METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Braves, 7-3, last night Flushing...The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games (2-7)...New York is 19-22 on the road compared to 28-12 at Citi Field in 2025...The Mets are in the middle of a brief four-game homestand against the Braves (1-2)...Following this series, the Mets head to Pittsburgh for a brief three-game trip against the Pirates.

LAST NIGHT: The Mets ended a five-game losing streak at home last night...It was their longest home losing streak since a six-game skid from October 1, 2023 - April 4 (G1, 2024) and was their longest home losing streak spanning a single season since September 3-14, 2022...It ended a six game losing streak against Atlanta that dated back to September 30 (G2), 2024...Are 2-10 in their last 12 games dating back to June 13.

IN GOOD COMPANY: Yesterday, Juan Soto joined Darryl Strawberry (May, 1987), as the only Mets player to have 10 ore more home runs and 20 or more walks in a calendar month...Courtesy of Sarah Langs...In 23 games this month, Soto is batting .325/.485/.753 with 22 runs, three doubles, 10 home runs, 18 RBI, 23 walks and one steal.

WALK TO ME: He has recorded 23 walks in the month of June, the most by a Met in a single calendar month since Brandon Nimmo's 29 walks in September of 2018...He has recorded a Major League-leading 66 walks this season, the most by a Met through the team's first 81 games in franchise history...His 66 walks through the team's first 81 games are the most in franchise history... John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999... Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024).

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: According to *Elias*, Francisco Lindor has hit 257 home runs and stolen 196 bases as a shortstop...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

UPCOMING MILESTONES: Francisco Lindor is two steals away from 200 career SB and one steal away from 100 as a Met...He would become the 12th Met to reach 100 stolen bases and the sixth Met to record at least 100 homers and 100 steals with the team (also: Darryl Strawberry, David Wright, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán and José Reyes).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers... Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 62-81 against Atlanta all-time at Citi Field...New York is 11-28 against the Braves dating back to August 15, 2022

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 10 straight games against the NL East...They are 2-7 in that span...New York is 14-11 against the NL East this season, sporting a 3.82 ERA...They have hit .250/.314/.430 against the division.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Over the last 28 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .315 (34-108) with 18 runs, five doubles, seven homers, 15 RBI, 10 walks, five steals and an .934 OPS...In 22 games when batting in the two-spot, Nimmo is hitting .329/.396/.610 with five doubles, six homers, 13 RBI, eight walks and three steals.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: In 23 games this month, Pete Alonso is batting .281 (25-89) with 14 runs, four doubles, seven homers, 21 RBI, seven walks, a .366 OBP and a .562 SLG...His 21 RBI this month are the third-most in the NL, while his seven homers are tied for fourth in the NL in June...He is fourth in the Majors with 64 RBI.

STEAL THIS BASE OR DON'T: Mets runners have now recorded an 86.1 (62-72) stolen base percentage this season which is the best mark in the majors...Mets catchers have combined to throw out 37.5% of potential base stealers this year (21-56), the second-best mark in the majors.

IN THE CITY: The Mets are 28-12 at home, tied with the '21, '10, '88 and '86 teams for the second-best mark in franchise history through the first 40 home games of a season...Only the 2015 team (29-11) had a better mark.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his seventh win of the season after allowing three earned runs over 5.0 innings at Philadelphia on June 21...He allowed six hits, two walks, and struck out four...He has seven wins through his first 15 starts this season and his seven wins are tied for the 13th-most in the majors and tied for the sixth-most in the NL...The Mets are 11-4 in games that Canning starts this season.

VS. NL EAST: In 10 career starts against NL East opponents he has a 4.53 ERA (27 ER/53.2 IP) and a 4-1 record...This season he's made four starts against divisional opponents and he has a 3.54 ERA (8 ER/20.1 IP) with a 2-0 record...The Mets have won all four games he's started against NL East opponents this season and he's allowed one or zero runs in two of those four starts.

START ME UP: His 3.91 ERA (29 ER/73.2 IP) is the best of his career through his first 15 games of a season, topping his 4.52 ERA through his first 15 starts of 2023...He earned his seventh win of the season on June 21 and that is the most in his career through his first 15 games of a season...Has allowed two or fewer earned runs in nine of his 15 starts this season.

THIS IS MY LEAGUE: In nine starts vs. NL opponents this season Canning owns a 6-0 record, 2.74 ERA (14 ER/46.0 IP) and has held opponents to a .618 OPS...The Mets are 8-1 in games Canning starts against NL opponents...In comparison, in six starts against Interleague opponents he owns a 1-3 record, a 5.86 ERA (18 ER/27.2 IP) and opponents have an .820 OPS.

NO EXTRA BASES: In 15 starts this season Canning has produced a plus five in Net Bases Prevented (a sum of advances prevented, and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to *Baseball Savant*...That is tied for the most this season with teammate David Peterson and Atlanta's Grant Holmes...Since the start of 2020 he is tied for second with 21 Net Bases Prevented...He is tied with Chris Flexen and trails only David Peterson (29).

GRIFFIN FANNING: During Spring Training, he struck out 22 batters over his 14.1 innings of work, highlighted by his nine strikeouts in 4.2 innings vs. Tampa Bay on March 17...His 22 strikeouts ranked ninth in the Grapefruit League and tied for the 17th-most across the majors...Canning finished the spring with an impressive 1.88 ERA (3 ER/14.1 IP) and a K/9. rate of 13.8%...He struck out a season-high eight batters on April 17 vs. St. Louis and he has racked up 67 strikeouts through his first 15 starts of this season...In his last two major league seasons, Canning has recorded 130 and 139 strikeouts respectively.

SLIDE TO THE LEFT: Canning has thrown his slider more this season than he ever has before...So far, he has thrown his slider 31.5% of the time compared to 24.1% of the time last season and 29.9% during the 2023 season...He has picked up 25 strikeouts on his slider so far this season and is generating a 33.3% whiff rate on the pitch...He has generated 71 swing & misses with his slider this season, which is the 10th-most in the majors this season...He has thrown his slider 412 times this season which is the 11th-most anyone has thrown their slider in majors this year.

WORKHORSE: Last season, he set a career-high with 31 starts and 171.2 innings pitched for the Angels and in 2023 he finished with 127.0 innings...He is just one of 51 pitchers to throw at least 125.0 innings in each of the past two seasons...In the last two seasons combined, Canning has thrown 298.2 innings which ranks 48th in the majors over that time.

KEEP THE CHANGE: Canning's changeup is one of his best pitches and last season it had a run value of four which ranked eighth in the majors...He threw his changeup 26.7% of the time and he held his opponents to a .259 batting average against that pitch...He also generated a 28.8% whiff% on his changeup which was the 11th-highest clip in the majors...So far this season he has thrown it 23.5% and it produced a 22.6% whiff rate while picking up 17 strikeouts with the pitch...His changeup has produced a positive five run value, which is tied for 12th-best mark in the majors this season.

STAY GOLDEN: Canning was awarded the American League Rawlings Gold Glove in 2020, and he owns a career .955 fielding percentage...Last season he had a perfect fielding percentage on his 32 chances, and he is perfect through his first 15 chances so far this season.

- Recorded his 10th hold of the season on June 24 vs. Atlanta...Allowed a sac fly to Ozzie Albies and left the game with two on, both eventually scored (0.1 IP, 3 ER, 3 BB)...Was the second time this season he has allowed at least three walks and three earned runs

- (also: 6/19 at Atlanta)...Prior to the game on June 19, had not allowed more than one earned in his first 30 outings of the season...Was also tied for his shortest outing of the season (also 5/3-G1 at St. Louis).
- Allowed one hit over 2.0 scoreless innings on June 21 at Philadelphia (2 K, HP)...Stranded an inherited runner in the sixth inning...Marked his longest outing since May 21 (2.1 IP)...Was his seventh scoreless outing of six or more outs which is tied for the fifth-most such appearances among major league relievers.
 - On June 19 at Atlanta, allowed a season-high four earned runs over 0.2 IP (2 H, 3 BB)...Stranded two of three inherited runners after entering the game in the fifth inning...Also pitched in the sixth, giving up a two-run double to Matt Olson and then left the game with a runner on base who eventually scored...Allowed four or more runs for the third time in his career and first since June 26, 2024 at Kansas City...Also marked the first time he allowed more than one earned run this season...His three walks were his most in an outing since June 1, 2024 vs. Texas.
 - Has gone 3-2 with one save, 10 holds and a 3.00 ERA (14 ER/42.0 IP) through 33 appearances (two as an opener) this season, holding batters to a .187 average (26-139) including right-handers to a .150 average (12-80)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .125 average (8-64).
 - Has allowed nine earned runs over eight appearances in the month of June after allowing just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April and May.
 - Has faced the Braves 14 times in his career...Had a 9.1 scoreless inning streak vs. Atlanta from 9/2/22-9/30(G1)/24...Has allowed 10 runs over his last four appearances vs. the Braves (9/30(G2)/24-6/24/25) after allowing just one run in his first 10 appearances against the club.
 - Has stranded 21 of 24 inherited runners this season...His inherited runners scored percentage (12.5%) is the third-best mark in the majors and tied for the best in the NL (min. 20 IR).
