RAY REPORT—The Rays begin a brief three-game road trip against the Marlins (three to play) tonight at loanDepot park...despite dropping four of five and eight of their last 10 games, their 24-12 record since April 22 is tied for the best in the majors with the Braves (26-13)...have owned the AL's best record for each of the last 27 days (May 9-pres.), including eight consecutive days leading the majors from May 18-25...are 9-2-1 in their last 12 sets since April 24...have a 0.5-game lead in the AL East and have spent 33 days leading the division, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

★ The Rays fell, 7-2, on Wednesday to the Tigers...marked their second time being swept this season, tied for the second fewest in the AL (also: ATH, NYY, TEX, TOR), with the Guardians standing as the only AL club to not be swept...was their first time being swept at Tropicana Field since Aug. 12-14, 2024 vs. HOU.

★ The five-run loss marked their 11th defeat by five runs or more, third most in the AL (also: HOU, 13; LAA, 12) and tied for eighth most in the majors.

★ Nick Martinez was tagged for six runs in 4.0 innings of work, snapping a stretch of 11 straight starts to begin the season with two runs allowed or fewer...it was tied for the fifth-longest season-opening streak by a traditional starter in the modern era (since 1900) and was the longest since LAD Hyn Jin Ryu (14GS) in 2019.

★ Out of the bullpen, Mason Englert set career highs in innings (5.0) and pitches (82)...was the first Ray to enter in the 5th inning or earlier and finish the game since Ryan Yarbrough (4th) on Sept. 11, 2022 at NYY.

★ The Rays are wearing their Columbia blue jerseys tonight...they are 3-1 when wearing the uniform this season.

BIRTHDAY WISHES—Today is Hunter Feduccia's 29th birthday...if he were to appear in tonight's contest, it would mark his first career appearance in a game on his birthday...Ben Rortvedt (Sept. 25, 2024 at DET) is the last Rays catcher to appear in a game on his birthday behind the plate.

RAS IS GOING FISHIN'—Tonight's probable starter, Drew Rasmussen, has made seven appearances (five starts) opposite the Marlins in his career and has earned a 3-0 record with a 2.30 ERA (31.1IP, 8ER), 25 strikeouts to seven walks, and a trio of quality starts...his 2.30 ERA is the third best against any NL opponent in his career behind the Dodgers (1.04) and Braves (1.08), while his 31.1 IP are his fourth most against any major league club (TOR, 63.0IP; NYY, 50.2IP; BAL, 35.2IP).

★ Each of his five starts against the Marlins have come as a member of the Rays...in those five outings, he is 3-0 with a 2.54 ERA (28.1IP, 8ER) and 21 strikeouts...since the Marlins joined the major leagues in 1993, his 2.54 ERA is the fourth lowest among all AL starting pitchers (min. 20.0IP), he trails only TB Chris Archer (1.80), BOS Brayan Bello (1.80), and NYY/BOS David Cone (1.80).

ALL ABOUT THAT BASE—Yandy Diaz is slashing .333/.418/.681 (23-for-69) with 6 2B, 6 HR, 16 RBI, and a 1.099 OPS during a season-high 18-game on-base streak, the third-longest active run in MLB (see table on the right) and his longest since a 27-game run from June 3-July 4, 2025...it is tied for the sixth-longest streak of his career (also: Aug. 23-Sept. 13[G1], 2022), three games shy of a pair of 21-game streaks between April 27-May 28, 2023 and July 24-Aug. 16, 2020...since the current streak began on May 12, only three players in the majors have better OPS's than Diaz: LAD Shohei Ohtani (1.286), HOU Yordan Alvarez (1.145), and ATH Nick Kurtz (1.119).

★ In each of the 18 games, Diaz has served as the designated hitter, tying the fifth-longest on-base streak in games as a DH in team history (also: Luke Scott, June 28-July 24, 2013) and the longest since his own 31-game streak between June 3-July 21, 2025...he is four games shy of Ji-Man Choi's 22-game stretch from Aug. 9-Sept. 12, 2018, which is the fourth-longest streak by a Rays DH.

OUT OF ORDER—The Rays pitching staff has a 6.38 ERA (90.1IP, 64ER) in 10 games since May 24 compared to a 2.37 ERA (235.1IP, 62ER) over their prior 26 games from April 22-May 22...their 6.38 ERA over that timeframe is the fourth highest in the majors, better than only the Rockies (8.58), Twins (6.64), and Giants (6.40)...the Rays staff has received the second-lowest run support average (3.69) in the AL (CLE, 3.54) and the fifth lowest in the majors during that stretch.

★ They have allowed 72 total runs in their last nine games (May 25-pres.), their most over any nine-game stretch since July 21 (G2)-30, 2007 (82).

★ Rays pitchers have allowed seven runs or more in three straight games, their longest streak since May 6-8, 2025...they have not had a longer stretch since a five-game streak from Aug. 24-29, 2019...the staff was charged with 25 runs last series with the Tigers, their second most in any set this season behind May 25-27 at BAL (26R)...also allowed 10 home runs in the series, marking the fourth time in franchise history they have allowed double-digit home runs in a series of three games or fewer (last: April 8-10, 2025 vs. LAA - 11HR).

★ The bullpen has worked 4.0 IP or more in five straight and eight of the last nine games...the five-game streak is their second longest this season behind April 5-11 (6G)...the 'pen has thrown 125.2 IP since the calendar flipped to May, fourth in the AL to the Tigers (132.2), Blue Jays (132.1), and Twins (127.2).

★ Rays starters have yielded multiple home runs in each of the last three games, their first time doing so since May 10-13, 2025 (3G)...entering the current streak, Rays starters had served up multiple home runs in only three of 56 outings all season...the only time in franchise history starting pitchers allowed multiple home runs in four straight was Sept. 11-14, 2023...the bullpen has conceded a home run in four of the last five games and eight of the last 10 contests overall...across the season, 115 of the 268 (42.9%) runs they have allowed have come via 73 home runs.

LA MÁXIMA—Junior Caminero has reached base safely in 16 of 28 PA (.571 OBP) over his last six games...he has reached base at a .426 clip since the beginning of May, third in the AL behind ATH Nick Kurtz (.449) and teammate Jonathan Aranda (.432), after entering the month with a .328 on-base pct...has reached base safely in 15 of his last 16 contests (May 16-pres.) and his .493 on-base pct. leads the majors over that span and is the best 16-game, single-season span by a Ray since Yandy Diaz reached at a .500 clip between Sept. 9-27, 2025.

★ The MLB leader in average bat speed (79.9 mph), he paces the AL with 74 batted balls hit at 100 mph or faster, tied for third in the majors (also: PIT Oneil Cruz) behind ATL Matt Olson (77) and ATL Michael Harris II (75), and is pacing for 203, which would break Diaz's Statcast era (since 2015) club record established last season (200)...he would join Diaz, ATL Ronald Acuña Jr. (2023), LAD Shohei Ohtani (2024-25), and TOR Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (2024, 2021-22) as the only players to record 200 such batted balls under Statcast.

WALKIN' ON THE SUN—The Rays have tallied 90 walks in their last 19 games since May 12, tied with the Dodgers for the most in the majors, and have recorded an MLB-best 12.0 pct. walk rate in that span...this, compared to 128 walks and an 8.5 pct. walk rate in their first 40 games (Opening Day-May 11), both of which ranked 14th among AL clubs...they have recorded 218 walks through 59 games and are pacing for 601 free passes, which would mark their highest total since a franchise-record 672 walks in 2010.

★ Junior Caminero has drawn a walk in four of six and 10 of his last 15 games, with his 15 walks in the latter span (May 17-pres.) ranking third in the majors to LAA Mike Trout (19) and ATH Nick Kurtz (16).

★ The club's season-long walk rate of 9.6 pct. is on pace to rank as the fifth-best mark in team history...it would be the best since the 2020 Rays had a franchise-best 10.75 pct. and the best over a 162-game season since 2010 (10.72%).

FINDING MARLIN—The Rays and Marlins are set to conclude the 2026 Citrus Series this weekend...the Rays lead the season series, 2-1, after taking the three-game set at Tropicana Field between May 15-17, and have an 86-64 advantage in the all-time series...the Rays have won 10 of 15, 18 of 24, and 30 of their last 38 against the Marlins...Tampa Bay has won 12 of its last 15 series against Miami, including eight straight from May 14, 2019-Aug. 31, 2022...since 2019, the Rays 29-8 (784) record is the second best by any team against a single opponent (min. 20G) behind the Yankees 36-9 (800) against the Royals.

★ The Rays held an all-time record of 46-47 against Miami prior to Kevin Cash becoming manager in 2015...under Cash, the club is 40-17 and won a franchise-best nine straight games against the Marlins between July 22, 2018-Sept. 4, 2020.

★ Since the start of 2025, Yandy Diaz has gone 10-for-32 (.313) with 1 2B, 3 HR, 9 RBI, a .625 slugging pct., and a .996 OPS in eight games against the Marlins...he has homered in three of his last four contests against Miami.

TONIGHT'S START—Drew Rasmussen will toe the rubber tonight for his 12th start of the campaign and 142nd career appearance (93rd start)...min. 50.0 IP, ranks seventh in the AL in opp. on-base pct. (.258) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.58) and is eighth in WHIP (1.02).

- ✦ Entering play tonight, is two starts shy of tying **Matt Garza** (94GS) and **Matt Moore** (94GS) for ninth most in franchise history.
- ✦ Needs 17 strikeouts to reach 500 for his career.

LAST TIME OUT—Rasmussen was dealt his second loss of the season after allowing a season-high five earned runs on May 30 vs. LAA (L, 4.OIP, 4H, 5ER, HR, 2BB, 4SO)...allowed a single and two walks before yielding a grand slam to **Wade Meckler** in the 1st inning, the first time in franchise history the Rays permitted an opening-frame grand slam at home...retired his next eight batters, but then yielded a single and a run-scoring double in the 4th frame that brought the Angels tally up to five before Rasmussen left the game.

- ✦ Had his streak of 48 consecutive starts allowing 4 ER or fewer snapped (April 30, 2023–May 24, 2026)...marked the longest run in franchise history by a traditional starter...was one of seven traditional starters in the modern era (since 1900) to turn the trick and the first since **Jacob deGrom's** 59-start streak between May 22, 2019–Sept. 18, 2022.
- ✦ The grand slam he allowed in the 1st inning was the first of his career and just the fourth home run he has allowed with multiple runners on base.
- ✦ Marked the second time this season he did not pitch into the 5th inning, joining a rain-shortened outing on April 18 at PIT.

MR. 305—Across seven career appearances (five starts) against the Marlins, Rasmussen has posted a 3-0 record with a 2.30 ERA (31.IP, 8ER) and 25 strikeouts...his last start against them came on May 17 at Tropicana Field, when earned the win after allowing two earned runs on seven hits, two walks, and one hit batter with two strikeouts over 5.1 innings...in three outings (two starts) in Miami, he is 1-0 with a save, a 0.69 ERA (13.OIP, ER), and a .170 (8-for-47) opp. average...min. 10.0 IP, his 0.69 ERA at loanDepot park is the second-lowest of any stadium he has pitched at in his career, behind only Seattle's T-Mobile Park (0.61 ERA).

- ✦ He is 5-2 with a 2.70 ERA (66.2IP, 20ER) over 18 career appearances (11 starts) vs. NL East competition, logging a 2.91 ERA (55.2IP, 18ER) in the 11 starts...is 8-2 with a 2.98 ERA (108.2IP, 36ER) in 23 career starts against NL opponents.

ROAD RHYTHM—Rasmussen is making his seventh start on the road this season...is 1-1 with a 3.13 ERA (31.2IP, 11ER), but he has gone 5.0 IP or more with 3 ER or fewer in five of his six road outings.

- ✦ Is a combined 16-11 with a 2.67 ERA (260.OIP, 77ER) in 59 career appearances (46 starts) in the state of Florida (Tropicana Field, Steinbrenner Field, and loanDepot park).
- ✦ Rasmussen's 18 career road wins are seventh most in franchise history among right-handed pitchers, one shy of sixth-ranked **Jake Odorizzi** (19)...min. 15 decisions, his .720 (18-7) winning pct. on the road as a Ray is the best in franchise history.

OL' RELIABLE—Rasmussen's last start snapped a streak of allowing four earned runs or fewer in 48 straight regular-season starts (April 30–May 24, 2026), the longest run in franchise history by a traditional starter, ahead of **Shane Bieber's** 44-start run from April 29, 2021–July 26, 2022...he is one of seven pitchers in the modern era (since 1900) to turn the trick and the first since **Jacob deGrom's** 59-start streak between May 22, 2019–Sept. 18, 2022...finished eight starts behind opener **Ryne Stanek** (56GS from May 26, 2018–July 16, 2019) for the longest streak by any starter in franchise history.

RIGHT ON—Right-handed hitters are batting .128 (11-for-86) with 20 SO and 3 BB against Rasmussen, the third-lowest mark in the majors (min. 60AB), behind NYY **Carlos Rodon** (.115) and ATL **Dylan Lee** (.123)...right-handed batters are hitting .083 (2-for-24) against his cutter, 1-for-15 (.067) off his four-seamer, and 6-for-40 (.150) against his sinker.

- ✦ Min. 250 AB, his .180 (60-for-333) opp. average vs. right-handed batters since the start of 2025 is second-lowest in the majors, behind ATH **J.T. Ginn** (.185).

SIXTH OR SEVENTH—Rasmussen has pitched into the 6th inning during six of his 11 starts this season and he has not allowed a run in the 6th or later...he has a .182 (4-for-22) opp. batting average, 0.79 WHIP, and 6.2 barrel pct. in those instances...since the start of 2023, he boasts a 1.27 ERA (21.IP, 3ER) in the 6th or later across the 22 starts in which he's pitched into the 6th inning.

FIRST THINGS FIRST—Rasmussen earned the starting nod for the Rays on Opening Day for the first time in his career, firing 5.0 innings of one-run ball on March 26 at STL...he became the 18th Opening Day starter in franchise history (12th right-hander), third in the last three seasons, and eighth in the last nine years on the heels of **Chris Archer's** four consecutive starts from 2015-18...at 30 years, 260 days old, he was the third-oldest pitcher to start for the Rays on Opening Day, trailing **Charlie Morton** (36.255) in 2020 and **Tanyon Sturtze** (31.172) in 2002.

LEADING THE WAY—Last season, Rasmussen paced the Rays rotation and ranked fourth in the AL (min. 150.OIP) with a 2.76 ERA (150.OIP, 46ER), trailing only DET **Tarik Skubal** (2.21), HOU **Hunter Brown** (2.43), and BOS **Garrett Crochet** (2.59)...under the same parameter, he also ranked among AL leaders in WHIP (4th, 1.02), opp. slugging pct. (5th, .340), ground ball rate (5th, 49.0%), opp. OPS (6th, .611), opp. on-base pct. (6th, .271), fewest pitches per IP (6th, 15.4), opp. average (7th, .221), walks per 9.0 IP (8th, 2.22), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 3.43) en route to his first career All-Star selection...led the majors with 10 starts of 5.0 IP or more with 0 XBH allowed, most by an AL pitcher since CAL **Nolan Ryan** (13) in 1977...made a club-record 10 scoreless starts of 5.0 IP or more, tied for third most in the majors behind DET **Tarik Skubal** (12) and PIT **Paul Skenes** (12).

- ✦ In 2025, he also became the fourth Rays pitcher (5x) to record a sub-3.00 ERA while making 30 starts or more, joining Cy Young winners **Blake Snell** (1.89) in 2018 and **David Price** (2.56) in 2012, **James Shields** (2.82) in 2011, and **Price** (2.72) in 2010.
