2024 HIGHLIGHTS

SEASON 27 RECAP: The D-backs went 89-73, 44-37 at home and 45-36 on the road.

♦ The D-backs finished third in the NL West standings.

89 WINS: The D-backs' 89 wins, which surpassed their total from last year (84), marked their third-most wins since 2008, behind 93 in 2017 and 94 in 2011... have reached 89+ wins 7 times in franchise history (also: 1999/100 W, 2002/98 W, 2011/94 W, 2017/93 W, 2001/92 W and 2007/90 W).

ABOVE THE .500 MARK: The D-backs finished the season above .500 for a second consecutive season with a .549 win pct. (89-73)...it is the first time they finished with consecutive winning seasons since 2017-19 (3 straight).

10+ GAMES OVER ON THE ROAD: The D-backs finished 9+ games above .500 on the road (45-36, .556) for the second time in franchise history (last: 1999, 48-33, +15 G, .593).

VICTORIES VS. NL: The D-backs' 65 wins vs. NL opponents finished fourth most, behind the Phillies (69), Dodgers (68) and Padres (66).

INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT: The D-backs went 24-22 (.522) in Interleague Play this season: 13-10 at home, 11-12 on road.

DAY BASEBALL: The D-backs finished with a 32-23 (.582) day-game record, the third best in the Majors, behind the Dodgers (28-15, .651) and Brewers (39-26, .582).

60 MILLION FANS @ CHASE FIELD: The D-backs welcomed 2,341,876 fans to Chase Field in 2024, their largest attendance mark in 16 seasons, since 2008 (2,509,924), and fourth largest since 2003 (ninth all-time), while eclipsing 60 million fans all-time on Sept. 28.

TOP RUN PRODUCERS: The D-backs led the Majors with a franchise second-best 886 runs (behind 1999/908 runs), ahead of the Dodgers (842) and Yankees (815).

AMONG MLB'S BEST SINCE JULY 1: From **July 1**, Arizona led the Majors with an .838 OPS, .276 AVG, .354 OBP .484 SLG, 745 hits, 131 homers, 279 extra-base hits, 492 runs, 6.31 R/G, 34 sacrifice flies and 23 sacrifice hits.

♦ The D-backs' 48 wins (48-30, .615; 22-16 home, 26-14 road) in the span were tied for the second most in MLB (also: Tigers).

HISTORICAL RUN: The D-backs were the first team to average 6.2+ runs scored per game post-All-Star break since the 2019 Astros (6.42) [18th team in MLB all-time].

D-BACKS MAKE DEFENSE HISTORY: Since 1900, Arizona became the first MLB team with consecutive seasons of 65 or fewer errors (62 in 2024 and a franchise-low 56 in 2023) [Elias Sports Bureau]...the D-backs led MLB in fielding for a second consecutive season with their .989 fielding pct. and 62 errors.

CORBIN CHARTER MEMBER OF 20+ HR / 30+ SB SEASON: Corbin Carroll became the first D-back ever to record consecutive seasons with 20+ homers and 30+ stolen bases...since 2012, he is 1 of 3 players to accomplish consecutive seasons of the feat in their age 23 season or younger (also: Bobby Witt Jr./2022-23 and Mike Trout/2012-13).

♦ Carroll along with Witt Jr. (2023-24) joined Andy Van Slyke (1987-88) and Willie Mays (1957-58) as the only other players in MLB history to have 30+ stolen bases, 20+ home runs and 10+ triples in consecutive seasons [OptaSTATS].

DINGER SEASON: The D-backs reached 200+ homers in a season for the first time since 2019 (220)...their 211 homers were fourth most in a single season in franchise history, behind 2017 (220 HR), 2019 (220 HR) and 1999 (216 HR).

♦ The D-backs' 211 homers this season were fifth most in the Majors, behind the Yankees (237), Orioles (235), Dodgers (233) and Braves (213).

♦ It was the second time in franchise history where the D-backs finished a season in the Top 5 in home runs [also: 1999 (5th, 2016), behind the Mariners (244), Athletics (235), Rangers (230) and Rockies (223)].

HOMER HAPPY: The D-backs' 90 homers since Aug. 1 were the most in MLB, ahead of the Dodgers (86) and Braves (80)...Arizona also led MLB in the span with an .832 OPS, .478 SLG and 328 runs.

♦ Since Aug. 1 their 29 games with 2+ homers led the Majors, ahead of the Dodgers (28).

9 STRAIGHT SERIES WINS: From July 12-Aug. 14, the D-backs secured 9 straight series wins, tying their second-longest streak in franchise history

20+-HOMER SEASONS: The D-backs' 5 players (**Corbin Carroll, Ketel Marte, Joc Pederson, Eugenio Suárez, Christian Walker**) with 20+ homers were the most in MLB and tied for the most in franchise history (also: 2005 - Tony Clark, Troy Glaus, Luis Gonzalez, Shawn Green, Chad Tracy).

RISP-Y BUSINESS: The D-backs' .285 average with runners in scoring position was the best in the Majors, ahead of the Royals (.282), Rangers (.271) and Padres (.269).

FIRST & NINTH-INNING OFFENSE: In the first and ninth innings combined, the D-backs' offense led the Majors with a .298 AVG, .364 OBP, .528 SLG, .892 OPS, 342 hits, 63 homers, 212 runs, 1.31 runs per game and 128 XBH.

BEST BY A D-BACK TEAM: The D-backs' 115 OPS+ was the best in team history (ahead of 1999/101 OPS+).

51 PLAYERS: This season, the D-backs featured 51 total players (21 position, 30 pitchers), tied for sixth most in franchise history (also: 2011)...the most players ever used in a season is 64 in 2021.

♦ Arizona featured 10 total rookies in 2024.

☐ **MOST PLAYERS USED IN A SEASON BY THE D-BACKS:** 64 - 2021; 57 - 2022; 54 - 2023; 52 - 2014/'04; **51 - 2024/'11**; 50 - 2016/'05.

10+-RUN CONTESTS: The D-backs' 21 occurrences of scoring 10+ runs in a game are third most in franchise history, behind 1999 (25) and 2017 (22).

10+ RUNS, 3-OR FEWER ALLOWED: The D-backs' 10 victories this season with 10+ runs scored and 3-or-fewer runs allowed in a game were tied for the most in the Majors (also: Dodgers)...Arizona met the feat 7 times at home, the most in MLB.

STRIKEOUT & WALK RATE: The D-backs' 20.1 strikeout pct. finished fourth lowest in the Majors [behind the Padres (17.6), Astros (19.3) and Royals (19.4)], while their 9.1 walk pct. was fifth highest [behind the Yankees (10.8), Brewers (9.7), Dodgers (9.6) and Mariners (9.4)].

1-RUN WINS: The D-backs' 26 1-run victories were the most for the team since 2017 (29 wins) and seventh all-time.

SLAMMIN' SERPIENTES: The D-backs slugged a Major League-leading and franchise-best 11 grand slams, ahead of the Brewers (10) [surpassed the previous single-season club record (9 in 2001)].

♦ 9 different D-backs with a grand slam in the same season tied for the most in MLB history (also: 2021 Braves, 2021 Dodgers, 2018 Indians and 2018 Reds).

TURNING THE PAGE: The D-backs' .562 win percentage (41-32) in games following a loss finished seventh best in the NL.

LATE ANSWERBACKS: Arizona's 26 victories when trailing in the seventh inning or later tied for seventh most in the NL (also: Giants).

♦ Among all MLB teams from the seventh-ninth innings, the D-backs ranked in runs (1st, 279), sac hits (1st, 16), OBP (2nd, .330), SLG (3rd, .424), homers (3rd, 67), OPS (4th, .755), hits (4th, 424) and extra-base hits (4th, 155).

SEASON-HIGH WIN STREAKS: The D-backs reached a season-high 6 straight wins twice (**Aug. 9-14** and **Aug. 19-25**), the most since Aug. 19-25, 2023 (6).

2000 FRANCHISE WINS: On **March 29**, the D-backs secured their 2,000th regular-season win as a franchise (since 1998) with their 7-3 victory vs. Rockies.

FASTEST IN THE WEST: The D-backs' team average of 29.2 ft/sec sprint speed (p90) ranked atop the NL West.

AN OPENING DAY TO REMEMBER: The D-backs became the first team to plate 16+ runs on Opening Day since the Braves in 2010 (16).

♦ Arizona also recorded its largest winning margin of victory vs. Rockies (previous: 11, 16-5 @ Rockies on June 21, 2017) and were 1 run shy of tying the most runs vs. Rockies (most: 17 on Sept. 28, 2002 @ Chase Field).

RETURN OF THE 'BACKS: **Ketel Marte** (8th season) and **Christian Walker** (8th season) entered the season as the longest tenured D-backs on the roster...both joined in 2017 when Arizona clinched a Postseason berth by defeating the Rockies 11-8 @ Chase Field in the NL Wild Card Game.

OPENING DAY STARTS: **Ketel Marte** made his team-record fifth start at second base and 7th straight Opening Day start (5 2B, 2 CF)...**Christian Walker** made his fourth straight start at first base (5th overall at first, 6th overall - started DH in 2020).

♦ **Corbin Carroll** (second straight), **Gabriel Moreno** (second straight) and **Geraldo Perdomo** (also: 2022) made their second career Opening Day starts...**Alek Thomas** made his first career Opening Day start.

♦ **Blaze Alexander** made his first career Opening Day start in his MLB debut.

2024 OPENING NIGHT SELLOUT: 2024 Opening Night (**March 28**) featured a sellout attendance of 49,011 at Chase Field, marking the fifth largest in franchise history on Opening Day and most on Opening Day @ Chase Field since 2017 (49,016).

THE 14-RUN INNING: The D-backs' 14 runs (3rd inn.) on **March 28** were the most scored by a team in a single inning on Opening Day since 1900 and tied for the fourth-most runs scored by a team in an inning since 1900 [@ MLB].

♦ Arizona also became the second MLB team in the modern era (since 1901) to score 14+ runs in an inning without hitting a home run [@OptaStats]...the other was the Red Sox against the Philadelphia A's on July 4, 1948 (14 in 7th inn.).

LARGEST WINS ON OPENING DAY IN MLB HISTORY: The D-backs' Opening Day 15-run win differential tied for the third largest in MLB history (also: 2016 Dodgers, 1912 Giants), behind the 1890 Buffalo Bisons (21) and 1955 Yankees (18).

NEW FRANCHISE HIGHS OUT OF THE GATE: On Opening Night (**March 28**), the D-backs set franchise inning records in the third inning with 14 runs (previous: 13 vs. PIT, 4th inn., 4/11/10), 13 hits (previous: 10 vs. PHI, 2nd inn., 8/11/15) and 18 plate appearances (previous: 16 vs. PIT, 4th inn., 4/11/10).

ROOKIES ON OPENING DAY: **Blaze Alexander** became the third D-back to start on Opening Day in their MLB debut (also: 2B Edwin Diaz/1998 and 1B Travis Lee/1998)...he was the 18th D-backs' rookie overall to make a start on Opening Day [courtesy Elias Sports Bureau]:

♦ **2023**-Corbin Carroll (CF), **2022**-Drew Ellis (3B), Seth Beer (DH), Geraldo Perdomo (SS), **2021**-Pavin Smith (RF), **2019**-Christian Walker (1B), **2015**-Nick Ahmed (SS), **2014**-Chris Owings (SS), **2013**-AJ Pollock (CF), **2011**-Juan Miranda (1B), **2007**-Chris Young (CF), **2006**-Conor Jackson (1B), **2005**-Koyie Hill (C), **2003**-Lyle Overbay (C), **1998**-Edwin Diaz (2B), Karim Garcia (RF), Travis Lee (1B).

BLAZIN' A TRAIL: **Blaze Alexander** became the second D-back to record 2+ hits on Opening Day in their MLB debut (also: Travis Lee, 3 hits in 1998)...he became the 18th D-backs' rookie overall to make a start on Opening Day.

GAME 1 FOR GURRIEL: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** hit his first career Opening Day home run in his first at-bat while his 5 RBI marked the most by a D-back on Opening Day in franchise history (previous: Jake Lamb with 4 on March 29, 2018 vs. Rockies).

♦ Gurriel Jr. also became the first National League player to record 3+ hits, 3+ runs and 5+ RBI on Opening Day since Vinny Castilla/COL on March 31, 1998 in the D-backs inaugural game @ Chase Field [Sportradar].

ADDITIONAL OPENING NIGHT SUPERLATIVES: **March 28** marked the second time in franchise history where 8+ batters had a multi-hit game (also: June 2005 vs. Royals)...Arizona became the fourth team since 1901 with 8+ batters having 2+ hits on Opening Day (also: 1912 Giants, 1951 White Sox and 1996 Brewers) [Sportradar].

♦ The last team to send 18 batters to the plate in a single inning was the Rockies on July 30, 2010 vs. Cubs (8th inn.) [Sportradar].

♦ It was just the second time a team had 16+ hits and 16+ runs through 3 innings in a game (also: Red Sox vs. Marlins, 6/27/03) and 10th time a team sent 18+ batters to the plate in an inning since 1974.

NL CHAMPS RING CEREMONY: On **March 29**, D-backs players and coaches received their 2023 National League Championship rings, designed by Jostens, during a special pre-game ceremony tonight.

OVER PAR HALFWAY THROUGH: The D-backs finished the first half over .500 after sitting 7 games under .500 entering June 1.

◆ It marked the 13th time in franchise history and fifth time in the last 7 seasons, including last season (.571; 52-39), where the team finished the first half with a record above .500.

D-BACKS TRADE DEADLINE SUMMARY: The D-backs made the following acquisitions at the MLB trade deadline:

- ◆ **July 25:** Marlins' LHP **A.J. Puk** for INF Deyvison De Los Santos and OF Andrew Pinar.
- ◆ **July 30:** Marlins' INF **Josh Bell** for a player to be named later or cash considerations.
- ◆ **July 30:** Nationals' RHP **Dylan Floro** for INF Andrés Chaparro.

19 GAMES OVER: The D-backs were a season-high 19 games above .500 [last: Sept. 21] for the first time since 2017 (24 games above at 93-69 on last day of season).

6+-RUN SCORING STREAK: The D-backs boasted a 6-game scoring streak of 6+ runs in a game (**Aug. 30-Sept. 4**), marking a season long (T-2nd longest in MLB) and their longest since Aug. 27-Sept. 2, 2017 (6 games).

HISTORICAL CROWDS @ CHASE FIELD: The 4-game series vs. Dodgers from **Aug. 30-Sept. 2** saw a series of near-record-setting regular-season crowds...the 4-game series 186,906 total attendance was third all-time @ Chase Field, only a few hundred shy of 2 games during Arizona's inaugural season (187,029 on July 30, 1998 vs. Cubs and 186,906 on April 20, 1998 vs. Marlins).

◆ The 50,041 fans on Aug. 31 marked the second-highest single-game attendance all-time, 139 behind 50,180 on Aug. 31, 2019 vs. Dodgers.

TOUGH STRETCH: With their final 10 games of the season (as of **Sept. 19**), the D-backs faced the second toughest remaining schedule (.548 SOS) of the 7 NL Postseason contenders, behind the Mets (.575 SOS).

FRANCHISE FEATS

FIRST-INNING SUCCESS: The D-backs led the Majors with a franchise-high 38 occurrences of scoring 2+ runs in the first inning [previous high: 34 in 2018], ahead of the Yankees (32) and Marlins (30).

- ◆ In the first inning, the D-backs led MLB with a .325 AVG, .384 OBP, .563 SLG, .947 OPS, 214 hits, 124 runs and 371 total bases.

MARTE'S FIRST & NINTH INNING HOMERS: **Ketel Marte's** 19 combined first-inning and ninth-inning homers were the most in a single season in franchise history, ahead of Paul Goldschmidt's 18 in 2018.

- ◆ No other D-back had more ninth-inning homers in a single season than Marte (8) this season, ahead of Jake Lamb (7 in 2016) and Carson Kelly (7 in 2019).

CARROLL'S CONSECUTIVE 10+-HR, 20+-SB SEASONS:

Corbin Carroll became the fourth D-back all-time to record consecutive seasons with 10+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases (2023-24) [joining Paul Goldschmidt (2015-16), Chris Young (2010-11) and Eric Byrnes (2006-07)].

CARROLL'S CONSECUTIVE 35+-STOLEN BASE SEASONS:

Corbin Carroll (2023-24) became the second player in franchise history to collect 2 consecutive seasons of 35+ stolen bases, joining Tony Womack (1999-2000).

- ◆ Carroll's 91 career stolen bases are fifth in franchise history, behind Womack (182), Paul Goldschmidt (124), Chris Young (112) and A.J. Pollock (102).

5+ RBI FROM THE LEADOFF: **Corbin Carroll** became the first D-back leadoff hitter to collect 3+ occurrences of 5+ RBI in a game (5 on May 7 @ Reds, 6 on July 13 vs. Blue Jays and 5 on Aug. 28 vs. Mets), ahead of Chris Young (5 on July 2, 2010 vs. Dodgers and 5 on Sept. 2, 2006 @ Nationals).

- ◆ Carroll's 6 RBI on July 13 vs. Blue Jays marked a career high and the most ever in a game by a D-back leadoff hitter.
- ◆ Carroll was 1 of 6 MLB players to record 6+ RBI from the leadoff spot (also: Kyle Schwarber/PHI [twice], Shohei Ohtani/LAD, Lawrence Butler/OAK, Ben Rice/NYY and Mookie Betts/LAD).

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK: On **Aug. 2** @ Pirates (Top 1), the D-backs marked their first Back-to-Back-to-Back-homer game since June 10, 2019 @ Phillies (Top 1 - Jarrod Dyson, Ketel Marte, David Peralta), and seventh all-time.

THE BACK-TO-BACK DUO: On **Sept. 10**, **Joc Pederson** and **Christian Walker** combined to hit back-to-back home runs for their fourth occasion, which tied J.D. Martinez and Paul Goldschmidt for the club record for duos with most back-to-backs in a single season [Elias Sports Bureau].

WINS BY 13+ RUNS: The D-backs set a franchise record with 4 wins by 13+ runs (first 3 were thru the first 26 games)...their 4 wins by 13+ runs led the Majors [15th occurrence with 4+ such games in MLB since 1998] (no other team had more than 2 such games in 2024)...only 4 other teams since 1998 had more occurrences: 1999 Phillies (6), 2019 Athletics (5), 2019 Astros (5) and 2018 Dodgers (5).

MARTE'S 10+-GAME HIT STREAKS: **Ketel Marte's** 10 total 10+-game career hit streaks are the third most in franchise history, behind Luis Gonzalez (12) and Paul Goldschmidt (11).

GO OFF, GURRIEL: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** became the first D-back in franchise history to homer in the first 3 games of the season (**March 28-30**).

RUNS SCORED THRU 4: The D-backs' 32 runs in their first 4 games of the season (**March 28-31**) were the most in franchise history, surpassing 27 runs in 2017.

OH MY, LOURDES: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** recorded a franchise-record 10 RBI in the first 4 games of the season (previous: Nick Ahmed/2018 and Chris Young/2010...became the first NL player with 10+ RBI in the first 4 games of a season since Trevor Story/COL in 2016.

ANOTHER FIRST FOR THE KID: On **April 9** vs. Rockies, **Corbin Carroll** hit his first career leadoff home run.

◆ At age 23-232, he became the youngest D-back in franchise history to hit a leadoff homer, 6 days younger than Chris Young (23-238 in 2007).

◆ The 16-run differential also tied for the largest margin of victory in franchise history (also: 16 runs on May 24, 2019 @ Giants).

A MOMENT BEE'LL NEVER FORGET, BEE-LIEVE US: **April 30** vs. Dodgers marked the second-ever "Bee Delay" at Chase Field...the first happened on April 3, 2014 vs. Giants after the third pitch of the game, which resulted in a 40-minute delay...Arizona owns a 1-1 record in Bee games.

◆ The 8:35 p.m. start marked the latest local game start time in Chase Field/Bank One Ballpark history (previous: 8:22 pm, 1998 Opening Day, D-backs first-ever game).

◆ The delay swarmed the media with features on the Today Show, GMA and the Dan Patrick Show.

◆ Blue Sky Pest Control's bee specialist Matt Hilton (PHX Branch Manager), who arrived to remove the swarm atop the backstop netting, threw out the ceremonial first pitch...the following day, TOPPS released autograph cards of him.

HR + BUNT HIT + SB: **Joc Pederson**, on **May 9** @ Reds, became the fourth D-back in franchise history to record a homer, bunt hit and stolen base in a game (also: Corbin Carroll on June 7, 2023 @ Nationals, Luis Terreto on Aug. 27, 2004 @ Reds and Tony Womack on Sept. 1, 2002 vs. Giants).

MULTI-HIT STREAKS: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr. (June 18-23)** and **Christian Walker (June 29-July 4)** each boasted streaks of 5 straight multi-hit games this season to tie for the third longest in franchise history (also: multiple)...were the longest streaks by a D-back since Ketel Marte's franchise-best 8-gamer in 2019 (June 15-25).

THE 87-PITCH GAME: The 87-pitch game by the D-backs (3 pitchers) on **June 20** @ Nationals marked the fewest pitches tossed thru 9.0 full innings in franchise history (previous: 90 on Sept. 14, 1998 vs. Giants).

GALLEN'S HOME STREAK: **Zac Gallen's** 46 consecutive home starts of 5.0+ innings from July 17, 2021-July 9, 2024 marked the third longest streak by a starter in franchise history, behind Curt Schilling (54) and Brandon Webb (48), ahead of Dan Haren (44) and Randy Johnson (40).

50 IN THE BOOKS: The D-backs marked their second straight season with 50 wins (on **July 19**) before team game No. 100 and have met the feat in 4 of their last 6 seasons (excl. 2020).

3+-HOMER PERFORMANCES: **Pavin Smith** (Sept. 8 @ Astros) and **Eugenio Suárez** (July 30 vs. Nationals) became the 12th and 13th D-backs, respectively, to collect 3+ homers in a game...it was the first time where multiple D-backs recorded 3+ homers in a game within a season since 2017 (Paul Goldschmidt Aug. 3, 2017 @ Cubs [3] and J.D. Martinez Sept. 4, 2017 @ Dodgers [4]).

◆ Smith's 8 RBI on Sept. 8 tied for second most RBI in a single game with Chris Iannetta (Sept. 22, 2017 vs. Marlins), behind Erubiel Durazo's club-high 9 RBI on May 17, 2002 vs. Phillies.

CARROLL'S 44-START ON-BASE STREAK: **Corbin Carroll** reached base in a franchise-high 44 straight starts from **July 7-Sept. 5**, ahead of Jay Bell's 39 straight starts (June 27-Aug. 17, 1998)...it was MLB's longest since 2022 (46, Paul Goldschmidt/STL, April 22-June 10).

GENO'S GIANT JULY: **Eugenio Suárez**, in **July**, became the fifth D-back in franchise history with 10+ home runs and 25+ RBI in a month, joining Eduardo Escobar (Aug. 2019, 10 HR/28 RBI), J.D. Martinez (Sept./Oct. 2017, 16 HR/36 RBI), Paul Goldschmidt (Aug. 2017, 11 HR/31 RBI) and Luis Gonzalez (2x; June 2001, 12 HR/35 RBI; March/April 2001, 13 HR/27 RBI).

A HISTORIC NIGHT: On **July 30**, the D-backs shutout the Nationals 17-0 @ Chase Field.

◆ The 17 runs scored were the most in a D-backs' shutout victory in franchise history.

◆ The D-backs' 22 hits tied the franchise record and marked the most ever in a game by the D-backs @ Chase Field (also: 22 hits on April 19, 2024 @ Giants and Aug. 24, 2013 @ Phillies).

◆ The D-backs 13+ hits thru the first 3 innings marked their second occurrence of the season (also: 16 hits on March 28 vs. Rockies) and fifth all-time.

◆ The D-backs, in the second inning, recorded their first-ever occurrence of 5 consecutive RBI hits and their fourth-ever occurrence of 7 consecutive hits.

BELL'S BOMBS: On **Aug. 2** @ Pirates, **Josh Bell** became the second-ever D-back to hit a homer on their very first pitch faced as a D-back...the first to do so was Didi Gregorius (April 18, 2013 @ Yankees) [source: Elias Sports].

◆ Bell also became the second D-back all-time to homer 2+ times in their first game with the franchise (also: 2 home runs by Felipe Lopez on April 6, 2009)...Bell and Lopez are the only players in the Expansion Era who had home runs from both sides of plate in a team debut.

◆ Bell's homer off Chapman's 102.9 MPH fastball was the then fastest pitch ever hit for a homer since ball-tracking began in 2008 [@SteveGilbertMLB] until Ian Happ's homer on a 103.2 MPH pitch on Sept. 17.

◆ Bell became the fifth player since 1900 to homer in his first game with a team after changing teams midseason multiple times (also: homered in first game with Marlins on Aug. 2, 2023) [@SlangsOnSports].

MORE ON BELL'S BOMBS: On **Aug. 7** @ Guardians, **Josh Bell** became the first player in D-backs history to have 2+ multi-homer games within their first 6 games with the franchise [courtesy: Elias Sports Bureau].

ADRIAN DEL CRUSHED IT: Adrian Del Castillo recorded his first career game-tying homer on **Aug. 18** @ Rays in the ninth inning to become just the third player in the Majors since 1961 to have his first 2 career homers come in the ninth inning and either tie or give his team the lead (also: Dan Masteller/MIN in 1995 and Jeff Clement/SEA in 2007) [Stats Inc.].

DEL CASTILLO IN THE BOOKS: Adrian Del Castillo's 14 RBI tied for the second most in a player's first 9 career games since RBI became official in 1920 (also: Dale Alexander/DET in 1929), behind Mitchell Page/OAK (15) in 1977.

◆ The 10-run game run differential was also the largest in any matchup vs. Red Sox in franchise history (previous: 7 runs, 15-8 on April 5, 2019).

11+ RUNS WITHOUT A HOMER: Sept. 15 vs. Brewers (W, 11-10) marked the 11th time in franchise history where the D-backs scored 11+ runs without the benefit of a home run and first time since April 9, 2023 vs. Dodgers (W, 11-6)...the Sept. 15 +1 run margin was the smallest out of all occurrences (prev: +5, 2x).

10TH WIN FOR BRANDON: Brandon Pfaadt became the seventh D-back starting pitcher at age 25 or younger all-time to collect 10+ wins in a season and first since Robbie Ray in 2017 (15):

7 STRAIGHT K'S: On **Sept. 19** @ Brewers, **Brandon Pfaadt's** 7 consecutive strikeouts (Contreras in Bot 4 to Monasterio in Bot 6) tied the franchise record from 2001 (Randy Johnson/3x, last on July 18, 2001, and Curt Schilling on July 21, 2001).

BACK-TO-BACK 11+ K OUTINGS: Sept. 19 marked the third time since 2017 (eighth all-time) where D-backs starting pitchers had 11+ strikeouts in back-to-back games:

◆ **Eduardo Rodriguez** (11 K on Sept. 18 @ Rockies) and **Brandon Pfaadt** (12 K on Sept. 19 @ Brewers)
◆ **Zac Gallen** (11 K on Aug. 22, 2023 vs. Rangers) and **Merrill Kelly** (12 K on Aug. 24, 2023 vs. Reds)
◆ Patrick Corbin (11 K on April 22, 2018 vs. Padres) and Robbie Ray (11 K on April 24, 2018 @ Phillies)

3-0 GREEN LIGHT: The D-backs' 3 hits with a 3-0 count on **Sept. 19** marked the most in franchise history (Joc Pederson/Top 1, Eugenio Suárez/Top 4 and Ketel Marte/Top 5) [previous: 2 - 3x; last: June 20, 2012 vs. Mariners; Justin Upton/Bot 5 and Miguel Montero/Bot 5].

◆ The D-backs are the third team in MLB since 1995 to reach the feat (also: Tigers on Sep. 10, 2022; Kerry Carpenter/Top 2, Spencer Torkelson/Top 2 and Harold Castro/Top 5 and Angels on Aug. 23, 1995; Chili Davis/Bot 3-5 and J.T. Snow/Bot 3).

17-K NIGHT: On **Sept. 25** vs. Giants, D-backs' pitchers combined for 17 strikeouts, the most in a game since 2002 and 11th occurrence in franchise history (accomplished 5 times in 2002, 4 in 2001 and once in 1999).

SUÁREZ JOINS 30+-HR, 100+-RBI CLUB: On Sept. 29, the final day of the regular season, **Eugenio Suárez** played his 155th game at third base, the most by any D-back third baseman in a single season (previous: Matt Williams, 153 G in 1999) and joined only Jake Lamb/2017 (30 HR/104 RBI/143 G) and Williams/1999 (35 HR/142 RBI/153 G) as the only primary third basemen to record a 30+-HR, 100+-RBI season in franchise history.

AMONG THE MAJORS

HISTORICAL RUN DIFFERENTIAL IN GAMES: The D-backs won 3 games by 15+ runs this season, the sixth team in the last 70 seasons to reach the feat (also: 2019 Astros, 2018 Dodgers, 1999 Braves, 1993 Tigers, 1976 Twins)... the only teams with more such wins in a season since 1900 are the 1939 Yankees (4), 1935 Tigers (4) and 1931 Yankees (4).

THE ANSWERBACKS: The D-backs' 10 wins this season when facing a deficit of 3+ runs tied for the most in the Majors (also: Padres, Tigers and Angels).

◆ The D-backs' 6-run comeback win on July 29 vs. Nationals marked their largest of the season...it was their largest comeback since Aug. 29, 2022 @ Phillies (franchise-record 7-run deficit).

◆ It was the third time in franchise history where they came back to win after facing a 4+-run deficit in the ninth inning or later (also: July 3, 2008 vs. Brewers and Sept. 27, 2011 vs. Dodgers) [Stats Inc].

14+-HIT AFFAIRS: The D-backs' 5 occurrences of back-to-back games with consecutive 14-hit games were the most in the Majors, ahead of the Padres (3), while their 20 total occurrences of 14+-hit games finished most in MLB.

10 STRAIGHT 5+-RUN GAME DECISIONS: The D-backs' streak of 10 games decided by 5+ runs (**June 7-18**) was the longest such streak since 1900 [SlangsOnSports] via @EliasSports]:

GO-AHEAD HOMERS: The D-backs' 12 go-ahead homers finished tied for the fifth most in the Majors (also: Rangers), behind the Mets (16), Orioles (14), Dodgers (13) and Padres (13).

VS. SOUTHPAWS: The D-backs' .284 team average vs. lefties was the best in the Majors, ahead of the Phillies (.270), Astros (.269) and Dodgers (.269), while their 1.93 runs per game were the most.

TRIPLE TROUBLEMAKERS: The D-backs led the NL with 37 triples this season (second in MLB), ahead of the Brewers (33) and Giants (30).

2-OUT APPROACH: The D-backs' offense with 2 outs ranked among the Majors in fewest strikeouts (3rd, 423), SLG (3rd, .413), runs (3rd, 321), extra-base hits (3rd, 163), OBP (4th, .329), hits (4th, 431), walks (4th, 201), homers (4th, 67) and doubles (5th, 88).

MULTI-HIT MACHINES: D-backs' 357 multi-hit player games ranked third in the Majors, behind the Astros (381) and Padres (365).

EXTRA! EXTRA! The D-backs' 519 extra-base hits (271 2B, 37 3B, 211 HR) were fourth most in the Majors, behind the Dodgers (550), Red Sox (535) and Orioles (530).

2+ HOMER GAMES: The D-backs' 65 games with multiple home runs were the fourth most in the Majors, behind the Orioles (72), Yankees (69) and Dodgers (69).

ALL ABOUT SACRIFICE: The D-backs' 73 bunt attempts (sacrifice hits + bunt hits + bunt outs) were second most in baseball, behind the Nationals (82).

6+-RUN INNINGS: The D-backs scored 6+ runs in an inning an MLB-leading 16 times while their 233 occurrences of 2+-run frames were also the most.

10+-RUNS & 10+ HITS: The D-backs' 18 occurrences of 10+ runs and 10+ hits were the most in the Majors, ahead of the Dodgers (17) and Brewers (16), and were third most in franchise history, behind 1999 (25) and 2017 (19).

MULTIPLE GAMES WITH 17+ RUNS ON 22+ HITS: The D-backs are 1 of 8 teams in the Majors since 2000 to collect multiple occurrences of 17+ runs and 22+ hits in a game (also: Astros/2019, Athletics/2019, Yankees/2011, Brewers/2010, Marlins/2003, Angels/2002 and Mariners/2000).

70+ RBI SEASONS: The D-backs' 5 players (**Corbin Carroll, Lourdes Gurriel Jr., Ketel Marte, Eugenio Suárez, Christian Walker**) with 70+ RBI tied for most in MLB (also: Dodgers) and tied for the most in franchise history:

20+-HOMER SEASONS: The D-backs' 5 players (**Corbin Carroll, Ketel Marte, Joc Pederson, Eugenio Suárez, Christian Walker**) with 20+ homers were the most in MLB and tied for the most in franchise history (also: 2005 - T. Clark, T. Glaus, L. Gonzalez, S. Green, C. Tracy).

COME ON BACK NOW: The D-backs' 10 wins post-All-Star break when trailing by 1+ runs in the seventh inning or later were tied for the most in the Majors (also: Rangers).

♦ Of the D-backs' 32 comeback wins, 17 were when trailing in the seventh inning or later.

A JULY TO REMEMBER: The D-backs' 41 homers in July were tied for the second most in the NL (also: Rockies), behind the Braves (44), and their most in July in franchise history.

♦ Their 13 July games with 2+ homers finished tied for the most in the Majors (also: Braves).

FIREWORKS BEFORE JULY 4: On **July 3** @ Dodgers, the D-backs became the first team in baseball history to allow multiple homers before even getting an out but then shut out their opponent the rest of the way and win by 8+ runs (12-4 final).

4 STRAIGHT EXTRA-BASE HITS TO START A GAME: On **Aug. 2** @ Pirates, the D-backs' became the first team in MLB history with 15 total bases from the first 4 batters of a game (@OptaSTATS).

♦ It marked the D-backs' second-ever occurrence with 4+ extra-base hits to start a game [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

♦ The D-backs are the only MLB team since July 2021 with 2 occurrences of 4+ consecutive extra-base hits to start the game:

WALKER & GEHRIG CONNECTION: **Christian Walker** in his 5-game span from May 21-July 4 @ Dodger Stadium, was on base 15 times (H+BB+HBP) with 11 hits, 9 extra-base hits and 7 home runs...in baseball history, the only other player to reach all of those numbers over a 5-game span at that point at any road ballpark in a season was Lou Gehrig at League Park in 1930 (Gehrig reached base 15 times with 13 hits, 10 extra-base hits and 7 home runs in 5 games at League Park in Cleveland from June 14-July 21, 1930).

CARROLL'S BARRELS: **Corbin Carroll** was 1 of 11 players in the Majors to hit 2+ homers off a 98.0+ pitch this season (off José Alvarado/PHI-98.6 MPH and July 13 off Nate Pearson/then-TOR-98.0 MPH).

KETEL AND THE BABE: **Ketel Marte's** 22 combined home runs in the first inning and ninth inning (or later) finished tied for the most all-time in a season with **Babe Ruth's** 22 in 1927 [Stats Inc.].

START WITH MARTE: **Ketel Marte's** 13 first-inning homers tied for the most in a season by a D-back with Paul Goldschmidt (13 in 2018), ahead Luis Gonzalez (11 in 2001), Goldschmidt (9 in 2015) and Chris Young (9 in 2007)...his 13 homers finished third in the Majors, behind Aaron Judge/NYY (18) and Kyle Schwarber/PHI (15).

♦ Marte's 33 home runs in the first inning as a D-back are third in franchise history, behind Paul Goldschmidt (52) and Luis Gonzalez (41).

MARTE MAKES MORE HISTORY: **Ketel Marte** became the second player in MLB history to hit 8+ homers in both the first inning and ninth inning in a single season (also: Alex Rodriguez in 2007) [@OptaSTATS].

GENO AND THE BAMBINO: **Eugenio Suárez**, with 4 games with 4+ hits and 4 games with 5+ RBI, joined Babe Ruth as the only players with at least 4 of each in July or later in a season since 1920, when RBI became an official stat.

bWAR LEADERBOARD: **Ketel Marte's** 6.9 bWAR ranked eighth in the Majors, and third in the NL, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (9.2) and Matt Chapman/SF (7.2).

AGE 23 OR YOUNGER WITH 20+ HR/20+ SB SEASONS: **Corbin Carroll** is the 11th player in MLB history to have 2+ seasons of 20+ homers and 20+ stolen bases in their age 23 season or younger [h/t Jack Sommers/Stathead]:

PFAADT HARD: Among NL pitching leaders, **Brandon Pfaadt** finished fifth in K/BB ratio (4.405), tied for fifth in starts (32), sixth in BB/9.0 IP (2.081), tied for seventh in innings pitched (181.2), eighth in strikeouts (185) and eighth in strikeouts per 9.0 IP (9.165).

THE MAN-TIPLY: **Joe Mantiplay** finished tied for third among relievers with a career-high 75 appearances.

WORKHORSES: The D-backs had 4 relievers with 60+ relief outings -- **Kevin Ginkel, Joe Mantiplay, Justin Martinez** and **Ryan Thompson**, matching last year's total (Miguel Castro, Scott McGough, Kyle Nelson and Kevin Ginkel)...the 4 total tied for the third most (also: 6 others).

♦ Mantiplay and Ginkel are 2 of 5 D-back relievers since 2019 to log 2+ seasons with 60+ appearances.

AWARDS & ACCOLADES

D-BACKS INAUGURAL HALL OF FAME INDUCTION: On July 27, franchise legends **Luis Gonzalez** and **Randy Johnson** became the first inductees into the Arizona Diamondbacks Hall of Fame.

- ◆ The Arizona Diamondbacks Hall of Fame was created to honor former players for their significant achievements, talents and contributions to our team, our franchise and our community.
- ◆ 2 of the franchise's most prominent and iconic players, World Series champions and the most decorated players in franchise history were instrumental in building the organization's foundation both on and off the field, guiding the team's successes, garnering their own individual honors and records while setting the tone for giving back to the community and fans...their legacies live on through their continued contributions as valued members of the front office.

PERDOMO WINS THE LUIS GONZALEZ AWARD: **Geraldo Perdomo** was the 2024 recipient of the Luis Gonzalez Award...the award, established in 2015, recognizes the player who best exemplifies the talents, spirit and heart of D-backs legend Luis Gonzalez both on and off the field, including baseball accomplishments, community impact and fan engagement.

- ◆ The award was voted on by coaches, broadcasters and staff members.

WALKER NAMED HEART & HUSTLE AWARD WINNER:

Christian Walker was named the D-backs' 2024 Heart and Hustle Award by the Major League Baseball Players Alumni Association.

- ◆ The award recognizes 1 player on each team who demonstrates a passion for the game of baseball and best embodies the values, spirit and traditions of the game.

SEWALD NAMED ROBERTO CLEMENTE AWARD NOMINEE:

Paul Sewald was announced by MLB as the D-backs' 2024 Roberto Clemente Award nominee...he is 1 of 16 first-time honorees in 2024...the Roberto Clemente Award is the annual recognition of a Major League player who best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field.

NL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.** (week of March 30) and **Corbin Carroll** (week of Aug. 26) were selected as NL Players of the Week this season.

- ◆ Gurriel Jr. was named after hitting .471 (8-for-17)/1.644 OPS with 6 runs, 2 doubles, 3 homers, 10 RBI, 2 walks and 1 stolen base...it marked his second player of the week honor (previous: AL Player of the Week, Sept. 6, 2020 with Toronto).
- ◆ Carroll was named after hitting .391 (9-for-23)/.423 OBP/1.087 SLG with 1 double, 5 homers, 11 RBI, 2 walks and 1 stolen base...it marked the second honor of his career.

CARROLL EARNS AUG. NL PLAYER OF THE MONTH:

Corbin Carroll was selected as the NL Player of the Month for August, his first career honor and became first D-backs player to win since Paul Goldschmidt in June 2018.

- ◆ Hit .280 (28-for-100) with 1 double, 4 triples, 11 homers, 24 RBI, 30 runs scored, 10 walks, 2 stolen bases, a .700 SLG and .342 OBP in 27 games in August.
- ◆ Ranked among the Majors for August in runs scored (1st, 30), triples (T-1st, 4), SLG (2nd, .700), homers (T-3rd, 11), total bases (T-3rd, 70), RBI (T-5th, 24) and OPS (7th, 1.042).

THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE: **Joc Pederson** (Aug. 18), **Randal Grichuk** (Aug. 13) and **Eugenio Suárez** (July 16) reached 10 years of service time this season.

SERIES & SHUTOUTS

SWWWEEPS: The D-backs collected 7 sweeps this season (vs. Rockies, @ Nationals, @ Tigers, vs. Rangers, vs. Cubs, vs. Giants).

TWIN BILL SWEEP: The D-backs collected a doubleheader sweep @ Guardians on Aug. 7 with a 7-3 game 1 win and 5-3 game 2 victory...it marked Arizona's sixth twin-bill sweep in its last 9 doubleheaders.

- ◆ **Josh Bell's** 2 homers (both in game 2) tied the D-backs doubleheader record (also: Matt Williams on April 16, 1998 @ Cardinals, Luis Gonzalez on Sept. 23, 2000 @ Giants and Christian Walker on May 17, 2022 @ Dodgers).

- ◆ It was the D-backs and Guardians second-ever doubleheader after having played and split their first on Aug. 13, 2014 @ Progressive Field [Cleveland walked off in game 1 by a score of 3-2 while Arizona took game 2 by a score of 1-0 in 12 innings, thanks to Tuffy Gosewisch's 1-out, RBI single in the top of the 12th].

SWWEEP CAROLINE: The D-backs marked their second-ever sweep @ Fenway Park from Aug. 23-25...their first sweep occurred in the D-backs inaugural matchup with the Red Sox from June 7-9, 2002 (3-0).

SHUT 'EM OUT: The D-backs collected 10 shutouts this season.

- ◆ April 2nd's shutout vs. Yankees marked the second time in franchise history (last: 4-0 in Game 2 of the 2001 World Series on Oct. 28, 2001)...it was Arizona's earliest shutout in a season since 2018 (3-0 vs. LAD in Game 6 of the 2018 season).
- ◆ April 14th's shutout victory marked their first shutout at home vs. Cardinals since April 28, 2016 (W; 3-0).

ROOKIE NOTES

SNAKES DEBUTS: 6 D-backs players made their MLB debut in 2024: INF **Blaze Alexander**, OF **Jorge Barrosa**, C **Adrian Del Castillo**, RHP **Yilber Diaz**, RHP **Cristian Mena** and LHP **Blake Walston**.

YOUNG 'BACKS: Arizona's 10 players aged 24 or younger (Jorge Barrosa, Corbin Carroll, Adrian Del Castillo, Yilber Diaz, Justin Martinez, Cristian Mena, Gabriel Moreno, Geraldo Perdomo, Alek Thomas, Blake Walston) tied for the eighth most in the Majors (also: Athletics and Cubs).

MANAGER'S MARGIN

NO. 8 FOR NO. 17: **Torey Lovullo** completed his franchise-record eighth season as skipper.

- ◆ Lovullo's 584 wins are the most in club history.

LOVULLO REACHES 500: **Torey Lovullo** earned his 500th career managerial win on April 9 @ Rockies to become the 12th active manager to reach the 500-win club.

LOVULLO GAMES MANAGED: **Torey Lovullo's** 1,194 games managed rank 10th among active managers, behind Bruce Bochy/TEX (4,356), Bob Melvin/SF (3,104), Bud Black/COL (2,556), A.J. REPLAY REVIEWS: **Torey Lovullo's** 53.755 replay challenge success pct. is fourth among active managers (min. 1,000 games managed)...Lovullo finished with a 62.86 overturn pct. (22-for-35) on challenges this season.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

ABOVE AVERAGE DEFENDERS: The D-backs' 32 Outs Above Average (OAA) and 26 Runs Prevented (RP) were third most in the Majors, behind the Royals (36 OAA/28 RP) and Brewers (32 OAA/27 RP).

ON THE BASES

STREAK OF STOLEN BASES: The D-backs recorded 1+ stolen bases in a season-high 5 straight games (May 28-June 1).

STOLEN BASE MISCELLANEOUS: Arizona's 17 different players to steal a base tied for the eighth in the Majors (also: Guardians, Marlins, Giants, Brewers)...tied for second most in franchise history and they have tallied 17 players with a stolen base over 3 consecutive seasons (2022-24).

TAKING BASES: The D-backs' 204 bases taken [bases advanced on fly balls, passed balls, wild pitches, balks, defensive indifference] led the Majors, ahead of the Dodgers (179), Cardinals (168) and Twins (157).

- ◆ The D-backs' 46 pct. extra bases taken percentage was tied for fifth in the Majors, behind the Dodgers (49%), Tigers (49%), Royals (48%) and Reds (47%) [Pct. a runner advanced more than 1 base on single or 2+ bases on a double].
- ◆ **Corbin Carroll's** 9 extra runs added on the base paths were the most in the Majors, ahead of Jarren Duran/BOS (6) and Bobby Witt Jr./KC (5).

LOVULLO AND COACHES LED NL ALL-STAR TEAM: D-backs Manager **Torey Lovullo** and his coaching staff, including **Jeff Banister** (Bench Coach), **Dave McKay** (1B Base Coach), **Tony Perezchica** (3B Coach), **Brent Strom** (Pitching Coach), **Mike Fetters** (Bullpen Coach), **Dan Carlson** (Asst. Pitching Coach), **Joe Mather** (Hitting Coach), **Dami-on Easley** (Asst. Hitting Coach), **Rick Short** (Asst. Hitting Coach), **Drew Hedman** (Asst. MARTE'S SECOND ALL-STAR START: **Ketel Marte** became a 2-time All-Star after being named the fan-elected National League starting second baseman, besting Luis Arraez/Padres 55% to 45%, for his second career All-Star appearance and start (also: 2019)...went 1-for-3 with 1 run as the NL's leadoff hitter.

- ◆ Joined Paul Goldschmidt as the only D-backs with multiple fan elections...became the D-backs' eighth fan-elected start for a position player.
- ◆ Marked the second straight season the D-backs have had at least 1 starter...last year, D-backs outfielder Corbin Carroll was a fan-elected starter and Zac Gallen was named the NL's starting pitcher.
