TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners host the Detroit Tigers for the second of 3 games (0-1) to close out the first homestand of the season...the Mariners opened their season with a 4-game split against the Athletics... following an off-day Thursday, the Mariners will travel to San Francisco to face the San Francisco Giants (3 G, 4/4-6) before returning home for a 6-game homestand where they will host the Houston Astros (3 G, 4/7-9) and the Texas Rangers (3 G, 4/11-13)...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call with **Jen Mueller** serving as sideline reporter... the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and Mariners.com with **Rick Rizzo** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped yesterday's series opener to the Tigers by a 9-6 final score.

- **Series Business** - since **Dan Wilson** was named manager on Aug. 22, 2024, the Mariners own a 7-2-3 series record in 12 series...Seattle owns a 4-1-2 series record at T-Mobile Park during that stretch.
- **Patiently Waiting** - Seattle's offense has drawn 22 walks through 5 games, tied for the most walks in the American League...Seattle ranks 4th in MLB, trailing the Cubs (33 BB in 7 games), Dodgers (27 BB in 6 games) and Pirates (25 BB in 5 games).
- **Winner, Winner** - The Mariners have put together 4 consecutive winning seasons (2021-c), tied for the most consecutive winning seasons in franchise history (also: 2000-03).
- **Runners** - The Mariners are 5-for-6 (83.3%) in stolen base attempts this season, with **Ryan Bliss** (2 SB), **Julio Rodríguez** (2 SB) and **Cal Raleigh** (1 SB) each swiping at least 1 bag so far...the Mariners set a franchise record with a 83.3% (140-for-168) success rate on stolen bases last season.
- **200 / 200 Club** - **Logan Gilbert** last season became the 6th pitcher in Mariners history with 200+ strikeouts and 200+ innings pitched in the same season, joining Félix Hernández (6x, 2009-14), Randy Johnson (5x, 1991-93, 1995 and 1997), Mark Langston (4x, 1984, 1986-88), Erik Hanson (1990) and Floyd Bannister (1982)

THE J-ROD SHOW...**Julio Rodríguez** has hit safely in back-to-back games, including going 2-for-5 with 2 runs scored, a triple and an RBI in last night's game after hitting a game-winning 2-run home run in the 6th inning of Sunday's game...dating back to Aug. 28, 2024, Julio is batting .336 (49x146) with 31 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 10 home runs, 31 RBI and 8 stolen bases, getting on base at a .385 clip and slugging .589 with a .974 OPS and a 179 wRC+ in 34 games...among qualified AL hitters with 100 PA during that span, his .974 OPS ranks 3rd, trailing only Aaron Judge-NYY (1.130 OPS) and Yordan Alvarez -HOU (1.005 OPS).

HE RALEY LOVES HITTING AT HOME...infielder/outfielder **Luke Raley** went 1-for-2 with 2 walks and his first home run of the season in last night's game...in 77 career games at T-Mobile Park, Raley is batting .266 (59x222) with 40 runs, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 17 home runs, 48 RBI and 10 stolen bases, getting on base at a .354 clip and slugging .568 with a .922 OPS...his .922 OPS ranks T-4th among active players with at least 100 PA at T-Mobile Park, trailing only Aaron Judge-NYY (1.195), Mike Trout-LAA (1.143) and David Fletcher-LAA (.929).

RANDY'S LASER SHOW...**Randy Arozarena** was 2-for-4 with 1 run, 1 double, 1 home run, 1 RBI and 1 walk in last night's game...over his first 5 games this season, Arozarena has 3 runs, 1 double, 2 home runs, 2 RBI and 4 walks with a .350 on-base percentage, a .625 slugging percentage and a .975 OPS...he leads Mariners hitters with 8 hard-hit balls (95 MPH+) and 6 balls in play of at least 100 MPH.

CAL IS ON THE BOARD...**Cal Raleigh** hit his 1st home run of the season in last night's game...Cal already has the 7th-most home runs among catchers in their first 5 Major League season, after leading all catchers with 93 home runs through his first 4 seasons...Mike Piazza (128 HR) holds the record for most HR through a catchers first five MLB seasons.

PICKING UP WHERE THEY LEFT OFF...in their first outings, **Logan Gilbert** (7.0 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 8 SO), **Luis Castillo** (5.0 IP, 3 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 4 SO), **Bryce Miller** (5.2 IP, 6 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 4 SO) and **Bryan Woo** (6.0 IP, 3 H 1 R, 1 ER, 5 SO) combined for a 2.66 ERA (7 ER, 23.2 IP), 6 walks and 21 strikeouts...last season, the Mariners starting rotation led the Majors in ERA (3.38), quality starts (92), IP (942.2), SO/BB (4.81), BB/9 (1.77), WHIP (1.03) and Opp. AVG (.221), ranking 2nd in strikeouts (889) and 4th in fWAR (15.2).

MUÑY, MUÑY, MUÑY...**Andrés Muñoz** has recorded saves in each of his first 2 appearances this season... Muñoz set a career-highs with 22 saves and a 2.12 ERA (14 ER, 59.1 IP) last season, earning his first career All-Star nod...on Opening Day, he joined Edwin Díaz, Josh Hader, Craig Kimbrel, Kenley Jansen, Dellin Betances, Ken Giles and Greg Holland as the only pitchers since 2000 to post a 2.64 ERA, 12.4 SO/9 and a 3.53 SO/BB or better over his first 200 career games.

HOT START FOR JORGE...third baseman **Jorge Polanco** has hit safely in each of his first 4 games to begin the season (3/27-c), batting .400 (6x15) with 1 home run, 4 RBI and a sacrifice bunt...on Thursday night, "Polo" supplied the go-ahead and eventual game-winning 2-run homer in the bottom of the eighth, his first career Opening Day home run in his seventh Opening Day game.

TERRIFIC AT T-MOBILE...in 2024, Seattle's pitching staff went 49-32 with 21 saves and a 2.85 ERA (234 ER, 739.0 IP) with 168 walks and 795 strikeouts in 81 home games...the 2.85 home ERA led MLB and was the best home ERA in franchise history, surpassing the 2.93 ERA during the 2014 season...the Mariners limited opponents to a .205 batting average at T-Mobile Park, tied for the 6th-lowest in MLB history... Seattle's .256 opponent on-base percentage at home was 4th-lowest in MLB history.

MARINERS EXTEND CAL RALEIGH TO 6-YEAR CONTRACT...the Mariners announced on Wednesday they extended catcher **Cal Raleigh** to a 6-year contract through the 2030 season, with a vesting player option for 2031...the 28-year-old backstop has led MLB catchers in home runs in 3 consecutive seasons and catcher caught stealing in 2 consecutive seasons...Cal led the Mariners in games played (153), plate appearances (628), home runs (34), RBI (100), extra-base hits (50) and total bases (238) last season... Raleigh won a *Rawlings* AL Gold Glove Award in 2024, also named the AL Platinum Glove Award winner and becoming the first Seattle player to go Platinum.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Logan Gilbert** is coming off his first career Opening Day start, where he joined Félix Hernández (2015) and Randy Johnson (1994) as the only pitchers in franchise history to toss 7.0+ innings while allowing 2 hits or less on Opening Day, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Gilbert holds a 2.23 ERA (24 ER, 97.0 IP) in March/April, 2nd among active pitchers with at least 10 starts during the opening month of the season?...he trails only Cristian Javier-HOU (2.08), while ranking ahead of Ranger Suárez-PHI (2.28), John Means-BAL (2.29) and Jacob deGrom-NYM/TEX (2.39).

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 2nd start of the season and 1st against Detroit...he will also make the 123rd start of his MLB career and 4th career start against the Tigers.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau.
- Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
- Was named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on 3/27 vs. ATH on Opening Day, tossing 7.0 innings allowing just 1 run on 2 hits (1 HR) and 0 walks with 8 strikeouts.

OPENING DAY DEBUT...made his first career Opening Day start, becoming the 19th different pitcher in Mariners history to start the season opener... Gilbert also became the 5th "homegrown" pitcher (signed or drafted and developed in the Mariners minor league system) to start Opening Day for the Mariners, joining Félix Hernández, Erik Hanson, Mike Moore and Mark Langston.

A DEBUT FOR THE BOOKS...joins Felix Hernandez (2015) and Randy Johnson (1994) as one of three pitchers in franchise history to have pitched 7.0 innings or more while giving up two or less hits on Opening Day...also became the fourth pitcher (done 8x) in franchise history to allow 1 or less runs over 7+ innings on Opening Day, joining Félix Hernández (2007, 2009, 2012-13 and 2015), Randy Johnson (1993) and Robbie Ray (2022)...tied for third-most strikeouts (8) in an Opening Day debut in franchise history, along with Erik Hanson (1991).

AROUND THE LEAGUE...compared to other 2025 Opening Day starters, Gilbert was the only pitcher to throw 7.0+ innings with 2 or less hits...also tied for third-most strikeouts (8), trailing MacKenzie Gore-WSH (12) and Nathan Eovaldi-TEX (9).

MARINERS MILESTONES...has recorded 719 strikeouts through his first 122 career starts, the most strikeouts in franchise history through a player's first 122 career games...he ranks ahead of Mark Langston (716) and Félix Hernández (714)

SPRINGING INTO ACTION...owns a career-best 2.23 ERA (24 ER, 97.0 IP) in the opening month of the season with a 6-1 record and 108 strikeouts... among active pitchers with at least 75.0 innings in March/April, he ranks third in ERA, trailing Aroldis Chapman (1.29 ERA) and Cristian Javier (2.08 ERA).

200/200 CLUB...finished the 2024 season with 208.2 innings pitched and 220 strikeouts, becoming the 6th Mariners pitcher to reach 200+ in each category in the same season, joining Félix Hernández (6x, 2009-14), Randy Johnson (5x, 1991-93, 1995, 1997), Mark Langston (4x, 1984, 1986-88), Erik Hanson (1990) and Floyd Bannister (1982).

ALL-STAR CALIBER...was named to the 2024 American League All-Star team, his 1st All-Star selection...in 20 starts through the All-Star break last season, he led AL starters with 132.1 IP while ranking 2nd in ERA (2.79), 3rd in strikeouts (124), and gave up the 3rd fewest hits (88).

PUNCHING TICKETS...had 220 strikeouts in 2024, the 13th-most in franchise history and the most since Félix Hernández (248) in 2014...also became the 9th different pitcher to reach 200+ strikeouts and the 3rd different Mariners pitcher to do so in the last 3 seasons (Robbie Ray in 2022 and Luis Castillo in 2023).

LEAGUE LEADER...led the Major Leagues in innings (208.2 IP) and WHIP (0.89) in 2024, becoming the first pitcher in Mariners to ever do so... also tied for the MLB lead in starts (33)...tied for the AL lead in quality starts (22), ranked 2nd in Opp. AVG (.194), 3rd in strikeouts (220), 3rd in strikeouts-to-walks (5.95) and 5th in fWAR (4.1).

CAREER YEAR...set career-best marks with 33 games started (previous: 32 in 2022 and 2023), 208.2 innings pitched (previous: 190.2 IP in 2023), 220 strikeouts (previous: 189 in 2023), 1.6 walks-per-9-innings (previous: 1.7 in 2023), 0.89 WHIP (previous: 1.08 in 2023) and 4.1 fWAR (previous: 3.1 in 2023)...finishes 6th in AL Cy Young Award balloting.

SUPER PERFORMANCES...tossed 8.0 complete innings on 4 occasions last season: May 4 at Houston, June 16 vs. Texas, June 22 at Miami and Sept. 7 at St. Louis...he tied for the Major League lead with 3 starts of 8.0+ scoreless innings (also: Max Fried-ATL).

STINGY STARTER...had 7 starts of 6.0+ scoreless innings in 2024, tied for the 2nd-most in the Majors (also: Zack Wheeler-PHI and Dylan Cease-SD), and trailing only teammate **Bryce Miller** (10).

TOUGH AB...opponents hit just .196 (148x756) against him in 2024, one of 2 qualified pitchers in franchise history with a sub-.200 opponents batting average (also: Randy Johnson, .194 in 1997).

WHIPPING IT UP...his 0.89 WHIP last season was the lowest in Mariners history and 1 of 4 pitchers to post a sub-1.00 WHIP in a qualified season joined by Félix Hernández (0.92 in 2014), Marco Gonzales (0.95 in 2020) and teammate Bryce Miller (0.98 in 2024).

SHUTDOWN STARTER...made back-to-back starts with 8.0 scoreless innings pitched from 6/16-6/22, 2024...since the beginning of the 2020 season, only Nathan Eovaldi-TEX (3 G, 4/29-5/11/23) has gone 8.0+ scoreless innings in consecutive starts...he became the first Seattle pitcher since Mike Montgomery (6/23-6/30/15) to do so.
