MARTE MAKING HIS CASE CLEAR: Ketel Marte leads all second basemen with a 3.9 bWAR, an 835 OPS, 33 extra-base hits, 12 defensive runs saved and 1.5 dWAR, is tied for first with 147 total bases, second with 15 homers and 43 RBI, tied for second with 16 doubles and third with 82 hits.

- Marte's 3.9 bWAR is third in the NL (8th in MLB), behind

Shohei Ohtani/LAD (4.3) and Mookie Betts/LAD (3.9).
VS. TWINS: The D-backs welcome the Twins back to Chase Field for the first time since June 17-19, 2022.

- In their last series @ Chase Field, the D-backs took 2-of3 from the Twins.
- The D-backs are 7-5 lifetime @ home vs. Twins
