RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals play the second game of a three-game weekend series with the division-rival Milwaukee Brewers this afternoon at Busch Stadium ... The Cardinals logged their first one-run victory of the season last night with a 3-2 win over the Brewers, and have now won five of their last seven vs. Milwaukee dating back to Aug. 21, 2024.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals enter today in 4th place in the National League Central Division, 5.5 games behind first place Chicago ... The Cardinals (+3) Brewers (+12), and Rays (+9) are the only three MLB teams with losing records and positive run differentials.

HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENT: St. Louis is 9-4 (.692) at Busch Stadium this season, and with a win this afternoon, will have its best home start through the first 14 home games since 2019 (10-4, .714).

TAKE CARE OF BUSINESS: St. Louis yesterday began a stretch of playing 10 of 13 games against NL Central foes (3 vs. Brewers, 4 at Reds, 3 vs. Pirates) ... After May 7, the Cardinals next divisional opponent is the the Brewers from June 12-15 at American Family Field.

ANOTHER MLB RECORD: Lars Nootbaar has drawn an MLB-leading nine walks as a leadoff hitter to open games this season, breaking **Davey Lopes's** (1975 Dodgers) MLB single-season record in the months of March/April ... Nootbaar's nine game-opening walks also passes 2014 **Matt Carpenter** (8 August) for the most by a Cardinal in a single month

- The single-season Major League record for leadoff walks in any month is held by **Eddie Yost** aka “The Walking Man” with 12 in August of 1952 with the Washington Senators.
- 1951 **Eddie Stanky** holds the Cardinals single-season record of lead-off free-passes (27).

IT IS YOUR BIRTHDAY: Happy 43rd birthday to Cardinals pitching coach **Dusty Blake** ... Other notables born on this date include **Aaron Judge** (33); actors **Kevin James** (60) and **Jet Li** (62); actress **Carol Burnett** (92), Hall of Famer **Hack Wilson** (1900-48), former Cardinals pitcher **Sal Maglie** (1917-92), and wrestler **Kane** (58).

GETTING DEFENSIVE: The Cardinals lead Major League Baseball Outs Above Average (16), Runs Prevented (13) and Fan-raphs' Defensive Runs Above Average (9.8), while ranking T-2nd in Groundball Out Pct. (77.8%), T-3rd in fielding percentage (.989), and T-5th in Defensive Runs Saved (12).

THE HEAT IS ON: The top four Major League leaders in stolen bases this season come from the National League Central Division: **Pete Crow-Armstrong** (12), **Oneil Cruz** (12), **Ely De La Cruz** (10), and **Victor Scott II** (9) ... Scott II (9-for-9) and Cruz (12-for-12) are the only two Major Leaguers with 9 SB+ and a perfect 1.000 stolen base percentage ... Scott's streak of nine stolen bases without being caught to open the season is the 9th-longest by a Cardinal to begin a season and longest since **Paul Goldschmidt** (11 in 2024 and 12 in 2021).

BEER WARS: The Cardinals own the most wins against the Brewers (245-197, .554) since St. Louis and Milwaukee began regular season play in 1997, and since the Seattle Pilots joined MLB as an expansion team in 1969, only the Minnesota Twins (255-242, .513) have more wins over Pilots/Brewers than St. Louis.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (April 26, 2000): The Cardinals set a Major League record by hitting their 50th home run in April ... Homers by pitcher **Rick Ankiel**, **Jim Edmonds** and **Fernando Tatis** in the 7-0 victory over the Brewers at Busch Memorial Stadium help to break the mark established by the 1997 Indians with 49 ... Ankiel also tossed 7.0 scoreless innings while going yard.

MILWAUKEE CONNECTIONS

Ryan Helsley (April 16, 2019) made his MLB debut at Milwaukee.

Trevor Megill was originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2014 MLB Draft, but did not sign to return to Loyola Marymount Univ.

Willson Contreras's younger brother, **William**, is also a catcher for the Brewers.

Caleb Durbin played college baseball at Washington University in St. Louis (2019-21).

Late Brewers broadcaster **Bob Uecker** played two seasons (1964-65) with St. Louis...won the 1964 World Series...traded by the Milwaukee Braves to St. Louis for **Jimmie Coker** & **Gary Kolb** (Apr. 9, 1964).

Connor Thomas was selected by St. Louis in the 5th round of the 2019 MLB Draft...pitched five seasons in the Cardinals minor league organization (2019-24)...selected by Milwaukee in the 2024 Rule 5 Draft (Dec. 11, 2024).

José Quintana made one postseason and 12 regular season starts for the Cardinals in 2022...acquired at the 2022 MLB Trade Deadline with **Chris Stratton** from Pittsburgh in exchange for **Johan Oviedo** and **Malcom Nuñez**.

Hall of Famer **Ted Simmons** played five seasons with Milwaukee (1981-85), where he was a two-time AL All-Star and faced off against St. Louis in the 1982 World Series...traded to Milwaukee with **Rollie Fingers** & **Pete Vuckovich** for **David Green**, **Sixto Lezcano**, **Dave LaPoint** & **Lary Sorensen**.

Ricky Horton made five starts for the Denver Zephyrs (AAA) in the Brewers organization in 1990.

Brewers Media Relations Intern **Owen Buescher** previously work as a 2024 Cardinals Communications Gameday Associate...graduated from Belleville (Ill.) West High School and the University of Missouri (2020-24).

KMOX broadcaster **Matt Pauley** hosted Brewers pre- and postgame shows for parts of six seasons (2017-22)...was radio play-by-play voice of the Univ. of Wisconsin-Green Bay women's basketball team.

Steve Dillard, father of Brewers broadcaster **Tim Dillard**, was hitting coach for the Single-A Quad Cities Swing/River Bandits from 2006-07 and hitting coach for the High-A Palm Beach Cardinals in 2007...later piloted Quad Cities in 2008-09, where he managed infielder **Oliver Marmol**.

Brewers broadcaster **Jeff Levering** previously worked three seasons (2010-12) as broadcaster for the Springfield Cardinals (AA).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played in 73 games for Milwaukee in 2010.

Cardinals Dir. of Medical Ops/Head Athletic Trainer **Adam Olsen** is a native of Green Bay...graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

TODAY'S GAME:

- Leads the team's starting rotation's 6th turn thru as he is set to make his 6th start of the season today; It's his 4th start of the season at home.
- The Cardinals are 4-1 in his five starts to begin the 2025 season and Sonny has won 4-straight decisions dating to last season, with his last loss coming on 8/24/24 at MIN.
- Prior to their loss last Sun. (4/20) at NYM, the Cardinals had won eight consecutive games that Sonny had started dating back to last season. The Cardinals have lost consecutive games started by Sonny just four times since he joined the team last year (3-straight from 8/12/24-8/24/24).
- He is trying to begin a season 4-0 for the 1st time since 2023 when he did so with Minnesota.
- Five of his 21 hits allowed have been HR's and **9 of his 11 runs allowed this season have come via HR's.**
- Ranks 5th in NL in WHIP (0.86) and 3rd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (7.25; 29 K & 4 BB); **his 3.6 walks pct. is lowest of his career** and he has no 4-pitch walks thus far.
- Has been matched up against MLB All-Stars Pablo Lopez (MIN), Yusei Kikuchi (LAA), Paul Skenes (PIT), Framber Valdez (HOU) & Clay Holmes (NYM) in each of his first five starts this season.**
- Is 20-12 with a 3.02 ERA in 45 career starts in April and had a 3-1 mark with a 1.16 ERA last April in four starts for St. Louis; **stands at 5-1, 2.28 ERA (47.1 IP/12 ER) in his 8 April starts as a member of the Cardinals (2024-present).**
- St. Louis is 21-12 in his 33 starts with the club since joining in 2024; His record stands at 16-9 while wearing the Birds on the Bat.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed a lead-off HR to Mets Francisco Lindor on Easter Sun. (4/20) at NYM, then settled in thru 6.0 IP. Took a ND as the Cardinals rallied to tie the game 3-3 in the 7th before losing, 7-4. The Cardinals loss snapped an 8-game win streak in games that Sonny had started dating back to 2024. **Threw 100+ pitches (102) for the just the 3rd time since joining the Cardinals** last season.

2025/CAREER NOTES:

- Started his 100th career game as a National Leaguer on 4/14 vs. HOU (and of course it was in an Interleague game) and worked a season-high 7.0 scoreless IP (92 pitches), allowing just 3 hits, in an 8-3 win to improve to 3-0.
- Improved to 2-0 with a 5-3 win over the Pirates on 4/8 at PIT in a match-up vs. Paul Skenes; Game time temperature was 38 degrees and snow flurries. Passed 1,750 career innings pitched in that start, becoming the 10th active Major Leaguer to hit that mark (*Justin Verlander, Max Scherzer, Clayton Kershaw, Charlie Morton, Jose Quintana, Chris Sale, Gerrit Cole, Patrick Corbin* and *Kyle Gibson*).
- Made his 300th career start on 4/2 vs. LAA. Threw 6.0 innings for a no decision, exiting after a grand slam by Logan O'Hoppe, before the Cardinals retaliated with nine unanswered runs for a 12-5 win.
- Drew the Cardinals Opening Day start on 3/27 vs. MIN, the 4th Opening Day start of his career and his 1st for St. Louis; improved to 3-0 with a 1.07 ERA (25.1 IP/3 ER) in his four career Opening Day starts.
- Struck out 203 batters in his first season in St. Louis in 2024, 19th-most in Cardinals single-season history. Became the 9th pitcher in Cardinals single-season history (20th instance) to reach 200 strikeouts and first since **Jack Flaherty** (231 in 2019).
- His 203 strikeouts were 2nd-most by a pitcher in their first season with St. Louis behind only **José DeLeón's** 208 strikeouts in 1988.
- Established new single-season Cardinals records in strikeouts/9 IP (10.98) and strikeout percentage (30.3%) in 2024, surpassing **Jack Flaherty** (10.59, 29.9%) in 2019.
- Finished two strikeouts shy of tying his single-season career high of 205 with the Reds in 2019. Recorded a 57.1 strikeout pct. on his Sweeper (fanning 112 in 196 plate appearances), MLB's best strikeout pct. of any pitch (minimum 150 plate appearances).
- Yielded a career high 21 home runs in 2024, but only five at Busch Stadium.
- His team-leading 13 wins in 2024 were his most since a career-high 14 victories in back-to-back seasons with Oakland (2014-15)
- Signed a three-year (2024-26) free agent contract with St. Louis following the 2023 Thanksgiving holiday, with a fourth year club option for the 2027 season.
- The Cardinals are his fifth Major League team, after the Athletics (2013-17), Yankees (2017-18), Reds (2019-21), and Twins (2022-23).
- Finished 2nd in the 2023 American League Cy Young Award voting behind Yankees **Gerrit Cole**, who received 30 unanimous 1st place votes. Gray received 20 2nd place votes and six 3rd place. Also ranked 18th in AL MVP voting.
- Three-time Major League Baseball All-Star, earning selections in 2015 (American), 2019 (National) and 2023 (American).
- Graduated from Smyrna (Tenn.) High School. A two-sport athlete, lettered all four years in baseball and three years in football. Played quarterback and led Smyrna to back-to-back Tennessee High School state championships. Was also Homecoming King.
- Originally selected by the Chicago Cubs in the 27th round of the 2008 MLB Draft out of Smyrna High School, but did not sign. Drafted by the Oakland Athletics in the 1st round (18th overall) of the 2011 Major League Draft out of Vanderbilt University.

GRAY vs. MILWAUKEE

- Is making his 17th career start vs. the Brewers this afternoon, but just his 2nd against them at Busch Stadium III.
- Is seeking his 1st win against Milwaukee as a member of the Cardinals;** in his three prior starts vs. MIL as a Cardinal, the team has provided just 3 runs in support.
- Is 4-4, 3.15 ERA career vs. the Brewers with his last win coming on 8/26/21 while pitching for Cincinnati.
- Took the loss at Busch Stadium on 4/21/24, a 2-0 defeat to the Brewers, when he struck out a season-high 12; Allowed three straight two-out singles in the 7th inning accounting for the two runs.
- Is a career 19-21 with a 3.72 ERA in his 56 career starts against National League Central opponents, with the Cardinals winning each of the last four that he has started.
