## NEW YORK YANKEES (6-2) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (2-7)

### April 6, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 1:35 EDT - Game #10/Home #3

#### RHP Will Warren (0-0, 3.60 ERA) vs. LHP Andrew Heaney (0-0, 1.80 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** were defeated for the sixth time in their last seven games with Saturday's loss against the Yankees...Returned home after a seven-game, season-opening road trip in Florida that took them to Miami (March 27-30) and Tampa Bay (March 31-April 2)...Opened the season on the road for the ninth consecutive year and the 10th time in the last 11 seasons (the only time in that span in which Pittsburgh opened the season at PNC Park was in 2016 against St. Louis).

**GOING THE EXTRA MILE:** Ke'Bryan Hayes doubled home Bryan Reynolds in the fourth inning Saturday vs. the Yankees, marking his third game in a row with an extra-base hit (tripled Wednesday at Tampa Bay and homered Friday vs. New York)...It's Hayes' longest-such streak since he recorded at least one extra-base hit in four consecutive games from September 19-22, 2023...Hayes has hit safely in four straight and in six of the team's first nine games...He's hitting .400 (6-for-15) with 4 RBI during the streak.

**ANDREW ALONG THE BANKS OF THE ALLEGHENY:** Andrew Heaney will start today in the finale of this three-game weekend series vs. the Yankees...Heaney has pitched in a total of 204 games in his big-league career, but today will be his first at PNC Park... There are five other active stadiums he hasn't pitched at, including the N.L. Central's Great American Ball Park and Wrigley Field.

**ON DECK:** The Pirates will continue their homestand tomorrow night when they welcome the Cardinals to town...It will wrap up a stretch of six straight games against American League East opponents and will begin a stretch of six consecutive games against National League Central Division foes (will also travel to Cincinnati for a series next weekend against the Reds)...Pittsburgh went 25-27 in games within its own division in 2024 (8-5 against Cincinnati & 5-8 against St. Louis).

**FIGURE EIGHT:** Oneil Cruz walked, doubled and scored a run Saturday...His eight walks are tied for fifth-most in all of Major League Baseball entering today...Through the team's first nine games of this season, he's also stolen a Major League-best seven bases, scored five times and recorded three-extra base hits, making him one of only eight Major League players since 1901 to post those stats through his team's first nine games of a season.

**LEAN ON THE LEFTIES:** Caleb Ferguson, who pitched in 42 games with the Yankees in 2024, tossed a scoreless sixth inning Saturday and has made five consecutive scoreless appearances (5.0ip) to begin this season...Dating back to September 16, 2024 (while he was with Houston), Ferguson has a 1.17 ERA (7.2ip/1er) in his last nine regular-season outings...His 5.0 innings so far this season are tied for 10th-most among left-handed relievers in the National League (teammate Joey Wentz is tied for second with 6.1 innings)...As a staff, Pittsburgh's 19.2 innings from its left-handed relievers so far this season are second-most in MLB (Dodgers, 22.1), while the 2.29 ERA is the 10th-best mark.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** On Friday, three of Pittsburgh's full-season affiliates (Double-A Altoona, High-A Greensboro and Low-A Bradenton) opened their respective 2025 seasons (Triple-A Indianapolis opened up on March 28)...High-A Greensboro has won each of its first two games, including a 13-0 win Saturday over Asheville where infielders Javier Rivas and Maikol Escotto each went deep as part of a three-hit performance.

**CAN'T CATCH ME:** In Friday's Home Opener, Oneil Cruz successfully stole his 27th consecutive base (streak began on April 28, 2024)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, it matches Frank Taveras' streak from April 23, 1976 to July 20, 1976 for the third-longest streak of consecutive successful steals by a Pittsburgh player since 1976...The only Pirates with longer streaks in that span were Tony Womack (32 steals) in 1997 and Nate McLouth (28 steals) in 2008-09.

**ON THE BASES:** Although they didn't steal a base Saturday, the Pirates have swiped an MLB-best 20 bases through the first nine games of 2025 (San Diego is second with 15)...The 20 steals are Pittsburgh's second-most through its first nine games of a season since 1901 (the 1907 team had 26 steals through nine games)...They're also tied with the 1992 Milwaukee Brewers, 1990 Montreal Expos and 1975 California Angels for the fifth-most by any Major League team through its first nine games of a season in the Live-Ball Era (since 1920)...Only the 1984 Cleveland Indians (23 steals), 1990 Cincinnati Reds (21 steals), 1986 St. Louis Cardinals (21 steals) and 1981 Montreal Expos (21 steals) had more through nine games... Pittsburgh has seven different players that have at least one steal, including three (Cruz, Kiner-Falefa, Pham) with multiple steals.

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 6, 1992: Doug Drabek scattered five hits over 8.0 shutout innings to give the Pirates a 2-0 win over the Expos at Three Rivers Stadium on Opening Day in Pittsburgh. The Pirates scored both of their runs in the second inning on a sacrifice fly from Mike LaValliere and a run-scoring single by Drabek. Roger Mason come on in the ninth to record the final three outs and earn the save.

**AGE:** 33 (turns 34 on June 5) **SIGNED:** Thru 2025

**HOW ACQUIRED:** Signed as a free agent (one-year contract) on 2/22/25.

**STARTING OFF:** The 33-year-old southpaw is in his 12th Major League season...He signed a one-year contract with the Pirates on February 22 after spending each of the previous two years with the Texas Rangers...Was the Angels' nominee in both 2018 and 2019 for the distinguished Roberto Clemente Award for his community involvement.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Heaney allowed one run on four hits in 5.0 innings of work in his Pirates debut on March 30 at Miami...Pittsburgh was walked off in the ninth inning.

**VS. NEW YORK (AL):** Heaney will be making his ninth appearance (ninth start) against the Yankees...He picked up his only win against the Yankees on June 30, 2015 after allowing one run with seven strikeouts in 7.0 innings while pitching for the Angels.

**AGAINST HIS OLD FRIENDS:** Heaney made 12 appearances (five starts) with the Yankees in 2021 after being acquired from Los Angeles (AL), in exchange for pitchers Janson Junk and Elvis Peguero, at that year's trade deadline...He struck out nine batters in his second start with the club that August 7 vs. Seattle...His longest outing with New York came that August 18 vs. Boston, when he allowed one run across 7.0 innings.

**WELCOME TO THE BEST BALLPARK IN AMERICA:** Heaney will be making his 205th appearance in the big leagues, but it will be the first time he makes an appearance at PNC Park...In addition to PNC Park, the only other active stadiums that Heaney hasn't pitched at yet are Chase Field (Diamondbacks), Great American Ball Park (Reds), Steinbrenner Field (Rays), Sutter Health Park (Athletics) and Wrigley Field (Cubs).

**SIGN HERE, PLEASE:** Heaney signed a one-year contract with the Pirates on February 22....He posted a 5-14 record, 4.28 ERA (160.0ip/76er) and 159 strikeouts in 32 games (31 starts) with Texas in 2024...Heaney's 159 strikeouts and 160.0 innings pitched both ranked second on the Rangers, trailing Nathan Eovaldi (166 strikeouts & 70.2 innings).

**WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS:** Heaney spent the 2023 campaign as a member of the World-Champion Rangers, where he posted a career-high 10 wins...His 9.22 strikeouts per 9.0 innings figure was the highest ever by a left-handed Texas starting pitcher in a season (min. 15 starts)...He finished the year 13th among American League pitchers (min. 140.0ip) in Ks/9.0 innings (9.22) and 19th in strikeout percentage (23.6 percent).

**IN NEED OF SOME SUPPORT:** During the 2024 season, Heaney received two or fewer runs of support in 23 of his 31 starts...His team-low 3.48 run support average as a starter was the eighth-lowest qualified mark in all of Major League Baseball.

**FOUR YOUR INFO:** Heaney is one of four Major League left-handed pitchers to record 150-plus strikeouts in each of the last two seasons, along with Yusei Kikuchi, Framber Valdez and MacKenzie Gore...He is also one of five lefties to throw 145.0-plus innings in each of the last two years, along with Valdez, Kikuchi, Patrick Corbin and JP Sears.

**THIS AND THAT:** Heaney has 20 career outings with 10-plus strikeouts, the sixth-most among all active Major League southpaws...The only ones with more are Chris Sale (87), Clayton Kershaw (68), Robbie Ray (40), Blake Snell (35) and Carlos Rodón (26).
