TODAY'S TILT...Seattle open a 7-game road trip with the Chicago White Sox (3 G, May 8-10) and Houston Astros (4 G, May 11-14)...the Mariners are coming off a series win at home against the Braves (2-1) handing Atlanta their first series lost of the season...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won Wednesday's game against the Braves by a 3-1 final...Seattle is 8-5 over its last 13 games and 10-7 over its last 17 games.

- **Rizzs Returns Home** - Mariners radio broadcaster **Rick Rizzs** plans to retire at the end of the 2026 season...Rizzs grew up on the South Side of Chicago and is a 1975 graduate of Southern Illinois University in Carbondale...he'll be on the call against the White Sox in his final series in Chicago.
- **At Rate Field** - Since the start of the 2023 season the Mariners have yet to lose a series against the White Sox in Chicago...over that span the Mariners are 7-2 against Chicago-AL at Rate Field.
- **Emerson on the Mound** - **Emerson Hancock** struck out a career-high 14 batters in his last start, bringing his season total strikeouts to 46, the 10th most in the American League this season.

NO FREE BASES...Seattle pitchers have only issued 93 walks this season, the fewest in the Majors, ahead of LAD-105...the pitching staff's 2.47 BB/9 is also the best in MLB...Mariners currently have two starting pitchers among the leagues best in walks per nine innings which include **Emerson Hancock** (2nd, 1.30 BB/9) and **Bryan Woo** (4th, 1.53 BB/9)...Hancock's 6 walks are T-1st as the fewest by any starter in MLB (min. 40 IP), also Tarik Skubal-DET.

J.P. CRAWFORD: GOOD BASEBALL PLAYER...**J.P. Crawford** went 0-for-2 with 2 walks in Wednesday's game...he has reached base safely in 9-consecutive games (4/27-c), batting .250 (8x32) with 7 runs, 3 home runs, 5 RBI, 9 walks to just 4 strikeouts and 1 stolen base with a .415 OBP, slugging .531 for a .946 OPS...Crawford has walked (24) more than he has struck out (20) this season, 1 of 18 players with more walks than strikeouts in 2026 (min. 100 PA)...additionally, he is getting on base at a .367 clip this season, posting an 18.8% walk rate that ranks 5th in MLB...since 2022, his 312 walks rank 7th in MLB and 2nd in the AL behind only Aaron Judge-NYY (484 BB).

HAMMER AND NAYLZ...over his last 16 games (4/17-c), first baseman **Josh Naylor** is batting .377 (23x61) with 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 10 RBI, 6 walks and 7 stolen bases, reaching base at a .426 clip and slugging .525 for a .951 OPS...since Naylor made his Mariners debut on July 25, 2025, he is 26-for-28 in stolen base attempts, ranking T-3rd in the Majors and 3rd in AL in stolen bases over that span.

WHAT A RELIEF...The Mariners bullpen's 3.14 ERA (42 ER, 120.1) currently ranks 2nd in the Majors this season, behind Texas (2.98 ERA)...the 'pen also doesn't issue walks, their 44 BB are the second fewest in MLB and the best in the American League...among the standout relievers is RHP **Eduard Bazarzo** 1.62 ERA (3 ER, 16.2 IP), his 30.1 homerless innings streak dating back to last August is T-7th best in the American League, tied with newly acquired teammate **José Suarez**, who will make his Mariners debut in his next appearance.

ALL IS FERRER IN LOVE AND WAR...Mariners reliever **José A. Ferrer** holds a 1.89 ERA (4 ER, 19.0 IP), 3 walks, 16 strikeouts and 2 save in 20 appearances this season, which are T-1st in the Majors...Ferrer has held opponents to a 28.6% hard-hit rate (95+ MPH) and T-13th among qualified pitchers in the 1.2 percentile in Brls/PA, giving up his first "barrel" in his last appearance.

J-ROD SHOWING OFF...over his last 24 games since April 11, **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .323 (31x96) with 13 runs, 7 doubles, 5 home runs, 15 RBI, 7 walks and is 3-for-3 in stolen base attempts, getting on base at a .375 clip, slugging .552 with a .927 OPS in 104 plate appearances.

GIVE ME A WOO...RHP **Bryan Woo** threw 6.0 scoreless inning allowing only 1 hit, 2 walks while matching a season-high 9 strikeouts in Wednesday's matchup against the Braves...this marked his fifth game of 6.0+ innings and 1-or-fewer hits allowed, the most in MLB since 2025, ahead of Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD (4 G).

K KINGS...the Mariners have had 4 of the last 5 pitchers to record 13+ strikeouts in a game: **Emerson Hancock** (14, 5/2/26 vs. KC), **George Kirby** (14, 9/14/25 vs. LAA), **Bryan Woo** (13, 9/13/25 vs. LAA) and **Logan Gilbert** (13, 8/24/25 vs. ATH)...Max Fried-NYY (13, 9/18/25 at BAL) is the last non Mariner with 13+ SO in a game.

COLE YOUNG'S RUN...over his last 19 games (4/16-c), **Cole Young** is batting .333 (23x69) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 1 home run, 11 RBI, 4 walks and 2 stolen bases...the 22-year-old leads second basemen and ranks 1st in MLB with 8 defensive runs saved (*Sports Info Solutions*).

REHAB UPDATE...OF **Victor Robles** and INF **Patrick Wisdom** have both appeared with Triple-A Tacoma against the El Paso Chihuahuas series on rehab...RHP **Bryce Miller** made his 4th rehab start on Wednesday for High-A Everett...tossing 5.0 scoreless inning allowing 2 hits with 3 walks and 2 strikeouts, he threw 61 pitches (38 strikes). INF/OF **Brendan Donovan** made a rehab appearance with Double-A Arkansas on Tuesday, going 1-for-3 with a double, 1 RBI and 2 walks.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Left-handed pitcher **José A. Ferrer** earned his second save in a Mariners uniform in Wednesday's win against the Atlanta Braves, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...since the 2014 season the Seattle Mariners have only had three left-handed pitchers with 2+ saves in a season?...along with Ferrer, LHP Tayler Saucedo earned 3 saves in 2024 and Roenis Elías had 14 in 2019...the club save record by a southpaw belongs to Eddie Guardado who had 36 saves in 2005.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 8

- **2018** - **James Paxton** pitched the 5th individual no-hitter in Mariners history at the Toronto Blue Jays. He completed the feat with just 99 pitches, walking 3 batters and striking out 7. He became the first Canadian MLB pitcher to throw a no-hitter on Canadian soil and just the second Canadian pitcher to ever throw a no-hitter. Paxton was the first American League pitcher to record a 16-strikeout game and a no-hitter in the same season since Nolan Ryan (TEX) accomplished this feat in the same game on 5/1/91 vs. TOR. It marked the Mariners fourth no-hitter since 2012, tied with San Francisco for most during that span.
- **2022** - **George Kirby** makes his MLB debut, tossing 6.0 scoreless innings with 7 strikeouts against the Tampa Bay Rays... became the first Mariners player to toss 6.0+ scoreless innings in their MLB debut...the Mariners would go on to win the game in 10 innings on a Ty France walk-off single.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 8th start of the season and the 39th start of his career...this will be his 45th career appearance including the 6 relief appearances he made throughout the 2025 regular season...it will mark his 1st start against the White Sox this season, 2nd career appearance and 2nd career start against Chicago.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...in his first start of the month on May 2 vs. Kansas City, set the 2026 MLB single-game high in strikeouts (14) while allowing only 1 run (1 ER), 6 hits, and no walks over 7.0 innings of work to match his career high in innings pitched...threw a career high 103 pitches and 75 strikes.

IN HONOR OF THE BIG UNIT...in his last start on May 2, followed up Mariners legend Randy Johnson's number retirement ceremony with a performance of his own, becoming the 4th player with 14+ strikeouts and no walks allowed in Mariners franchise history, joining Randy Johnson (done 2x), **George Kirby** (done 2x) and Mark Langston...is 1-of-5 pitchers in MLB to have 14+ strikeouts and no walks since the start of 2023, joining **George Kirby** (2x, last: 9/14/25), Max Meyer-MIA (4/21/25), Tyler Glasnow-LAD (4/9/24), and Pablo López-MIN (9/10/23)...is the most recent pitcher to record 13+ strikeouts in a game, joining **George Kirby** (14, 9/14/25 vs. LAA), **Bryan Woo** (13, 9/13/25 vs. LAA) and **Logan Gilbert** (13, 8/24/25 vs. ATH) as 4 of the last 5 pitchers in MLB to record 13+ strikeouts in an outing...Max Fried-NYY (13, 9/18/25 at BAL) is the last non Mariner with 13+ SO in a game.

SWINGS AND MISSES...finished the game with a career high 21 swings and misses, the most by a Mariners pitcher this season...surpassed his previous career high of 19 swings and misses set in his March 29 start vs. Cleveland...owns 87 swings and misses on the season, ranking 15th in the AL while he has 47 swings and misses on his 4-seamer, ranking 3rd in the AL just ahead of **Bryan Woo** (44) and **Luis Castillo** (42).

TRAFFIC CONTROL...his 42 baserunners allowed over 41.2 innings in his first 7 starts, are tied for 6th fewest among pitchers in 2026 through their first 7 games (min. 41.0 IP)...owns a baserunners-per-9 of 9.07, ranking 8th in AL in 2026 (min. 35.0 IP)...ranks 2nd in WHIP (0.73) with runners on base in the AL in 2026 (min. 15.0 IP).

HOT OFF THE BAT...is the 2nd Mariners pitcher to record 46+ strikeouts and 6-or-fewer walks through their first 7 games of the season (last: Cliff Lee, 2010)...is 1-of-2 pitchers this season to have done so (also: Cam Schlichter-NYY)...through his first 7 starts owns a 9.9 K/9 and a 28.9 K%, both marks outpacing his 6.4 K/9 and 16.6 K% recorded in 2025, both career-highs...his 5 quality starts through his first 7 games already tie his career high set in 2025.

QUALITY CONTROL...has recorded a quality start in 5 of his 7 starts this season...is 1-of-2 pitchers in 2026 to have 4 quality starts with 1-or-fewer walks and 5+ strikeouts (also: Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD)...the Mariners are 9-5 when Hancock logs a quality start since 2023 and are 7-3 since the start of 2025.

NO FREE PASSES...is 1-of-3 pitchers this season to have allowed 2-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP in each of their first 7 starts...his 3.8 BB% ranks 2nd in MLB in 2026 (min. 30.0 IP)...has contributed 5 starts with 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks to a Mariners pitching staff that leads the league in such games (22) in 2026.

LENGTH ON THE MOUND...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 15 of his 38 career starts, including 6 times during the 2025 season and already 5 times in the 2026 season (last: 5/2 vs. KC)...the Mariners are 9-6 when he tosses 6.0+ innings compared to 14-11 when he tosses less than 6.0 innings...has also tossed 5.0+ innings in 29 of 38 career starts, doing so in all 7 of his starts this season.

NO HITS HERE...in his first start of the 2026 season on March 29 vs Cleveland he threw a career high 9-strikeouts over 6.0 no-hit innings...he became the 2nd player in franchise history to toss 9+ SO without a hit allowed, joining Félix Hernández who threw 12 SO in his Perfect Game on Aug. 15, 2012 vs. Tampa Bay... is the first Mariners starter with 6.0+ IP and no hits allowed since James Paxton's threw a no-hitter (5/8/18 at TOR).

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...became the third pitcher in Mariners history and the second starter to record 7-or-more strikeouts with no walks in 4.0-or-less innings pitched on 9/25/25 against Colorado (also: Yusei Kikuchi as a starting pitcher, 6/5/21 at LAA, and Roy Thomas as a relief pitcher, 4/23/1983 at DET).
