RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a six-game, seven-day homestand against the Cubs (1-0, two to play) and Yankees (three to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...have won three straight games on the heels of a three-game losing streak (March 31-April 3)...are 500 for the second time (also: 2-2)...are second in the AL East, 2.5 GB the first-place Yankees (7-2)...marks their first time alone in second place since June 30, 2025...have spent two days in second, three in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- ★ Playing their first game at Tropicana Field in 561 days, the Rays hit a season-high 3 HR and saw eight of nine starters reach base safely in a 6-4 win over the Cubs yesterday...they improved to 16-13 in home openers and have won five of their last six since 2021.
- ★ Over their last seven games, half (14) of the Rays 28 runs have come via their 10 HR, including eight of 10 runs over their last two contests...their 11 HR are tied for third in the AL.
- ★ Rays batters rank among AL leaders in several categories (see table to the right)...they have been out-hit only once in 10 games (April 1 at MIL - 8-5).
- ★ The Rays have struck out five times or fewer in three straight games, their longest streak since June 24-28, 2024 (4G), to lower their strikeout rate to a majors'-best 18.5 pct. ...over the same span, they have 8 SB compared to 2 SB in their first seven games.
- ★ The Rays have led in each of their first 10 games, including multi-run leads in eight of them (six straight)...it marks their second-longest streak to begin a season, trailing only their modern era-record-tying 13-game winning streak to open 2023 (Stats Perform).
- ★ **Mason Englert** will make his third career start tonight in place of **Drew Rasmussen**, joining Aug. 28, 2024 vs. LAA and June 12, 2023 vs. ATL...Rasmussen was scratched to be with his wife, Stevie, for the birth of their second child.

WHAT'S AT STAKE—With a win tonight, the Rays would:

- ★ Move above .500 for the first time since Sept. 5, 2025 (72-71).
- ★ Record their first four-game winning streak since Aug. 29-Sept. 4, 2024 (7G).
- ★ Earn their first series win at Tropicana Field since Sept. 20-22, 2024 vs. TOR.
- ★ Record back-to-back series wins for the first time since Aug. 29-Sept. 3 (at WSH, vs. SEA).
- ★ Improve to 3-0-1 against the Cubs in series play at Tropicana Field.
- ★ Win their first two home games for the seventh time, first since 2023 (first 14).

PITCH PERFECT—The Rays staff has held opponents to a .109 (10-for-92) clip with 28 SO over the last three games...they have yielded four hits or fewer in each of those contests, tying the longest streak in franchise history (7x, last: July 25-27, 2024)...tonight, they could become the first team with a four-game streak since the Athletics from Aug. 6-9, 2025...opponents are batting .172 (38-for-221) against Rays pitchers over the last seven games compared to .292 (31-for-106) in the first three.

- ★ The Rays starting rotation leads the majors in WHIP (0.87), opp. average (.161), opp. on-base pct. (.221), and opp. OPS (.482) ...it marks their best opp. average, on-base pct., and OPS through 10 starts in franchise history, and the 0.87 WHIP ranks second to 2019 (0.78).
- ★ The rotation has allowed 2 ER or fewer in seven straight starts, their longest streak since an eight-start run from May 20-28, 2025.
- ★ See the table to the right for a comparison of the Rays bullpen through the team's first seven games vs. the last three.

SLAM-INERO—After eight straight games without an RBI to open the campaign, **Junior Caminero** has homered in back-to-back games for the 11th time in his career, first since Sept. 13-14, 2025...he has gone deep in three consecutive games three times in his career, all in 2025: April 12-14, Aug. 6-9, and Aug. 22-25...Caminero paces the majors in average bat speed (79.5 mph).

- ★ Only 39.1 pct. of the pitches he has seen have been located in the strike zone, third lowest in the majors (min. 150 pitches faced) to DET **Kerry Carpenter** (37.1%) and ATL **Ronald Acuña Jr.** (38.7%)...despite this, his 28.6 pct. chase rate is still the lowest mark of his career.

BECAUSE HE GETS ON BASE—**Yandy Díaz** has reached base safely 23 times (17H, 4BB, 2HBP), tying **Akinori Iwamura** (2007) for the most in Rays history through the club's first 10 games...Iwamura and **Carlos Peña** (2012) share the record through 11 games (24 TOB)...Díaz's AL-leading 17 hits are tied with **Rocco Baldelli** (2003), **Carl Crawford** (2003), and **Wander Franco** (2023) for second most through the Rays first 10 games, trailing only **Quinton McCracken** (19) in 1998...McCracken had a club-record 22 hits through 11 games that season.

- ★ Díaz's 10 RBI are the most among major league leadoff hitters, ahead of WSH **James Wood** (9).
- ★ He is 26 hits shy of reaching 1,000 for his career...he would become the 20th Cuban-born player in major league history to reach mark...with 899 hits as a Ray, he needs 11 more to tie **B.J. Upton** (910) for fourth on the club's all-time list.

WELCOME TO SPRINGFIELD—**Chandler Simpson** is the 16th player to reach base safely in each of the Rays first 10 games of a season, first since **Randy Arozarena** (10G) in 2023...the last longer streak belongs to **Tommy Pham** (15G) in 2019, and the franchise record of 20 games is shared by **Evan Longoria** (2013) and **Jorge Cantú** (2005)...Simpson has an 11-game on-base streak overall dating back to Sept. 27, 2025, second longest of his career (18G from June 25-July 19, 2025)...he paces the majors with seven infield hits, and his six multi-hit efforts are tied for the most in the AL with TEX **Brandon Nimmo** and NYY **Giancarlo Stanton**...the six multi-hit performances are tied for second in club history through the Rays first 10 games, trailing only **Quinton McCracken** (7G) in 1998.

- ★ His 10 hits off fastballs are tied with three others for second in the AL behind HOU **Cam Smith** (11).
- ★ Simpson's 4.9 pct. strikeout rate is the best in MLB, and he has not struck out in his last 26 PA, the third-longest active streak in the majors to AZ **Geraldo Perdomo** (33) and ATH **Jacob Wilson** (28).
- ★ According to Baseball Savant, Simpson leads all major league left fielders with two outs above average...he recorded -5 OAA last season.

HOLDING DOWN THE FORT(ES)—**Nick Fortes** has reached base safely in nine straight games, the second-longest season-opening streak by a Rays catcher behind **Toby Hall** (14G) in 2002...he has a career-high 11-game on-base streak overall dating back to Sept. 25, 2025...Fortes has also hit safely in a career-best 12 consecutive starts dating back to Sept. 17, 2025 vs. TOR, batting .333 (15-for-45) with 4 2B, 1 HR, and 7 RBI in those games...it marks the longest streak by a Rays backstop since **Wilson Ramos** club-record (for a catcher) 18-game streak from April 14-May 12 (G2), 2018.

- ★ He leads MLB catchers with a .345 (10-for-29) average and ranks third in slugging pct. (.722) and OPS (.939), trailing ATH **Shea Langeliers** (.722/1.081) and ATL **Drake Baldwin** (.682/1.070) in both categories...between Fortes and **Hunter Feduccia** (3-for-9), Rays backstops lead the majors in batting average (.382/13-for-34 - does not include PH appearances)...the 13 hits are the most by Rays catchers through the club's first 10 games since 2002 (13).

NORTH SIDERS HEAD SOUTH—The Rays and Cubs meet for their 10th all-time series (4-3-2 in prev. nine) this week, including their fourth at Tropicana Field (2-0-1)...despite dropping two of three games at Wrigley Field last year from Sept. 12-14, the Rays are seeking their third series win in their last four sets with the Cubs...since 2023, seven of the 10 games between the clubs have been one-run affairs...the winning run has been scored in the 7th inning or later in six of the last eight meetings.

- ★ The Rays have recorded three straight multi-homer games against the Cubs (Sept. 13, 2025-pres.), their longest streak against Chicago in team history...they entered the streak with three multi-homer games in 23 all-time meetings with the Cubs.
- ★ The Rays are 84-63 (.571) in Interleague play since balanced schedules were introduced in 2023, the second-best winning pct. vs. the NL among AL clubs behind the Astros (81-60/.574).
- ★ This marks the Rays third time in four series facing an NL Central opponent after opening with sets in St. Louis and Milwaukee...they are 10-12 vs. the division since the start of last year.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✦ Hit his third home run of the season yesterday vs. CHC...each of his last three hits have been extra-base hits (2B, 2HR). ✦ Dating back to last season, he has a hit in 13 of his last 17 games (July 28–pres.)...over that span he is hitting .279 (19-for-68) with 3 2B, 6 HR, 17 RBI, 8 BB, 11 R, and a .934 OPS. ✦ Had a career-long 20-game on-base streak (July 19, 2025–April 1)...over that streak, he went 22-for-73 (.301) with 3 2B, 5 HR, 15 RBI, 13 BB, 12 R, and a .946 OPS...it was the longest on-base streak by a Ray since Brandon Lowe's 22-game streak (June 9–July 5, 2025). ✦ On March 26 at STL, became the sixth Mexican-born player (9x) to homer on Opening Day...joined Vinny Castilla (2002, 1997-98), Karim Garcia (2003, 1998), Ramón Urías (2023), Erubiel Durazo (2003), and Bobby Avila (1953). ✦ Had a seven-game RBI streak (July 29, 2025–March 26, 2026), tied for the second-longest streak by a Mexican-born player in MLB history with Vinny Castilla (7G, April 12-19[G2], 1998)...trailed only Castilla's 10-game streak from April 14-25, 2004. ✦ Represented Mexico at the World Baseball Classic for the second time in his career (2023)...went 5-for-14 (.357) with a 2B, HR, 4 RBI, 3 R, 2 BB and a .438 on-base pct. in four games...tallied a hit in every game at the tournament, including an 8th-inning, go-ahead, three-run homer in Mexico's opening game vs. GB. ✦ Despite missing 49 games with a left wrist fracture in 2025, earned his first career All-Star selection, setting career highs in every major category...at the time of his injury on July 31, he ranked third in the AL in average (.316) and on-base pct. (.394) and was sixth in OPS (.872)...min. 350 AB, his .316 batting average on the season was fourth best in Rays history behind Yandy Díaz (.330) in 2023, Jeff Keppinger (.325) in 2012, and Jason Bartlett (.320) in 2009. ✦ His 3.4 bWAR last season marked the highest total by a Mexican-born first baseman in MLB history, surpassing AZ Erubiel Durazo in 1999 (1.4), and was the 11th-highest single-season total by any Mexican-born position player.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✦ Launched his second home run of the season yesterday vs. CHC, his second in as many days...marked the 11th time in his career he has homered in consecutive games (last: Sept. 13-14, 2025). ✦ Has hit safely in 13 of his last 15 games dating back to Sept. 24, 2025 at BAL after going 1-for-4 yesterday...has batted .310 (18-for-58) with 1 2B, 3 HR, 5 RBI, 10 BB, 7 R and a .895 OPS...has recorded five multi-hit games in that span, with two in 2026. ✦ In four career games against Chicago-NL, he has batted .294 (5-for-17) with 1 2B, 3 HR, 3 RBI, and 3 R. ✦ Made his second career Opening Day roster (2025)...on March 26 at STL, made his second career Opening Day start and went 1-for-2 with 4 BB and R...tied the franchise record reaching base safely five times in an Opening Day game (also: Evan Longoria - April 6, 2012)...his four walks tied an Opening Day major league record (16x, last: DET Spencer Torkelson on March 27, 2025 at LAD). ✦ Played for the Dominican Republic during the World Baseball Classic...finished the tournament 7-for-20 (.350) with 1 2B, 3 HR, 7 RBI, 5 R, 1 BB, and a 1.259 OPS...his three home runs were tied for the most in the tournament with Jarren Duran, Shohei Ohtani, and Vinny Pasquantino...was also T5th in RBI, 7th in OPS (min. 10AB), and T10th in runs scored. ✦ Homered in his first career WBC game against Nicaragua...at 22 years, 244 days old, became the youngest player to homer for the Dominican Republic at the WBC and was the second-youngest player in tournament history to hit a go-ahead home run in the 6th inning or later, older than only Yuli Gurriel (21.269) on March 8, 2006 at Panama. ✦ Went 2-for-2 with 2B, RBI, and 2 R on March 13 vs. South Korea, his third multi-hit game of the tournament...is one of eight players to record at least three multi-hit games for the DR at a single WBC...became the fourth-youngest player (22.251) in WBC history to have three multi-hit games or more in the same tournament and the youngest since Hyun Soo Kim (21.69) in 2009. ✦ During his first full major league campaign in 2025, ranked third in the AL with 45 HR, second most in Rays history behind Carlos Peña (46HR) in 2007...per Stats Perform, he became the sixth player to rank among the AL's top-three home run leaders in an age-21-or-younger season (age as of June 30), joining BOS Tony Conigliaro in 1965, BOS Ted Williams in 1939, CLE Hal Trosky in 1934, BOS Tris Speaker in 1909, and DET Ty Cobb in 1907...marked the second-most long balls in an age-21-or-younger season in MLB history, trailing the Milwaukee Braves Eddie Mathews (47HR) in 1953. ✦ His 110 RBI were the most by a Ray since Evan Longoria (113) in 2009 and were fourth most in franchise history, also trailing Peña's 2007 season (121) and Jorge Cantú (117) in 2005. ✦ Recorded 6 HR or more in each month of the season (March/April, May, June, July, Aug., Sept.) becoming the first Ray to accomplish the feat and the youngest player in major league history to turn the trick.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✦ Snapped a six-game hitting streak (Aug. 4, 2025–March 30) after pinch hitting March 31 at MIL, the second longest streak of his career behind an eight-game streak from March 30–July 29, 2025...he hit .348 (8-for-23) with 2 2B, 1 3B, 1 HR, 4 RBI, 4 R, and 1 SB over that span. ✦ Delivered a game-tying, solo home run in the 7th inning on March 30 at MIL, his first long ball of the season and his first since Sept. 8, 2024 at BAL...marked his second career game-tying blast (also: Aug. 25, 2024 at LAD)...has now plated runs in three of his first five games this season. ✦ Made his second career Opening Day roster (2025) and made his second career Opening Day start, going 2-for-4 with 2 RBI...alongside Jonathan Aranda, became one of 14 players (15x) in franchise history with a multi-hit, multi-RBI Opening Day game...marked his first multi-hit, multi-RBI game since Sept. 9, 2024 at BAL (2H, 2RBI). ✦ Recorded an eight-game hitting streak across two stints with the Rays in 2025 (March 30–July 29, 2025), going 12-for-26 with a .462/.462/.615/1.077 slash line and 2 3B, 3 RBI, 4 SB, and 4 R during that span. ✦ Was limited to 20 games in 2025 due to a stint on the 10-day IL (April 8–May 26) before being transferred to the 60-day IL on May 27...was reinstated July 25, but returned to the 10-day IL again on Aug. 8 and transferred to the 60-day IL Sept. 13, ending his season.
