YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Orioles fell to the Blue Jays, 3-2 in 10 innings, in the opener of the three-game set...**Adley Rutschman** recorded his first career multi-homer game, going yard in the fourth and sixth innings to bring his total to eight long balls this season; became the second Oriole with a multi-homer game this year, joining **Colton Cowser** on April 11 at Boston, and the first O's backstop with a multi-homer game since **James McCann** on September 9, 2023 at Boston...**Corbin Burnes** turned in his team-leading sixth quality start but did not factor in the decision, allowing one run on six hits and two walks with two strikeouts in 6.0 innings...**Craig Kimbrel** tossed a perfect seventh inning with two strikeouts; in his last three appearances, he's worked 3.0 no-hit innings, allowing just one baserunner (a hit batter) with four strikeouts.

BOUNCE BACK: Baltimore has lost back-to-back games for the third time this season; after dropping two straight from April 6-7, they won three in a row, and after dropping two straight from April 12-13, they won four in a row...The O's, Cubs, and Phillies are the only teams in MLB this year without a losing streak of at least three games.

THE TIMES THEY ARE A-CHANGIN': The game between the Orioles and Red Sox on Saturday, August 17, has been changed to 7:05 p.m. ET (from 4:05 p.m. ET).

WHAT'S TRENDING: At 26-14 (.650), the Orioles have the best record in the AL and fourth-best in MLB...Since the start of 2022, Baltimore is 210-154 (.577), the second-best record in the AL and fourth-best in MLB behind the Astros (.581, 212-153), Braves (.635, 230-132), and Dodgers (.651, 239-128).

HOMER HAPPY: The Orioles lead MLB with 62 home runs, tied for the second-most homers through the first 40 games of a season in O's history with 2012 and trailing 1987 (64)...The most through Baltimore's first 41 games of a season is 66 in 1987.

⚾ The Orioles have an MLB-best seven players with at least six homers: **Gunnar Henderson** (12), **Adley Rutschman** (8), **Anthony Santander** (7), and **Colton Cowser**, **Ryan Mountcastle**, **Cedric Mullins**, and **Jordan Westburg** (6); the Dodgers and Yankees rank second with four players with at least six long balls.

⚾ Henderson's 12 home runs are tied for second in MLB with Atlanta's Marcell Ozuna, trailing Houston's Kyle Tucker (13).

BIG TIME RUTSCH: **Adley Rutschman** enters today ranked tied for fourth in the AL in hits (51) and sixth in batting average (.309)...He ranks fourth in the AL and sixth in MLB in multi-hit games (16).

⚾ Rutschman has hit safely in 20 of his last 22 games since April 19 and 25 of his last 28 since April 11; for the season, he has reached safely in 33 of his 39 games and has a hit in 32 of those.

⚾ Since April 19, he's slashing .333/.347/.594 (32-for-96) with four doubles, seven homers, 11 runs, 18 RBI, two walks, and a stolen base; the 32 hits are the most in the AL and third-most in MLB over that period.

⚾ He had a career-long 11-game hitting streak from April 19-30, the longest by an O's batter this season.

FEELS GOOD TO BE HOME: The Orioles continue their season-long nine-game homestand tonight with the second of three games against the Blue Jays...Baltimore took two out of three against Arizona over the weekend...The O's have a scheduled off day on Thursday, May 16, before hosting the Mariners (3 G) from May 17-19.

⚾ The O's are off to a 14-9 (.609) start at home, tied for the fourth-best home winning percentage in the AL and eighth-best in MLB.

BATTLE OF THE BIRDS: The O's and Jays continue a three-game set in Charm City tonight...The Orioles will host the Jays for another three games from July 29-31, and will travel to Toronto for a four-game set from June 3-6 and three games from August 6-8...The Orioles won the season series over the Blue Jays last year, 10-3...The O's swept a three-game series at Rogers Centre from May 19-21, took two of three at Oriole Park from June 13-15, three of four at Rogers Centre from July 31 to August 3, and two of three at Oriole Park from August 22-24...Since the start of 2022, the O's hold a 19-14 (.576) edge over the Blue Jays.

AL BEAST: Entering the current series against the Blue Jays, Baltimore had gone 16 straight sets against AL East opponents without a series loss, while going 12-0-4 in series during that time...That is the longest such streak in team history since divisions were introduced in 1969, per the *Elias Sports Bureau*...The Orioles are 36-18 against division opponents since the streak began on April 24, 2023...The O's went 32-20 (.615) against the AL East last year, the second-best winning percentage against the division by the team since 1981 behind the .618 (47-29) mark in 2014...The Birds won the season series against the Blue Jays (10-3), Rays (8-5), Red Sox (7-6), and Yankees (7-6), the first time since 2014 that the Orioles won the season series against each of their division opponents.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: **Gunnar Henderson** and **Colton Cowser** were voted American League Player and Rookie of the Month, respectively, for March/April...It marks the first time in team history that the O's have claimed both awards in the same month...The last MLB team to do so was the Dodgers in August 2023: Mookie Betts (Player) and James Outman (Rookie)...The last occurrence among AL teammates was the Guardians in April 2022: José Ramirez (Player) and Steven Kwan (Rookie).

SWEETNESS IN BALTIMORE: The Orioles have gone 104 consecutive regular-season series of at least two decisions (no ties) without being swept...According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, that is the fourth-longest regular-season streak in MLB history, trailing the 1942-44 St. Louis Cardinals (124), 1906-09 Chicago Cubs (115), and 1903-05 New York Giants (105)...Baltimore's current streak is the longest in O's history, ahead of 46 such series from 1971-72...The Birds have not been swept in a regular-season series of at least two games since May 13-15, 2022 at Detroit (0-3), and not at home in a series of at least two games since August 27-29, 2021 vs. Tampa Bay (0-3)...The Orioles were swept by the Rangers in three games in the 2023 ALDS.

POWER RANKINGS: MLB.com yesterday released their updated [Power Rankings](#)...The O's have claimed the top spot for the first time since the rankings began over a decade ago...The rankings are voted on by MLB.com contributors.

THE SKIPPER: Manager **Brandon Hyde** is in his sixth season in Baltimore...In 2023, he led the O's to an AL-best 101-61 record, their second straight winning campaign and the first time since 1997 that the Orioles claimed the top seed in the AL...He made his Postseason managerial debut in the ALDS, and was named the BBWAA AL Manager of the Year, becoming the fourth Orioles manager to win the award...He was also voted the *Sporting News* American League Manager of the Year by fellow AL managers for the second consecutive year...Hyde's 341 wins rank fifth all-time among Orioles managers, trailing **Hank Bauer** (407), **Paul Richards** (517), **Buck Showalter** (669), and Orioles Legend and National Baseball Hall of Famer **Earl Weaver** (1,480).

QUICK HITS: Scheduled to make his third start of the year tonight against Toronto... Began the season on the 15-day Injured List (right UCL sprain)...Made three rehab starts, one with Double-A Bowie and two with Triple-A Norfolk, pitching to a 3.97 ERA (5 ER/11.1 IP) with 14 strikeouts and four walks...Went 12-7 with a 2.83 ERA (53 ER/168.2 IP), 168 strikeouts, and a 1.04 WHIP in 30 starts (18 quality starts) for the O's in 2023 and finished fourth in AL Cy Young voting; became the first qualified O's pitcher with a sub-3.00 ERA since Mike Mussina posted a 2.54 ERA (68 ER/241.0 IP) in 1992...Spent time on the Injured List with a right foot contusion from April 5-19 after being struck by a comebacker in the second inning of his season debut on April 3 at Texas...Acquired by the Orioles along with RHP Kyle Brnovich, RHP Zach Peek, and RHP Isaac Mattson from Los Angeles-AL in exchange for RHP Dylan Bundy on December 4, 2019...Originally drafted by the Angels in the fourth round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of New Mexico State.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor into the decision in his last start on May 8 at Washington...Allowed one run on four hits, two walks, one hit batter, and one wild pitch with nine strikeouts in 5.0 innings...Struck out the side in his final inning of work...Threw 90 pitches, 56 strikes.

AGAINST THE BLUE JAYS: Owns a lifetime 1-3 record and a 5.25 ERA (21 ER/36.0 IP) across seven starts against the Blue Jays...Took the win in his last start against the division opponent on August 1, 2023 at Rogers Centre after allowing three runs on four hits (2 HR) and one walk with seven strikeouts in 7.0 innings.

AGAINST THE AL EAST: Has gone 4-11 with a 5.70 ERA (77 ER/121.2 IP) across 25 career starts against the AL East, his highest ERA against any division...Has gone 4-3 with a 2.66 ERA (15 ER/50.2 IP) in his last nine starts against the division.

HOME SWEET HOME: Bradish owned a 5-4 record and a 2.23 ERA (19 ER/76.2 IP) in 13 starts at Oriole Park last year...Surrendered two earned runs or fewer in eight of his final nine home starts of the 2023 campaign; shut out opponents in four of his final nine home starts...His 2.23 ERA was the best single-season mark in Oriole Park history among hurlers with at least 60.0 innings pitched at home.

NIGHT OWL: Slated to make his second night start of the season...Went 9-6 with a 3.44 ERA (41 ER/107.1 IP) across his 19 night starts in 2023...Opponents slashed .229/.283/.364 (92-for-401) off him at night, compared to the .187/.260/.266 (40-for-214) slash line that hitters produced in 12 day starts.

HE'S A BRAD MAN: Bradish led the O's in nearly every pitching category last season, including ERA (2.83), strikeouts (168), opponent batting average (.215), on-base percentage (.275), OPS (.605), WHIP (1.04), and quality starts (18).

COUNT 'EM UP: Bradish finished the 2023 campaign with a career-high 168 strikeouts, the most by an O's hurler since Dylan Bundy fanned 184 batters in 2018.

HIGH QUALITY: Bradish logged five straight quality starts from August 6 to September 8, the longest such streak of his career...The last longer streak by an Oriole was Alex Cobb's six-gamer from July 26 to August 24, 2018...Bradish's 18 quality starts this year led the O's and were a career high; the last O's hurler with more than 18 such outings was Dylan Bundy, who logged 19 quality starts in 2017.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS: Appeared on his first career Opening Day roster...Finished fourth in the AL Cy Young voting, earning six, third-place, eight, fourth-place, and five, fifth-place votes; marked the highest finish by an Orioles hurler since Zack Britton finished fourth in 2016...Ended the campaign ranked among qualified MLB leaders in ERA and WHIP (4th), as well as opponent batting average (7th, .215), and among qualified AL leaders in opponent average (2nd), ERA (3rd), WHIP (4th), and winning percentage (T-8th, .632)...Had a 16.0-inning scoreless streak to end the regular season.

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Made his Postseason debut as the starter in Game 1 of the ALDS vs. TEX; dealt the loss after allowing two runs on seven hits with one walk and nine strikeouts in 4.2 innings; became the third player in O's history (since 1954) to strike out at least nine batters in his Postseason debut, joining Mike Boddicker (14, September 6, 1983 vs. CWS - ALCS G2) and Moe Drabowsky (11, September 5, 1966 at LAD - WS G1).

Scheduled to make his eighth start of the season and sixth career appearance (fourth start) against Toronto tomorrow afternoon...Earned the win his last time out on May 10 vs. Arizona after allowing two runs on five hits and one walk with six strikeouts in 5.2 innings; one of his two runs scored after he exited the game...Became the first Oriole to win four consecutive starts this year...Extended his career-high scoreless streak to 22.2 innings before surrendering a home run in the third inning...Owns a lifetime 2-1 record and a 3.92 ERA (9 ER/20.2 IP) in five career appearances against the Blue Jays.
