WASHINGTON NATIONALS (8-10) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (11-7) April 16, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 12:35 EDT - Game #19/Home #10 LHP Foster Griffin (2-0, 1.76 ERA) vs. RHP Braxton Ashcraft (1-1, 2.12 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won two of the first three games in this four-game series vs. Washington after picking up a 2-0 win on Wednesday...Will also host Tampa Bay for three games (Friday-Sunday) before departing for a six-game road trip to Texas (April 21-23) and Milwaukee (April 24-26)...Have won 10 of their last 14 games (since March 31 at Cincinnati)...Are looking to win seven of their first 10 home games in a season for the third time in PNC Park history (since 2001), along with 2016 and 2023...Have not lost back-to-back games since opening the year with two losses (March 26-28 at Citi Field).

SHUT 'EM DOWN: Pittsburgh picked up its second shutout of the season (also April 10 at Chicago-NL) with Wednesday's 2-0 win vs. Washington...The Pirates had a Major League-best 19 shutouts in 2025, tied with 1968 for their second-most in a season in the Live Ball Era (since 1920), behind only 1992 (20)...Pittsburgh's 3.25 staff ERA ranks fourth in all of Major League Baseball.

FROM THE ASHES: Braxton Ashcraft will get the start for Pittsburgh in today's series finale vs. Washington...He has struck out at least eight batters while allowing one or zero runs and issuing one or zero walks in each of his last two starts (April 5 vs. Baltimore and April 11 at Chicago-NL)...No Pirates pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) has accomplished that in three straight starts.

CARMEN'S ELECTRIC: Carmen Mlodzinski earned his first win of the season after relieving starter Mason Montgomery in the second inning of Pittsburgh's 2-0 win on Wednesday vs. Washington and going on to not allow a run over a career-high 6.0 innings of work...He became the first Pirates relief pitcher to pitch at least 6.0 innings in a game since Quinn Priester (also 6.0ip) on July 9, 2024 at Milwaukee...Mlodzinski also became the first Pittsburgh reliever to throw at least 6.0 scoreless innings in a game since Steve Cooke pitched 7.0 scoreless innings on September 21, 1992 vs. St. Louis.

SOUTHPAW SIGHTING: The Pirates will be opposed by Washington southpaw Foster Griffin in today's series finale, marking the sixth time this season that Pittsburgh is facing a left-handed starter (the Pirates have gone 3-2 in those games)...Pittsburgh won on March 31 at Cincinnati (Brandon Williamson), April 1 at Cincinnati (Andrew Abbott) and April 10 at Chicago-NL (Shota Imanaga), while falling on March 28 at New York-NL (David Peterson) and Tuesday vs. Washington (PJ Poulin)...Oneil Cruz is 8-for-20 (.400) with three home runs vs. lefthanders so far in 2026.

SO(TO) GOOD: Gregory Soto struck out two batters (James Wood and Daylen Lile) in a perfect eighth inning on Wednesday vs. Washington...He has posted a 0.93 ERA (9.2ip/1er) and 15 strikeouts while allowing two hits over his first 10 appearances (9.2ip) with Pittsburgh...Soto and Isaac Mattson (September 20, 2024-June 15, 2025) are the only Pirates relievers during the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 15 strikeouts and two or fewer hits allowed in their first 10 appearances with the team...He and Don Gross (April 15-May 30 [G2], 1958) are the only Pittsburgh relievers in the Modern Era with at least 15 strikeouts and one/zero runs allowed in their first 10 outings with the club...Soto's 15 strikeouts are tied for the fifth-most among all relievers in MLB.

O'YEAH: Ryan O'Hearn went 3-for-4 with a stolen base (his first steal since last year on May 30 with Baltimore vs. Chicago-AL) and a run on Wednesday vs. Washington...His .333 batting average (21-for-63) is tied with San Francisco's Luis Arraez and Atlanta's Mauricio Dubón for the fourth-best mark in the National League...O'Hearn has reached base safely 31 times in his first 17 games.

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds extended his on-base streak to 14 straight games (since March 31 at Cincinnati) by drawing three walks on Wednesday vs. Washington...He is batting .333 (16-for-48) with a double, a triple, three home runs, 11 RBI, 11 walks, a stolen base and 12 runs scored during the streak (he has raised his average from .182 to .288 during the streak).

April 16, 2025: Oneil Cruz connected for his first career grand slam (off Eduardo Salazar) in the seventh inning of Pittsburgh's 6-1 win over Washington at PNC Park. It marked the first of three straight games with a home run for Cruz, who would go on to hit a leadoff home run in each of his next two contests. Henry Davis hit his first home run of the season (off Mitchell Parker) and had two RBI in the victory.

LAST TIME OUT: Ashcraft had a no-decision after allowing one run on four hits and one walk while striking out a career-high nine batters over 5.0 innings on April 11 at Wrigley Field...He left with the Pirates holding a 3-1 lead before the Cubs tied it in the ninth inning and sent it to extras, where Pittsburgh earned a 4-3 victory in 11 innings.

HISTORIC STRETCH: Ashcraft has recorded at least eight strikeouts while issuing one or zero walks and allowing one or zero runs in each of his last two starts (April 5 vs. Baltimore and April 11 at Chicago-NL)...He joined Bob Friend (August 20-24, 1959), Rick Rhoden (June 21-27, 1986), Joe Musgrove (September 20-26, 2020), Mitch Keller (May 8-14, 2023) and Paul Skenes (last year from September 4-10) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have consecutive starts with at least eight strikeouts, one/zero hits and one/zero walks (nobody has accomplished it in three straight starts).

WIN THE DAY: Ashcraft earned his first win of the season and helped Pittsburgh complete a three-game sweep after allowing only one run (zero walks) and striking out eight batters over a career-high-tying 6.0 innings of work on April 5 vs. Baltimore... He joined Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis, Major League debut) as the only Pirates pitchers during the 21st century to pitch at least 6.0 innings while issuing zero walks and having eight strikeouts in an outing within their first two games of a season.

THROWN FOR A CURVE: Ashcraft has generated a 53.8 whiff percentage on his curveball this year (he has thrown the pitch 70 times)...He has limited opposing hitters to a .059 batting average against (1-for-17) when he throws his curveball this season.

HOW LOW CAN YOU GO: Ashcraft has posted a 2.15 ERA (50.1ip/12er) in the first 11 starts of his Major League career (since last season on June 23 at Milwaukee)...That trails Cy Blanton (1.55 ERA, 1934-35), Zach Duke (1.84 ERA, 2005), Paul Skenes (1.90 ERA, 2024) and Red Witt (2.12 ERA, 1957-58) for the lowest mark by a Pirates pitcher in the first 11 starts of their Major League career during the Live Ball Era (since 1920).

CASHING IN AT PNC: Ashcraft has a 2.77 ERA (39.0ip/12er) and 46 strikeouts in 15 career appearances (five starts) here at PNC Park...He has also allowed just one home run at home (a solo shot to Chicago-NL's Michael Busch last season on September 15).

HOMER HIATUS: Ashcraft allowed three home runs in 69.2 innings pitched last season, coming on July 4 at Seattle (Dylan Moore, two-run), September 9 at Baltimore (Jeremiah Jackson, solo) and September 15 vs. Chicago-NL (Michael Busch, solo)...He was one of only two Major League pitchers from May 26 (debut date) through the end of the regular season to pitch at least 65.0 innings and allow three or fewer home runs, along with Milwaukee's Aaron Ashby (he allowed three home runs over 65.2 innings).

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: Ashcraft struck out six batters over 3.0 perfect innings of relief during his penultimate appearance last season, which came on September 20 vs. the Athletics...He became the third Pirates reliever during the Modern Era (since 1901) to accomplish that feat, joining Bob Patterson (May 25, 1991 vs. Philadelphia) and Chan Ho Park (October 1, 2010 at Florida)...Ashcraft also joined starter Bubba Chandler, who had six strikeouts and zero walks, as the only pair of Pirates pitchers in the Modern Era to each have at least six strikeouts while also giving up zero walks in the same game.

A BIT OF BOTH: Ashcraft went 1-2 with a 2.16 ERA (33.1ip/8er) in eight starts last season, while also going 3-2 with a 3.22 ERA (36.1ip/13er) in 18 relief appearances... His lone win as a member of Pittsburgh's starting rotation came on August 22 vs. Colorado, when he allowed one hit and struck out six batters over 5.0 scoreless innings.

THREE'S COMPANY: Ashcraft pitched at least 3.0 innings and allowed one or zero runs in each of his first six Major League starts, joining Los Angeles' Fernando Valenzuela in 1981 (seven starts) as the only pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to accomplish that...The streak was snapped last year on Sept. 15 vs. Chicago-NL (gave up three runs).
