TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-game homestand with the first of 3 games against the Red Sox...Seattle earned a series win against the Orioles on the homestand (2-1)...following Sunday's game, Seattle will embark on a 6-game road trip to Pittsburgh (3 G, 6/23-25) and Cleveland (3 G, 6/26-28)... tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners.TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call, and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** as sideline analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners yesterday captured the rubber game in shutout fashion, beating the Orioles 3-0...Seattle is 14-8 (.636) over their last 22 games since May 25, the 2nd-best record in the AL and 5th-best in MLB over that span.

- **Best In The West** - The Mariners (39-37) are in first place in the American League West Division, 1.5 games ahead of the second place Athletics (37-38).
- **Tidal Waves** - The Mariners pitching staff leads MLB in ERA (3.52) and WHIP (1.07) since May 25... Seattle hitters rank T-3rd in MLB in home runs (36) during that span.
- **Rack 'Em Up** - The Mariners starting pitching staff leads MLB in strikeouts this season with 424, ranking ahead of the next closest Phillies (417 SO).
- **P is Hot - J.P. Crawford** is batting .288 (15x52) with 1 double, 4 home runs, 7 RBI, 7 walks and a .916 OPS over his last 14 games since May 24.
- **What a Weekend!** - The Mariners will host a Juneteenth Celebration which includes wearing their Steelheads uniforms tonight and a post-game fireworks show...Seattle is 4-2 in their Steelheads jerseys...Sunday is Father's Day, when Seattle is 29-17 all-time.
- **Youth Movement - Cole Young** and **Colt Emerson** each recorded an RBI in the same game yesterday for the 4th time this season...the only duo in Mariners history to record an RBI in the same game more times before turning 23 are Ken Griffey Jr. and Omar Vizquel (5 times in 1989).

★**YO ADRIAN, SEND YOUR M'S TO PHILLY**★...Major League Baseball announced a ballot update to Phase One of voting for the 2026 MLB All-Star Game on July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia... the Mariners currently have a player in the Top 8 of voting at every position...OF **Julio Rodríguez** and OF **Randy Arozarena** headline the list, ranking 6th and 7th among AL outfielders, respectively...fans can submit up to 5 ballots per day until the conclusion of Phase One on June 25...Phase Two, which takes the finalists at each position, will run from June 29-July 2 before the All-Star rosters are announced on July 4... for more information and to vote, visit Mariners.com/Vote

BATTERS BEWARE...since **Bryce Miller** and **Luis Castillo** made their first tandem start on May 19, Miller is 3-0 with a 1.21 ERA (4 ER, 29.2 IP), 4 walks and 33 strikeouts in 5 games (4 starts) while Castillo holds a 2.38 ERA (6 ER, 22.2 IP), 9 walks and 22 strikeouts in 5 games (3 starts)...in games where both Castillo and Miller have pitched, the Mariners are 2-1, allowing no more than 2 runs in any of the 3 games...additionally on 5/31 vs. ARI, Miller and Castillo became just the 10th duo in MLB history to each toss 5.0+ innings while allowing 2-or-fewer hits in the same game, and first since the Chicago Cubs (6/2/18 vs. NYM).

MAMMA MIA, DOM...**Dominic Canzone** went 0-for-3 with a walk and a run scored in yesterday's game, snapping his career-long 7-game hitting streak...over his last 21 games since May 24, batting .375 (24x64) with 13 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs and 12 RBI, reaching base at a .437 clip and slugging .797 for a 1.233 OPS...during that span he leads Major League batters in slugging percentage and OPS and also ranks 7th in average among players with at least 60 plate appearances.

J-ROD BEING J-ROD...**Julio Rodríguez** had his first day off of the season in yesterday's game...he recently became the 3rd-fastest player in MLB history (665 G) to record 125+ 2B, 125+ HR and 125+ SB, trailing only Ronald Acuña Jr.-ATL (591 G) and Alfonso Soriano-NYY/TEX (643 G)...he also became just the 3rd player in franchise history to record 125+ doubles, 125+ homers and 125+ stolen bases, joining Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. and Alex Rodriguez...in 75 games this season, Rodríguez is batting .249 (75x301) with 15 doubles, 13 home runs, 35 RBI and 9 stolen bases with a .739 OPS.

COLE YOUNG'S HOT STRETCH...**Cole Young** went 1-for-3 with a double and a RBI in yesterday's game and has now hit safely 18 of his last 20 games since May 27...during that span, he is batting .305 (25x82) with 11 runs, 3 home runs, 7 RBI, 2 walks and just 8 strikeouts in 87 plate appearances...his 9.2% strikeout rate during that timeframe ranks 3rd-lowest in the American League, closely behind teammate **Josh Naylor** (8.0%) and trailing only Trent Grisham-NYY (7.0%)...Young recorded a career-high 11-game hitting streak from May 27 to June 8.

BRYAN WOO STARS IN CUSTOM CLEATS...**Bryan Woo** yesterday tossed 7.0 scoreless innings with 9 strikeouts in a win over the Orioles...during the start, he was wearing custom cleats that were presented to him on Wednesday by 11-year-old Charlotte and 12-year-old Cooper on behalf of around two dozen patients at Seattle who painted custom designs on the cleats.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Bryce Miller** has been electric in his 6 games (5 starts) this season, going 3-0 with a 1.54 ERA (6 ER, 35.0 IP), 5 walks, 36 strikeouts and 0.71 WHIP while holding opponents to a .168 average with a .513 OPS, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Miller's 1.20 ERA (4 ER, 30.0 IP) in his first 5 starts this season is the 5th-best in Mariners history (excluding openers)?...he trails teammate **Logan Gilbert** (0.64 ERA, 2023), **Randy Johnson** (0.92 ERA in 1995), **Bill Swift** (1.11 ERA in 1990) and the first 5 starts of Miller's career in 2023 (1.15 ERA).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JUNE 18

- **1996** - Ken Griffey Jr. breaks the hamate bone in his right hand swinging at a pitch from Erik Hanson vs. Toronto. Junior misses only 20 games.
- **2008** - Manager John McLaren relieved of duties...Jim Riggleman named manager for remainder of 2008 season.
- **2012** - Ichiro went 4-for-5, and his first-inning single was his 2,500th career Major League hit. He accomplished hit #2,500 in his 1,817th game, becoming the 4th-fastest to reach the milestone. Only Al Simmons (1,784 G), Ty Cobb (1,790 G) and George Sisler (1,808 G), all Hall of Famers, have reached 2,500 hits faster than Ichiro.
- **2018** - Nelson Cruz hit his 144th home run with the Mariners in a loss to the Yankees. The home run broke a tie with Bret Boone (143 HR) for eighth-most home runs in club history.

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 7th appearance (6th start) of the season and the 81st (80th start) of his career...it marks his 1st start of the season against the Red Sox and his 4th career start.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller on July 20, 2021.
- Played 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...W#3

on June 12 at Washington Nationals, tossed a career-high 8.0 innings, allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 4 hits (2 HR) and no walks, while striking out 7 batters...has logged back-to-back starts with 7+ strikeouts for the 2nd time in his career (last: 9/12/24-9/18/24)...is the first time in his career he has thrown 3 consecutive games of 6+ strikeouts.

WHAT A STRETCH...

is 5th pitcher in MLB all-time to have 6-or-fewer runs, 5-or-fewer walks, 35.0+ IP and 36+ strikeouts through their first 6 games of the season (last: Ranger Suárez, 3/31/24-4/27/24).

HOME AT LAST...

will be making his 3rd start home start of the season in tonight's game...in 10.2 innings over 2 starts at home, he has yet to allow a run...has allowed 1 hit, 1 walk, and recorded 6+ strikeouts over 5.0+ IP in both starts at home this season...is 1-of-3 pitchers this season to record back-to-back home starts of 2-or-fewer base runners allowed and 6+ strikeouts (5/19-5/31)...over 41 career home games is 13-9 with a 3.19 ERA, 9.2 K/9 and a 1.018 WHIP...owns the 5th best WHIP in home games among AL pitchers since 2023 (min. 200.0 IP)...also ranks 5th in opponent batting average (.209), 5th in ERA (3.19), and 16th in K/BB (3.98)...the Mariners are 25-16 when he starts at T-Mobile...Miller has allowed 3-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP in 29-of-41 career home starts, including his 2 scoreless starts this season...17 of those starts are over 6.0 IP.

DYNAMIC DUO...

Miller and Luis Castillo will make their 4th tandem start this season...Miller owns a 1.15 ERA (2 ER, 15.2 IP) over the 3 outings, while the 2 pitchers have combined for a 1.67 ERA (5 ER, 27.0 IP), 8 walks, 30 strikeouts and a 0.74 WHIP over their last 3 tandem starts (5/19-31)...on May 25 at ATH Miller pitched 5.0+ innings out of the pen to follow Luis Castillo's start, becoming the first Mariners pitcher to log 5.0+ innings of relief and earn the win since Tommy Milone on September 18, 2019 at Pittsburgh.

BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER...

recorded 5.0+ innings with 2-or-fewer runs allowed in each of his first 6 appearances this season...marks the first time in his career he has recorded 6+ such outings in a row...is 1-of-4 pitchers to start the season with 6+ consecutive such games...also is the first time in his career he has recorded 3 consecutive games of 6+ strikeouts (5/31-6/12)...his 1.54 ERA (6 ER, 35.0 IP) and 25 base runners allowed through his first 6 outings are all best marks over a 6 game span to start the season.

BRYCE BESTS ALL...

is dominating lefty batters through his first 6 appearances this season ranking 12th in WHIP (0.74) and 16th in opponent batting average (.159) against left handed hitters in MLB (min. 15.0 IP)...also owns a 8.5 K/BB and a 9.0 K/9...historically matches up better against right handed batters...ranks 8th, in WHIP (0.95) and 9th in BB% (4.5), while ranking T-12th in K/BB (5.5) against right handed batters among AL pitchers since 2023 (min. 100.0 IP)...leads in K/BB (18.0) and ranks 6th in WHIP (0.69) in the AL against RHH this season.

KEEPING THE PATHS CLEAN...

owns a career 10.11 base runners per 9, ranking 11th lowest in MLB since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP)...his 6.43 base runners per 9 this season is the 4th lowest in MLB in 2026 (min. 20.0 IP)...his 21 career games with 4-or-fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP (last: 6/12 at WSH) since 2023 rank T-6th in MLB, joining rotation-mates Bryan Woo (1st, 25 G) Logan Gilbert (T-2nd, 24 G), Luis Castillo (T-8th, 18 G) and George Kirby (T-10th, 17 G) in the top 10 most such games in MLB over that span.

WHAT THE NUMBERS ARE SAYING...

through 6 outings this season, is posting career-high marks in whiff rate (27.2), chase rate (36.0), strikeout rate (28.8), and hard hit rate (27.4), which ranks in the top 3% of pitchers this season, while his walk rate (4.0) is sitting 4.7 points better than his 8.7 mark last season.

CRACKING THE WHIP...

ranks T-3rd in WHIP (0.71) in MLB in 2026...ranks 3rd among Mariners all-time WHIP leaders (min. 400 IP) with a 1.094 WHIP...his 110 walks are the 6th fewest through a starting pitchers first 80 games with the Mariners (min. 400.0 IP) while his 368 hits allowed are 3rd fewest...has recorded 2 outings of 1-or-fewer hits and 1-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP this season (last: 5/31 vs. ARI)...he is 1-of-4 pitchers to have multiple such games this season, along with Paul Skenes-PIT, Drew Rasmussen-TB, and Reid Detmers-LAA.

BEWARE THE 4-SEAM...

owns a career .284 opponent OBP and a .222 opponent average on his 4-seam...his OBP on his primary pitch ranks 10th in MLB among pitchers that have thrown 2000+ 4-seam fastballs since 2023...his 475 swing and misses on his 4-seam are 6th most in the AL since 2023...through his 6 appearances this season, he has increased the average velocity of his four-seamer to 96.6 mph compared to 94.8 mph last season...on May 19, fired a 99.3 mph 4-seamer for a strike, marking the fastest pitch thrown of his career, just passing his previous career-high of 99.2 mph thrown in his first start of the season (5/13 vs. HOU)...has logged 15+ pitches over 97 mph in 3 of his 5 outings...prior to the start of this season his career-high was 10 pitches above 97 mph on Aug. 6, 2023 vs. LAA.

GOING THE DISTANCE...

has pitched 6.0+ innings in 32 career games, including his last start, and 5.0+ innings in 64 of his 80 career outings...the Mariners are 40-24 when he pitches 5.0+ innings and 25-7 when he pitches 6.0+ innings compared to 2-8 when he tosses fewer than 5.0 innings...tossed a career-high 8.0 innings in his last start on June 12 at Washington.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 33-year-old right-hander is set to make his 15th appearance (12 starts) this season and his 258th career appearance...is making his 1st appearance against Boston this season and is facing them for the 6th time in his career.
- Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on Dec. 23, 2011.
- Made MLB debut on June 23, 2017 vs. Washington (w/ CIN).
- Signed a 5-year contract extension with the Seattle Mariners on Sept. 24, 2022 after being acquired in a trade with Cincinnati on July 30, 2022.
- Named an All-Star in 2019 (CIN), 2022 (CIN) and 2023 (SEA).

LAST TIME OUT...L#6

on June 13 at Washington, allowed 5 runs (2 ER) on 7 hits across 5.2 innings with 2 walks and 4 strikeouts...he threw 84 pitches (55 strikes) in his 12th start of the year...has reached the 6th inning in each of his last 2 starts and in 6 total starts this season.

LATEST STRETCH...
