The Brewers (72-44) are 28 games over .500 for the first time since they finished the 2021 season at 95-67..... the team has not been 29 games over .500 since 10/2/21 (95-66).

The Brewers enter the day on an 8-game winning streak, which marks their third streak of at least 8 games this season.

The Place To Be
The Brewers have played in front of sellout crowds in seven of their last eight home games and six in a row.....the team last had six straight sellouts in 2011 from August 17-30..... the Brewers are expecting sellouts in all three games this weekend against the Mets at American Family Field, which would mark seven straight capacity crowds for the first time since 2008 when the team had 44 on the season, including 22 in a row from July 10-September 1.

Make No Mistake...

The Brewers have gone 10 consecutive games without an error, which is the sixth streak of 10+ errorless games in franchise history.

TDDAY'S GAME: Is game 3 (2-0) of a 6-game homestand against New York-NL (2-0) and Pittsburgh (3g)....following this homestand and an off day on Thursday, the team takes an 8-game trip to Cincinnati (3g) and Chicago-NL (5g).

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without Bob Uecker on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

AT HOME: The team is a National League-best 38-20 at home (2nd in MLB), going 14-5-0 in series play, including this series.....are 26-11 in the last 37 home dame 15-4 in the last 19....had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from 7/7-7/13.

ON THE ROAD: The team is a Major League-best 34-24 on the road, going 10-7-2 in series play.....are 24-6 in the last 30 road games and 12-1 in the last 13 contests with a current season-high 7-game winning streak.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager. 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

assistant pitching 8 strategy coach <u>Jim Henderson</u> (4th season/2nd in current role), assistant pitching & strategy coach Jim Henderson (4th Season)/2nd in current role), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (2nd season), lead hitting coach Al LeBoeuf (1st season), hitting coach Eric Theisen (1st season), assistant coach Daniel de Mondesert (2nd season), infield coach Matt Erickson (2nd season), first base coach Julio Borbón (1st season), third base coach Jason Lane (10th season/5th in current role).

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made 20 replay challenges this season, going 13-7.....their last challenge (won) came on 8/4 at Atlanta as an out call at first base involving Andrew Vaughn was overturned.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times in the last seven seasons (2018-24) and won the NL Central in four of the last seven, three of four, and two in a row....Milwaukee is one of five teams to make the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons, joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees [6].....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight straight seasons (2017-24), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons [2017-24].....this does not include 2020.....the Brewers have 738 wins since 2017 [4th in MLB/2nd in National League].

PRIESTER AT A GLANCE: Quinn Priester, 24, will make his 22nd appearance and 17th start of the season.....Priester last pitched last Monday in a start at Atlanta and earned a 3-1 win (7ip, 2h, 1r, 1er, 2bb, 4k, 1hr, 1hbp, 90 pitches).....the team is 10-6 in his starts.....he has 7 quality starts.....opponents are batting .228 (98-for-429, 13hr).....he has gone 8-2 with a 2.57 ERA as a starter (87.2ip, 25er) and 3-0 with a 5.06 ERA in relief (26.2ip, 15er).....he is on a 10-game winning streak over his last 12 games/9 starts while posting a 2.45 ERA (69.2ip, 57h, 20r, 19er, 15bb, 61k, 8hr).....Priester was acquired from Boston on April 7 for 0F Yophery Rodriguez, a Competitive Balance Round A selection and a player to be named (RHP John Holobetz on May 5).....he began the season at Triple-A Worcester (1 start).

LAST SEASON: Priester went 3-6 with a 4.71 ERA in 11 games/7 starts with Pittsburgh (10g/6gs) and Boston (1gs).....his teams went 1-6 in his starts.....he had 2 quality starts..... opponents batted .277 (56-for-202, 7hr).....he went 1-5 with a 4.42 ERA as a starter (36.2ip, 18er) and 2-1 with a 5.54 ERA as a reliever (13ip, 8er).....Priester was traded by Pittsburgh to Boston on 7/29/24 in exchange for INF/OF Nick Yorke.

CAREER: Is 17-11 with a 4.58 ERA in 42 games/31 starts (214ip, 109er) while pitching for Pittsburgh (2023-24), Boston (2024) and Milwaukee (2025).....has gone 11-10 with a 4.27 ERA as a starter (164.1ip, 78er) and 6-1 with a 5.62 ERA as a reliever (49.2ip, 31er).....Priester was selected by Pittsburgh in the first round (18th overall) of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft out of Cary-Grove (IL) High School.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 7-2 with a 3.53 ERA in 12 games/8 starts (66.1ip, 26er).....is 6-1 with a 3.04 ERA in 9 games/6 starts this season (50.1ip, 17er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 8-6 with a 4.32 ERA in 24 games/18 starts (125ig. 60er)....is 5-1 with a 3.23 ERA in 12 games/10 starts this season (64ig. 23er).
