, Eduardo Escobar is batting .333 (21-63) with 10 runs, six doubles, a triple, three home runs, 15 RBI with a .603 SLG and a .926 OPS...He is batting .317/.354/.650 against left-handed pitching this season.

TRIPLES MAKES IT SAFE. TRIPLES IS BEST: The Mets lead the major leagues with 14 three-baggers this year...Brandon Nimmo is tied for the major league lead with four triples, while Eduardo Escobar is tied for fourth with three...Francisco Lindor and Starling Marte have hit two each, placing them tied for 13th in The Show...The Mets recorded 18 triples in 2021...The franchise record is 49 triples accomplished by the 2009 Mets...Lance Johnson holds the franchise record with a single-season total of 21 triples, doing so in 1996.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Mets lead the majors with a .289 average with runners in scoring position...They rank fourth in MLB with a .359 OBP and sixth with a .454 SLG in those situations...Nido leads the club, hitting .400 (10-25) in those situations...Jeff McNeil - .391 (18-46), J.D. Davis - .364 (8-22), Pete Alonso - .360 (18-50), Mark Canha - .318 (14-44) and Francisco Lindor - .310 (18-58) are all hitting .300 or better with RISP...Alonso leads the majors with 41 RBI in RISP situations and has nine home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, three more than any other hitter in the majors.

STRIKE THAT: The Mets batters have struck out 437 times this year...That is tied for the eighth-fewest strikeouts in MLB and tied for the third-fewest in the NL...They have struck out 19.6% this year...The Mets are one of six teams who have struck out less than 20% this season...Their 19.6% strikeout rate is fourth in the majors and third in the NL.

TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: Over his last nine games, Tomás Nido is batting .407 (11-27) with five runs, a double, five RBI, three walks with a .911 OPS...Over his last 18 games, he is batting .315 (17-54) with five runs, two doubles, seven RBI, five walks with a .373 OBP...He is 10-25 (.400) with runners in scoring position this season.

PADRES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 24-36 in San Diego since Petco Park opened in 2004.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Over his last eight games, Mark Canha is batting .387 (12-31) with eight runs, two doubles, two RBI, two walks with a .431 OBP, a .452 SLG and an .893 OPS...He is batting .319/.380/.431 over his last 19 games.

TWO-FERS: The Mets are batting .250/.338/.396 with two outs this season...Their 110 RBI with two outs are tops in the major leagues...The Mets have hit .202/.275/.283 with two strikes this year...Their .202 batting average is the best in the majors, as is their .275 OBP.

ROAD TRIPPIN': New York is 19-12 on the road this year...Their .613 road winning percentage is the fifth-best in the majors and is the third-best in the NL...The Mets did not record their 19th win on the road until July 4 in 2021 in their 44th road game (19-25)...The Mets finished the first-half of the 2021 season going 19-26 on the road...They did not record their 20th road win until July 18 in 2021 (20-28)...New York is batting .258/.327/.401 away from Citi Field...Their .258 road average ranks second in the majors, while their .327 OBP ranks fourth.

BY THE WAY: New York has won 38 games this season, the most in the National League...Their .655 winning percentage is second in the majors and is the best in the NL...The team has posted a 38-20 record through the team's first 58 games...Only the 1986 (42-16) team posted a better record through the first 58 games of the season...The 1988 Mets also went 38-20.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS: Over his last 12 games, J.D. Davis is batting .341 (14-41) with seven runs, four doubles, six RBI, three walks with a .391 OBP, a .439 SLG and an .830 OPS in that span...Over his last 22 games, Davis is batting .268/.333/.366...He owns a .304/.388/.464 slashline in 20 road games, compared to a .170/.264/.213 slashline in 16 games at Citi Field in 2022.

DOMINATING DÍAZ: Edwin Díaz has recorded 11 saves this season, tied for the seventh-most in the majors...He is second in the major leagues and first in the NL among relievers with 41 strikeouts...His 16.28 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...He has struck out 41 of the 91 batters he faced, good for 45.1%...He is 2-1 with 11 saves, a 2.38 ERA (six earned runs/22.2 innings), allowing 16 hits and 10 walks...The Mets are 22-1 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 74 saves as a member of the Mets...That places him ninth on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Francisco Rodríguez who recorded 83 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 183 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is 10-14 with 74 saves, a 3.78 ERA (71 earned runs/169.0 innings) with 69 walks and 279 strikeouts...His 279 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Liam Hendriks (308) and Josh Hader (301) have struck out more...Additionally, his 279 strikeouts are the 10th most by a reliever in franchise history...Seth Lugo is ninth with 287...Aaron Heilman is eighth with 289.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: Mets Manager Buck Showalter is in his first season with the team...Showalter has 20 years of managerial experience with four different teams: Yankees (1992-1995), Diamondbacks (1998-2000), Rangers (2003-2006) and Orioles (2010-2018)...A three-time AL Manager of the Year winner (1994, 2004, 2014), Showalter ranks fourth among active managers in career managerial wins with 1,589...He ranks 23rd on the all-time win list, surpassing Dick Williams (1,571) earlier this year...Tommy Lasorda is next at 1,599 wins.

BASSITT NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: In his first start at Dodger Stadium, Bassitt went 6.0 innings allowing four runs, three earned, on five hits against the Dodgers...He came out of the game with a season-high 110 total pitches after matching a season-high eight strikeouts and walking two...His four runs allowed came on a pair of two-run home runs off his cutter.

ROAD TO SAN DIEGO: Bassitt has won three of his five road starts this season, going 3-1 with a 3.86 ERA (12 earned runs/28.0 innings)...Across those starts he has struck out 30 batters and walked 10...His three road wins rank tied for ninth in the majors...Bassitt has a .213 opponent batting average on the road compared to his .234 batting average at home.

VS. SAN DIEGO: Bassitt will make his first career start at Petco Park...In his only career start against the Friars, Bassitt went 4.2 innings, giving up two runs on seven hits while striking out six and walking three...His last start against the Padres came on July 3, 2018...Against the NL West, Bassitt owns a 4.25 ERA (32 earned runs/67.2 innings).

DOING THE SPLITS: This season the Padres have the third-lowest average in the NL and sixth-lowest batting average in the majors, against right-handed pitching (.227)...They also have the lowest OPS (.644) in the NL against righties...Against right-handed batters Bassitt owns a .206 opponent batting average which ranks sixth in the NL and eighth in the majors...His opponent OPS (.586) against righties ranks eighth in the majors (min. 100 batters faced)

SLOW DOWN, YOU'RE DOING FINE: Chris Bassitt owns the second-lowest average exit velocity (85.7 mph) among all qualifying pitchers in the majors... That would be the lowest full-season mark of his career.

DON'T STOP ME NOW: Bassitt is tied for seventh in the NL with eight starts of at least 6.0 innings this year...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in all but three of his starts this season...In 117 career games (104 starts), Bassitt has only given up four or more runs 26 times...He has surrendered three runs or fewer in his remaining 91 games.

RIGHT WHERE HE WANTS THEM: When Bassitt is ahead in the count against opponents they are held to a .182 batting average...He owns a sub-.200 opponent batting average when there are two strikes in any count...He has 40 strikeouts after being ahead in the count which ranks 10th in the majors.

CUT, IT, OUT: After allowing two more homers on his cutter in his last start, Bassitt now has allowed 19 home runs off his cutter through five years he has been throwing it (2018-2022) which is the most he has allowed on any pitch... Of his 11 home runs given up this season, four came on the cutter, three on his fastball, two on his sinker, and two on his slider.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND: Chris Bassitt ranks fourth in strikeouts (68) among starters through their first 11 games as a New York Met.

JUNE: This is Bassitt's first start of June...In 18 career starts in the month of June Bassitt owns a 7-7 record and 3.35 ERA (38 earned runs/102.0 innings)...Bassitt's June numbers are some of his lowest in any month having given up the fewest hits and fewest runs in June (min. 100.0 innings)

- Ranks tied for 10th in Mets history with 122 homers...Up next on the Mets all-time HR list: Todd Hundley (124), Lucas Duda (125) and Michael Conforto (132).
- Owns the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (six) and is second in games with multiple RBI (13) this season...He is the first player since Carlos Lee in 2005 with at least six 4+ RBI games in his team's first 55 contests...The only players with more through 55 team games are Juan Gonzalez (eight in 1998), Jimmie Foxx (seven in 1938) and Lou Gehrig (seven in 1930)...All three of those players finished the season with at least 157 RBI.
- Hit two homers and drove in five on June 4 at Los Angeles-NL...Was his 13th career multi-homer game (tied for most since 2019).
- Has a 1.426 OPS with runners in scoring position, going 18-50 (.360/.486/.940) with two doubles, nine homers, 41 RBI and 15 walks.
- After putting up a .744 OPS in April, owns a 1.012 OPS since May 1 (ninth-best in MLB)...Set a Mets record with 30 RBI in May...Willie Montañez (1978) had the old mark with 28 RBI in May...He is the seventh Met with 30+ RBI in a calendar month.
- Hit his third career walk-off home run on May 19 vs. St. Louis to help the Mets win a four-game series.
